## **Self-Hating Queens**

Are you familiar with the term self-hating queen? Let me tell you I have heard the term, but never truly seen the reality of it till a few months ago.

Self-hating queens are commonly found to sometimes be GLBT Republicans. They are often commonly found in churches that have issues with gay people. To clarify it even more these people many times have what I call "reverse discrimination syndrome."

What these people tend to do is separate political and religious issues, compartmentalize them and keep them separate from themselves. These are the gays that are against gay marriage. They join political affiliations that tend to discriminate against GLBT people, like the Republican Party. Now, I know some gay republicans, and sexuality is the least of their concerns. I cannot imagine how they can put who they are on the back burner. Perhaps they just think of things bigger than themselves? I don't know.

To top it off, these are the same people who go to church and will get mad that there is a gay bishop in the pulpit. I feel sorry for GLBT clergy. People think there is this archaic point of clergy, and that they are not allowed to do the same things as other people. It may be true, but at the same time, why is it ok for a person to do something like date someone of the same sex, but their pastor is not allowed to do it? It is ridiculous!

Within the context of "reverse discrimination syndrome," these people also have a tendency to have a fear of women at a church altar, and they sometimes discriminate against other GLBT people. They are gay men that attack lesbians or transgendered people. They become racists. How can a gay person put themselves above all others.

I am concerned when a gay man has issues with women at the altar of a church. It is not only inconsistent ethically, it is inconsistent theologically.

I had this experience when I visited a church within my own denomination. There were many gay men in this church and I was drilled on my beliefs, as I am entering the priesthood. They wanted to know which seminary. Then the topic of female ordination came up. A gay man, of all people, said lets not desecrate the altar. Well you know that the church is not going to burn down if a woman was to reside at mass. I could handle this statement from a straight man, but a gay man?

Who is he to say his lifestyle is ok, but that a woman

who is in no way questioning that they were born this way, can say God discriminates at the altar? Maybe this man needs to look at himself and decide that his views are inconsistent. He either believes in an all inclusive God or he does not. If he does not, it is time for him to change and become an ex-gay. If there is nothing wrong with being gay (which there is not), then he needs to shut up and start loving diversity. This would allow him to be himself and allow others to be themselves without feeling that no matter what that person does it will never be good enough, because of the way they were made.

Inconsistencies only breed ignorance. No one should elevate themselves over another person. No one can think it is ok for them to do something and not ok for another to do the same thing.

#### Nebraska Sees Slight Decrease in New AIDS Cases

New AIDS cases reported in Nebraska dropped from 71 in 2002 to 60 last year, while new HIV infections remained level, with 47 cases reported for both years, according to the state Health and Human Services' HIV/AIDS Surveillance Report. Steve Jackson, HIV counselor and testing coordinator for HHS, said the decline in AIDS cases could be the result of better testing and heightened awareness about the disease.

The report found that the Latino population posted the biggest increase in new AIDS cases last year, with 15 cases reported-more than double the seven cases recorded for 2002. Twenty-eight new AIDS cases were reported among whites for 2003, a drop from 34 cases in 2002. New cases among African-Americans also declined from 28 in 2002 to 13 last year. For Native Americans new AIDS cases remained the same, with two cases reported each year. Two new AIDS cases were reported among Asians last year; in previous years no cases were recorded. More Nebraskans are getting tested for HIV, which could explain the reduction in AIDS figures, said Charles Houseman, public education coordinator at HHS. Last year HHS reported that 7,300 residents were tested, up from 6,231 in 2002. (AP)



## Review

# "416", The Documentary

"Equality Before the Law" is the Nebraska state motto, but this motto is merely a lie in our state. How do you define marriage? Here is your chance to see both sides of the issue and truly decide if marriage is what you want.

"416" is a documentary that takes you behind the scenes to see how politics work in establishing our current Defense of Marriage Amendment in Nebraska.

In 1996, the federal government approved the defense of marriage act defining marriage between a man and a woman. This also allowed states to ignore gay marriage from other states.

In 1997, history was made in Nebraska with Jimmy Creech being held on church trial for doing a same sex union at the First United Methodist Church. In addition Vermont passes Civil Unions. This brought concerns to the State of Nebraska alarming conservatives that Nebraska could soon have "counterfeit marriages." The Christian right now makes its moves primarily with the Church of Later Day Saints (Mormon), Roman Catholic Church and many evangelical bodies.

"416" allows us to see the characters behind the conservative movement, who stopped at nothing to prevent gays to have any chance at equality in Nebraska. The amendment not only stopped marriage, but barred civil unions and domestic partnerships.

There was also the liberal side that fought hard to preserve the rights of gays, but, having far less money (\$10,000) than the conservatives (\$750,000), most of the conservative money coming from people out of state.

The fight was tough, but not over. Representatives also filmed in the documentary include the ACLU in conjunction with Citizens for Equal Protection. The film gets into legal ramifications by having interviews from law professors, many of whom talk about the legal strategy.


This film makes good use of prominent figures. It even cuts to the heart of the issue of the religious debate over homosexuality. Part of the interviews dealt with biblical debate. There were representatives for conservatives from the Mormon Church, Grace University and the head pastor from Christ Community, a church in West Omaha. The liberal side of the issue was represented by MCC pastors.

There is even more, when issues about hate crimes against GLBT people are brought up. All of this linked together brings up the subject of present day ramifications. The documentary film also interviewed several GLBT couples, who talked about their love and how the present legal situation affects them.

The battle is not over. There are steps to fight 416. "416" captures the heart of the real issue of marriage. No matter what side of the issue you are on, this documentary is a fair and unbiased film that is worth seeing. The editing is clean cut. Some of the statements are even comical, allowing this interesting documentary to be not quite so intense.

Support the premiere of "416." It is guaranteed to trigger some emotion within you. The premiere will be July 9-10 at

the Omaha Community Playhouse. Tickets are \$8. For tickets and group sales call 402-212-3424.



# France's First Gay Wedding Faces Official Split

PARIS (Reuters) – A public prosecutor challenged France's first gay wedding Monday, only two days after the male couple exchanged marriage vows in the southwestern town of Begles.

France's ruling conservatives and the opposition have locked horns over gay marriage ahead of the European elections this month, with the government starting proceedings to suspend the Green mayor who married the couple despite warnings he was breaking the law.

Prosecutor Bertrand de Loze wants to summon the couple to court for a hearing, which the couple's lawyer said did not surprise her.

"It does not disturb me. This hearing will allow us to discuss the issues seriously in front of the judge, away from political speeches," said lawyer Caroline Mecary.

Justice Minister Dominique Perben had already declared the wedding invalid. Green mayor Noel Mamere has said he would appeal if the marriage was annulled and take the case to the European Court of Human Rights if necessary.

Some two thirds of French people are in favor of same-sex weddings, a recent poll by Elle magazine showed.

French law already allows civil unions between homosexuals but gays say this puts them at a disadvantage in terms of tax, inheritance and parenting rights.

#### The Presidential Prayer Team.....

...... is currently urging us to: "Pray for the President as he seeks wisdom on how to legally codify the definition of marriage. Pray that it will be according to Biblical principles. With any forces insisting on variant definitions of marriage, pray that God's Word and His standards will be honored by our government."

Any good religious person believes prayer should be balanced by action.

So here, in support of the Prayer Team's admirable goals, is a proposed Constitutional Amendment codifying marriage entirely on Biblical principles:

A. Marriage in the United States shall consist of a union between one man and one or more women. (Gen 29:17-28; II Sam 3:2-5.)

B. Marriage shall not impede a man's right to take concubines in addition to his wife or wives. (II Sam 5:13; I Kings 11:3; II Chron 11:21)

C. A marriage shall be considered valid only if the wife is a virgin. If the wife is not a virgin, she shall be executed. (Deut 22:13-21)

D. Marriage between a believer and a nonbeliever shall be forbidden. (Gen 24:3; Num 25:1-9; Ezra 9:12; Neh 10:30)

E. Since marriage is for life, neither this Constitution nor the constitution of any State, nor any state or federal law, shall be construed to permit divorce. (Deut 22:19; Mark 10:9)

F. If a married man dies without children. his brother shall marry the widow. If he refuses to marry his brother's widow or deliberately does not give her children, he shall pay a fine of one shoe and be otherwise punished in a manner to be determined by law. (Gen. 38:6-10; Deut25:5-10)

G. Divorced people may not remarry without being considered adulterers. (Math. 5:31-32) (Mark 10:4) Adulterers shall be stoned to death. (Lev. 20:10)



#### No Vaccine in Near Future

One of the men who jointly discovered that HIV leads to AIDS says a vaccine is unlikely to appear in the near future, warning that scientists working on the project are doing so with "two hands behind their backs."

Speaking as he collected an honorary doctorate from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Professor Robert Gallo said that despite ongoing work to find it, a viable vaccine is unlikely to appear in the next few years.

He said that, because of the risk associated with the virus, traditional ways to develop a virus are unlikely to yield success in the development of an anti-HIV product.

"Because of the danger, we cannot make a vaccine out of [weakened] viruses. We also won't be allowed to make a vaccine from a 'killed' virus, as there is the risk that not all the viruses are destroyed," he told the Jerusalem Post.

The rapidly changing virus also makes it impossible to attack the outer layers of the virus, since it becomes immune to any antibody attack as it mutates, Gallo continued.

But he says a vaccine is possible in the future.

"There have been many advances in the last three to five years that indicate it is do-able," Gallo told the newspaper.

# Pope Meets Bush, Denounces Gay Marriage

(Vatican City) Same-sex marriage represents nothing more than "self-centered demands" erroneously depicted as human rights, Pope John Paul II declared Friday, following a meeting with President George W. Bush.

While much of the meeting focused on the Church's opposition to the war in Iraq the two were able agreed on their opposition to gay marriage.

Immediately after the meeting with Bush, the pontiff held a separate audience with visiting U.S. bishops where he told them that the church's position on same-sex unions must be driven home in the face of "erroneous yet pervasive thinking."

"It is your special responsibility for evangelizing culture and

"It is your special responsibility for evangelizing culture and promoting Christian values in society and public life," the Pope told the bishops.

This included not only gay marriage but abortion, the aged pope said, slurring his words making him difficult at times to understand.

"Rights are at times reduced to self-centered demands: the growth of prostitution and pornography in the name of adult choice, the acceptance of abortion in the name of women's rights, the approval of same sex unions in the name of homosexual rights," he said.

He urged church leaders to be courageous despite detractors

who call the church bigoted.

"Ambiguous moral positions, the distortion of reason by particular interest groups . . . are just some examples of a perspective of life which fails to seek truth itself and then abandons the search for the ultimate goal and meaning of human existence," John Paul said.

## DEFYING THE ODDS, THE RAINBOW RIDE GRANNIES ARE HALF-WAY HOME

Amid death threats and hateful protests, Carrie and Elisia Ross-Stone, the lesbian grandmas who are riding bicycles on the Rainbow Ride Across America, persevere.

The Ross-Stones are lesbian civil rights activists and grandmothers to Jareth, age 2. They are riding their bicycles from San Francisco to New York City to raise awareness and get support for equal civil marriage rights.

With their journey more than half-way completed, Carrie and Elisia feel they are doing what they set out to do.

After 5 weeks and 2,100 miles on the road, they have met with many supporters of LGBT equality and have faced a few foes. They met with elected officials in several cities, including the Mayor of Salt Lake City Utah who spoke out in support of equal civil marriage rights. They have met and rallied with progressive groups from African American, Latino, Native American, Feminist, and Youth organizations, who are working together with the LGBT community to create positive social change in America.

The pair even paid a visit to the office of Marilyn Musgrave, the sponsor of the mean-spirited Federal Marriage Amendment. During their travels, Elisia and Carrie took a side trip to Laramie, Wyoming. There they spent a quiet day reflecting upon the extreme consequences of unjust laws that inspire some to act out violently toward members of oppressed groups who are deemed "unworthy" by the government and a few religious organizations.

The Rocky Mountains proved a formidable climb for the 50 year-old women who see the literal ups and downs as symbolic of the struggle for LGBT equality. In addition to their physical aches and pains, Carrie and Elisia have also been the targets of death threats and insults from hate-mongers.

But these women believe they are making a difference in the struggle for equal civil marriage rights.

Because they dare to openly protest inequality, they inspire others to do so. When people meet them face to face, they are often forced to rethink the usual stereotypes about what gay and lesbian families look like, how they act, and what they do. The youthful and athletic grannies also challenge the stereotypical image of a "grandmother."

With five more weeks and over 1,000 miles left to travel, there is still much work to be done. Over the next few weeks Carrie and Elisia will be in the following cities:

Springfield, IL on June 11, 12, and 13; Indianapolis, IN June 19 and 20; Columbus, OH on June 26 and 27; Pittsburgh, PA on July 1, and finally in New York City for the end of the Rainbow Ride on July 10.
