Dear Friend,

The need for a new Chapel and Sunday School at Muker has been felt for almost twenty years. A favourable site for a Chapel in the village was bought eighteen years ago, and £100 was left by the late Mr. Christopher Whitell, but the Great War held up the scheme.

During that time the building has become so dilapidated that something must be done, and done quickly. Two methods were open to us. Either to patch up the old building at a cost of £400 or to launch a scheme of building a new Chapel and Sunday School. We have decided to do the latter. The estimated cost of this scheme is approximately £900. The time to build is now.

Ways and means of raising funds are now well in hand.

It is proposed to hold a Bazaar on Wednesday Nov. 1st, 1933, in order to raise a considerable sum towards the amount required.

We feel that many who have gone from this dale and whose fathers worshipped in the old Chapel, together with many who have enjoyed holidays in this beautiful dale, will be keen to respond to our appeal; and so enable us to build a little Chapel and School which will be worthy of Methodism.
