Lady Gaga Dissolves Deal With Target

A source close to Lady Gaga confirms to The Advocate that the entertainer has dissolved her deal with Target over the chain's controversial political donations. "She and Target didn't see eye to eye on Target's policy of political donations and how they affect the LGBT community," the source tells The Advocate exclusively.

The Advocate was tipped off that the deal had crumbled by Bob Witeck of Witeck Combs



Communications.

Target came under fire by LGBT activists last year when it was revealed the discount store chain had donated corporate funds to MN Forward, a political action committee that supported antigay candidate Tom Emmer in his failed 2010 run for governor of Minnesota.

Last month Gaga discussed the decision to partner with Target with Billboard magazine.

"That discussion was one of the most intense conversations I've ever had in a business meeting." Gaga told the music publication. "Part of my deal with Target is that they have to start affiliating themselves with LGBT charity groups and begin to reform and make amends for the mistakes they've made in the past ... our relationship is hinged upon their reform in the company to support the gay community and to redeem the mistakes they've made supporting those [antigay] groups."

The Peter Pan Syndrome

The longer I practice psychotherapy, the more I hear phrases like, "Only young guys turn me on", "men my age aren't attractive to me" or "being with someone older and more successful than I am terrifies me"

with someone older and more successful than I am terrifies me."

These phrases typically fall from the lips of mid-life gay men; I rarely hear them from guys in their 20's or 30's. I wonder if all successful gay/bi/trans guys are destined to be like those rich, narcissistic gay celebrities who - when they find another wrinkle or gray hair or saggy pec - get rid of boyfriend #1 and take up with someone who's barely legal? Is how we handle getting older?

Remember Peter Pan? His theme song was, "I won't grow up". Sound familiar? While this may be charming in an animated Disney character, it's pretty sad in a gay man. So many midlife gay men lament: "I can't find anyone to date who's relationship material".


Is it such a big surprise that someone 20 years' younger than you isn't as mature as you are? Let's put the puzzle pieces together: unless you relish the role of perpetual daddy/mentor/teacher, you need a partner who's a peer, an equal... someone who's been "around the block" like you have and has comparable life experience. This is unlikely to be someone 20 years' younger than you.

Some mid-life gay or bisexual men say that men like them "do nothing for me". This is a form of self-hatred. Why would we reject potential partners who are our age? Must we hate growing older? Aging is inevitable... we can fight it (like Joan Rivers or Phyllis Diller) or we can accept it like Paul Newman, Robert Redford and other elder men who were once amazingly beautiful and still are, albeit in a 60- to-80-year-old way.

Peter Pan wants to stay eternally youthful...like a kid. Many of us want to look like a kid while we age. What an uphill struggle that is. Do you really want to experience all the anxiety and fear that comes with continually fighting the aging process?

I'm not recommending that you stay home, eat junk food and watch bad TV all day. However, neither should you obsess with every wrinkle, gray hair and physical change you are inevitably to experience. This is an incredible waste of your energy; it will bring you much suffering and depression.

Peter Pan never had an adult relationship; adult relationships are hard work. There's no botox shot or liposuction procedure to make you or your lover happy all the time. Real intimacy forces us to look at ourselves and see all of our unresolved shit, not just the carefully-maintained image we show to the world. One way to avoid real intimacy is by choosing men who are unavailable (emotionally or mentally) or a bad fit psychologically and maturity-wise. This kind of relationship would please Peter Pan immensely: he'd never have to deal with grown up



Many handsome and charming older gay men tell me that they want a beautiful, kind, sweet, "twink" boyfriend. While young men like this may be beautiful fantasy objects, with rare exceptions, they're not good potential partners for mid-life men. Psychologically, someone in his 20's is in a very different place than someone in his 40's or 50's.


The developmental tasks for 20-year-olds include: experimentation, finding yourself, having fun, getting laid, discovering who you are and what you like. This is rarely a good fit for men 20 to 30 years older. At this age, most of us are looking for something more meaningful: we've done the bars, the clubs, the alleys (!) and we want more. We've had great fun sex and been out all night more than we can count, but now we want something with depth and meaning. We want to connect with another man and see if we can create a good life together. Most young guys aren't there developmentally, emotionally or spiritually.

For some men, being with much younger men is about control; it may be a reaction to an earlier time in their life when they felt out of control (and probably were). These men may feel they can play the "older, wiser" man who may want to help or even mentor a younger guy; but, hey, all you silver daddies out there, check out your motivation! You may have unresolved emotional issues that push you to be very controlling of your relationship(s).

Picking much younger guys gives you a guarantee that you won't be threatened or challenged by someone your own age, who may see through your bullshit and call you on it. Picking beautiful but inexperienced "twinks" for partners is one way to avoid acting your age; you avoid having a partner who challenges you to be the mature man you could be.

Instead, you get to live out a "second adolescence" and pretend you're much younger than you are. It's a great way to avoid telling yourself the truth about who you are, how old you are, and how you feel about it.

Almost all of us, myself included, like looking at the youthful bodies of handsome young men: they are aesthetically beautiful, like living works of art. But what about the beauty of 40-year-old men, 50-year-old men...even 60- and 70-year-old men? Youth is a wonderful thing, but all too often it's used to sell us things we really don't need and, if unexamined, can destroy our self-esteem if we don't fit the picture of Youthful Gay Perfection. There's nothing wrong with finding young guys attractive, but if it prevents us from hooking up with someone hot, handsome and around our own age - someone who could potentially be a good boyfriend/lover/long term partner - than this Peter Pan side of ourselves is not really our friend, after all He's the face of self-sabotage.

LGBT Mortgage Borrowers Need to Prepare for New Fannie Mae Rules

As many LGBT borrowers have heard through recent media reports, the huge mortgage agency Fannie Mae might get scrapped later this year. Whether or not that will adversely affect LGBT home buyers, LGBT homeowners wanting to refinance, or LGBT sellers hoping that their buyers qualify for a mortgage is suddenly a big concern. Meanwhile Fannie Mae instituted much more stringent underwriting policies in February, requiring banks and other lenders to take a closer look at borrower credit and debt profiles. These high-

er standards could potentially have a significant impact on the mortgage loans of many consumers, especially those who are not aware of how to successfully respond to them in 2011.

Fannie Mae (the nickname for the Federal National Mortgage Association) participates in the majority of home mortgages that are made in the USA. But Fannie Mae is not a direct mortgage lender. Instead it underwrites and insures mortgages that banks and other lenders can then provide to Americans at less expensive rates. But the agency was poorly managed during the years leading up to the subprime mortgage crisis and it has been hemorrhaging money ever since. Now officials are talking about closing down the inefficient Fannie Mae and letting private banks and lenders handle Fannie Mae's responsibilities. First of all, breathe easy and rest assured. The troubles at Fannie Mae should not directly affect LGBT borrowers. No matter what changes are enacted regarding that agency it will have little impact on the average buyer or seller. Congress cannot risk jeopardizing the real estate economy by doing anything that would interfere with the smooth running of USA mortgage markets.

But there is, on the other hand, a recent development at Fannie Mae that does matter to LGBT borrowers. Fannie Mae has begun requiring its lenders to more carefully scrutinize borrower debt loads. The newly imposed underwriting standards affect all Fannie Mae loans, and the policy was in full force as of February 1st.

Here's how it works. Lenders are now told to examine 120 days of credit bureau files in the days leading up to a loan application. They used to only check back 90 days. What they are looking for is evidence that the borrower applied for new credit or loans that may not have showed up yet in their credit reports, but will be included in reports later – after the borrower's loan has already been processed. These add extra debt to the borrower's budget, so if Fannie Mae discovers that new loans have slipped past them they may decide to retroactively update the loan application before funding. Doing so could potentially result in a lowering of the originally approved mortgage amount – and that could, in turn, affect the financing on a home purchase that has not yet closed.

But what is even more drastic is that Fannie Mae has also instituted a policy of tracking credit behavior between the time that mortgage loans are approved and the actual closing date. It typically takes anywhere from 30 to 60 days to process a loan and close on a house purchase, but if the borrower's files show evidence of new debt accrued during that timeframe Fannie Mae may trigger a new examination of the loan. If the borrower's new debts are significant enough the lender might change the original terms of the mortgage and could even decide to raise the interest rate. Should that occur the day before closing, for example, buyers and sellers may have to unpack the moving vans and reschedule their closing - and there is even an outside chance that the whole deal could fall apart in the 11th hour. But there is nothing for LGBT borrowers to worry about, as long as they take simple and deliberate steps to avoid all of this potential chaos. The main culprit is new debt. So as long as LGBT borrowers do not take on any extra debt during the 120 days leading up to the loan application – plus the month or two between loan application and the final closing transaction where they pay for the house and get the keys from the seller there will be no red flags.

Avoid taking out auto loans, student loans, personal bank loans, or applications for new credit cards. Don't make any major purchases on credit cards or do anything else that could add to debt levels. Hold off on loans to fix up the new house and don't accept offers for department store credit cards to get a clothing discount. Postpone those furniture and home appliance purchases, for example, until after the deal has closed. Then there won't be any cause for underwriting adjustments or mortgage revisions.

LGBT borrowers who follow these straightforward guidelines and do not increase their debt during that 6-month window will be just fine, and their Fannie Mae approved loans should sail through without a hitch and without unexpected last minute surprises.

Colorado Advances Civil Unions Bill

The state's senate judiciary committee approves a civil unions bill, more than 18 years after voters passed an antigay amendment that led to the landmark U.S. Supreme Court decision in Romer v. Evans.

In a bipartisan vote of 6-3, the Colorado senate judiciary committee Monday approved a civil unions bill, more than 18 years after state voters passed an amendment banning antidiscrimination protections for gays and lesbians—



one that was overturned four years later by the U.S. Supreme Court in the landmark case Romer v. Evans.

The bill now moves on to the state senate appropriations committee, where it will undergo further revision and debate before being voted on by the full senate.

The bill, introduced last month by gay Democratic senator Pat Steadman of Denver, offers many of the legal rights and responsibilities conferred by marriage, though civil unions as prescribed in the bill, SB-172, differ from marriage as required by Colorado's constitution, which voters amended in 2006 to define marriage as the union of one man and one woman.

The bill does provide numerous legal protections for gay and lesbian couples and their families, including inheritance and survivorship rights, medical decision-making, and clarifications on parental responsibility for children born within and outside of a civil union, including establishing step-parent adoption procedures as applicable to married couples. The bill also provides a legal framework for the orderly dissolution of civil unions, similar to the state language regulating divorce.

All five committee Democrats were joined by Republican senator Ellen Roberts of Durango in their support of the bill. In her closing statements, Collins commended the familial protections included in the bill and cited her experience working in family services, where she said she saw no difference in the love and commitment shown by gay and lesbian parents than that shown by heterosexual parents.

Steadman said of Monday's vote in favor of civil unions: "I'm elated. This is a very significant event for me personally, and for my constituents, and for the advancement of our laws in Colorado, to make sure that they work equally for everyone."

Supportive testimony for the state senate bill drew 27 witnesses representing a varied collection of citizens from across the state, including activists, business organizations, and religious

clergy representatives.

Testimony in opposition to the bill saw 19 witnesses, including Rosina Kovar, whose testimony was the most provocative of the hearing. In addition to quoting Joseph Stalin, comparing "homosexual fornication and sodomy" to Big Tobacco, and describing the physical composition of the anus, Kovar claimed that this bill would lead to mandated sex education in elementary schools. "If you introduce sexual education to kids [between the ages of 5 and 12], they won't learn compassion," she said.

Republican senators Kevin Lundberg, Steve King, and Mark Scheffel voted against the bill. Of those voting no, Lundberg, the ranking Republican committee member, was the only legislator to speak. His commentary focused on the similarities between civil unions and marriage, arguing that SB-172 essentially creates a "carbon copy" of marriage.

"Make no mistake," Lundberg said in his closing comments, "this bill will change the institution of marriage for Colorado."

Judiciary Committee vice-chair and lesbian senator Lucía Guzmán expressed her hope in the bill's success at Monday's hearing. "I'm cautiously optimistic," Guzmán said, "I think the more we are able to speak to people on both sides, the more people might understand that this is a justice issue, that it's a legal issue."

For some LGBT Colorado residents, civil unions don't go far enough. Tom Carllon and Gabe Martinez, a gay couple who were married in California prior to Proposition 8, testified in opposition to the bill, arguing that civil unions only serve to confuse voters about the rights actually offered to LGBT couples. Marriage equality is the ultimate goal, Carllon stated, and anything less is "just the crumbs, not the cake."

"Civil unions will be an excuse not to upgrade us to marriage," Carllon testified. "The public will forever equate civil unions as marriage, or, less hopefully, just 'good enough' as marriage."

On Monday medical examiner Mark Spanbauer confirmed that the case had officially been ruled a suicide, according to KSAX.com. Spanbauer said the toxicology report



from the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension and MEDTOX determined that Lunsten had died from ingesting mixed drugs.

Rollins Chastises Boehner

Rollins says that same-sex marriage is undeniably constitutional and that Boehner should be focusing on job creation, not defending DOMA.


Gay Minnnesota Teen Killed Himself

After nearly two months of speculation and controversy, the death of Minnesota teenager Lance Lundsten has been ruled a suicide by the Douglas County medical examiner.

The 18-year-old gay high school senior, whose death contributed to a national conversation about teen bullying and suicide, was found at his home around 10 p.m. January 15 in need of medical care. Officers rushed Lundsten to the Douglas County Hospital, where he was later pronounced dead.

While Lundsten's family believed the teen died from a medical condition, rumors circulated that Lance had committed suicide after being bullied at school for being gay. An autopsy on January 18 revealed a slightly enlarged heart, but the medical examiner listed the cause of death as undetermined.






