### Brüno's Boffo at Box Office

Sacha Baron Cohen's controversial comedy Brüno raked in \$30.4 million at the box office during its opening weekend, even after a drop-off in ticket sales on Saturday.

The movie, starring Cohen as an over-the-top. flamboyant gay fashionista, beat out animated feature Ice Age: Dawn of the Dinosaurs -- now in its second week of release -as the number 1 grossing film this weekend.



Brüno has received a great deal of flack over its risqué content, which critics say pushes the boundaries of homophobia. The film is Cohen's follow-up to the 2006 film Borat, based on another character he developed for his U.K. series Da Ali G Show.

The Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation's incoming president Jarrett Barrios said in a statement on Friday, the film's opening day, that Brüno's message can further fan the flames of hate and violent attacks against LGBT people.

"In many parts of the United States, lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender people live life in harm's way," Barrios said. "We are among the most frequently targeted for hate crimes -- including physical attacks, verbal assaults, and destruction of our property."

Barrios added that the film is built around stereotypes and situations that do more to mock gay people and families rather than portray them in a realistic or positive light.

"It's unfortunate that Brüno ultimately misses the mark, particularly when there are still far too few positive images of gay people in major studio films. Some members of our community will not be offended by this film. Others, like those of us at GLAAD, find it frustrating and discouraging to be confronted

with a movie that wants to increase America's discomfort with homophobia, but which for much of America, seems likely to decrease its comfort with gay people."

Out magazine's editor in chief, Aaron Hicklin, however, had a contrasting view. In an interview with CNN, Hicklin said that the film puts homophobia under the spotlight in a humorous, powerful way.

### Neil Patrick Harris to Host Emmys

"After having had such a hoot hosting the Tonys, I was thrilled to get the call about the prime-time Emmys." Harris said in a

CBS press release. "I'm looking forward to the challenge of the show -- adding my own voice to it, while honoring the nominees and the entire year in television. But which voice to choose? I'm torn between gangsta, foppish Brit, and robot. Really proud of my robot. We'll see what happens on the night."

The Emmys will air on CBS on September 20.

### Should I Stay or Should I Go?

Often clients ask me, "Should I stay with my partner or should I go?" This is obviously not a question I can answer for them, so I help them look at the big picture - their expectations, the reality of their relationship, their old patterns - to help them make their decision. Many people feel bored in their relationships and wonder if someone else would be a much better partner. Some people decide to try and "have it both ways" and have an affair. An affair can feel so exciting: your lover seems to have all the qualities that your (boring, predictable) partner



doesn't. You feel understood in a way your partner never could. This, dear readers, is characteristic of an affair. It is full of excitement, newness and illusions. While we enjoy the excitement and newness, it is the illusions that spell trouble for us. We imagine that this new, wonderful person will lead us into a whole new life, but it's the rare affair that blossoms into a happy long-term relationship. Affairs usually end badly: the illusions eventually bite the dust and we see that the person we're cheating with has plenty of problems and annoying habits. Once we wise up, we may wonder why we're giving up someone we really know for someone we barely know at all.

I'm not advocating that you stay in a boring, stagnant relationship. Some times a different person meets unmet needs and you are really ready to change your life. But, in all honesty, this is NOT the case for most of us. For most of us. it's US that needs to change. This is such a drag, isn't it? Wouldn't it be great if our partner would do all the changing and we could just lie back in our La-Z-Boy recliner and enjoy how wonderful they are now that they've gotten rid of all those annoying habits? Ah...if only it worked that way.

It doesn't. If we want to have better relationships, we need to work on ourselves first. Couples counseling can be great, but only if BOTH people are willing to change. Change is uncomfortable, scary hard work. Many people aren't willing to go there, so they keep repeating the same scenarios over-and-over, regardless of who they pick as partners. If this is you: wake up! It's you who is the problem, not your partners. If you have a common pattern in relationships, it's all about you, not them. Changing partners probably won't make a damn bit of difference. Oh sure, at the beginning things might look rosy with your new lover, but give it time and the same old you will start to emerge. Big surprise.

If you're unhappy with your relationship, I recommend you consider several options:

- Talk about it with your partner. If he/she is willing to change, you have the potential for your relationship to deepen and become really amazing. You may find couple's counseling to be useful, or a workshop for couples, or some other way to get new information and skills to improve your relationship.
- If your partner isn't willing to change, focus on changing yourself (perhaps in individual psychotherapy) and see if your partner will eventually "follow along".
- Sometimes a trial separation is a good reality check for a couple in trouble: it gives both parties a chance to see if they miss each other, what they had together, and can serve as a good motivator for discussions about "how can we be happy together again?"



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You may be clear that what's best for you is to end the relationship. If so, do it with as much kindness, grace and honesty as possible. Love isn't like a light bulb, you can't just turn it on and off with a switch. If you've loved this man or woman, you still probably do. Leaving is rarely the easy, breezy panacea we hope it will be. It's usually fraught with lots of sadness, anger and uncertainty, e.g., "Did I give it my best shot?" "Did we try everything we could to stay together?" "Did I give up too easily?"

If you do end your relationship, I strongly recommend that you be on your own for a while. Do not jump right into another relationship, even if it appears immediately on your doorstep. After a relationship ends, it usually takes a few months for your internal voices to calm down and for you to see clearly where you're at and what you really want next. Jumping right into another relationship usually has a poor outcome. Yeah, you may be lonely for a while, but you need to figure out who you are now and what you want in terms of your next relationship. I define a good relationship as one where you and your partner help each other to become the men or women that you truly want to be. Whether you stay or go, let that be your guide.

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
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### Diane's Story

"My partner and I had been together for 14 years when I received the worst phone call of my life. There had been a terrible accident, and she was being flown to the hospital by helicopter. The hospital staff wanted to know how to get in touch with her next of kin. Mine was the only phone number they could find in her wallet. I gave them her parents' phone number, got into the car and drove straight to the hospital.

When I arrived at the hospital, I couldn't get any information on Susan's condition. The hospital staff informed me that medical information could only be released to Susan's family. For them, family did not include live-in partners regardless of the length of the relationship. It took six hours for Susan's parents to arrive at the hospital. During that time, I sat in the hospital waiting room and wasn't allowed to see or comfort her.

Only after Susan's parents arrived was I able to see her. Thankfully, they were caring people who accepted our relationship. The doctors predicted that Susan would not make it through the night. She died within the next hour. All that time had been wasted as I sat in that dark waiting room. She had been slowly dying alone, when I should have been holding her hand and couldn't."

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## Australian Senator Introduces Gay Marriage Bill

SAME-SEX couples will be allowed to marry if a Bill introduced in the Federal Parliament is passed.


Greens senator Sarah Hanson-Young introduced her private member's Bill, proposing to grant gay couples equal marriage rights, into the Upper House on Wednesday.

The Bill seeks to remove all discrimination based on sexuality and gender from the Marriage Act.

It will also allow same-sex marriages legalized abroad to be recognized in Australia.

Senator Hanson-Young tabled a petition of more than 30,000 signatures supporting gay marriage rights, saying: "The Rudd Government can no longer hide behind the lame excuse of the community not being ready for same-sex marriages in Australia."

Debate on the Marriage Equality Amendment Bill 2009 was adjourned.


