Philander Smith College is a small, privately supported, historically Black, four-year liberal arts institution related to The United Methodist Church. The College offers four degrees: the Bachelor of Arts, the Bachelor of Science, the Bachelor of Business Administration, and the Bachelor of Social Work.

The College's mission is to graduate academically accomplished students, grounded as advocates for social justice, determined to change the world for the better.

Philander Smith College, the only United Negro College Fund member institution in Arkansas, strives to provide a quality education for all, regardless of race, religion, sex, national origin or ethnic background.

Background

Founded in 1877, Philander Smith College is the result of the first attempt west of the Mississippi River to make education available to Freedmen (former African American slaves). The forerunner of the College was Walden Seminary, named in honor of Dr. J.M. Walden, one of the originators and the first Corresponding Secretary of the Freedmen's Aid Society.

In 1882, while soliciting funds, Dr. G.W. Gray met Mrs. Adeline Smith, widow of Mr. Philander Smith of Oak Park, Illinois. The late Philander Smith had been a liberal donor to Asiatic Missions and had developed an interest in the work of the Methodist Church-South. In making her gift to Dr. Gray, Mrs. Smith designated \$10,500 for Walden Seminary. The trustees accepted the gift and gave it special recognition by changing the name of the struggling Walden Seminary to Philander Smith College. A new site for the school had already been purchased at Eleventh and Izard Streets, Little Rock, Arkansas. The gift made by Mrs. Smith was a significant contribution towards the construction of Budlong Hall, the first brick building on the new site.

REV. DR. PHILLIP L. POINTER, SR.

Rev. Dr. Phillip L. Pointer, Sr. is the Senior Pastor of the St. Mark Baptist Church in Little Rock, AR. There he resides with his wife Keya and their three children: Gabriela, Phillip, Jr., and Elijah. Some twenty years ago, Pastor Pointer recognized and accepted his call to preach and teach the Word of God. As a minister of the gospel, he has dedicated himself to the faithful exposition of the Holy Scriptures. He has served as a Senior Pastor for the last 10 years.

Before coming aboard at St. Mark, Pastor Pointer served as the Senior Pastor of St. John Baptist Church in Alexandria, VA. In October 2005, he led the merger between St. John Baptist Church and Providence Baptist Church. This historical consummation formed the Providence St. John Baptist Church. During his tenure there, Pastor Pointer transitioned the traditional congregation to a progressive place of worship. He cultivated a style that was Bible-based and Holy Spirit-guided yet retained the essential historical elements of Baptist polity and beliefs.

Pastor Pointer earned a Master of Divinity Degree with honors from The Samuel Dewitt Proctor School of Theology at Virginia Union University in Richmond, Virginia. He recently completed his Doctor of Ministry at United Theological Seminary in Dayton, OH. His emphasis in doctoral study was "Preaching Prophetically in a Postmodern Culture: Communicating with Contemporary Audiences."

Pastor Pointer is the fourth generation in his family to serve as a Baptist pastor. He is firmly devoted to his family and seeks to model a commitment to family first. Pastor Pointer has a strong passion for leadership development and personal discipleship. He also has a great desire to empower people to both live as God intends and to serve God to their highest capacity. He seeks to accomplish this through meaningful worship, clear teaching, and providing consistent and loving pastoral care.
