

19TH ANNUAL NEBRASKA PRIDE CELEBRATION COMING JUNE 18TH THRU 20TH

Drag performers and rodeo fans, parents and kids, teenagers and seniors, chorus singers and church members, loving couples and good friends will be part of the lively crowd gathering Friday-Sunday, June 18-20, 2004, for the 19th annual Nebraska Pride Celebration in downtown Omaha.

Under the theme "Show Your True Colors", the diverse spectators and participants - lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and heterosexual - will be celebrating the dedication and love of friends, family, and the greater human rights community.

Friday night, June 18, is the Freedom Party '04, celebrating a night of Freedom, Diversity and Pride starring Jade Esteban Estrada. Jade has performed in seven languages and in 33 countries to date and his hypnotic music can be heard on the Golden Globe and Emmy award-winning police drama The Shield on FX. "Energetic and sizzling...the diva of Latin pop" raves Genre Magazine, "the most exciting Latin pop artist ever to emerge onto the music scene".

Saturday, June 19, brings the morning Parade followed by the afternoon-evening Festival. The 2004 GLBT Pride Parade Grand Marshal is the one and only Eric Anderson, so be certain to wave to him as he helps lead the parade which begins at 11:00 AM. Among the many wonderful parade entries you will spot a special 20x50-foot flag created by area residents and regional organizations to mark last year's 25th Anniversary of the Rainbow Flag, an internationally-recognized symbol of justice and equality for all.



This giant flag contains the 8 colors of the original design and will be carried along the parade route north across the 10th Street Bridge and west up Jackson Street to the festival site. Any money tossed by spectators onto the giant flag each year goes to a selected GLBT-related charity. This year, the funds will go to Lincoln PFLAG Cornhusker, a group working hard to support GLBT rights in the capital city and across Nebraska.

The Pride Festival runs from Noon till 11:00 PM at 15th Street, from Leavenworth to Jackson. Expect to enjoy food and beverages, vendors, kids' activities, speakers, awards, a public commitment ceremony for couples, and live stage performances including magic and music by local talent as well as professional entertainers brought to Omaha specifically for the Nebraska Pride 2004 Celebration. This year brings the extraordinary talent of Ann Lincoln, Linda Imperial, and Robin S. to Omaha for Pride!

On Sunday, June 20, the Freedom Party is over, the Parade was a blast, you bought every new rainbow thing you could find, and you danced and partied your bottom off all day and night at the Nebraska Pride Festival... Well it's not over yet - Get over to the Q in Lincoln for the fantastic Post Pride Party from 8 PM - Midnight. Enjoy a relaxing time with your friends and make some new ones!

Don't Miss the Main Election

On May 11, Nebraska held its local primary. The question is, did you vote?

Voting is not a right, it is a responsibility. A friend and I were talking the other day in which he said, "There is no point in voting in this state, the Republican is always going to win."

This is only true because democrats have not asserted themselves strongly enough. Usually the more vocal a person is the more attention they get to their cause. When I look at candidates, Human right issues are one of my top priorities on selecting a candidate. If you cannot respect equality in every human being can you expect that candidate to make good decisions that is good for the whole of society?

We have people in our community that all they want to do is go out and have fun. They can't do their part by just voting. Imagine if every gay person in Nebraska was to vote. Statistics say 10 percent of the population is gay. That would be 170,000 people approximately. If even 70,000 of those people voted that would still give our community an edge on making decisions that affect us. When less than 40% of the general population votes in any given election, it would make the 170,000 gay population the single largest voting interest.

There are those in our community that marriage is not an issue or they don't believe we should have the same rights. Well if not for yourself, do it for the love of your friends or

neighbors who do want those rights.

One cannot complain about the government if one does not vote. Voting is the bare minimum of getting the system to try to work in your favor. Writing letters to legislators is also a necessity. Politicians give in to political pressure. If we were more assertive and stood in numbers, I would guarantee the legislators would have a more sympathetic ear.

Registering to vote is easy. You can do it at your local tag agency, post office or go online to http://www.sos.state.ne.us/forms/pdf/vr.pdf, print out the online form and mail it in. Need help knowing your candidate, contact the league of women voter's they put out an unbiased bio about each candidate. Let your voice be heard! Remember to vote. Between Election Day now and in November, join the Human Rights Campaign or the ACLU online. When you join they send you emails on legislation and all you have to do is click take action and a letter is sent to your congressman in just seconds. It really is easy to be involved and make a genuine difference.



Riverdance returns to Omaha; A Gayzette Interview By Jon Owens

RIVERDANCE is a celebration of Irish music, song and dance, which focuses on the evolution of Irish dance, as well as its similarities with, and influences on, other cultures. Mr. Whelan won the 1997 Grammy Award for "Best Musical Show Album" for his original music and lyrics for RIVERDANCE. This extraordinarily unique show features an international company that has taken the world by storm. The Gayzette had a chance to interview Riverdancer Padriac Moyles

Born in Dublin, Ireland, Padriac and his family immigrated to New York when he was 9 years old. He was a student at the renowned Donny Golden school of Irish dancing. He competed extensively, winning regional and North American Championships. He was also very active in athletics, competing in such sports as Gaelic football, soccer, basketball and track and field. In 1992, Padriac played the part of Sean O' Casey off-Broadway in the Irish Repertory Theater Production of "Grandchild Of Kings" directed by Harold Prince. He has also enjoyed working on concert, film, and video projects with such artists as Cher, Shania Twain, Nelly, Ja Rule, The Chieftains and Cherish the Ladies. Padriac joined RIVERDANCE in London in 1997 and has toured with the show in the US, Canada and Mexico. He is delighted to be dancing the principal role.

Gayzette: Is American culture much different than

Irish culture?

Padriac: It is pretty much the same in New York. In New York we have Irish neighborhoods so it really has that home feel to it. The big difference is our word usage. I had trouble with this growing up. We say the word voke all the time and to Americans, it is only for eggs. Our food is very different as well.

Gayzette: How would vou describe Riverdancing to

people who have never seen it in action?

Padriac: The closest form to riverdancing by American standards would be tap. There is even a number where you get to see a few riverdancers compete against American tap dancers. The dance is different in that we do not use our upper bodies. So the form of dance is totally strict.

Gayzette: How many people are a part of the production?

Padriac: We have 71 people total. 52 in the cast and 34 of them are troop dancers.

Gayzette: Wow, tha'ss a lot of people! Is it hard to

coordinate them all?

Padriac: All of the people are experienced so it did not take that long to put it together. We had two weeks from our first rehearsal to our first performance.

Gayzette: Experienced, huh? When did you start to

learn riverdancing?

Padriac: I learned it when I was a little kid. Most children in Ireland learn how to riverdance. I stuck with it, but never thought I would be doing this professionally.

Gayzette: What are your future goals?

Padriac: I just got my TCRG certification. I would like to one day teach dance, but for right now I would like to stay performing. I love the aspect of touring.

Gayzette: What is the most challenging aspect of the

show?

Padriac: Staying healthy, staying disciplined, and staying fit. You have to stay mentally focused to be prepared to do the same show everyday and to keep it fresh and new.

Gayzette: One last question, how would you describe the show to those of us who have never seen it and why should we see the show?

Padriac: The first act is myth and legends of Ireland. The second act is on famine and migration of our people, especially to America. In our migration we meet Spanish and American dancers. This show is good entertainment with high energy and powerful music.
