

If I must forget everything I've ever witnessed in organized gay politics except one thing, I would choose to remember a gay rights organization board meeting I attended in Wichita, Kansas last fall. On the agenda was an issue that frequently causes great division between men and women. Yet, in this group, rather than fight, the men and women were so eager to make peace that each side was tripping over itself to say to the other, "Let's do what will make you comfortable." I don't know where they got that unity, but I wish they could bottle it and export it.

The New Voice is only three months old, yet we have already been charged with being anti-female. This comes in spite of of the fact that our Editor has been pleading with politically active women, personally and in print, to join our staff so we can have their input and meet their needs. One woman left our staff because we decided to run a controversial editorial, even though she could have done her position more good by staying and writing a rebuttal. We believe in freedom of expression and will gladly print statements by people who do not agree with us.

In preparation for this editorial, I spoke with several politically active members of the community. Most of the women I talked to said they were willing to work with men, but the men didn't want to work with them. Most of the men said they were willing to work with women, but the women were unwilling to cooperate. Obviously someone is not communicating!

The enemy is out there, if you'll forgive us for using a tired cliche. The gay/lesbian community simply does not have the time, energy and resources to fight each other. We hope Lincoln will never reach the point another city has where the female executive director of the community center is disliked by men because she's a woman, and disliked by women because she agrees to work with men.

So please, can there be peace in the family? Remember, every ounce of energy we waste on internal bickering is one less ounce left to fight the common enemy. We hereby renew our plea for female staff members and articles by and for women. If you disagree with us, write us and we will print it. If The New Voice adopts a policy you don't like, talk to us. We try to be reasonable and we need you even if you think you don't need us.

Imperial Court News

The Imperial Court of Nebraska is proud to present Coronation IV, the largest-attended function of any organization in Nebraska. Sex Therapist Speaks at Forum Part II

Carol Rogers, sex therapist and chemical dependency consultant in private practice, recently spoke at a forum on April 27, 1984 at Buffy's Buffet. The forum addressed Alcohol, Drugs, and the Gay/Lesbian community. Several counselors and students attended the lecture. This is the second and final segment.

Many families have the "no talk rule" — there are certain things that you can't talk about. Alcoholism and homosexuality are two subjects often included in the denial process. It has been found that, especially in male homosexuals, the individual gets farther and farther away from the family, while the person is still carrying the family values and traditions. The "no talk rule" and fear of rejection cause some to turn to alcohol. This starts a cycle of more isolationism, and continual use of chemicals to protect oneself. When we ask gays to give up chemicals, we are asking them to give up their comfort, their way of coping with a hostile world.

The chemical dependency problem comes first, even if the person also has a sexual identity problem. The other issues can be worked on along with the dependency, but if the person doesn't get help with the chemical dependency, solving the other issues won't matter.

Sexual identity is important as the individual finds he has conflicting value systems. Are they really his own values, or were they handed to him? Another issue is relationships, and counselors need to help gays and lesbians with their relationships. Is the relationship healthy or could the relationship lead to more trouble? People tend to stay in an unhealthy relationship because it may be the only love and acceptance they receive. It is better to have somebody, even in an unhappy relationship, than nobody at all.

Giving advice on "coming out" to others and making appropriate decisions in that process is important. Rules and guidelines can be given to the individual as long as it doesn't put the individual in a bind. Why is it necessary to go to an someone and say, "I'm so-and-so and I'm gay."? Yet some gays do this in the coming-out process and get hurt.

The goals of the coming-out process are to help a person move from defensiveness about their homosexuality to a positive self attitude. The ability to be open and to express gay identity is very positive and affirming. A grieving process is also involved, a loss of traditional lifestyle.

Ms. Rogers' presentation was very positive and she offered other helpful suggestions to counselors, such as how to work with clients who don't know if they are homosexual or heterosexual. She discussed several stages that a person goes through, such as denial, confusion, bargaining and sometimes, depression.

Ms. Rogers suggested that some gay A.A. groups and religious organizations can be helpful and affirming. (See listings in the resource directory of The New Voice). Positive role-models are extremely important.



In a major legal victory for the gay/lesbian community, the United States Court of Appeals, Tenth Circuit, has reversed the ruling of a lower court and struck down the main part of an Oklahoma law which permitted the firing of teachers for speaking in favor of gay and lesbian civil rights.

Democratic presidential candidate Gary Hart has signed on as the ninth U. S. Senator to co-sponsor Senate Bill 430, the gay civil rights bill.

The gay community will soon have their "own" beer, named after 19th century English author OSCAR WILDE. Wilde's Brewing Company, a small Sacramento, California firm, introduced Wilde's Beer at a gathering of owners and employees from San Diego area gay bars last week.

Oscar Wilde himself was not known as a beer drinker (he liked wine and the hard stuff), said company chairman Lee Nichols, "but he was gay and he did have a sense of style."

Overriding a veto by Mayor James Griffin, the Buffalo, New York Common Council has approved by a 9-2 vote an ordinance banning antigay discrimination by the city in employment and provision of services, and by firms doing business with the city.

TO THE GAY/LESBIAN COMMUNITIES OF NEBRASKA:

It has been my honor to serve as your elected representative for the past year. As Emperor III, I have worked constantly to establish communication between the communities which had been virtually non-existant for the two years prior to my reign.

When I accepted the title of Emperor III it was my goal to reach as many people as I could within a year's time.

In meetings of the Board of Governors, I stressed the need of the Imperial Court to do whatever was necessary to re-establish honest communication between Lincoln and surrounding communities. My suggestion was taken into consideration as one of importance, but no action was ever taken to implement the suggestion.

I determined not going to ignore the need to reestablish communication between Lincoln and the Imperial Court simply because of the negative reaction of others who had failed in the past.

I started out by coming to Lincoln as often as I could in order to meet the people. In October of last year I moved to Lincoln.

Besides enjoying the city of Lincoln, I have been fortunate to establish new friendships, as well as meeting and negotiating with the heads of the many Gay and Lesbian organizations in Lincoln.

Communication has now been re-established with the Lincoln community. For the first time in years, the Lincoln community knows that the Imperial Court's reigning Emperor and Empress are working as hard for them as they are for Omaha.

Just recently I have been able to establish a source of communication in Kearney, Nebraska. Dave Wright has offered to be a liason of the court and of the Court and The New Voice, to let his community, as well as Grand Island and Hastings, know that they are of as much concern to the Court as Lincoln and Omaha. But we still need liasons in other parts of the state. If you are interested, please contact the Court.

It takes more than words to establish communication and to keep the unity of Nebraska growing. It takes phone calls, travel and a sincere effort to reach the people of Nebraska.

I have made those phone calls and I have travelled to reach as many people as I could. I have had, and still have, the sincere desire to unite all Gays and Lesbians in Nebraska.

I have been a working emperor, and with your vote and support I will continue to work as hard as I can, to continue the progress that has been achieved this past year.

I will be moving back to Omaha June 1st because of my job and heavy burden of commuting. But no matter where I live, the responsibility as your representative is very clear to me, and as a candidate for re-election I stand committed to serve all of the people.

As one, I stand alone! Together, we stand UNITED.

A vote for me will be a vote for all of Nebraska.





The answer to the question, Is Tootsie outlawed in Lincoln, is no. According to the City Attorney's office and a copy of the Lincoln Municipal Code, the original ordinance prohibiting dressing like the opposite sex has been repealed.

The original ordinance was passed on July 6, 1936 under Chapter 21: Peace and Morals of the 1936 Lincoln Municipal Code. The original ordinance was 21-217: Dress of the opposite sex. The ordinance read as follows: "It shall be unlawful for any person or persons within the limits of said city to wear the dress or garb of the opposite sex, or to assume the dress of the opposite sex in and upon the streets, alleys, or other public places in said city for the purpose of disguising his or her sex." This ordinance was repealed by the city governing body on February 13, 1984.

On May 21, 1984, the Gay Rights National Lobby (GRNL) saluted the Imperial Court of Nebraska its support of AIDS activities.

"We appreciate the close working relationship we've enjoyed with officers of the Nebraska Court," said GRNL Executive Director Vickey Monrean. "By working together, we've been able to make Sen. Exon and Sen. Zorinsky and the three representatives from Nebraska aware that they have constituents who are concerned about stopping the AIDS epidemic."

Among other things, GRNL lobbies Congress for increased federal money for AIDS research and public education. The Court worked with GRNL on AIDS lobby day in Washington, DC. Emperor III Ken, Grand Duke Terry Sweeney, President Dan Flowers and Vice President David Hansen attended Lobby Day activities and actually lobbied members of the Nebraska Congressional delegation for more money for AIDS. The Court also made a generous contribution to the National AIDS Vigil Commission.

Besides AIDS, the GRNL lobbies for the gay civil rights bill (H.R. 2624), for immigration reform, and for reform of the military's anti-gay policy.

Aids Information Presented

DOCTOR GIVES AIDS PRESENTATION

William E. Wade, M.D., a member of the American Association of Physicians for Human Rights, gave a lecture/slide show on Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) on May 9 at Commonplace sponsored by the Gay/Lesbian Information and Support Line.

Dr. Wade presented the history of AIDS, which diseases it consists of, the risk groups involved, statistics of the victims and the new discovery of the virus.

According to Dr. Wade, AIDS was originally called the Gay Related Immune Deficiency Syndrome changed. He stated that the disease considered at least moderately indicative of underlying immunodeficiencies are: protozoan infections (e.g. pneumocysticis pneumonia), fungal infections (e.g. candida esophagitis), bacterial infections (e.g. mycobacterium avium-cellulare), noncongenital viral infections (e.g. Herpes simplex (31 months)), and cancers (e.g. Kaposi's Sarcoma). Kaposi's Sarcoma was discovered in 1872 by Morris Kaposi, and was endemic at that time in Equatorial Africa in ages 8-12 and older men.


He suggested pysychians should "never assume one is straight or gay." His advice to the gay patient is to "be honest with your physician."

On the subject of the discovery of the AIDS virus, Dr. Wade commented, "I'm concerned that it's not used as a political football to get grants and funding."

Dr. Wade closed his presentation with the statement that, "just because of our orientation, we should not allow ourselves to become guinea pigs at the cost of our confidentiality and possibly at the cost of humanity." A question and answer session followed.
