

EVENTS OF INTEREST TO METROPOLITAN OMAHA & LINCOLN

ANTI-GAY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSED

The Human Rights Campaign and Metropolitan Community Churches this week assailed an attempt to propose an anti-gay U.S. constitutional amendment that would deny any legal recognition of gay relationships and forever deprive gay families in the U.S. of fundamental protections.

"This proposed constitutional amendment is an attempt by a misguided group who believes that to strengthen the concept of family, they must tear gay families down," said Donna Payne, HRC constituency field organizer, who was joined by the Rev. Phil Matthews of MCC-DC. "This attempt to rewrite our Constitution to deny a group of Americans equal rights is wrong. It is morally vacuous, spiritually vacant, intellectually dishonest and we believe, not what our forefathers intended when they wrote the Constitution."

A group of religious political activists known as the Alliance for Marriage released the text of what they call the "Federal Marriage Amendment" that they say will be introduced in Congress. "Marriage in the United States shall consist only of the union of a man and a woman," reads the proposed amendment.

HRC and MCC joined with religious leaders at a press conference this week to respond to the anti-gay group's efforts. Speaking at the press conference were HRC's Donna Payne; Rev. Phil Matthews, MCC-DC; Rabbi Jonathan Biatch, Beth El Hebrew Congregation; Rev. Michaele Moore, God's Living Spirit Church.

An "On-Line" Petition encouraging Congress to oppose this discriminatory amendment is currently being circulated around the Inter-Net. The following was received last week.

Subject: Federal Marriage Amendment Petition - Anti Gay & Lesbian

I know we all get a lot of "sign and forward" petitions. But this is different and important. A bill was presented a couple of days ago (July 12th) proposing a Constitutional Amendment that will ultimately ban homosexual marriages and subsequent domestic partner benefits.



A petition is now created against this proposal. I respect the way it's being organized, and I feel strongly about it. Since this will be coming to Congress soon, time is obviously of the essence. HIV CARE & PREVENTION CONSORTIUM SEEKING TO FILL POSITION DESIGNATED FOR MAN WHO HAS SEX WITH MEN (MSM) FROM URBAN AREA

The Nebraska HIV CARE & Prevention Consortium (NHCPC) currently has an elected position open which is designated to be filled by a man who identifies himself as men who have sex with men (MSM) from an urban community. The NHCPC is an advisory body to the HIV Prevention and Ryan White CARE Act Programs in Nebraska. As part of this advisory group, the State is required to have specific representation which may vary based on the epidemiological profile of HIV and AIDS cases in Nebraska. One of the current requirements in that MSM's from urban communities be represented.

The NHCPC meets approximately four times per year. Travel expenses are reimbursed. Interested persons should contact Paula Sitzman or Virginia Gergen at the state HIV office at 402-471-9098 for an application. Applications will also be available at local Nebraska AIDS Project case management offices throughout the State. The deadline for submission of applications is October 1, 2001.

BISEXUALITY & GENDER CONFERENCE


The First North American Conference on Bisexuality, Gender and Sexual Diversity (NACB 2001) is set to convene at the University of British Columbia Conference Centre on August 9-12, 2001. The first event of its kind on the continent, NACB 2001 represents a rare and unique opportunity to address the issues of bisexuals and other sexual minorities in an inspiring international forum.

By bringing bisexual, transgender, polyamory, BDSM, intersex, and other sexual minority communities together under a single roof, NACB 2001 offers unprecedented access to this highly marginalized and largely misunderstood — though vital sector of the global community.

Five-hundred delegates of local, provincial, national and international stature are expected to be in attendance from across North America, and many influential speakers have agreed to participate. Prominent speakers, for example, include:

- pioneering transgendered activist and author, Kate Bornstein (whose works on gender and gender identity including "Gender Outlaw: On Men, Women and the Rest of Us", and "My Gender Workbook" — are taught in over 120 college and university campuses around the world);
- electrifying 'guerilla bisexual theologian' Rev. Dr. Eliyahou Farajajé (Dean of the Faculty and professor of History and Sociology of the Starr King School for the Ministry);
- "Intersex Society of Canada" founder, Doctor Morgan Holmes (currently an Assistant Professor of Sociology at Wilfrid Laurier University, Holmes has been an activist in intersex issues since 1993, working with ISNA and independently to change standard medical appraoches to intersexed infants, children and their families. HIV CARE & PREVENTION CONSORTIUM SEEKING TO FILL POSITION DESIGNATED FOR MAN WHO HAS SEX WITH MEN (MSM) FROM URBAN AREA

The Nebraska HIV CARE & Prevention Consortium (NHCPC) currently has an elected position open which is designated to be filled by a man who identifies himself as men who have sex with men (MSM) from an urban community. The NHCPC is an advisory body to the HIV Prevention and Ryan White CARE Act Programs in Nebraska. As part of this advisory group, the State is required to have specific representation which may vary based on the epidemiological profile of HIV and AIDS cases in Nebraska. One of the current requirements in that MSM's from urban communities be represented.

The NHCPC meets approximately four times per year. Travel expenses are reimbursed.
