

that all of the proposed Trustees who are approved of by you and the congregation take the trust upon themselves, I think it would be well to let things pass as they are.

as to the property of which you were alone admitted you can admit who you like as Trustees, you being like Richard Alderson in that respect sole Trust upon the Roles of the Manor; If you named the same persons as those named by Richard Alderson for the rest of the property. The Trust as to the Institute might be ~~devised~~ in the same deed as the rest; and really when by the deed it is provided that the Trustees are merely to do the legal acts directed by the Minister or Congregation that is - are bare Trustees it is hardly important who they are.

I have not had time to prepare a draft of the proposed Trust Deed, but it will merely embody in formal language &c the terms desired by you and the congregation, and I enclose your sketch so that you may add to it any further details thought desirable for carrying out your wishes. Thus as heads - Minister for the time being to let or occupy &c. House Land &c as owner <sup>re</sup> keeping every thing in good repair.

Trustees to hold property subject as to house and land to the order of Minister for the time being, and as Chapel for Minister and Congregation repairs &c herof to be borne by the Congregation. Congregation to chose Minister - as to Institute; Heads also for Management of this

I think that if you will read my letter of March 25<sup>th</sup> and this at your proposed congregational meeting you and they will be able to come to a determination; and then you can see me at the at the Court with your sketch filled up as to the necessary heads.
