Never before had a sanctioned rodeo of the International Gay Rodeo Association been called, but judges deemed it unsafe to continue. In the four events that were called off, awards were presented to those with the best scores in the Saturday events. Once again, our hats are off to the brave cowboys and cowgirls of the Heartland Regional Rodeo.


ART FROM THE CLOSET SILENT AUCTION



IMPERIAL COURT OF NEBRASKA CELEBRATES 20 YEARS OF SERVICE TO COMMUNITY

Saturday, July 15 will mark the 20th Coronation of the Imperial Court of Nebraska. In 1980 a group formed in Lincoln, Nebraska and made the decision to provide a way for the gay community to come together for a gala evening of formal attire and the glitz, glamour, and pageantry of high society. The event was patterned after elaborate affairs held on the West Coast and in Denver where gay men entered a world of make believe and a "camp" Court system including the selection of an "Emperor" and "Empress" to lead the organization throughout the year. However, attempts to find a location for the event in Lincoln proved unsuccessful and the first "Coronation" of an Emperor and Empress was held at the prestigious Crown Motel in Bellevue. Members of the founding group, Don Flowers and Jay Quast, were chosen to serve as "Regents" until the community selected its first Emperor and Empress, Gary West and Rex "Dolly" Goins.

The organization had the avowed purpose of "furthering the cause of gay society in Nebraska" and they did this very successfully. The third Coronation was held at the Joslyn Art Museum in Omaha and was attended by 450 people. That year marked the beginning of the Imperial Court's involvement with fundraising for the community as Labor Day activities raised money for Muscular Dystrophy and Empress Dolly appeared on local television in full drag presenting a check for "Jerry's Kids." In Reign 5 the Imperial Court helped organize the first Pride Parade in Omaha where 60 brave souls carried candles through the streets of downtown Omaha and Empress 5 Laura Lee and Mother

to all Athenas JoJo Morrison were among those pictured in the Omaha World Herald. By Reign 6 the "Gay Men's Health Crisis" was a matter of concern even in the Heartland and the Imperial Court led the way in fundraising for research into the disease and in spreading information to the community through "Project Concern." By now the Imperial Court had taken on much of the structure that is seen today. Community Picnics were held on each of the three major summer holidays, major fund-raising activities targeted the needs of PWA's and their families at Thanksgiving and Christmas, fledgling female impersonators launched their careers at Closet Ball, and community fundraising reached well over \$10,000 a year.

In the 20 years that the Imperial Court of Nebraska has served the GLBT community, over \$500,000 has been donated to local, regional, national, and international charities, including such diverse groups as "Jerry's Kids," the American Cancer Society, the Nebraska AIDS Project, the River City Mixed Chorus, the Nebraska Humane Society, the Heartland Gay Rodeo Association, International Ms Leather, the Names Project Quilt, the National Gay Lesbian Task Force and over 40 other groups and organizations.

Reign 19 of the Imperial Court under the leadership of Emperor Michael Lyons and Empress Laura Lee has continued its record of service to the community with nearly \$30,000 donated back to the community. Well over \$10,000 of this has gone to support AIDS and HIV related causes.

FLAT WATER BEARS 4TH ANNUAL BEAR-B-Q & BEER BUST AT MAX JULY 22

Flat Water Bears is holding its Fourth Annual Bear-B-Q; a picnic, beverage-bust and raffle on Saturday, July 22nd. The event will be 4-7 PM. Saturday on the Patio of the Max, 15th & Jackson St., Omaha.

The Bear group draws membership predominantly from Nebraska and Western Iowa, with this annual event bringing hungry Bears from Clubs in Missouri, Kansas and Minnesota. Last year's revelry even enticed a Bear from Iceland. Mainly a victuals-rich party, this event is also a fundraiser helping support the group's charitable projects. A variety of Bearaphernalia including club-logo clothing and items from other Bear Clubs will be raffled. The Bear-B-Q also celebrates the club's founding four years ago.

Main menu for the evening will be BBQ chicken and grilled bratwurst with scads of side-dishes and beer/beverage-bust. Cost is \$7, \$5 for Bear Club members. New this year will be a "scavenger hunt" with clues to Omaha architecture in the "bar district". Prizes for participants best correctly identifying cited buildings will be awarded at 10 PM at the Diamond Bar, 712 S. 16th. WORLD PRIDE 2000 FESTIVAL OPENS IN ROME

World Pride 2000, a weeklong festival demonstrating GLBT pride, began Saturday with a gala opening concert - and a fistful of angry anti-gay demonstrations. World Pride 2000 is scheduled from July 1 – 9, 2000 in Rome, Italy. In many cities, the festival wouldn't raise so much as an eyebrow.

But Rome is the center of the Roman Catholic world - and the center of that world's Holy Year, the 2000th anniversary of the birth of Christ. The Vatican has been open in its disapproval, setting a tone of intolerance that has made the festival as much a political event as a party. The Roman Catholic Church officially opposes homosexuality, which it has called "intrinsically evil," and under Pope John Paul II, it has actively campaigned against gay rights. The Church was one of the major sponsors of California's anti-same-sex marriage Knight Initiative. And earlier this year when the Pope officially apologized to groups harmed by the Church throughout history, he conspicuously excluded gay men and lesbians. Rightist politicians, neo-fascists and conservative Catholic groups have been relentless in their anti-gay pronouncements. The city withdrew its official patronage and the premier of Italy spoke out publicly against World Pride. Festival organizers say the outcry has boomeranged, creating a groundswell of support and sympathy. They recently upped their estimate of the number of people who would attend from 200,000 to 300,000.

Rev. Troy D. Perry has been asked to speak during World Pride 2000 on the topic of religion and homosexuality. Rev. Perry was invited to speak at the celebration by the World Pride committee and he will serve on a panel discussion on the same topic of religion and homosexuality. While at the event, Rev. Perry will request a meeting with Pope John Paul II.
