Couple Removed from Homecoming Dance

BIG PINEY, WY -- In response to a letter sent by the American Civil Liberties Union on behalf of two girls who were marched out of a high school homecoming dance by police, the Sublette County School District has agreed that same-sex couples will no longer be excluded from school dances, the ACLU announced today.

"This is a terrific victory for the lesbian and gay students in our school," said Amanda Blair, a senior at Big Piney High School in rural western Wyoming. "From now on, all students, not just straight students, will be able to enjoy school dances. It's good to know that you can make a difference by standing up for what's right."

Blair, an honor student who participates in swimming, band, basketball, track, and choir, had listed a female friend as her homecoming date when she signed up for the September 12 dance. School officials told her that same-sex dates aren't allowed at dances. Blair is heterosexual, but she and her friend decided to attend together in order to help lesbian and gay students in her district who may want to bring dates to school dances in the future. When Blair and her date arrived at the dance the next evening they were met by local police officers, who then escorted them off the premises without any explanation.

"We are very pleased that the school has decided to follow the law and do right by its lesbian and gay students," said Linda Burt, Executive Director of the ACLU of Wyoming. "It's unfortunate that Amanda and her date were so brutally excluded from participating in this year's homecoming dance. But by coming forward and standing up for their rights, they have made the school a better place - especially for the lesbian and gay students who now know their school won't exclude them from dances because of who they choose to date."

The Sublette County School District's assurances that students can bring same-sex dates comes in response to a letter the ACLU sent to district officials on behalf of Blair and her date. The letter, citing a 1980 federal case in Rhode Island, pointed out that students have a constitutional right to bring same-sex dates and demanded that the school allow them to do so. In the Rhode Island case, *Fricke v. Lynch*, a federal judge ruled that students who want to bring same-sex dates to school dances are not only protected under the free expression provisions of the First Amendment, but that schools must take steps to ensure their safety when they do bring same-sex dates to school dances. In the 23 years since *Fricke* was decided, students throughout the U.S. have brought same-sex dates to school dances without incident.

"Amanda should be commended for her efforts to make Big Piney High School a better place for lesbian and gay students," said Ken Choe, a staff attorney with the ACLU's Lesbian and Gay Rights Project. "Thanks to her bravery and determination, high school has become a little more bearable for the gay students, who no longer have to worry that police officers may be waiting for them should they choose to bring a date to a school dance."

"We are especially glad that we were able to resolve this issue without litigation, thus sparing the students the pain and the school the expense," Choe added. The *Fricke v. Lynch* decision can be read at http://archive.aclu.org/court/fricke_decision.html.

The Legend Continues...and It's a Musical Comedy!

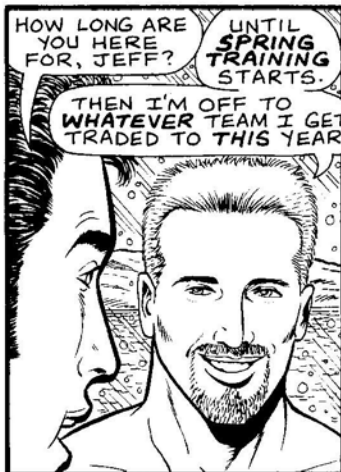

President Bush Throws Support Behind Anti-Family Amendment

Last night in an interview with Diane Sawyer, President Bush indicated his willingness to support the Federal Marriage Amendment. Bush also said: "The position of this administration is that whatever legal arrangements people want to make, they're allowed to make, so long as it's embraced by the state or at the state level."

While some will interpret Bush's remarks as implicit support for state-sanctioned civil unions, do not be fooled. Bush has endorsed an amendment to the U.S. Constitution that would not only lead to the immediate repeal of the civil union laws in Vermont and California, but would also strike down hundreds of state laws providing protection to gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender (GLBT) families, including the right of same-sex couples to visit one another in the hospital.

DNC Chairman Terry McAuliffe said: "GLBT Americans are a vital part of the Democratic Party. With President Bush's endorsement last night of the divisive "Federal Marriage Amendment," he has now made it clear that he and his party are indeed uninterested in demonstrating compassion towards gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender (GLBT) American families."

"Bush's endorsement now completes all of the items on the holiday wish list of right wing organizations. Earlier this year, Bush and Republicans gave the right wing some early holiday presents by declaring October 12-18 as "Marriage Protection Week" and signaling their intent to place in their official party platform the language of this anti-family amendment."

This President has lacked the courage to support basic federal protections for GLBT Americans, including the right to be free from workplace discrimination (Employment Non-Discrimination Act) and the right to be protected from violent crimes motivated by hate (Local Law Enforcement Enhancement Act).

This President has failed to respond to the domestic HIV/AIDS crisis and rewarded with lifetime appointments to the federal judiciary individuals who have made their careers based on animosity towards GLBT Americans.

The DNC and all nine of our Democratic candidates for President are opposed to the anti-family constitutional amendment, as are more than 80% of Americans--according to a recent Pew Research Center poll.

Democrats have long supported the passage of ENDA and comprehensive hate crimes legislation, as well as full-funding for the prevention and treatment of HIV/AIDS.

It is time for new leadership in the White House. A Democratic President will make America a better place for all Americans--including gay and lesbian Americans.

After three retired military officers, two generals and an admiral has challenged the ten-year policy "Don't Ask, Don't Tell," policy one should ask if it is a valid policy. Here three officers even "came out," while making their argument.

There are some great guys, but the issue would be I could not up and travel with them as they get re-stationed all over the world.

I support the military having a brother in the army, but I do not necessarily support their policies. The military has its own mind, making them different from civilian standards. It is not like these days the military can pick and choose.

The military does have large gaps in recruiting people. AN inclusive policy might help to get the numbers up.

An Interview with Dexter Jones "42nd Street"

"Come and meet those dancing feet..." at the Orpheum as 42nd street dances its way into the Omaha Metropolitan area. January 6-11.

"The Broadway Musical for people who love Broadway Musicals," 42ND STREET, winner of the 2001 Tony Award, Drama Desk Award and Outer Critics Circle Award for 'Best Musical Revival' is now on tour. The First National Tour opened at the Starlight Theatre in Kansas City, Missouri, August 4, 2002.

A Broadway legend, 42ND STREET defined musical comedy, with its star-is-born story, spectacular design, score of hit standards, and remarkable show chorus, and the most-admired ensemble tap dancing to grace the Great White Way even to grace the Great White Way. A true "Lullaby of Broadway," John Simon of *New York Magazine* said: "An absolute knockout! From grand effect to minute detail, executed with savvy and sensitivity. Prodigious sets, splendiferous costumes, caressing and coruscating lights, and intoxicating configurations of dancers that defy our minds and muscles not to join in. As I write this, the songs are buzzing in my head, and my feet have to be restrained from tapping. 42ND STREET is back!"

Featuring Broadway song standards such as: "We're in the Money," "You're Getting to Be a Habit With Me," "Lullaby of Broadway," "I Only Have Eyes For You," and, of course the spectacular title number, danced down a flight of steps -- the original production of 42ND STREET ran for more than 8 years and is one of the ten longest-running shows in Broadway history. 42ND STREET won the Tony Award for Best Musical 20 years ago. This new production opened May 2nd, 2000 in the Ford Theatre, the jewel in the crown of a renewed and invigorated 42ND STREET in New York City.

Dexter Jones (*Andy Lee, the dance director*) talked to the Gayzette about the upcoming show.

Jones has done Broadway, national, international: *Black & Blue, A Chorus Line, Riverdance, 42nd Street, Oh, Kay!*. Television: "One Life to Live," "Loving," "Bojangles" starring Gregory Hines, Michael Jackson's video "You Rock My World" starring Marlon Brando & Chris Tucker. Dexter is from the Bronx in New York. He attended S.U.N.Y., Purchase/Oswego NY and the London Academy.

"This is an eye-popping show with a stampede of dancers dancing together, with great songs, great dance moves and colorful costumes," said Jones. "It is a show where we all root for the underdog."

Within this challenging musical, Jones is able to captivate how his particular character fits into the big scheme of things.

"Andy Lee is a dance director, who is fair and likeable, but is also hard work and no nonsense," said Jones. "I love it, he is a great character," as he has been a part of this musical 8 times and played this character before.

"This musical has a lot of great dance numbers and a lot of acting. It is amazing when you get 36 people on stage to dance in sync. I really enjoy tap dancing."

For those who have seen 42nd street before, Jones assures that the choreography is different from the 1980's version of the show.

"I have been tapping for 34 years. This choreography is made to please the audience. Audiences tend to clap for the easiest moves, cause it looks good when everybody does the moves together."

The acting is something very meaningful to Jones's life.

"Acting gives you a chance of bringing a character to life and gives the audience something new to see. It is like putting on new skin."

Jones does not see the shows as a goal-oriented thing but something he enjoys.

"I have been on Broadway and I have toured. To me it is all about the caliber of the show."

Jones is excited as he makes his way to Omaha.

Jones is also a family man consisting of two sisters, 7 nieces and nephews, a lover named Tim and a 19 year old step son. One must also mention his cat Louise as apart of the family. He finds it still possible to be a family oriented person being on the road.

"If you find the right person, they don't fault you for being away. Sometimes between shows I am home for long periods of time."

"The gay community has not been allowed to have a family, because of laws."

Is 42nd street going to temporarily raise the gay population in Omaha?

"Yes, in the theatre gay male is the norm," Jones said as he hinted to many cast members being gay.

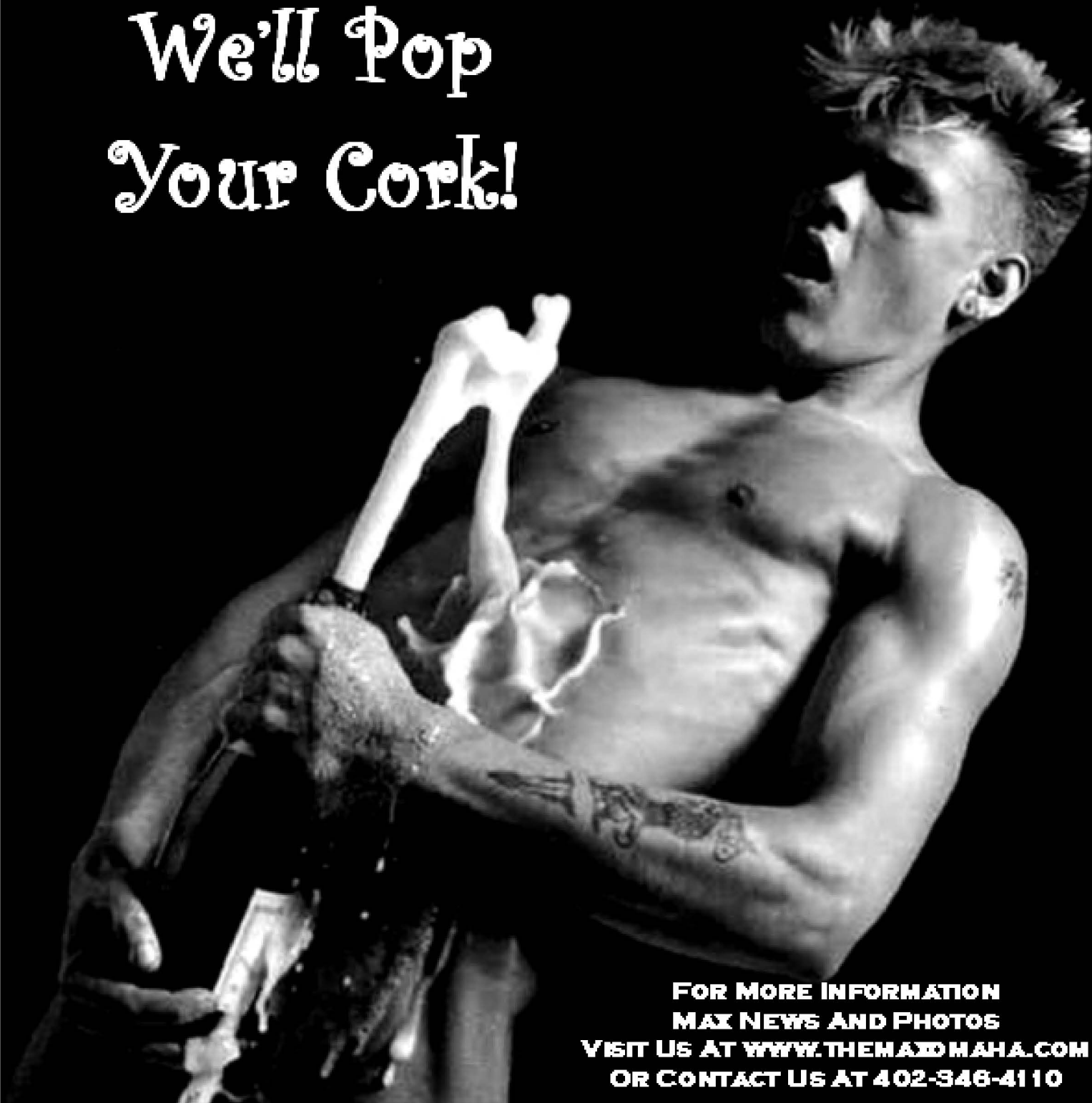
