Federal Judge Overturns Anti -Gay Initiative 416

A federal judge has finally said what we all knew: Initiative 416 violates the rights of Nebraskans. In a major victory for the GLBT community, federal Judge Joseph Bataillon ordered on May 12th that the State of Nebraska immediately cease any enforcement of Initiative 416 because it violates rights guaranteed by the federal constitution.

In discussing his finding that 416 was an unconstitutional, Judge Bataillon reviewed its history and passage in the November 2000 elections. In a surprisingly frank comment, he found that 416 was motivated by either fear or hatred towards the GLBT community.

Judge Bataillon made clear that his ruling did not mean that Nebraska gays and lesbians could marry, and that he was simply restoring the constitutional rights to seek changes in law that could protect gays, lesbians and families formed by same-sex couples.

"This anti gay-union law, in effect, hung a sign on the door of the Unicameral saying 'Same-sex Couples Not Allowed,'" said senior trial attorney David Buckel of Lambda Legal. "It makes no sense that Americans who believe in commitment and want to be more responsible to each other and their children have to fight so hard just for the right to try to persuade legislators that protections for family are important -- successful or not, all citizens should have an equal shot in the democratic process."

Within minutes of the opinion being released, Attorney General Jon Bruning announced that the State of Nebraska would appeal the ruling. The appeal will be made to the Eighth Circuit court of Appeals, and the matter could eventually end up in front of the U.S. Supreme Court.

Judge Bataillon ruled in favor of three organizations that claimed both the organizations and their members had their rights violated by 416. The plaintiff groups were Citizens for Equal Protection, Nebraska Advocates for Justice and Equality,

and ACLU Nebraska. Five gay and lesbian couples, all members of the plaintiff groups, allowed their stories to be told to the court to underscore the personal affect of the country's most anti-gay state constitutional amendment.

Immediately following the passage of 416, ACLU Nebraska announced that it would challenge the amendment. "On the day after the election, we were on the phone with the people we knew we could trust, Lambda Legal and the ACLU Lesbian and Gay Rights Project. Neither one of them hesitated. I knew we could create the right team to defeat 416," said ACLU Nebraska Legal Director Amy Miller. The result was the largest legal team ever assembled by ACLU Nebraska.

"This was a team effort, everyone knew that the stakes were too high for us not give every bit of effort in this fight over basic rights. All of the attorneys, the plaintiff groups, and the couples

worked towards a common goal of overturning this horrible law," said Miller.

Judge Bataillon found that 416 "imposes significant burdens on the expressive and intimate associational rights of the plaintiffs' members and creates a significant barrier to the plaintiffs' right to petition or participate in the political process.

In addition to finding that the amendment deprived gay and lesbian couples of their rights under the First Amendment and the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th Amendment, he also found that 416 was an unconstitutional Bill of Attainder, meaning that it punished gays and lesbians because of their status rather than for something they had done.

Citing an earlier case, Judge Bataillon wrote, "It is clear that the government can regulate conduct, e.g., criminal activity, but the government 'may not create classes among its citizens on the basis of who they are rather than what they do."

In his ruling, Judge Bataillon wrote that Initiative 416 had an expansive reach that created "significant burdens on the promotion of, or lobbying for, any legislative or governmental action that would eventually extend rights or recognition to gays and lesbians, or for that matter would change the status quo concerning numerous applications of family law, custody, or adoption issues, thus affecting citizens other than gavs and lesbians."

"Judge Bataillon has given us level playing field in the legislature. We now need to convince legislators that gay and lesbian families deserve the same protections as all other families." said







With Pride weekend fast approaching, I would like to remind everyone how lucky we are to have such an amazing festival. This June 9-12 will mark Nebraska's 20th Anniversary of Pride. Thursday, June 9th kicks the weekend off with a Riverboat Cruise. Friday and Saturday is full of festivities in downtown Omaha. The weekend comes to a close Sunday, June 12th in Lincoln for the Post Pride Party.

While we are enjoying an amazing weekend, many places around the world will not have the same opportunities.

For the second time in two years the city of Warsaw, Poland is without celebration. Mayor Kaczynski said, Organizing a gay parade is a joke. Kaczynski says that he is for tolerance of gay people, but is against the spreading of gay orientation. Last year, Kaczynski banned Pride, saying he feared clashes between gay rights groups and opponents who planned a counter-demonstration. Nevertheless, about 500 gays rallied in front of city hall, chanting "Homophobe".

Another city not feeling the Pride this year is Jerusalem. World Pride celebrations were scheduled this August in Jerusalem but was cancelled on Sunday, May 15th. The decision was made because Israel's pullout from Gaza would have come at the same time as the celebration.

World Pride is held every five years. After selecting Jerusalem as the host city, organizers received criticism including threats of violence. Abdel Aziz Bukhari, said "We can't permit anybody to come and make the Holy City dirty. This is very ugly and very nasty to have these people come to Jerusalem." Other groups have warned that if the gay pride organizers do not listen to warnings and continue with the march in Jerusalem, their lives will be in danger.

In light of Jerusalem and Warsaw, nearly 100 people marched through Hong Kong on May 16th to call for civil rights protections for gays and lesbians. The Hong Kong protestors wore masks so they would not be recognized. Event organizers said the masks were also a symbol to the way gays are forced to live in the shadows of homophobia.

So when we are enjoying the festivities Pride weekend, don't forget the men and women around the world who are still being denied their basic human rights. Join me downtown and cele-

brate who we are and stand up for the GLBT community around the world.



What's Love Got To Do With It?

Earlier this month, four students were suspended for spray painting the message 'Love' over 25 times on their Howell, Michigan high school sidewalk. The students sprayed the message across their school grounds after being greeted with the words 'God Hates Fags' on the school grounds sidewalk.

The students, 3 being seniors, were suspended and are unable to attend their own graduation.

The suspension resulted in about 375 students protesting in their honor on Tuesday, May 10th. The demonstrators skipped class and held a rally in front of the school. Students at the four-hour protest said they felt the suspensions were too extreme. Principal Margaret Hamill said that she understood the students frustration, but the school must enforce the disciplinary procedures of the school's code of conduct. "Although the word 'love' is a beautiful message, instead of using sidewalk chalk that we could wash out, they used spray-paint." Hamill said.

There have been no leads in an investigation into the spraying of the original slur.

New Poll Shows Overwhelming Support for Allowing Gays to Serve

'Boston Globe' Reports Majority of Republicans, Churchgoers Think Gays Should Serve Openly

WASHINGTON, /U.S. Newswire/ — A poll published in the Boston Globe reports that 79 percent of Americans believe gays should be allowed to serve openly in the U.S. military. "Large majorities of Republicans, regular church goers, and (even) people with negative attitudes toward gays think gays and lesbian should be allowed to serve openly in the military," the Globe reports.

Don Mihovk, who works for the Nebraska Chamber of Commerce and agreed to be interviewed after responding to the poll, told the Globe that, "(Gays) can serve their country, they can work in any job they want."

The Globe poll follows other recent polls showing growing support for allowing gays to serve openly. Recent Gallup polls have reported between 65 percent and 79 percent support for lifting the military's gay ban. The Amenberg Survey reported in October that half of junior enlisted personnel and their families support allowing gays to serve. And in 2003, FOX News reported 64 percent support for allowing gays to serve.

"Across every political spectrum, and by ever-increasing majorities, Americans favor allowing gays to serve our country," said C. Dixon Osburn, executive director of Servicemembers Legal Defense Network (SLDN).

"National security is neither a Republican nor a Democratic issue. Americans do not support a policy that places discrimination above military readiness. Our homeland is made more secure, in both the blue states and the red, when qualified, capable Americans are allowed to serve without regard to sexual orientation. Members of Congress from both sides of the aisle should heed the counsel of the American people and repeal 'Don't Ask, Don't Tell' once and for all."

In March, Rep. Marty Meehan (D-Mass.) introduced the Military Readiness Enhancement Act, a Congressional bill to lift the military's gay ban.

Today, the bill is supported by a bi-partisan group of 83 lawmakers in the House of Representatives. "We've tried the policy. I don't think it works. And we've spent a lot of money enforcing it," said Rep. Ileana Ros-Lehtinen (R-Fla.), a member of the Subcommittee on National Security, Emerging Threats and International Relations. "People who've signed up to serve our country, we should be thanking them."

The Boston Globe poll was conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center, which polled 760 randomly selected adults between May 4 and May 9. The margin of error is 3.6 percent.



Utah Gays To Carry Concealed Arms To Pride

(Salt Lake City, Utah) A gay gun club says its members will bring firearms to Salt Lake Pride celebrations next month despite a regulation from Pride organizers that says no guns are allowed at the events.

Stonewall Shooting Sports of Utah founder David Nelson says that the rule which would ban "weapons of any kind" is too broad, unenforceable.

Nelson said that his members own and use legally concealed firearms and will not be deterred by the regulation. He said that the rule is a departure from the 2003 and 2004 pride events when organizers agreed that people with legally concealed firearms could not be denied admission to the events.

"There were no complaints at the 2003 and 2004 events. The previous organizers didn't confuse the difference of legal and illegal firearms."

Ernie Chambers Civil Rights Bill Defeated

On May 11th, a bill banning discrimination of state workers based upon sexual orientation was defeated by two votes in the Nebraska Legislature.

The measure, created by Sen. Ernie Chambers, was an amendment to a budget bill. It would have banned discrimination against gays and lesbians employed by the state, or any entity that receives state funding.

Chambers had previously introduced the bill gaining the support of 19 Senators. This vote he earned 23 supporting the measure. Noting the increase in support, Chambers said he plans to continue trying this session to ban discrimination based on sexual orientation. He said he believes that other senators are changing their views.

Chambers said, State government should not concern itself with a person's private life, and it especially should not discriminate based on whether a person is gay.

Chambers has been advocating for gay rights throughout this session. He has successfully added an amendment to a bill banning discrimination based on a persons sexual orientation of employees at three Nebraska Universities.

Chambers also has two other related measures coming up this session. One is similar to the measure that was defeated on May 11th. The second measure will ban discrimination based on sexual orientation in any workplace in the state of Nebraska.

Nebraska law already prohibits discrimination in the workplace based on race, color, religion, sex, disability or national origin. Chambers measure would add sexual orientation to the list. Many Nebraska companies already have policies protecting employees based on their sexual orientation. Both Omaha and Lincoln have laws protecting city workers regardless of their sexual orientation.

Currently, there is no federal law banning discrimination based on sexual orientation in the workplace. Sixteen states and Washington, D.C., have laws prohibiting workplace discrimination based on sexual orientation. ested in joining the fun to join and help with Rodeo 2006.
