
Where does race come from and how is it different from bias?

- Race is a social construction
 - There is no word for "Race" in the Christian Bible
 - Scientific accounts of skin color
 - 17th century Response to the heat of sun; Bile theory; Optic theory; New World: first major study in 1744; "degenerate races"; 20th Century Vitamin D, Folic acid, Cold tolerance.
- We all have Bias (Bias vs Racism) See Rise, Shine,
 Be Woke / See ADL Glossary; Debby Irving (Waking Up White); Implicit Bias Project (Harvard)
- Discrimination. Redlining. Examples of Racism (structural, systemic).



Construction of race continues:

2020 Census wanted to eliminate "race" and add a new category MENA: White; Black or African American; American Indian or Alaska Native; Asian PI; Some Other Race



What the Census Call Us

The traditional definition of race and ethnicity is related to biological and sociological factors respectively.

Race refers to a person's physical characteristics, such as bone structure and skin, hair, or eye color.

Ethnicity, however, refers to cultural factors, including nationality, regional culture, ancestry, and language.

An example of race is brown, white, or black skin (all from various parts of the world), while an example of ethnicity is German or Spanish ancestry (regardless of race). In many countries – India – religion marks identity.

In the US, the US Census gives us names and these have become a source of the three Cs:

Conflict, Cooperation as well as Confusion.




- How does God's diversity then play out in real life, on earth right now as I practice my faith?

Changing Demographics

2019 Equity Profile of OC

- OC leads the nation in demographic change
 - One-third residents are foreign born
 - Mixed status households (250,000 US citizens + 250,000 undocumented + 75,000 legal residents)
 - By 2050: Latino 45%; Asian or Pacific Islander 26%; White 23%;
 Black 2%; Mixed 4%
- Inequalities threaten region's long term economic prosperity;
 racial economic inequalities persist
 - White \$32 per hr; Black \$24.30; Latino \$15.60; Asian/Pacific Islander \$27.90; Mixed/other \$27.00
 - "OC Pattern of Inequities is on steroids"
 - Community health and safety risks affect POC disproportionately
 - 12th most expensive region to live (Latinos most rent burdened; long commutes into work places)
 - Hate crime is on the uptick Islamophobia, Anti-Semitism
- Devaluing of care-giving, gardening, and janitorial work



What is American Identity?

#1. An American Identity is an Anti-racist Identity.

Anti-racism is very much an American value!!!!

Anti-racism is some form of focused and sustained action, by a mix of people which includes inter-cultural, inter-faith, multi-lingual and inter-abled communities with the intent to change a system or an institutional policy, practice, or procedure which has racist effects.

Anti-racist Identity


Anti-racist identity = Share Power + Eliminate/Uncover Prejudice + Examine Privilege.

Follow the Golden Rule individually, collectively.

An anti-racist identity respects difference, shares power, strives to eliminate prejudice, examines privilege, uncovers thoughts, changes language, builds and strengthens community, restores equity, and increases justice for all.

American Dream & Being Woke

- Woke means being aware of race, racism, racialization, and having the ability, confidence, and persistence to challenge, interrupt, erode, and eliminate all forms of racism and its manifestations in one's own sphere of influence. Being woke means cultivating an anti-racist identity and practicing behaviors like: Active Listening; Cultural Humility; Inclusion; Lifelong Learning, and more.
- Selective Acculturation: Building a culture where racial equity is discussed and is a shared goal. Choosing the best from different cultures, including the USA and discarding those that harm.
 - Bystander anti-racism vs. Racial Equity
- Commit to reducing disparities & improving outcomes for all OC.
 - E.g. Affordable housing; Early childhood education; what else?

Racism vs. Bigotry (from Irving)

- **Prejudice** is when a person negatively pre-judges another person or group without getting to know the beliefs, thoughts, and feelings behind their words and actions. A person of any racial group can be prejudiced towards a person of any other racial group. There is no power dynamic involved.
- **Bigotry** is stronger than prejudice, a more severe mindset and often accompanied by discriminatory behavior. It's arrogant and mean-spirited, but requires neither systems nor power to engage in.
- Racism is the system that allows the racial group that's already in power to retain power. Since arriving on U.S. soil white people have used their power to create preferential access to survival rights and resources (housing, education, jobs, voting, citizenship, food, health, legal protection, etc.) for white people while simultaneously impeding people of color's access to these same rights and resources. Though "reverse racism" is a term I sometimes hear, it has never existed in America. White people are the only racial group to have ever established and retained power in the United States.

- Talk / Listen / Be Woke


