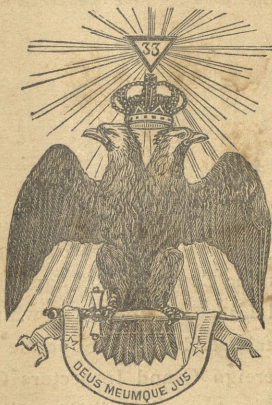

THE ANCIENT

AND

Accepted Scottish Rite

Is a system of Freemasonry, consisting of thirty-three Degrees, which are conferred in the Consistories, Chapters, Councils and Lodges of the Rite, which have been established by the Supreme Council of Sovereign Grand Inspectors General, for the country or jurisdiction where they are located. But where the York Rite has been already established, and is conferring the first three, or Symbolic Degrees under the authority of some Grand Lodge, the Scottish Rite exercises no jurisdiction over those Degrees, receiving its candidates from among those who have already received the Degree of Master Mason in the York Rite.

Hence, the Scottish Rite works in perfect union and harmony with the York Rite in this country.

In foreign countries, the Scottish Rite is the one most extensively practised, and here its gorgeous ceremonies and paraphernalia, and its impressive ritual are attracting such attention as to largely increase the membership of its various organizations to be rapidly increased with brethren interested in the Lodges, Chapters and Commanderies of the York Rite.

The comity and courtesy which prevail between the two Rites, may ere long result in limiting the conferring of the higher degrees, at least, of the Scottish Rite upon those only who have been created Knights Templar. Peace, harmony and unity of action prevail, and the brethren are laboring together to "advance the interests, increase the usefulness and augment the splendor" of the

Ancient and Accepted Rite.

It presents the simplest, cheapest, safest and promptest plan of Life Insurance that has yet been devised.

The membership fee is, for applicants under 40 years of age, \$5.00; and for each additional year or part of year, \$1.00.

On the death of a member each survivor is assessed \$1.10, and the family of the deceased receives as many dollars as there are surviving members.

It has been in successful operation over three years, and has already disbursed thousands of dollars to the families of deceased brethren. It now numbers nearly 750 members, and has a considerable invested fund.
