Hy gh wan the previous owner of a Uncoln pay bar called Molleno's, whito had not been open very long. However, the faot that a gay businessman has been arrested for exploitetion of chlldren has tarnlshed the gay community to a amall degree. This is all homophobes need who already bonst that gaye are child molesters who spread ATDS,

The New Volee supports the EPPortie of the pollice to arreat and conviet individuals who use and abuse ah1ldren.

## Out \& About in Omaha

I get out and abcut less and less as the protective coverfing of the treats and shrutibery has fallen to the ground and the phobia about AIDS blosnoms all around me. I sea the bar scene in Omaha changling as there is less oruising, more fear of being open and, per chance, making contact with the "wrong type."

We have bean warned against casual sex with unknown partners, and there are so many who do not know or practice the art of conversation or making friends. I realize that this is difflcult with the musio blasting you off the dance floor, but it seems that it must be done. It is not easy to abk a strahger if they belleve in safe sex When you don't even know their name, A recent report in The Wall street Journal foctober 24) shows a strong correlation between the use of drugs (IV, pot, poppers, speed and so forth) and the devel-
opment of AIDS. Since most druge other than poppers, and booze in either against the law or prescribed by doctors, we don't normally know a person's drug intake on a first meating. It in fust another reason to get to know a person before bedding them.

On October 20, I attended a "Safe Sex" Seminar at The Max. I loarned famething thare: We have been sold of the warning signs, but did you know that when they refer to night sweatis, they moan sweating to the point of meeding to change bed clothes on a nightly basis over an extended period, and that elevated temperature zeferp to a continual reading of 101 degrees for a period of more than a week. Becky Inot her real name) was given an "alternative" concerning her sexuality: she would have to go through a 'homosexual rehabilitation? program designed to cure homosexuality, or she would be expelled, In wich case she would recelve no oredit for the courses she was taking. At the same time, she Mas pressured to confess her-sextallty to her parents twhich she did), and when/if she chose to stay at Union College, the issue would be discussed at the Deans' Councll. While Becky was ryying
to decide what to do, she was called in to see the Women's Dean, who wanted to know the names of other female students she'd had sex with and the names of other Lesblan atudents on campus. (Can you imagine? ! !

Becky spent several days away from Union trying to evaluace other alcernatives. Her friends gave her a lot of support and a place to stay during that time. Even so, Becky suffered a great deal of angulsh and Einally decided to ga home. It is not known what she faces there.

## Terry Taylor Receives Life Sentence

On December 21, 1984, a tragedy occurred that hag affected the lives of many people, inoluding those in the gay communlty. Ben DeBeats, $\sqrt{5}$, wan brutally murdered. DeBents' body suffered 51 atab wounds and was found in the trunk of hla oar. Soon after the diacovery of his body, DeBeats' former lover, Terry Taylor, was sought and apprehended by Lincoln police: Initially he was charged with manslaughter, but the charge was changed to firat degree murder, Approximately three monthe ago in an apparent plea bargaln, charges were onoe again changed $\rightarrow$ to second degree murder. At that time a pre-sentence investigation was initiated to halp the judge determine sentanoing. On November 27, Lancaater County Distriot Judge Jeffre Cheuvront sentenced Taylor, 22, to a Iffe sentence after a 90 -minute hearing wae conducted.

The human toll is immense and the scars will be felt for many years. Never has the gay community of Linooln witnemsed auch a tragedy ainoe the murdersuicide of two male lovers in the late 1970 s . Many people knew of, or saw, Terry Taylor and Ben DeBeata, Jr. In the bara or gay social ophere of Lincoln. Those who knew Terry were thockad and bewildered because it Was felt that he was incapable of any kind of violence. He was known as a friendly, nor:egoressive individual. Taylor's father, John Taylor of Broken
Arrow, Oklahoma, and hla grandfather, Dr. Bowen E. IayLor, testified that Tervy was quiet, caring. and hardworking.
od a groat amount of grief. /tra. DeBeata gald her son had conflded.in her that he wat homosexual, and she and her nusband had accepted that. Ben, 18 years old, had recelved a grant before his death and he had planned to stuay Intorlor desige at the Univeralty of Nebraska - LIncoln. Earller teatimony hald revealed that Ben mot Taylor in the gummer of 1964 and the two eventually became lovers. They moved Into an apartment at 610 S. 17 th on September 1. 1964.

Taylor expressed regret and remorse before the sentencing. Terry atated, "I loved Ben yory much. I gared for him. A11 I ever wanted was to be with him. Thinge changed. It created a situation that nelther one of un was experienced in handling. It led to arguments once in a while. If one of us had the guts of leaving that night this would never have happened. I take full reaponaiblilty. At timea I wish I could take hil place. I reallze there la pain and anger agalnst me. I can't axpress how sorry I am about everything. I don't ank their forgiveneas (DeBeata' family). I know how they feel. I know I have hurt my fantly. It is herd for them to deal with It a11 and mo to deal WIth It all. I hope that sometlme I can be forgiven, at least by my famlly. I lows them very much. I realize that I w1ll spend a lot of time. There is nothing anyone can 60 . I loved him very mueh. I'm sorry."

## State Health Department Minimizes AIDS Problem

The Nebrakka State Health Departmont in recent announcements has minlmized the serious problem of AIDS as well as thown Irresponsible conduct in their reporting. On November 25 the Department gaddenly announced three more cases of AIDS, bringing to seven the total number of caases in 1985. It has been known since late 1984 that statiatics were underestimeted and not reportad correctly. Why, suddenly, did three cases get reported in one day?

The State Health Department reported that the firgt cane of AIDS in Nebraska was reported in 1963. Two casea werg reportad in 1984 and aeven have been detected so far this year. A11 10 onses reported involved males betweon the ages of 28 and 69 , with an average age of 38.7 years. Nine of the cases ocourred in the atate's metropolitan aress. Elght of the men were honosexual or bisexual and the remairing two cases resulted from blood transfusions. The Department reported that no trans-fusion-relsted ATDS casen heve been reported in Nebraske sluce blood banks began screaning

Gonated blood for the AIDS-reinted virus thle apring.

The State Health Department alzo mintmized the problem by stating that Nebraska remalns a low incidence state. The state Health Department director, Dr . Gregg Wright, stated that AIDS was a severe public health problem but he did not aly what the department was doIng as far as education and researoh. It $1 s$ apparent that the Kealth Department is doing too 11 ttie. too late. The word epidemic was never used in the press ralease but has been used nationally by public health officlals.

It was also reported recently that Ianoaster County had ita first case of AIDS. Barlier the State Health Department stated an urwil1ingness to release county-wide staviatios, apparently fearing that persons In smaller countfes would react hystarically.

Lastly, the Departiment asked Individuala in high risk groupe to take atepa to lower thelr risk but did nat outline what these stepa were.

## Nebraska Wesleyan S.A.S. Support Protection of Gays <br> cussing circumstances of and

On Monday, November 18, 1983, the Student Affaits Senate (SAS) at Nebraska Wesleyan University, in a move to reflect thele concern, passed, nearly unanlmously, senate FIIe $9-85 \mathrm{SR}$. The primary portion of this bill states:

1) This senate shall not disoriminate in any way agalnst any minorlty group which organizes itself for the purpose of dis-
consequences faced by that group because of that group's or its members' sex, race, creed, ethnic origin, sexual orientation, national origin, or handicap.

It also contains an important statement in item 4 when It says:
4) No group asecing as a alnorlty for purpases of discusston of that minoricy's concerns, if that group in a minor-



Ity group because of its members* sex, race, creed, ethnic origin, sexual orlentation, or national origin, shall be defined as or categorized with groups formed by, of, or for persons with abnormal behaviors or physical, mental, of enottonal altments or disahilities by this senate or any of tea commictees. All members of the campus communtty are urged to avoid such definitions and zategorl atations.

At the thine of this Writing, it was not certaln whether the PresIdent of Nebraska Wesleyan Universicy, Dr, John thite, would sign this bill. Any bitl passed by the SAS must be signed by the President. Shoutd he not sign it, the SAS may then appeal it to the Soard of Governors. It is this vriter's oplition that Dr. Whice witl sfgn this legislation, because it is only binding upon the Student Affalrs Senate and is not In confliot with existing Administrative guidelines.

## Gay Couples-Holidays

Have yous ever wondered what other couples do for the holidays? Thanksgiving and Chriatmas are consldered famlly holtdays. This can bring up issues about our ovn familles and hollday rituale. It can also be a tise of feeling alone and depressed. The holiday ritunls chat we experienced as children innger with us as adults. It is Important to respect and remember those traditions.

Rituals are behaviors that we repeat over and over agaln. They incorporate behaviors that are meaningful to each individual and posatbly communtcate meanting ko other people. A Chrlstmas ritual might be you and your partner having oyster stew together on Christmas eve and making a coast to each other. This might be followed by sitting in front of the fireplace and opening special presents from each other. It has meaning, because the two of you are doing it
together, and it incorporates the warm feelings you bad as children when your famllies had oyscer stew. It is a special time that the two of you set aside and do not allow other people to interrupt. When you thirik of Christmas later in the year you might conjure up che feelliggs you had with each orther in front of the fireplace. The more you repeat this ritual, the mora it has meantig.
The hollday rituals we experienced as chlidren were neat, but we did not have muich to do with creating chem. Gay couples do not think much about creating rituals, but it is important to do just thac, especially at this cime of the year. Ricuals that you repeat each year help bond the two of you to each other. There are no formal rituals for gay couples, like chere are for straight couples. This may be an advantage; because the rituala you oreate with your parcmer will have far more meantigg than the ones created by tradition.

## Violence Against Wimmin -Part 2

(The followtng to Part 2 of a two-part edicorial aubinitted by $H$. Moore and the counsetors, of the Rape-5pouse Abuse Crisis Center. Part 1 was published In the November issue.)

The recent opintion in state V . Hunt vacating the sentencing of Hobert Hunt, Ir. communicates to the women of Nebraska a whote set of misogynist sessages through the application of the law. Understand from the outset, the imposition of the death penalty is not the focus. We must set that aside because many women among us feel that the death penalty is applied in if discriminatory pattern nationwide (as are murder charges). Instead, we must challenge the messages included in the formal opinion of State $V$. Hunt and reiterated in public by Chief Justice Krivosha at the University of Nebraska, Lincoln on September 12, 1985.

The ma fority of the Court denied that aggravating clrcumstances vere Involved In the death of Beverly Ramspott. They argue that the murder was not comitted to conceal the commission of a crime, but was an act of "sexual gratification." They further assert that "There is no evidence that acts were performed for the satisfaction
of inflicting elther mental or physical pain or that pain existed for any prolanged perfod of rime," Many detalls of the case have been presented in public media, and Krivosha has stated publicly that Mike Royke and other critics have not read the opinton or have misrepresented the legal "hatr splitting" that occurs In thls case.

The above quotes-- E rot the Nebraska reporca-and the gentrat medfa coverage of this lisue send the following messagen to un:

1. That any rapibc who klils or render: unconsclous a victim first, and then rapes that victim, has established a "not espacially hetnous, atraclous or sruel enough" scene for the orime of murder.
2. That sexual assaute is sexual gratiflcation. By drawing a parallel between these two acts. the motivacion for sexual assault is obscurtedthat motivation being domination, power and the degradation of women. By using the term "sexual gratification" the fustices imply that a reciprocal relationship extste between the victim and the assatlant. This is parently

3. In Krivonha's public comments, he scates that ". . the reason for the slaying was sewual gratifleation." This equates murder with sexual gratification-another dangeroun Idea to reinforce In our pacernallstic soclety.
4. That the unconscious state of the victim somehow mitigates the acts surrounding a murder. The use of the vietim's oneonsclous state as a "mitigating circumstance" is not accepted In Nebraska all an excuse for sexual assault le, if. if the Hiceim le drunk, not competent or consclous), why then should it be a mitigating circumstance for murder?

More to the point, we have no proof of Janet Ramspott's uncon-sclous-atace throughout the sexual assaults and murder. The only evidence we have is the lack of water in the victim's lungs, whish places her death at any time before she vas held uncer Niter by her murderer. Note that the court depended upon the convicted murderer's testimony for the time of her deach (though he noted that he felt a pulie after sexually assaulting her, and then tried to drown her) and for the time of her loss of consciousness (within one minute of entering her housel. The burden of proof should be upon the defendant $t_{0}$. prove that his victim was not conscious up to and untt1 he dragged ber to the bathtub. She may velt have been consclous during each of his assaults agalost her; bound and gagged, she could hardly struggle in any way that would give physical evidence of her not suffering, Janet Ramspote cannot speak to the especially helnous, atroclous and crual acts carrled out againec her, but we can and must.

Judiclal and community energy should be put into challenging the vague statute created by State V . Stevart. Arguing against the "especially heinous" victimlzation of Janet Ramspote increases che burden agalnst all women victims of sexual assault. As elected officials, the state supreme
Court Justices must attend to the community atandards of all Nebraskans. Our agreement or disagreement with the death penalty per se cannot be used to stifle our outrage at the opinions expressed by a majority of the court. The supreme Court engaged in legal denfal of a victim's "experience" of a painful death and seman! assault, which ted them to umproveable and dangerous conctusions.

The weeh of October 5-11 was a statuwide focus on vialance Agelnat Women Avarenes5. Women in Lincoln organlzed a series of educationat and political activities concorned with sexual assaut and yolence an the job, in the legal system, in schools. and in the Iives of women of color. The justices of the sourts were sent a copy of this editortal and invited ta setend a Comunlty Symposfum on Viotence Against Women. None attended. Each of un must dectde where and how wo will work for women vietims of vio-lence-in our courts, at the voting polls, at our centers and crisis lines or in our own persanal recoveries.

## Nebraskans Attend N Affirmation Meeting

More than 60 people from at least 17 states, including 4 Erom Nebraska, partioipated in celebrating Affirmation: United Methodists For Lesbian and Gay Concerns' 10th birthday held this past september $20-22$ at Wheadon United Methodiat Church in Evanston, Illinois.

The work of the weekend Included regional organizing with an emphasis upon more grassroota activities. Nebraska is only one of several local groupe to have organized in recent months. In addition, the Reconciling Congregation Progratn now includes 15 local congregations who have chosen to be intentionally supportive
and inclusive of lesbians and gay men. Inquirlea about the Reconciling Congregation Program continue to be received from all over the country,

The national meeting next turned its attention to the AIDS epidemic. While the population most affected is the gay male community, AIDS is a danger to all people-regardless of gender, race, elass or sexual orientation. Affirmation is working on a more detalled statement to be released after itg Coordinating Committee meeting in February of 1986. Work began for selecting a new Coordinating Committee to take office in the sipring of 1986 . Pledges in the amount of $\$ 10,000$ were raised to underwrite Affirmation's work.

## A Choice

With the onslaught of news about AIDS pacients and victims, I have become oppressed by che frustration of how to channel my energies to best help the gay community. I have learned to engage in safe sex, and promoted ic in verious ways. I have read extensively about people with AIDS from Rock Hudson to porno stars to infants. I have supported yarlous fund raisers for AtDS research. I have read a book on splritual gifts to help recognize my gifts that might be helpful at this time, as well as Elizabeth Kubler-Ross's book On Death and Dying.

My faich in my God has been helpful to me as I know that I do have eternal 11 fe , and that I am neither condemned to hell or to have AIDS because of my sexualicy. I have looked for and found fellowshlp with other believers. I know the principles of Christian Love which are set forth in the scriptures, and 1 attempt to incorporate chese into all of my inter-personal relationships.

Having recently read On Death and Dying, I am overwhelmed by the common thread of despair In the various case studles. None were done with a gay perion with AIDS. The studies did re-
flect the loneliness during dying by people with strong genetic fintly ties.

1 recall the Biblical account of Jeuss as He prayed alone in the Garden when He knew that He was to die, and His anger at His disclples as chey slept through lls hour of despalr: However death comes to me, I choose to have people around me that share my Christlan philosophy of Love.

I With still have my fours in the garden when 1 must face death alone, but i will also have times such as the Last Supper when frlends gather in comimal love.
We cannot choose our genetic tam11y; however, we can choose our friends. If you hold to the Chrlstlan concept of Love, and have not become a part of a congregation (Church family), I urge you to do so. You don't have to have AIDS to need people, and becoming a part of a church will not guarantee that you will not get AIDS. People who know their need for people are the smartest people in the world. Scripture records $\operatorname{In}$ the story of creation God's first revelation, "It is not good for man to be alone."

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## Film Depicts M.C.C.

The Universal. Fellowship of Metropolitan Comanity Churches has prepared i docomentary which is available on video tape. I have had the privilege of viewing this film twice. Both times, I was maved it the concern expressed by those in leadership posicions within the Iniversal Fellowshlp of Metropolitan Community Churches (UFMCC).

This film is primarily about the hiscory of UFMCC, but also reflects a portion of our history as Gay men and Lesbians. It was begun In the late $60^{\prime}$ s prior to Stonewall and was incorporated in 1970 as the International. Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches. Primarily a religious organixation, the UFMCC is also a policical force to be deale with.

There are over 200 churches worldwide, In ten countries with approximately 30,000 menbers. The UFMCC was the first Christian denomination to be organized around sexual arientation. The sexual orientation of members is not the main focus of UFMCC. The message is that God's love is for
everyone. About $20 \%$ of the members are not Gay.

This film was especially moving to me, because It caused me to remember some chings I had forgotten. It tells of those churches which were mysteriously destroyed by fire, of those that have been vandalized, and those that have been destroyed. But more Importancly, it brought back to my memory that there have been IIves lost in these acts of violence against a group attempting to bring God's love to a suffering community.

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## How to Choose Condoms

There are many kinds of condoms --latex, sheep gut, lubricated. unlubricated, long, short, wide, narrow, thick, thin, smooth, ribbed, ruffled, mushroom topped, receptacle tipped, round-ended, clear, opaque and brightly colored--they also have differont tastes and amella. The main thing to remember when ohoosing the right condom for you is to EXPERTMENT:

Try out lots of different kinds using safer sexual activities such as maturbation, and intercourse between the thighs. Be sure to BRRAK SOME while you practice so you know how much stress you can reasonably put on rubbern and what it feels like when one breaks.

## * LATEX OR SHEEP GUTS?

Some users prefer condons made from the appendix of sheep-r often called "natural" condoms. However, latex is more durable and provides better protection. Both rubber and sheep intestines are highly impermiable, but the animal fiber condors have walls of unequal thickness and thus tend to leak or break more easily. They should be used with those occasional people who are allergic to rubber, or who have such an aversion to latex that it's sheep guts or nothing.

* LUBRICATED OR UNLUBRICATED

There is evidence Iubricated condoms do not break as easily as unlubricated ones. Lubricated rubbers also give that mofint natural sexual feeling noxt to the akin that is miasing in the dry, powdered ones. And because they are a little more slippery, lubricated condoms provide greater sensation to the wearer.

Rubbers are lubricated with gels or sillcone based products. These are injected into the condom package just before sealing it. Gels tend to coat the rubbers unevanly inside the package, while silioone producta (because of their molecular properties) Iubricate all parta of the condom eqqually. This means there is lass goo when you open the package and that the rubber is less likely to break from grabbin on dry spota during use.

* DIFPERENT SIZES

Most large manufacturers make at least two condom sizes--Clasa I2 $\left(7.1^{\prime \prime} \times 4.2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ and class i1 $\left(6,4^{\prime \prime} \times 3,6^{\prime \prime}\right)$. Somem manufacturers also make narrower condoms as well. Theae are usually advertised an "Enugger for extra sensitivity." And for those who are "hung humongous," there are a fow condoms which are longer and wider than the above sizes. So when picking a brand SHOP AROUND and remember, rubber STRETCHES to fit many sfes:

A point you may wish to conaider about condop size is that rubbers which eit snugly at the bottom ereate a silight toarniquet effect on the superficial veins. This makes a harder arection and Increases the power of the orgasm-much like a cock ring'works. If you ilke this effect, GQ FOR IT: The researchera say it'a safe tun -if not, pick a rubber which does fiot silp too much.
