## Keld Mutual Intellectual Improvement Society – Chronology

1838	James Wilkinson commences his ministry position in Keld
1839	James restarted the day school in Keld
1843	The school moved into a new building
1854	James created the Keld Mutual Intellectual Improvement Society
1860	Keld Chapel was rebuilt
1861	The Keld Literary Institute building was officially opened
1866	James Wilkinson died in Southport in December.
1867	The building was extended to include an assembly room and stable below.
1899	The Cooperative Holiday Association paid rent to use the room for holiday groups
1913	Chapel Trustee Resolution passed to regain control of the building (May)
	Institute reopens with a 50% Church / 50% Institute member committee (October)
1926	Keld Public Hall is built as a war memorial (including a reading room)
1931	Mail van driver used the room to wait for the village postman to deliver and collect outgoing mail.
1933	Keld band used the basement room for band practice, paying 10 shillings per annum
1935	Barclays Bank paid £10 per annum to use the room for one hour every Wednesday.
1953	Electricity was installed in the Institute
1971	Meeting held in January resulted in decision to close the Institute
1973	Keld school closed
1976	School and Institute buildings were opened as The Keld Centre, providing hostel accommodation.
1985	The Manse became part of The Keld Centre when it became vacant.
2001	Foot and mouth epidemic resulted in the closure of the Keld Centre.
