Online Hepatitis Education

Announcing the Launch of an Online Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B Education Campaign for Men Who Have Sex with Men

The American Social Health Association (ASHA) announces the launch of an online hepatitis A and B vaccination education campaign, funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Preven-



tion (CDC). The campaign was designed by Cohn & Wolfe for men who have sex with men (MSM). Unvaccinated men can check their knowledge about hepatitis and comment on the campaign by visiting www.ashastd.org/hepatitis_survey/ hepsurvey.html.

Some men who have sex with men are at increased risk of hepatitis A (HAV) and hepatitis B (HBV) infection and, therefore, CDC and Gay and Lesbian Medical Association (GLMA) recommend both hepatitis A and hepatitis B vaccinations. Vaccination levels in the MSM population are inadequate and so, as part of a five-year project, ASHA has posted an educational campaign, and a web-based evaluation. The overall goal of this campaign is to increase levels of awareness and knowledge, and to increase intentions to get hepatitis A and B vaccinations.

ASHA, a nonprofit organization devoted to preventing sexually transmitted infections since 1914, offers additional resources about hepatitis A and B and other STI's through many venues including its websites (www.ashastd.org; www.iwannaknow.org; and www.quierosaber.org).

Woman Sues EHarmony for Discrimination

LOS ANGELES (AP) - A Northern California woman sued the online dating service el-larmony on Thursday, alleging it discriminates against gays, lesbians and bisexuals.

Linda Carlson said she tried to use the Internet site in February to meet a woman but could not based on her sexual orientation. When Carlson wrote to eHarmony to complain, the company refused to change its policy, according to the lawsuit filed on her behalf in Los Angeles County Superior Court.


The lawsuit claims that by only offering to find a compatible match for men seeking women or women seeking men, the company was violating state law barring discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation.

"Such outright discrimination is hurtful and disappointing for a business open to the public in this day and age," Carlson said in a statement.

The lawsuit names Pasadena-based eHarmony.com Inc., company founder Neil Clark Warren and his wife Marylyn, the company's former vice president, as defendants. It seeks class-action status, a jury trial and unspecified damages.







The company, which conducts extensive personality profiling before introducing couples with matching values and interests, denied the allegation.

"The research that ellarmony has developed, through years of research, to match couples has been based on traits and personality patterns of successful heterosexual marriages," a company statement said. "Nothing precludes us from providing same-sex matching in the future, it's just not a service we offer now based upon the research we have conducted."

Warren is a clinical psychologist who has written several books about dating and relationships.

I Try to Fit In

How Typical

We all carry around a pretty steady mental dialogue. Do you ever stop and listen to what you're saying to yourself? I very rarely do, maybe it's because I have gotten used to the criticism and judgment that I so often create.

In high school, fitting in was never really an issue. Go to the mall, buy the trendiest clothes, date a few girls, throw down a few beers and boom-popularity was in the bag. If only it were that easy today.

I'm not talking about fitting in with the "popular" crowd or fitting in with our primarily-straight society. I'm talking about fitting in with my own, those who live their lives as gay and lesbian individuals. I have never felt so out of place.

I still remember the first time I walked into a gay bar. I was overwhelmed to say the least. I sat down ordered a drink, and started judging myself immediately. I wasn't dressed as nice as some of the guys at the bar, nor were my muscles as big as the guy next to me. Unfortunately, it was obvious that I wasn't the only one making criticisms. I could see the eyes following me from the door to my chair. Were they thinking the same things I was? The questions never ended.

Since I knew I was attracted to guys from a young age, my sexuality was never a question. Becoming open about it was. The only thing I knew about gay society were the drag queens I saw on TV, and the negative things I heard on a weekly basis in church service. Once again I didn't seem to fit in.

It seems that there are certain groups or clicks in every aspect of life. In high school you had the nerds, the jocks, the goths and the cheerleaders. Unfortunately these "cliques" followed me into adulthood. The gay society is full of them. You have the feminine guys, the druggies, the drag queens, the closeted men, the straight acting guys and the "I swear I'm not gay" men. Once again I have to try to fit in.

When talking about a topic such as self-image or selfacceptance the most common reply would be, "It doesn't matter what people think about you, it's what's on the inside that counts." Sounds nice, but who actually lives by that rule? If you didn't care about what people were thinking why are you wearing makeup? Designer shoes? And most importantly, why are you talking to me about self-acceptance?


I'm not the gay guy that goes shopping for shoes with girls, nor am I the guy with impeccable and precise makeup application skills. You may find me on occasion wearing a shirt that doesn't match my pants, and I can guarantee you my closet is free of anything with a designer's name pasted on it. Doesn't sound very gay, huh?

The self-image and self-acceptance issue seems to be a neverending cycle. I have come to the realization that I am my own person and not the typical gay guy, and I'm cool with that. Guys like the fact that I don't have a limp wrist and wear a designer man-purse, and frankly I like it too.

I still struggle with criticizing myself and trying to adjust to other people, but it's life. My mental dialogue may not always be pleasing or flattering, but it's all in my head and that's where it stays.

I'm a 21-year-old atypical gay guy. I can deal with that.
