








# "Attention: Omaha area GLBT homeowners in trouble! There is a solution!"

Many Omaha area gay and lesbian homeowners who have had trouble with credit cards and so on have found that there is *one* place in Omaha where they can be treated with respect.

No "better than you" attitude, no "b.s.", no guilt just for being gay or lesbian.

At last, finding financial help doesn't have to be like a "coming out" at Thanksgiving dinner with everyone pointing fingers, and finding fault.

Mindy Hahne, of Service First Home Mortgage in Omaha's Midtown area works at a GLBT friendly outfit that *specializes* in helping Omaha area GLBT homeowners in need.

Hahne says she takes great pride in being gay and lesbian friendly. And treating the folks she helps like family.

Hahne has helped many gays and lesbians over the years, many personal friends.

"I am the one person in town that specializes in help-

ing gay and lesbian folks with debt consolidation, cash out, credit repair and so on!" Hahne says.

"These are good people with damaged credit reports and/or hard to prove income! Not through any fault of their own! I *specialize* in helping the gay and lesbian community get a *fair shake* from the financial industry!" Hahne says.

Hahne says she has a lot of connections to Wall Street money, "I have personal relationships with investors *nationwide*, even *internationally*! Fair-minded people who want to fund loans for people with past credit problems!" she says.

Hahne says, "It's my personal mission to change the mindsets! And to liberate everyone from the restraints!"

"I grew up in a house where we didn't have much money! And my parents understood just how money *really* works even less! Nowadays, it's a lot of fun for me to help people get control over their money and their lives!" Mindy says.

# Gay Bar Bomber Eric Rudolph Sentenced to Life

The confessed bomber of a gay bar, abortion clinic and the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta was sentenced Monday to life in prison without the possibility of parole.

The sentence is part of an April plea deal in which Eric Rudolph, 38, avoided the death penalty by pleading guilty to a bombing campaign that killed two people and injured more than 100 between 1996 and 1998.

During his plea deal, Rudolph called his crimes part of a war against the "homosexual agenda," abortion and the U.S. government.

LGBT rights, Rudolph opined, was "a direct assault on the long -term health and integrity of civilization."

Rudolph has also claimed responsibility for the February 1997 bombing of the Otherside Lounge, a gay bar in Atlanta. Four people were hurt, and the bar eventually had to shut down.

Rudolph detonated a bomb at Atlanta's Centennial Olympic Park during the 1996 Olympics "to confound, anger and embarrass the Washington government in the eyes of the world for its abominable sanctioning of abortion on demand," he said in a statement. Over 100 people were injured, and three people died.

In January 1997, seven people were wounded in a second blast at the Northside Family Planning clinic in the Atlanta suburb of Sandy Springs.

# **Bob Knows Best**

Dear Bob.

Hi, my name is Jill and I'm19. My boyfriend and I have been dating for two years. I love him more than I've loved anyone else in my entire life. Suddenly, I started having this feeling that he wasn't very attracted to me anymore. When I confronted him about it, and after an hours long discussion, he finally told me he was gay.

It was obviously a huge shock to me. I was also frustrated, because I felt he had been lying to me for years. He told me he had only known for the last month or so, but I was still upset that he hadn't told me sooner. We talked about it for a very long time. I figured that with a little bit of time, I could accept it. We need each other, we've always been best friends.

But I'm still having such a hard time dealing with it, I'm not sure that our friendship can take it. I feel better when he's not around. When he is, I feel very cold and bitter, and I honestly try not to be. I'm having such a hard time with this. I'm completely in love with my gay boyfriend.

And what makes it even harder is that he acts as though nothing has changed between us, besides from the stuff like kissing. He's very happy, and I'm glad he's happy, but I'm in so much pain. I feel as though the last two years of my life were wasted. We could have become friends and just stayed that way. It makes it even harder that I can't tell the majority of my friends, because he's still in the closet and isn't planning on coming out any time soon. Only his mother and I know, and he intends to keep it that way. I don't have anyone to talk to about this and I hate lying to my friends.

I feel so alone. I know for a fact that he doesn't feel this way, he has adjusted to it very well and doesn't feel any of the pain that I do. I don't know what to do. I don't want to lose my very best friend. But I don't know where to draw the line between friendship and more than friendship (he still likes to flirt and all that stuff) and that makes me very angry with him. He is the only boyfriend I've ever had---the only guy that has ever made me feel attractive. Our relationship is based on one big lie. I can't deal with this. I don't know if I'm still attracted to him. I try not to be. I try to accept him, but when I look at him I feel disgusted. He was my very best friend. But now I feel as though he's a completely different person to me. Not because he's gay, but because he lied about it for so very long to me. He knew for quite some time, and yet still kept our relationship going. He still kissed me. He doesn't care because he feels relieved that he finally told me. I'm in so much pain.

The more I try to accept this, the more I just can't. I feel so alone. Please help me. I don't know how, but if you can, please help me. Thanks.

Dear Jill.

You feel betrayed and lied to, you have the right to feel hurt, but your boyfriend has been conflicted and in pain too. Since being honest is important to you, let him know how angry you





are. It's great that he's relieved after telling you, but your feelings are equal to his. Let him know that you are not comfortable with him pretending nothing has changed.

Because he has decided to stay in the closet and continue living a lie, he will only become more and more involved in lies and misrepresentations. He may act happy, but he won't really feel good about himself until he is honest about who he is. Now that everything is out in the open between you, consider yourself lucky to know about him before getting even more entangled.

I suggest that you and his mother attend a PFLAG meeting with or without him so you might get a better understanding of what he is going through, and to help adjust with your own feelings of anger and betrayal.

Coming out of the closet is a very emotional event that can take years. Trust me, your friend is feeling much confusion and pain. He is scared of losing everyone he is close to, including you. This is why he continues flirting with you; He feels that if he stops you will no longer want his friendship. You have to let him know you support him, but in order to do so, he'll need to change his actions.

You may also consider taking him to a Proud Horizons gettogether. Proud Horizons is a gay youth orientated club right here in Omaha. It could be a great group for him to be involved with where he can be open and honest about himself.

For your own mental health, STOP being this guy's front! If he wants to pretend he's straight, that's up to him, but you don't have to go along with it. As long as you allow him to come

around and act as if everything's okay, you're going to get angrier and feel more betrayed. Stop pretending your friendship is okay and accept that things need to change.

Maybe in time you can be friends again with your "gay boyfriend", but not while he continues his lies. If he continues down his path of lies it is best the two of you have some time apart to recover.

You're young, give yourself a chance and you'll find someone you like who will make you feel attractive again, and who will be attracted to you!

In 1998, Rudolph bombed another abortion clinic, killing an off -duty Birmingham policeman Robert Sanderson and maiming Emily Lyons, a nurse at the New Woman All Women abortion clinic.

On Monday, a federal judge sentenced Rudolph to two life sentences for the Birmingham bombing. Rudolph is scheduled to be sentenced August 22 in Atlanta for the bombings of the Otherside Lounge, the Sandy Springs clinic and the Olympics. The plea deal applies to all the other bombings, so the maximum Rudolph can receive is more life sentences.

Rudolph offered no apologies after hearing his sentence. "My actions that day were motivated by my recognition that abortion is murder," Rudolph said. "And because it is murder, I believe deadly force is indeed justified in an attempt to stop it."

Emily Lyons, the nurse who was maimed in the attack, told reporters that she had been waiting seven and a half years for the chance to speak to Rudolph face to face. "The main purpose was to see him and let him know he failed."

"I hope I used the word 'failure' enough that he knows it," she said in a quote published by CNN.

Felicia Sanderson, widow of the security guard who was killed, said, "I don't think Eric Rudolph listens to anything except his own stupid ramblings," Sanderson said. "You look in his face --nobody's home."

"There's no justice for the crimes, but we join in hoping that the victims of the crimes are feeling closure and can move on," said Jay Smith Brown, a spokesman for the Human Rights Campaign (HRC).

"When asked if religious conservatives were in any way responsible for Rudolph's violence, Smith replied, "We need to foster a dialogue of honesty and understanding and not a dialogue of hate and vitriol. Both sides of the debate should be responsible to bringing the other to a place of positive dialogue."

# HIV+ Man Jailed for Having Unprotected Sex

A medical student in Atlanta faces felony charges for having unprotected consensual sex without telling his partners his HIV status.

Police say that in April 2004, Garry Wayne Carriker, a 26-yearold fourth-year medical student who had graduated from the Air Force Academy, had already been dating John Withrow for five months before he revealed he was HIV-positive.

Withrow decided to press charges. "The reason I came forward to file a complaint was to stop him from victimizing someone else," he told the Associated Press (AP).

Carriker posted bond, but was then accused of having unprotected sex with two other men in Atlanta's Fulton County without telling them his HIV status.

Superior Court Judge Johnnie Caldwell Jr. revoked Carriker's \$5,600 bond. He now faces three counts of felony reckless conduct.

If prosecutors can prove Carriker knew he had HIV during the alleged encounters and did not warn his partners, he could spend up to 10 years in prison.

While the felony reckless conduct charge is rarely used, some in the gay community think it's the best way to handle a health crisis.

"Since Carriker is not accepting responsibility for his own health status, perhaps the law is needed to protect others," Chuck Bowen, the executive director of Georgia Equality told the PlanetOut Network.

Joel Ginsberg, interim director of the San Francisco-based Gay and Lesbian Medical Association, says the prosecution's plan could backfire.

"From a public health perspective, the most important thing is that both sexual partners, not just the HIV-positive one, take \*\*Continued on Next Page\*\*)

responsibility for preventing infection," he said. "Criminal prosecution could undermine public health if it discourages testing."

According to the AP, Carriker's arrest has sent a jolt through

Atlanta's LGBT community. One activist launched a Web site devoted to the case, listing the clubs Carriker frequented and urging those who may have been involved with him to get test-

"It's really amazing to me that, in this day and time, people would have unprotected sex," said Bowen. "I think it demonstrates that both partners need to be honest about their HIV status."

## Georgia Gay Group Launches **Billboard Campaign**

(Atlanta, Georgia) The blue billboard bears a simple image five casually dressed men and women standing arm in arm and a simple message: "We are your neighbors. And ... we are gay."

The sign, posted on a stretch of nightclubs and restaurants in midtown Atlanta, is part of the first wave of a statewide campaign Georgia's largest gay and lesbian group hopes will change attitudes throughout the state.

"For so long, extremists have used gays and lesbians as a means to further their own agendas," said Chuck Bowen, executive director of Georgia Equality. "The purpose of this campaign is to let people know we're no different than anybody else."

The group's "We Are Your Neighbors" campaign is an 18month effort that comes on the heels of what gay activists call a bruising year in politics.

Last year, several states, including Georgia, passed anti-gay marriage amendments and many believe homosexuality was used as a divisive wedge issue in the presidential campaign.

"We're tired of being chased," Bowen said. "We constantly had to react to very negative, erroneous misrepresentations of us. Now, we're trying to send a positive signal to let people know who we really are."

The campaign began with 12 billboards in metro Atlanta's Cherokee, Clayton, Cobb, DeKalb, Forsyth, Fulton, Gwinnett and Paulding counties.

The billboards went up two weeks ago and, on Sunday and Monday, the "we are gay" messages were added. According to official traffic counts, more than 8 million people will see the billboards during July, Bowen said.

A second wave of billboards is expected to go up in October in suburban and rural communities throughout the state. Bowen said many of the locations were picked using polling data from last year's election that showed low levels of support for gay

issues.

Over 18 months, billboards are planned in 38 counties. The campaign, funded by private donations, also will feature television and print advertisements.

Other billboards feature a firefighter, with the phrase "I protect you ... and I am gay," and a female doctor with the phrase, "I care for you ... and I am a lesbian."

Bowen said the people featured on the first wave of billboards are from out of the state, but that future signs will picture residents of the communities where the signs are placed.

Members of some conservative groups who pushed last year's anti-gay marriage amendment in Georgia see the campaign as a political ploy.

"I think it's just one more step in their agenda to try to mainstream their lifestyle," said Sadie Fields, executive director of the Christian Coalition of Georgia. "I'm certainly not going to question their stated motives, but I don't expect their political agenda to stop."

But supporters say the campaign is more about winning friends than winning votes.

"It's just about people," said David Greenberg, 43, of Atlanta, a speech coach and author who is speaking to the public and media as part of the campaign. "The more people get to know gay people, they realize that we really are just people with similar issues just wanting to have a happy life like everyone else."
