## A FOUR KITTY NIGHT

I was always intrigued by the origin of the name of the group "Three Dog Night." In the outback of Australia, the aborigines were subjected to extremes of heat and cold as they slept under the stars of the Southern Cross. Lacking modern weather equipment, they would describe the temperature in terms of the number of dogs an individual would have to gather around him in order to keep warm; the very coldest night being described as a "three dog night."

Well, Carla and I got to experience our own version of dark, cold nights, nights without light or heat, which we came to describe as "four kitty nights."

On the night of the big snowfall, we had been at Club James Dean and then at Club 15 for twin benefits raising money for breast cancer research. My Emperor, Jeff McKenzie, had invited special guests from Des Moines, Emperor and Empress III Patrick Quinn and Liz Starr, who were planning to stay overnight with Jeff and Tracy before returning to Des Moines. After the show, a group of us braved the falling snow to go to Jeff's home near Dewey Park for a get-together.

It was really a very ordinary party — someone was sent out to get more ice and the rest of us sat around talking — and then the lights started to blink. And in the sudden darkness, you could see flashes of bright light from outside. At first I thought, "Oh, how interesting — a thunder snow (a snow storm with thunder and lightning)." The lights continued to go off and on and the flashes

of light continued. My mind was briefly drawn back to a winter morning 30 years ago when an early snow hit Lincoln, when the flashes of light were blue and red as transformers went down, when a walk outside was accompanied by a pattern of sounds (crack, swish, swish, thud) as heavy snow brought down tree limbs. But the lights were still on and we were safe. And then the lights went off and did not come back on. Candles were lit; the gas fireplace was started; and flashlights located. About that time, Joe Reed returned from his trip to the local 7-11 to get ice, reporting "It's terrible out there — there are trees down everywhere. You can get down Leavenworth but there are branches everywhere."

Not too long after that, Carla and I decided that it was time to head for home — FeFe (our Ford Explorer — get it? FE, FE) does just great in snow so we didn't anticipate any problems. Yes, there were some branches down and some traffic and street lights out, but we cruised down Leavenworth and up Saddle Creek without any difficulty. And then we turned up the street to our house and CRACK! A branch came down right in front of us. We eased around it and pulled into the drive in front of our very dark house. Since we always leave a light on, we knew that our power was out, too, but that wasn't a big deal — we got out some candles and extra covers and bedded down for the night, after calling back to Jeff's to suggest that people stay there unless they had four-wheel drive. Michele and Chandler had

already left, but everyone else was planning to stay put.

The next morning, we awoke to the sound of the telephone. It was Johnathan, the worship coordinator for church. He had misplaced Rev. Sloat's number and wanted to check to see if we were having church. Well, Rev. Sloat said it didn't seem too bad where she was, but she'd go on down to the church to see what the roads were like. Forty-five minutes later, the phone rang again. It was Rev. Sloat. She'd gotten to the church (only had to move one tree to do it) and the church had both heat and lights, but there was extensive tree damage all around the church and it was too dangerous to ask people to travel. So, she was calling the radio stations and asking them to announce the cancellation.

Now, my inclination was to stay put, but Carla just could not stand sitting at home and worrying about what had happened to her church and the trees. Okay, I learned a long time ago, there are times that it just doesn't do any good to argue. But, I suggested, why don't we take the ham and eggs from the refrigerator and after we check on the church we'll go over to Jeff's and do a potluck breakfast. We'd all planned to go out for breakfast later anyway.

So, we loaded up FeFe and started out. Oops! Small detail. Can't go up the hill — there's a tree across the road — so let's back out of the drive, through 10 inches of snow, turning carefully to miss the fire hydrant that sits 12 inches away from the end of our drive. Well, that didn't work too well — even with four wheel drive we ended up stuck — until I got out to shovel. Then, of course, Carla got it turned just right and could back right down the hill, with me trudging along behind her trying to catch up. Okay, now we're at the bottom of the hill. Can't go any further down to get on Saddle Creek — more branches came down and blocked the road. Can't go south — there's another tree across the road. And to the north — well there are branches hanging down on both sides with a path between them about three feet wide. Should we try it? Of Course!

FeFe slid through the opening like the lady she is, and we were able to get safely onto the main streets and safely to the church. As we turned off Leavenworth on to 22nd street, we could see the devastation, with more branches falling around us. A huge limb had come off the ancient American Elm that stands in the front churchyard and had taken out a section of wrought iron fence and the brick pillar that supported it. A quick survey of the grounds revealed damage to at least 50 trees, but the church was undamaged.

Carla went to work immediately, making signs for the door in case some hardy church

# RAISING A STRAIGHT CHILD

I am a single parent of a 17 year old boy. I have been a single parent for 11 of those 17 years. I have known I was gay for all of my son's life. This was only one of the many reasons for my divorce, none of the reasons of which I will go into.

My son has grown up knowing his mom was gay. He got an inkling of this when he was six years old when a beautiful woman named Tina was my constant companion. "What is it with you and Tina, Mom?" he asked me when he was six. Smart kid, huh? We never did anything overt in front of him and he still figured something was up.

Nine relationships with women later and he and I are still struggling through this thing called life. He has not liked all of the women I've been with, but he has liked most of them.

It's getting more difficult as he gets older because he has a lot of peer pressure to be straight and to come from a straight family.

He is homophobic. He puts down "gays," "dykes," and "fags" all the time. But he only dislikes them in a general, abstract way. Individual gays he meets he likes and accepts. And he absolutely loves and defends his mom.

I think that once he grows up and has his own sexual identity firmly established he will no longer have an attitude about homosexuality. He will accept gays as a normal deviance in make-up and lifestyle and will push for acceptance of gays by the larger society. This will be as a result of how he grew up in a "gay family."



## GIVING BACK

I am appealing to the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community for active support of Reverend Jimmy Creech. Rev. Creech recently performed a covenant ceremony for two lesbian members of his church in Omaha. He was suspended on November 10, 1997 for this action.

It is usually gay and lesbian people who speak out in order to gain acceptance. Rev. Creech is heterosexual. He has little to gain and everything to lose by supporting our community.

Rev. Creech began his social activism in the 1980's due to a gay parishioner in his church in North Carolina resigning his membership. The parishioner resigned because the Methodist church had announced they would not ordain "self-avowed homosexuals" and no longer saw the church as a welcome place for him. This action moved Rev. Creech to begin working on behalf of gays and lesbians within his church and society. For three years he worked with churches in Raleigh, North Carolina to support and welcome gays and lesbians.

As a result of this activism, Rev. Creech was not re-appointed to his church. The reason given was his very public support of gays and lesbians in the church and society. After a period of unemployment and eventually finding work for the Methodist Conference, Rev. Creech was called to Omaha just over one year ago to serve at First United Methodist Church.

In January of this year, Rev. Creech was asked "to stop referring to gay men and lesbians in sermons when referring to people in our society who are discriminated against." Rev. Creech

said, "I was asked not to encourage the church to truly be open to gay persons. I was not willing to do this because to do so contributes to the mistreatment of gay persons and continues the avoidance by the church of the injustice of a gay person's experience. This would be contrary to the life and ministry of Jesus Christ."

On September 14 of this year, Rev. Creech performed a covenant ceremony for two lesbian members of his congregation. He informed Bishop Martinez that he would be performing this ceremony and was advised not to do this. However, he did perform the ceremony and as a result was suspended from his job on November 10, 1997.

The Bishop alleges that Rev. Creech violated the Methodist Social Principles. According to Rev. Creech, "the prohibition of clergy celebrating holy unions or covenant ceremonies is located in the Social Principles of the church. Historically, they have not been considered church law, but as moral guidelines. Since the complaint is based on his prohibition, it is questionable whether it can be upheld. The question will most likely be deferred to the Judicial Council. I believe that the Judicial Council will rule that I have not broken a law of the church and that the Social Principles cannot be treated as law of the church. If that is the ruling, then it will open the door for other clergy to celebrate holy unions with impunity. However, if the Judicial Council rules that it is to be treated as law, then other statements (such as the opposition to capital punishment) in Social Principles will be subject to treatment as law

Either way, its decision will have great importance and significance.

This kind of giving through love and respect for other human beings is inspirational. I hope that Reverend Creech's story and his commitment to the gay and lesbian community will speak to your heart, as it has to mine. I hope as well, that you will be moved to write letters in support of him.






# NATIONAL NEWS

## CLINTON'S HISTORIC SPEECH TO HRC

The Human Rights Campaign saluted President Clinton November 8th for having the courage to bring his power to bear for an American where gay men and lesbians, "will no longer be bashed or banished to the closet, or told to betray their own identity."

"President Clinton, you have done so much to challenge all of that, and you can be certain that we will ask you to do more," said Elizabeth Birch, HRC's executive director.

Birch's remarks came at the Human Rights Campaign's first National Dinner, where Clinton delivered the keynote speech.

This was the first time a sitting President ever addressed a lesbian and gay civil rights event.

"We anticipated your first term as President with utter hope and joy," Birch said in introducing Clinton to the sold-out crowd of 1,500. "We stood nearly alone against the worst epidemic in this century... Through the first decade of AIDS, your predecessors offered only a wall of stony silence as countless died around us."

Birch was referring to Ronald Reagan's silence of the AIDS crisis during his presidency. AIDS funding began growing by the billions during George Bush's tenure.

Acknowledging that the gay and lesbian community has suffered some disappointment under Clinton, Birch said, "I can honestly say: You have played a brave and powerful and indispensable role in the march toward justice for us, and all Americans."

She singled out the President's endorsement of the Employment Non-Discrimination Act, a bill that would outlaw job discrimination based on sexual orientation.

Also at the dinner, the organization presented its two National Civil Rights Award to two outstanding leaders in the quest for equality. One went to the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights (LCCR), the legislative arm of this country's historic civil rights movement. LCCR Chairperson Dorothy Height accepted the award.

The other HRC National Civil Rights Award went to actress Ellen DeGeneres for her historic and very public coming out last spring. DeGeneres was accompanied by her partner, actress Anne Heche, and her mother Betty DeGeneres. Betty DeGeneres is HRC's 1997-98 National Coming Out Project spokesperson.

The sold-out national dinner took place at the Grand Hyatt Hotel in Washington and raised an estimated \$300,000. Protesters demonstrated outside. Some were protesting the President's lack of action against AIDS. Others were protesting the President's support of civil rights for gay Americans.

Other Washington dignitaries attending the dinner included: White House Chief of Staff Erskine Bowles, White House Deputy Chief of Staff for Policy and Political Affairs John Podesta, White House Press Secretary Mike McCurry, White House AIDS czar Sandra Thurman, White House Communications Director Ann Lewis, Director of the White House Office of Public Liaison Maria Echaveste, and the White House liaison to the gay and lesbian community and a special assistant to the President Richard Socarides.

Several members of Congress also attended, including Reps. Connie Morella, R-MD; William Coyne, D-PA; Diana DeGette, D-CO; Juanita Millender McDonald, D-CA; and Bob Filner, D-CA.

Last year, President Clinton provided a videotaped message to the Human Rights Campaign's OutVote convention during the 1996 campaign. That event was designed to inspire volunteer involvement in political campaigns for state and federal office seekers who are supportive of equal rights for lesbian and gay people.

The National Dinner took place two days before the first White House Conference on Hate Crimes. The conference examined bias-motivated crime and sought to find solutions to curb the escalating social problem which is one of HRC's highest priorities.

## UFMCC FOUNDER TROY PERRY HONORED BY PRESIDENT CLINTON

On November 20, 1997 President Clinton honored 120 American religious leaders for their service to society. The Reverend Elder Troy Perry, founder and moderator of the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches has been selected as one of the honorees, and invited to return to the White House for this honor and to breakfast with President Clinton on that date.

The event, originally scheduled to last only two hours, stretched into three hours as the President and Vice President took questions from the assembled group.

Threats by the Religious Right turned out to be simply that - threats. Despite a national media campaign attacking Rev. Perry and the UFMCC, no picketers were present as Perry entered the White House.

During the meeting, Perry had a one-on-one discussion with Vice President Gore and commended the Vice President for his support of the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgendered communities.

Vice President Gore, in turn, commended Perry for both his spiritual and civil rights work, and indicated his familiarity with UFMCC's ministry.

In accepting the White House honor and invitation, Rev. Perry noted, "This invitation is, in a wider sense, a recognition of the contributions of each of our churches, ministers and members to the worldwide work of building 'spiritual outposts' for the gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgendered communities."

"I think it is also a recognition of the hard grassroots work our churches have done to build bridges of understanding throughout our society. I am both humbled by this recognition and honored to represent the UFMCC at this White House event."

Prior to the breakfast, Perry received calls from two White House Aides assuring him that the President was not swayed by the protests from the Religious Right and confirming that the President was not swayed by the protests from the Religious Right and confirming that the President was honored to host Perry at this event.

In a show of support for the attacks on UFMCC, Perry was seated in the front row of the breakfast at the table next to the Vice President... and two tables from the President.

This marks Rev. Perry's second invitation to the White House this month. Rev. Perry was also a participant in the White House Conference on Hate Crimes held on November 12.

## GAY MEN TAKEN OFF SEX OFFENDERS LIST


Two years ago, the state of California approved the so-called "Megan's Law" — a law that required convicted sex offenders to register their place of residence with local authorities.

Then a problem developed.

Gay men, who were prosecuted and convicted for having consensual sex as far back as the 1940's, had their names show up on the list. Some of them were reportedly confronted by police who advised them they must register or be arrested, tried, and convicted of a felony.

The American Civil Liberties Union reports the state has modified the law to have those names removed from the list. A study is underway to find out how many gay men's names are on the public registry simply because they are gay.







## FIFTH ANNUAL NIGHT OF A THOUSAND STARS

### Continues Tradition of Holiday Support for Nebraskans with AIDS

The Nebraska AIDS Project (NAP), in cooperation with the Alan and Marcia Baer Family Foundation, announced that a record number of participants are expected for this year's Night of a Thousand Stars fund-raiser. The event, scheduled for Saturday 6 December, is one of the largest gatherings for charity anywhere in the region attracting more than 5,000 participants. According to NAP's Executive Director, Joseph Hall, "Night of a Thousand Stars will raise almost ten percent of NAP's budget in one night." Director of Development, Jeff Wilson, notes, "it is very exciting. We have 90 parties being held in Lincoln and Omaha. This is a big jump over last year." Founded in 1984 and operating from five offices across Nebraska, NAP is among the oldest AIDS service organizations (ASO) in the U.S. and currently the only state-wide ASO in the nation. NAP is a non-profit agency that provides social services and financial assistance to people living with HIV or AIDS throughout Nebraska and southwest Iowa. NAP also serves as the primary resource for HIV prevention offering anonymous HIV testing and counseling, toll-free HIV/AIDS information hotline, Speaker's Bureau, and Teens Educated to Combat AIDS. The project currently serves 425 men, women, and children living with HIV or AIDS.

## A HERO FOR QUEERDOM

Last month, I had an orgasmic moment in the stacks of Antiquarian Books. I found one of Leslie Charteris' original Saint books, circa 1937, in the original dust cover (which is rare). My hands trembled as I took my loot to the cash register, hoping the clerk would not notice my excitement. Flushed cheeks. Dilated pupils. Et al.

For the uninitiated, the Saint — also known as Simon Templar — is the Robin Hood of modern crime, oft described as "gay" before gay was associated with rainbow stickers, and who figures in dangerous adventures and intrigue on nearly every continent and in some 50 books or so. He cracks codes, jumps off buildings, and with his hands tied behind his back, he can kick a bad guy in the chops (in pulp fiction, bad guys never have faces — they have "chops" and "mugs"), knock him to the floor and hold him in a scissors lock with his muscular thighs until the dolt passes out. All without ever mussing his blue-black hair or losing his tan.

To get what he wants, the Saint is not beneath coming on to humpy hotel bellhops (in *Thieves Picnic*), or luring a villain's chauffeur away from his post with the promise of quick, gritty sex (in *Saint's Getaway*). Even back in the 1930's, he knew how to use queerness as a commodity. In our age of glossy gay mags, Billy dolls and ski weekends, we can only aspire to sell our sex with

an ounce of Simon Templar's sophistication.

True, he always had a dame on his arm. But often, these women seem to be great platonic pals, and his most frequent partner in crime, Patricia Holm, comes across as mannish in a very glamorous, lesbo-chic way. I am certain Patricia wears sports bras and Prada shoes.

Last spring, Simon Templar made his debut to the big screen in the film starring Val Kilmer, titled, simply, *The Saint*. Val played the role with serious camp, and to the hilt. And when he unzips those leather pants on screen, you can virtually smell him.

I think the Saint is an archetypal hero for queer boys everywhere. On the cusp of a new millennium, the legend of the Saint teaches us an important lesson: a guy can be anything he wants. There are no limits, no barriers, no rules. None.

The Saint would never describe himself as either Top or Bottom: he would insist on both. Militant, boy-next-door, queen, butch artistic, mechanically-inclined, shallow, tortured-soul, ambitious, slacker, twinkly, nerdy, blond, black and blue, techno-savvy with simple tastes, sinner (sometimes) and saint (always). Simon Templar embodies all of these. The common threads stitching it all together, like really good recon-

structive surgery, are an open mind — gaping, wide open — and the commitment to manage one's risks while at the same time living life as an adventure (this, my friend, is art).

Perhaps this describes you. Or our community. Perhaps it should...

How many times do we hear the gay rent-a-cops whine about... how we must look a certain way (as in "alike"?)... how we must behave in order to pacify those who do not understand us anyway... how we must wear chinos to march in the parade (when we'd rather wear vinyl hot shorts)... how we should wear vinyl hot shorts when we go clubbing (when we'd rather be at an archeological dig anyway)... how we shouldn't talk about sex too much for fear we will only be seen as sex monsters... and so on, ad nauseum.

There are those who would take a community held together by delicate and simple common threads and bind it together in yards and yards of thick, scratchy rope.

Which is ok if that's your thing, but most of us like to be asked first.




