We celebrated a great commencement with the graduation of our 2003 Senior Class. Many thanks to those who helped make this event a success, including guest speakers Rev. Tyrone Gordon and commencement speaker, Philanderian and former Little Rock Mayor, Lottie Shackelford. Also, hats off to our three Honorary Doctor of Humane Letter recipients, Dr. Coleman H. Peterson, Vice President of the People Division, Wal-Mart Stores, Inc.; Dr. Kathryn F. We have all anticipated the opening of the new





Johnson, for their outstanding leadership of the Little Rock community and their combined support of Philander Smith College.



Philander Smith College held its 126th Commencement Ceremony at the Statehouse Convention Center on Saturday, May 10, 2003. A total of 109 graduates received their degrees. Of those graduates, 44 were awarded Honors or were designated with Distinction in Field.

The honorary "Doctor of Humane Letters" was bestowed upon actor Sherman Hemsley, Wal–Mart executive Coleman Hollis Peterson, and PSC Alumna Kathryn F. Worthen, in recognition of their exemplary service to humanity.

Dr. Lottie Shackelford, alumna, former member of the PSC Board of Trustees, and former Little Rock Mayor, delivered the keynote address to an audience of more than 2,000. 



Rev. Maxine Allen to Head New International Mission Center

The new Harry R. Kendall Science and Health Mission Center, an \$8 million facility on the campus of Philander Smith College, will not only provide educational opportunities for international students who will return to their homelands to enhance health-care systems, but also be a training ground for others in the field of community- and congregational-based health care ministries.

This will be one of only two unique international mission centers in the United Methodist Church, and Rev. Maxine Allen, former Dean of the Chapel, has accepted the charge to head the facility.

Allen's responsibilities will include forging new relationships with congregations, communities and agencies to bring about significant programs related to health-care ministries. The only other campus to house such a center is Emory University in Atlanta, GA.

Allen received a Master of Divinity degree from the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta. She was ordained an elder in full connection in the United Methodist Church's Little Rock Conference in 1999.

The center will also be the new home of the Office of the Bishop, as well as other programming ministries of the Arkansas Annual

Conference. The center was made possible through a grant from the Harry R. Kendall Fund of the United Methodist General Board of Global Ministries. The grant was the largest gift ever awarded by the agency's health and welfare unit, which oversees the fund.
