GRAND MARSHAL VOTING BOOTH LOCATIONS ANNOUNCED

A secure program written especially for Nebraska Pride, the program allows the Pride Committee to take the laptop and does not rely on internet access. Each of the 3 nominees are shown with a complete biography detailing their many accomplishments and achievements on behalf of the GLBTA communities.

Citizens for Equal Protection Announces Good News From the Unicameral!

Last week three pro-GLBT bills were introduced in the Unicameral. Senator Dave Landis, District 46, introduced LB 50. LB 50 would include sexual orientation, as a protected class, into the existing Nebraska fair housing laws. Sen. Landis' office has been very willing to work toward full equality of Nebraska's GLBT citizens. Laurel Marsh, Sen. Landis' legislative aide, helped CFEP and the Nebraska chapter of the ACLU with an interim study resolution that determined there was no reason housing and workplace laws couldn't include protecting our GLBT citizens.

Senator Ernie Chambers, hero to GLBT rights from district 11, has introduced LB 759 that would include sexual orientation into the Nebraska Fair Employment laws.

Senator Gwen Howard, newly elected senator form district 9, has introduced LB 627. LB 627 is an anti-bullying bill that would protect our GLBT-yes I said GLBT- students from harassment and bullying.

The national chapter of GLSEN (Gay, Lesbian, Straight, Education Network) contacted our office asking if we would work on the anti-bullying legislation. We will be working with GLSEN, HRC (Human Rights Campaign), the NGLTF (National Gay and Lesbian, Task Force), PFLAG (Parents Family and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) and the Equality Federation to bring a victory home for the GLBT citizens of Nebraska.

Recently CFEP received a \$15,000 grant from the Gill Foundation, the largest GLBT funding organization in the U.S. This is a grant that CFEP and the ACLU will partner together to study, document, combat, and inform about hate crimes and hate incidences. LB627 falls squarely into this category.

Spanish, Northern (Dutch and Flemish), French, and English works spanning the 15th through the 18th centuries. 

A Poetry Book That Hits Home

On February 28th, PublishAmerica will be releasing my latest book/collection of poetry, entitled FIRST CHILL. Some of these poems first appeared in THE NEW VOICE, back when I served as Poetry Editor.

FIRST CHILL is a collection of poetry about Brian E. Bengtson's life in Nebraska, and the lessons learned "along the way." His poetry reflects his time as an artist, most notably working for eight years with the Omaha Magic Theater as an actor, stagehand, and director. On May 1992, he joined the growing number of Americans with HIV, and has been writing, talking, and more importantly, surviving it ever since. His poetry talks about the early years of the AIDS crisis, before the advent of new medications and new hope.

He also writes about the people who have "wandered into his sights," whether they are from across the street in the middle of winter ("Purple Woman"), a beloved grandmother and matriarch ("Glenda Rae"), or the first person to die in his arms ("Survivor's Walk").

Malcolm X

Malcolm X, a bisexual born Malcolm Little in Omaha, Nebraska in 1925, was an American black nationalist known for his strong advocacy of self-help and community empowerment. The son of a Baptist minister, he eventually became a minister in the Nation of Islam. He was assassinated in 1965 while speaking at a rally of the Organization of Afro-American Unity in New York City.

Martin Luther King, Jr., sent a telegram to his widow, Betty Shabazz, expressing his sadness over "the shocking and tragic assassination of your husband. While we did not always see eye to eye on methods to solve the race problem, I always had a deep affection for Malcolm and felt that he had a great ability to put his finger on the existence and the root of the problem. He was an eloquent spokesman for his point of view and no one can honestly doubt that Malcolm had a great concern for the problems we face as a race".

Billie Holiday

Billie Holiday, the bisexual daughter of a teen-aged jazz guitarist who soon deserted her likewise teen-aged mother, was born Eleanora Fagan Gough in Baltimore in 1915. "Lady Day", as she is also known, is considered by many to be the greatest jazz vocalist of all time, with her intensely personal, bluesy interpretations of classic jazz standards.

Billie was a phenomenal woman, who created "a new conception of black womanhood" and was "God's spirit", according to poet Maya Angelou. Her life was marked by struggles with both racism and drug and alcohol addictions, but she left behind a legacy of memorable recorded music, including her interpretation of "Strange Fruit", a song about lynchings of innocent blacks in the South, and the song she co-wrote, "God Bless the Child".

It was the first time that a GLBT group had been invited to participate in the 20-year history of the event.

During the program, the chorus, which is composed of GLBT individuals and allies, sang "Lift Every Voice and Sing", which is regarded as the Black national anthem, and "Freedom is Coming", an African responsive chant. At the reception following the event, the chorus sang several selections from their upcoming "Great Women of Song" concert, closing with the powerful call for equality "Singing For Our Lives".

'Ex-gay' Billboards in Texas Stir Anger Christopher Curtis, PlanetOut Network

The LGBT community in Houston and Galveston is reacting angrily after 15 billboards appeared with the message "I questioned homosexuality. Change is possible. Discover how."

The billboards feature either a man or a woman and promote Focus on the Family's "Love Won Out" conference set for Feb. 19 in Houston. The conference bills itself as "a dynamic one-day conference addressing, understanding and preventing homosexuality."

Galveston resident B. Joe Cline of Lighthouse Freedom Ministry raised money from various Christian organizations to put up the billboards. Cline says he was inspired by his son, who Cline claims was able to change his sexual orientation.

Community activist Ray Hill says the billboards are a sign of desperation. "Focus on the Family charges big bucks for this seminar. And Grace Community Church, which is hosting the thing, is worried it will take a bath. So the billboards have been put up so the church won't suffer."

The conference costs \$50 for advance registration. Walkin registration costs \$60.

"I don't know if they're going to get enough suckers in to make it profitable, but they're trying," Hill added. "This is all about money."

Sue Null, an advocacy chair for the Houston chapter of the Parents, Family and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (PFLAG) told the Houston Chronicle that her organization is considering an appropriate response to the billboards.

"For an organization to spend their time and money promoting untruth and lies against gays, lesbians, bisexuals and transgenders is a deplorable situation," she said.

John Paulk, the author of the book "Love Won Out," which is the inspiration behind these conferences, made the cover of Newsweek for claiming people could change their sexual orientation. He would later leave Focus on the Family after being photographed by a Human Rights Campaign staffer at a gay bar in Washington, D.C.

According to the American Psychiatric Association's Web site, "There is no published scientific evidence supporting the efficacy of 'reparative therapy' as a treatment to change one's sexual orientation. It is not described in the scientific literature, nor is it mentioned in the APA's latest comprehensive Task Force Report, "Treatments of Psychiatric Disorders." (1989)

"There is no evidence that any treatment can change a homosexual person's deep-seated sexual feelings for others of the same sex," the APA says.

The Web site concludes, "Clinical experience suggests that any person who seeks conversion therapy may be doing so because of social bias that has resulted in internalized homophobia, and that gay men and lesbians who have accepted their sexual orientation positively are better adjusted than those who have not done so."
