STONEWALL AWARDS ANNOUNCED

The Stonewall Awards, \$25,000 each recognizing contributions to the gay and lesbian community, reach back this year to the clandestine and dangerous days of 1950 when merely gathering could cause homosexuals to lose their jobs, their basic rights, their personal safety. The 1996 Stonewall Awards are going to:

— Harry Hay, 84, of Los Angeles, a founder in 1950 of the Mattachine Society, the first organization for gay people

— David LaFontaine, 37, Canton, MA, innovator of h.s. programs to protect gay youth

— Gloria J.T. Smith, 42, of Columbus, OH, creator of a model community AIDS plan

— Phyllis Satrazemis, 72, of Raleigh, NC, who bridges straight and gay communities to educate and comfort victims of bias and AIDS.

The Stonewall Awards are made by The Anderson Prize Foundation. They are named for the Stonewall Rebellion in 1969, when gays defied police repression in Greenwich Village, NY, and initiated gay rights activities across the country. Including this year's awards, almost \$600,000 in prize money has been distributed.

Stonewall Awards are made without regard to sexual orientation, race, ethnic origin, age or gender. Leaders of the gay and lesbian community are invited by the Foundation to anonymously nominate a slate of candidates, from which four winners are chosen by a Foundation committee to represent the nation's Northeast, South, Midwest and West.

A PERSONAL UPDATE: Carla's Better!

I promised you an update on how Carla's doing — well, all in all she seems to be doing better. She has seen 4 different specialists, been on the right thyroid medication for six weeks and her thyroid level is within the "normal" range.

Some of the symptoms are improving and getting back toward "normal." Her feet are much less swollen and she has more energy, but others persist and are causing new concerns. She has some problem with her liver but so far all the tests to figure out what is causing it have been negative so they hope that it will return to normal over the next few months.

However, the first symptom of all of this was a cough that wouldn't quit (and still hasn't quit). We've seen the lung specialist twice and he's prescribed three different medications. The most recent one is prednisone — a steroid (and, of course, now that Carla knows she's taking steroids she figures she should be in Atlanta lifting weights with the best of them!). If the prednisone doesn't get rid of the cough and shortness of breath, Carla will have to have some extensive tests looking for more serious causes (CT scan, bronchoscopy, etc.). We have another week or so before we go back to the doctor, so we are hoping and praying that it works. We'll keep you posted.

KERREY RESPONDS ON SAME-SEX MARRIAGES

Will "Keep Your Views in Mind"

Dear Ms. Van Butsel

Thank you for contacted me regarding same sex marriages. I appreciate hearing your views on this issue.

As you may know, the Defense of Marriage Act was recently introduced in the Senate. This legislation creates a federal definition of marriage and would allow each State to determine whether to recognize same-sex marriages.

Currently, states have the power to determine what they recognize as a legal union. Providing a federal definition of marriage concerns me. Once the definition of marriage is federalized, any subsequent Congress could change the definition and every state would have to abide by that change.

Other similar laws regarding marriage, divorce, custody, and other family issues have traditionally been left to the states to decide. As you may know, the state of Hawaii's Supreme Court will be ruling on the legality of same sex marriages in Hawaii, although the court may not issue a decision until next year. Legal scholars disagree about the impact Hawaii's decision will have on other states. The Supreme Court may ultimately have to decide the issue.

The Defense of Marriage Act has been referred to the Senate Judiciary Committee. Should this legislation come before the full Senate for consideration, I will keep your views in mind.

AUSTRIAN ACTIVISTS CALL FOR REPEAL OF ANTI-GAY LAWS

Austrian activists are calling for an international campaign to bring about the repeal of 3 anti-gay laws. Article 209 sets the minimum age of consensual sex between gay men at 18, 4 years above the age of 14 set for lesbians and heterosexuals, and allows for a prison sentence of 6 months to 5 years. Article 220 prohibits the production or distribution of any materials which present homosexuality in a positive way and carries a sentence of up to 6 months. Article 221 prohibits the existence of any group whose aims include the promotion of homosexuality and imposes a prison sentence of up to 6 months.

Although gay and lesbian groups are active in Austria, there are several documented cases of Article 220 being used to censor publications, and the unequal age of consent law has been enforced numerous times against gay men.

On January 15, 1996, the first day of the new parliamentary session, the Social Democrats, the Greens, and the Liberals, which together hold 93 of the 183 seats, introduced new bills to repeal Articles 209, 220 and 221. The proposals to repeal the laws received strong opposition from the religious People's Party and the far right Freedom Party.

When Parliament postponed discussion of the bill until November, 1996, the Austrian Lesbian and Gay Forum (ALGF) responded by setting a 100-day deadline for considering the proposal.

This deadline passed on April 24, 1996, and the ALGF is now calling for letters to pressure the government into considering the proposal as soon as possible. ALGF is also encouraging people to organize local protests and boycotts of Austrian goods. Letters should call for the repeal of Articles 209, 220 and 221, stressing the following points:

Laws such as these are a disgrace to a democratic society. With such discriminatory laws in force, Austria is in violation of the principles of non-discrimination and equal protection that are the foundation of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, and the European Convention on Human Rights, all of which Austria has signed.

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TRANSSEXUAL EXPelled FROM PUBLIC PARK

Last month, Merrisa Leigh Coleman, a Sacramento, California area transsexual and her son, were harassed and expelled from "Water World", a local theme park open to the public.

While at the park, Coleman had tried on and purchased a bikini at the park store. A short time later, she was surrounded by three park rangers, a deputy sheriff and several park employees (including the park's general manager).

Informed there had been a complaint, Coleman was questioned and forced to leave.

The woman who lodged the complaint refused to give her name, and when asked by officers present if Coleman appeared male or female to her, she responded, "I don't know."

Referring to Coleman as "a guy in drag", the deputy sheriff also accused her of lewd conduct for using the women's room to relieve herself.

When informed her California driver's license and ID showed her as a female, he responded, "Well, we'll just take you into the restroom and have one of these ladies check you out," adding, "Whoever issued your driver's license didn't check you out good enough."

The sheriff declined to take any formal statements in this case, including one from the complainant, and no formal charges were filed.

Merrisa said, "I feel humiliated and degraded and made to feel like a freak. This was done completely indiscriminately right in front of hundreds of people as well as my own son. I could have been taken aside, questioned in private, and asked for my ID and, when it showed me as a female, the matter dropped.

"I've worked so hard to get to where I am in such a short time, and now I have no idea where I am going. I've been having nightmares, nausea, lack of appetite, and I'm terrified to be alone or even seen in public right now."

k.d. lang ALL YOU CAN EAT SUMMER TOUR HELPS FEED HUNGRY

During the summer dates of k.d. lang's current "All You Can Eat" tour, the Grammy-winning vocalist and songwriter will sponsor a food collection drive to help feed the hungry, administered under the auspices of USA Harvest.

Concert-goers will be asked to bring packaged food to the venue, where it will be collected by USA Harvest volunteers for distribution to the hungry through local missions, soup kitchens and shelters.

k.d. lang has requested that the donated food be of the vegetarian variety.

USA Harvest utilizes 59,000 volunteers to deliver up to 225 million pounds of food annually across the nation.

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Local concert dates for the tour include Kansas City on August 2nd, Des Moines on August 3rd, and Morrison, Colorado on August 13th.

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
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

ORAL EXPOSURE TO AIDS VIRUS RISK FOR INFECTION IN ADULTS

Oral exposure to high doses of human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) can lead to infection by the virus and AIDS, researchers at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute and Tulane University report in a study in *Science*.

In experiments with rhesus monkeys, investigators found that adult animals exposed orally to the simian immunodeficiency virus (SIV), a close biological cousin of HIV, became infected with the virus and developed AIDS. The finding offers evidence that AIDS can be contracted through unprotected receptive oral intercourse, researchers say.

"There have been isolated reports of HIV-1 transmission by oral-genital contact in adults," said senior investigator Ruth M. Ruprecht, M.D., Ph.D., chief of the Laboratory of Viral Pathogenesis at Dana-Farber. "On the basis of reports on humans and our study, unprotected receptive oral intercourse should be added to the list of behaviors that place people at risk of infection by HIV-1."

The study stems from research into the transmission of HIV during childbirth. Previous studies by Ruprecht and her colleagues with rhesus monkeys had suggested that the low acidity of newborns' stomach secretions at birth made them especially susceptible to AIDS virus infection after oral exposure. The higher acidity of adults' stomach secretions would, it was theorized, offer protection against infection.

To test this hypothesis, researchers gave two healthy, adult rhesus monkeys a drug that inhibits the secretion of gastric acid. The macaques then had a solution containing SIV administered to

their tongue. Both animals became infected. A third animal was given the same SIV dose without having previously been given the gastric acid-inhibiting drug. It, too, became infected, to the surprise of researchers.

They next set out to determine the minimal dose of SIV needed to infect adult macaques orally. A total of 7 macaques were given oral doses of SIV. Six of these animals, none of which had any oral lesions, became infected. Two of them have died of AIDS.

"We are surprised to find that the minimal dose needed to achieve infection after oral exposure in controlled laboratory conditions was 6,000 times lower than that needed for rectal infection," Ruprecht said.

Ruprecht added that the study findings do not mean the risk for acquiring HIV infection through oral intercourse is higher than that for rectal intercourse. Ruprecht's research, carried out under controlled laboratory conditions, did not replicate the dynamics of sexual activity. Human epidemiological studies have shown consistently that rectal intercourse is a high-risk activity. Such intercourse is believed to cause tears in rectal tissue that may facilitate infection by HIV.

The results of the macaque experiments do indicate, however, that oral exposure to the virus can result in infection and AIDS in adults. Combined with reports in which people have described oral sex as the event leading to HIV infection, the new macaque study serves as a warning that unprotected, receptive oral sex with an infected partner is not safe; infection can occur even in the absence of oral lesions such as mouth

sores, cuts or gum disease, Ruprecht said.

The current study in macaques should not raise alarms that the virus can be transmitted through casual contact, Ruprecht noted. "The SIV preparation had also been tested by intravenous injection in macaques. Our results show it took 830 times more virus to infect animals orally than intravenously. Such doses are not likely in casual contact."

"Sharing eating utensils, toothbrushes or kissing have not been associated with HIV-1 transmission," she said. "Many epidemiological studies have shown that casual transmission of HIV does not occur."

COSTA RICAN VICTORY!

Costa Rica's Defensor de los Habitantes has issued a recommendation that the Costa Rican government begin granting legal recognition to gay and lesbian organizations. The March 10, 1996 recommendation is the result of a complaint filed by the San Jose gay group Triangulo Rosa.

Triangulo Rosa first applied to the Registro Civil for legal status as a non-governmental organization in April, 1995 under the name Abraxas. The registry rejected the application on the basis of Abraxas's goal of struggling "against the social discrimination leveled against people with homosexual orientations." The registry eventually bowed to international pressure and granted a charter to the group under the new name Triangulo Rosa.

The Defensor's recommendation states that the original decision by the Registro Civil to deny legal recognition to the group was in violation of the Costa Rican Constitution, which guarantees the right of association to all citizens. This finding has important implications not only for the registration of gay and lesbian organizations but also for the struggle against discrimination based on sexual orientation in many aspects of Costa Rican life.

FLIRTATIONS LATEST RELEASE: THREE

The popular, unabashedly lesbian and gay a cappella group The Flirtations, well-known for their appearances in Jonathan Demme's film *Philadelphia*, and on *Donahue*, *Good Morning America*, and *HBO*, released their latest recording *Three* on June 1, 1996.

Audiences of all persuasions have been raving about the out a cappella group's new incarnation since early 1995 when the acclaimed pop jazz vocalist Suede began singing with the formerly all-male a cappella group. Together with baritone Jon Arterton whose vision created "The Flirts" back in 1987, and tenor Jimmy Rutland whose vision and courage through periods of great change have shaped the group's evolution, the three have just released The Flirtations' most exciting recording to date, their first as a trio. 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HIV AND THE OMAHA GAY COMMUNITY

GWM, 25, 6'1", 185, Blond hair, blue eyes, clean shaven, HIV+, seeks other disease free gay men 20-35 for friendship and more.

Does this type of personal ad look familiar? It should, many are placed each month in magazines, voice mail ads, and even on-line. The one above is, of course, fiction. However, it has all the parts commonly contained in an ad of this nature: sex, sexual orientation, age, physical traits, and likes/dislikes in those sought.

It is in the latter category, likes/dislikes, that one commonly finds the term "HIV+" or "disease free". As a person living with AIDS, this irritates me.

The problem with this type of statement is that, in almost all cases, it is baseless. It is possible to be infected with HIV and still have a test show negative. This is what is called the "window period".

The window period is the term given to the time between infection and when a person's body produces antibodies to fight the infection, about three to six months. Current HIV tests look for these antibodies, not the actual virus that causes AIDS.

So, in order for a person to make this statement and have it be accurate, that person would need to be tested, then wait six months, having absolutely no sexual contact with another, then test again. When both tests show negative, the person can know and advertise that they are HIV negative. The other option that would allow this statement to stand would have if the person making it were a virgin, having had no sexual encounters involving penetration or the exchange of body fluids.

There are, of course, other ways of contracting HIV. I chose to speak to this issue because it affects me on a personal level.

As a 20 something gay male living with HIV, I've found myself somewhat ostracized by others in my social class. Most are friendly, but not too friendly, wanting to do no more than have a brief conversation and then move on. I am no longer considered a possible sex partner, to say nothing of a life partner.

While confiding my frustration to a friend, he said something that I had never considered. "What do you expect? You are a public figure; everyone knows that you have AIDS." I started to think about this and perhaps he is right.

Over the past few years I have tried to make a positive contribution to the local community by working at various AIDS charities. I was proud of myself, thinking others would respect my public stance and appreciate the effort I was making to protect them from this disease.

While the heterosexual community seemed to take that expected attitude, the gay community shied away. They took the brochure or condom that I was handing out. Or, they listened politely to my speech, then they made a mental note. "He has AIDS; stay away!"

If this isn't bad enough, more than once I have met someone at a bar and began talking. Both of us seemed to be interested in the other. Then, a friend of this person's pulls him aside, whispering in his ear. Very shortly after that, the man excuses himself to the restroom, never to be seen again. Can you imagine how that makes me feel? Mind your own business! It is my choice as to whether or not I inform someone of my HIV status. It is my responsibility to protect my partners. I take both very seriously.

Just because I am HIV+ does not mean that I don't need and want companionship. Don't



misunderstand, this is not just a "sex thing". New friends would be nice, too. However, keep in mind that one's sex drive does not disappear just because they become infected with HIV.

In the past, potential partners were informed of my health status. I told them up-front. I felt that was the right thing to do. Sadly, more often than not, it turned out to be the wrong thing to do. One man told me that if I would have kept my mouth shut and played safely, he would have had no problem in "being with me." But, since I chose to be honest, he just couldn't. Talk about burying one's head in the sand!

Having talked with other people living with AIDS in the area, I have found that my experiences are not uncommon. This is tragic because it forces us to make a choice, to be honest and alone, or silent, with someone, but aching inside for our omission.

I'll be honest in saying that I am tired of being alone. And if by staying silent I can be treated like everyone else at the bars, then perhaps that is what I need to do. It is not my first choice, but how much must I be made to suffer? This disease is bad enough without having to endure it alone!

Before anyone brands me a bitter old queen, let me say that on rare occasion, I have revealed my HIV status and it made no difference. These men were obviously educated on the subject. After all, there are many things a couple can do with little or no risk. And in case you have never considered this before, remember that anyone who you don't absolutely know for sure is HIV+ should be considered HIV+, and treated as such by using condoms and having safe sex.

I would ask the gay community to become educated. Learn what is considered "safer sex". Protect yourself! Be tested! Even if you chose not to inform a partner of an HIV+ test result, it is vital that early medical treatment is sought. This is the key to long-term survival. Finally, even if you chose not to be intimate with an HIV+ person, you can still be their friend. Talk with them, spend time together, help make them feel like a normal human being.

If I had written this a year ago, I would have proudly signed my name to it, but not today. As to whether or not I disclose my HIV status to future partners, the internal battle continues.

RESPONSE TO HOUSE "MARRIAGE PROTECTION"

The U.S. House has approved the so-called "Defense of Marriage Act". If approved in the Senate, President Clinton has indicated he will sign it. The bill would allow states to reject same-sex marriages performed in other states.

Organizations representing lesbians and gay men nationwide reacted strongly to the House's lopsided vote (342-67) and characterized it as an election-year product of extreme conservatives.

Matt Coles, Director of the Lesbian & Gay Rights Projects at the ACLU said, "The House turned its back on a fundamental human right for political expediency. This goes beyond legislators saying they are not ready to accept same-sex marriages. This is an unnecessary and mean-spirited attempt by some in Congress to select out lesbians and gay men for discriminatory treatment."

William Waybourn, Managing Director of the Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation said, "Americans are overwhelmingly for fairness and the vote in the House means that we must work harder to educate the public to the fact that lesbian and gay couples deserve the same freedoms guaranteed to ALL Americans."

Elizabeth Birch, Executive Director of the Human Rights Campaign, said, "The House committed an ugly, cowardly and unconstitutional act by passing this bill, and history will remember it as such. It is nothing more than gratuitous election-year gay bashing and the Human Rights Campaign intends to hold every member of Congress accountable for this vote."

Kate Kendell, Executive Director of the National Center for Lesbian Rights said, "In an act of sheer political pandering, Congress has disrespected and denied the reality of the lives of millions of lesbians and gay men. Our families and our relationships have endured despite similar acts of mean-spirited homophobia. Our fight will continue despite election year scapegoating, until we finally realize the goal of legal equality and respect for our families."

SINCE WHEN DOES VICIOUS MEAN GAY OR LESBIAN ?

The Microsoft Corporation has issued an apology for users of a Spanish language version of software which had offensive Thesaurus synonyms.

People using the software Word 6.0 would find that synonyms for "homosexual" were "vicious" and "inverted". Synonyms for "lesbian" were "vicious" and "pervert".

Microsoft said it was working on a new dictionary — and that new software would be available for free. The software also included "savage" and "man-eater" as synonyms for "Indian". At last word, Microsoft was also actively checking every word in the Spanish version to make sure there were no other offensive synonyms.

SENATE BILL NOT LOADED WITH ANTI-GAY LANGUAGE

The Senate version of the 1997 defense authorization bill is free of hateful, anti-gay amendments, according to the Human Rights Campaign.

"The Senate bill is a stark contrast to the House version, which extremist members of Congress loaded with ugly, anti-gay measures," said Winnie Stachelberg, HRC's legislative deputy. "We are confident that when the two bills go to conference, that these House measures will be stripped out, as they should be."

In May, when the House considered the defense bills, extremists led by Rep. Bob Dornan, R-California, used the legislation to push their anti-gay social agenda, rather than deal with the nation's vital defense interests. At Dornan's

behest, they attached the following measures to the 1997 defense authorization bill:


"...a mandate to discharge, within two months of diagnosis, all members of the armed services with HIV, the virus that causes AIDS."

A similar measure, enacted in January, was repealed by Congress in April. "The Dornan provision singles out service members with HIV and treats them differently from those with other chronic medical conditions," said Stachelberg.

Currently, service members with HIV are allowed to serve their country as long as they can perform their duties, but are not deployed overseas. The same policy applies to service members who have other chronic medical conditions such as diabetes, asthma, heart disease or cancer.

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LESBIAN HIV REPORT

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has published the first-ever federal government report on Lesbian HIV issues. The report, Report on Lesbian HIV Issues Meeting, reflects the current knowledge of the impact of this disease on women who have sex with women and provides direction to the CDC on developing and appropriate research and prevention initiatives. The historic report includes 25 recommendations under four major headings: research, surveillance, communications, publications and further meetings.

"There is research to suggest that lesbian and bisexual drug injectors may actually be MORE likely than other female drug injectors to be infected with HIV and/or engage in high-risk drug injecting behaviors or high-risk sex with men," said Marj Plumb, Lesbian Health Consultant for the National Center for Lesbian Rights. "At the same time, there is no credible research on the epidemiology or biology of risk of female-to-female sexual transmission. This voice dangerously leaves lesbian and bisexual women infected with HIV without safer sex guidance."

NEW SOUTH AFRICAN CONSTITUTION PROTECTS GAYS AND LESBIANS

On May 8, 1996, South Africa became the first country in the world to constitutionally prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation. The new South African Constitution protects people from discrimination on the basis of "race, gender, sex, pregnancy, marital status, ethnic or social origin, color, sexual orientation, age, disability, religion, conscience, belief, culture, language and birth."

The Constitution was adopted by an overwhelming majority of the South African Parliament, winning the approval of the African National Congress (ANC), the Pan African Congress and the National Party. The ANC, which holds over 60% of the seats in parliament, has consistently taken a position against discrimination based on sexual orientation, partly as a result of the years of involvement of gay and lesbian activists in the anti-apartheid struggle. Archbishop Desmond Tutu strongly urged the constitutional assembly to retain the clause in the Bill of Rights and recently stated that rejection of gays and lesbians by the church is "nearly the ultimate blasphemy."

The permanent constitution replaces an interim constitution which had been in place since 1993 and which also included sexual orientation in its equality clause. The retention of the clause in the final document follows 2 years of intense lobbying efforts and a nationwide letter-writing campaign coordinated by the National Coalition for Lesbian and Gay Equality.



RIVER CITY MIXED BOWLING LEAGUE

The River City Bowling League is celebrating its Seventeenth year of existence. It is an ABC/WIBC sanctioned league and is closely associated with the International Gay Bowling Organization (IGBO). Our members started the "Ice Bowl Tournament" three years ago and now run one of the more popular and lucrative tournaments in the country.

96-97 League Limited to 24 Teams Considering 5 Person Teams

The league has become more and more popular each year and this year the league will be limited to 24 teams. In the past we have had four-person teams. This year, if interest is high enough, we will go to five-person teams. It is a long season, 32 weeks, and because of this most teams keep a roster of one or two over the required number and alternate weeks of play. That way no one has to be there every week of the season. The weekly cost of play is \$8.00. The first week you will also have to pay ABC/WIBC sanction fees and sponsor fee of \$30 per team. Our \$8.00 weekly fee is basically one dollar less than most leagues in the city. Our league is one of the very largest in the city and more fun than any of them.

We bowl weekly at the Sky Lanes Bowling Center on the Fifth level of the Center Mall at 42nd and Center Streets. Membership is open to gay and gay friendly persons of both sexes. We are an 80% handicap league. If you don't know what that means.....it is simply a way to make the bowling competitive no matter how bad or good your game. The lower your average, the more pins you have added to your game to catch the better bowlers.

The first week of bowling is August 24. The organizations meeting starts at 1:00 p.m. Everyone is asked to be at this meeting who plans on joining the league. If you don't have a team before then, we'll get you lined up with a team at the meeting. After the meeting, we will have our first week of competition starting at 3:00 p.m. We start at 3:00 p.m. every week after that, taking holiday weekends off.

"Comments on A WORK IN PROGRESS..."

Many years ago when an industrial man in Germany decided that he wanted to rule the world, he set out in a methodical fashion to take control of the world as it was then known. Adolf Hitler took control of the Sudetenland and then all of Czechoslovakia, Austria, Poland, France, etc. This was quite an amazing display of power in such a short period of time.

However, after gaining these territories and power, his methodism of coolly calculating which area to blitzkrieg next seemed to deteriorate. It was almost as if the sudden accumulation of land went to his head and he became negligent. Hitler in his zeal dove into the proverbial pool head first. Once he threw out his methodical tactics for tottery avarice, the entire Third Reich crumbled.

Many of you are probably wondering what this has to do with anything today, least of all the G/L/B/T community in greater Omaha. These thoughts are projected at the fledgling community resource center. Many of you have been hearing things about this center for quite some time and, if you have some of the same opinions I have maintained, you are wondering whether or not there will ever be a resource center. Since I espoused my opinions about this endeavor, I felt that my only responsible course was to attend some of their meetings.

Like Germany's early days, the resource center is indeed progressing. Slowly but surely they are taking steps to become a permanent reality in the metropolitan area. Work of this magnitude is not a project that can be done haphazardly. There are many variables to weigh and even more wrinkles to iron out when preparing to open a community resource center.

I give many accolades to the small albeit dedicated workers on this project. They cannot and should not make the mistakes that Hitler made and jump without first establishing all of the framework. This is a project that must build from a firm foundation until it is completed. When the resource center finally opens, you can be rest assured it will be a permanent fixture in this city.

NAP OFFERS DPI TRAINING

The Nebraska AIDS Project (NAP) is well into a grant through the Nebraska Department of Public Institutions, Division of alcoholism, Substance Abuse, and Addictions Services (DPI) to provide free continuing education trainings on HIV and AIDS to drug and alcohol counselors throughout the state. To date, NAP's DPI trainings have served over 300 counselors from 93 agencies. Each 4-hour training is facilitated by Emer O'Connor, and involves the participation of case managers and persons with AIDS as guest lecturers.

While the dangers of injection drug use in connection with HIV are fairly well known, considerably less attention is devoted to the influence of more commonly used drugs (alcohol, marijuana, crack, powder cocaine, etc.) on an individual's HIV risk. Preliminary studies have shown that a majority of persons with HIV report past or current issues with drugs and alcohol. This information points to drug and alcohol counselors as important players in HIV prevention among people in substance abuse treatment, and yet many counselors indicate that they are not up-to-date on HIV and AIDS. Not only do behavior patterns driven by drug use increase HIV risk, but emerging study data also suggest that many commonly abused substances increase HIV risk by suppressing the immune system at the time of HIV exposure, or by stimulating viral replication at the time of exposure. NAP's DPI trainings are designed to build a solid AIDS education among counselors that will translate into improved drug and alcohol treatment services for persons with HIV, and for persons at imminent risk for HIV infection.

The first round of trainings across the state consisted of an intensive "AIDS 101" with a special emphasis on counseling issues. A second round of trainings currently in development will focus on the chemical and behavioral interactions of substance abuse and HIV within specific populations, including gay men, Native Americans, the homeless, the incarcerated, and undocumented migrant workers.

IOWA COALITION FOR HUMAN RIGHTS FORMS

***What is the Iowa Coalition for Human Rights?** The Iowa Coalition for Human Rights (ICHR) is a newly formed state-wide organization whose goal is to work for civil and human rights for gays, lesbians, bisexuals, & transgender people. The ICHR formed in reaction to anti-Gay legislation in the 1996 State Legislature. In the past six months, the ICHR has worked on the defeat of HF-2183 (the anti-same-gender marriage bill), held a GLBT Lobby Day in which over 100 people participated; and started to organize a state-wide network of GLBT groups and individuals.

****Who can join the ICHR?** Anyone who supports civil and human rights for GLBT people. Already ICHR includes GLBT people, parents, siblings, friends and pastors. Although the Iowa Coalition for Human Rights is still in its infancy, we have already built the foundation for a strong network of politically active GLBT people and supporters. Now we must move forward quickly to prepare for the 1996 elections and the 1997 Legislative Session. We need your help and together we will make a difference.

****If I join the ICHR is my name and other information confidential? Do I need to be out to help? You do not need to be out to participate.** Many members of ICHR are not GLBT people. All information provided will be held in strictest confidence except where you give us permission to use your name as a founder or otherwise noted. If you choose to participate in the political survey, rest assured that your information will not be given out to candidates. You will only be contacted by ICHR or a ICHR campaign liaison volunteer.

****What does my contribution to ICHR go to?** Contributions will go to activities such as: building a network, operating expenses, getting out the vote, surveys and endorsements, lobbying and legislative research. At this point, all contributions to ICHR will be used for political organizing and cannot be deducted for federal income tax purposes. Developing a political organization will be expensive, but contributions of any amount will be put to good use.

****What if I don't have any money to give now? Is there something else I can do? Yes!** Obtaining civil and human rights will take more than just

money. It will take getting people involved on multiple levels. There are jobs for everyone. One can get involved by putting up yard signs, making calls, helping organize an event, helping with get-out-the-vote, being a district legislative liaison, lobbying, or any number of other ways.

****What if I don't like politics, or have never been really involved?** Even though the Iowa Coalition for Human Rights is a political organization, many of us have never worked on political campaigns, lobbied elected officials, or spoken out publicly. However, we must learn to become as organized and skilled as the right-wing radicals. There is nothing to be afraid of. People will be available to assist you. You can start slow with as little as offering your yard for a sign. As you learn more about politics, you will find areas to help where your interest and skills are desperately needed.

****Is the ICHR a partisan group?** The ICHR is a non-partisan political organization. People of all political stripes are welcome to join our cause. As a non-partisan organization, ICHR may endorse and assist a variety of candidates.

****Why do you need the information on the "Political Survey?"** At this point, the ICHR may not be in a position to provide direct financial assistance to candidates who support GLBT civil and human rights; but we still can help them. Political candidates need help in a variety of ways. ICHR may be able to assist candidates by things like: providing 4-5 people to walk in a parade, finding 20 yard sign locations, securing individual campaign contributions.

****What can I do on an everyday basis to help work for our civil rights?** Read your local paper and send any local clippings about GLBT issues to ICHR. ICHR needs to know what is happening everywhere in the State. Get to know your elected officials and develop a mailing list, phone, e-mail, etc. Contact your elected officials about your thoughts at the beginning of each session and every time a GLBT issue comes before them. Stay informed of political issues coming before the State Legislature and Congress.

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
