Omaha Man Says 'There's Nothing to Fix



It took years for Michael Pack to truly understand that his strong religious faith doesn't conflict with his gay sexual orientation. "I am not broken," he said in a front-page Living Section story in Saturday's Omaha World-Herald. "There's nothing to fix."

Pack, 31, of Omaha, will speak during an ecumenical worship service at 7 p.m. this Friday at 1st Central Congregational Church, 36th and Harney Sts. "The service will counter the harmful notion that people can and should change their Godgiven same-sex orientation," said Michael Gordon, Citizens for Equal Protection executive director.

Omaha Area Youth Summit Soars

Straight allies and gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender (GLBT) participants made the 1st Omaha Area Youth Leadership Summit a spectacular success.

Hosted by the GLBT Center and GLSEN Omaha, energetic students and advisors from area high schools and middle schools gathered at the Rainbow Outreach GLBT Center, 1719 Leavenworth, for a day of workshops, networking, and community building (see pictures).

In the morning, participants attended a workshop presented by GLSEN Omaha Youth Board member Sarah Barnett about strengthening and building Gay Straight Alliances (GSAs) in area schools. After lunch participants heard keynote speaker Amy Miller, ACLU Nebraska's Legal Director, discuss the rights of GLBT and Allied youth.

A resource panel of individuals from a variety of GLBT-allied organizations provided youth with an opportunity to learn about each group's mission and services as well as to ask questions and talk one-on-one. Panelists included representatives from the Gay Lesbian Straight Education Network (GLSEN Omaha), Imperial Court of Nebraska (ICON), National Center for Transgender Equality, Parents Families and Friends of Lesbians and



Corey from Minneapolis writes: My bf is usually the one who initiates sex. The few times I've tried to do it he claims he is busy. With a little warm up it is fun of course, but my bf is getting pissed that I'm never hard when we start. I've tried explaining to him that I'm not an ever-hard teenager anymore, but he still takes it personally. Is there a way to negotiate this?

Annette: Okay...what does he want? A meaningful relationship with a loving partner that is based on more than sex, or a stand-by hooker? I suggest you tell him your side and then together make a plan; however, he needs to realize that, since he is part of the problem, he needs to be part of the solution.

Jeremy: I know if I tell you to "talk it out" I'm probably living in happy-fantasy-unicorn land. So I won't. My sense is that you tried to initiate sex on a couple of occasions, but gave up too soon. Don't stop trying- get a new strategy. How can you put him in the mood? And, if you're really not in the mood, don't feel you always need to be "ready" for him, either. Tell him you have a headache. Intimacy should be a two-way street.

Anonymous writes: I accidentally outed my sister in front of our parents. To be honest, I thought they already kind of knew, but it turned out they didn't, and the proverbial shit hit the fan. Now my parents are disappointed in my sister, my sister is angry with them, and everybody is mad at me for rocking the boat. I know I was wrong to open my big mouth, and I have to repair this. Focus on the Family and Exodus International will sponsor a "Love Won Out" event, which promotes the controversial idea that "individuals don't have to be gay." The all-day event will be Saturday at Trinity Church Interdenominational in West Omaha.

Pack's story is accompanied by the story of a Lincoln man who had homosexual relationships as a young adult and has been married to his wife for 29 years. "We don't mind the Lincoln man's story being told too," Gordon said, adding: "Michael Pack is a remarkable young man who has struggled to find self-worth and self-acceptance. His story is typical of many in the gay-lesbian-bisexual-transgender community.

"In the 27 years I've lived in Omaha," Gordon said, "I've gotten to know countless same-sex couples in successful, long-term, committed relationships."

Pack and Gordon are scheduled to appear on the Todd and Tyler Z-92 radio show at 9 a.m. Wednesday.

Eleven pastors and other leaders of Omaha churches are expected to take part in Friday's worship service. River City Mixed Chorus and the 1st United Methodist Church choir will perform. A reception will follow. You can park across 36th Street from the church.

Another response event, Bowling for Gandhi, will start at noon Saturday at Maplewood Lanes, 101st and Maple Sts. This is a benefit tournament. Everyone is welcome to bowl. All proceeds above costs will go into a college scholarship fund for gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender and ally youth. A \$15 entry fee covers three lines of bowling and shoe rental. Gays (PFLAG Omaha), Planned Parenthood of Nebraska & Council Bluffs, Proud Horizons Youth Group, Rainbow Celebrations, Rainbow Outreach GLBT Center, River City Gender Alliance, and the American Civil Liberties Union.

In the afternoon, participants attended a workshop presented by Ms. Barnett and Ingrid Olson of GLSEN Omaha on the four major Days of Action (National Coming Out Day, Ally Week, National Transgender Day of Remembrace, Day of Silence).

They also attended a workshop on Healthy Relationships presented by Jean Rollin of Planned Parenthood of Nebraska & Council Bluffs, who noted that despite media portravals to the contrary, 97% of what Planned Parenthood does deals with the health and well being of individuals regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity.

Feedback from participants was overwhelmingly positive and indicates the Omaha Area Youth Leadership Summit will return next year. Thank you to all the individuals who so generously shared and continue to share their time and knowledge to help improve the lives of GLBT and Allied Youth in eastern Nebraska and western Iowa.






