My fear is that my othervise scraight san may possibly in rebellion think of himself all gay or being gay, chlnk of himself as straight. ## Gay Couples - Parents

"I wiah you weren't gay, Dad," This was part of a discussion that ay son and I had revoral weeks ago. I was not sure at the time whether he was wishing that I weren't gay, or that I weren't different.

I told him I understood that he probably did not want a dad who was different from other kida' dads. Part of the resson for the discussion was that he had told comeone I was gay and had gotten an adverse reaction. He decided that it was not something that you tall everyone. that you keep it under your hat, ao to speak.

Well, what does a qay parant do? Surely, there must be easy answers someplace. The pain my son experienced was real and difficult to watch. 1 way not sure at times how to help him, other than to tell him i loved h 1 m and that I understood. He is now in the eloset about my being gay, except for family and some other folka.

This article is more personal than the past ones because the isaue is very important to me. I have a partner also who has a child. We are both parents and atepparents. Our relationahips

With the children are pretty qood most of the time. It has taken years to devolop them, however. Stepparenting takes a lot of work. In my work with stepparents and in the reading I have done, it is estimated that stepparenting relationships take about seven yeara to develop. I believe that: Truet is an important issue in any selationship, but it appears to be even more of an issue with children.

Another lisue in the loyalty children have to their natural parents. i do not know how many times 1 have heard in my office and at home, "You are not my dad and you can't tell me what to do." That atatement hite at the core of the Loyalty children feel and their sense of who is in autherity and who is not. Because of this Idyalty, I believe that the stepparent needs to start out more as a friend than as a parent. If a friendahip can develop Eirst, the actual parenting and disciplifing is assier Later. Trying to tell a partner's kid what to do usually does not go over very well, especially if the child ia over four or five years old.

I don't think that I can deal with all of the issues of being a gay parent and stepparent in this short article. I believe that as a gay parent, 1 can use all the help I dan get. It has been important to me to talk to ocher gay parents and stepparents, and it may be that you will need to do the same. It seems to me that we have to be axtramely creative In dealing with the issues suriounding ourselv= ess and our children.

I keep hoping that my son W111 have an easier time as the world becomas less homophobic. but that may not come in his Iifetime. Probably the most frustrating question I get from straight folks I know is, "You don't want your son to grow ip to be gay, do you?" I don't know how to answer that questionI am umually at a loss sor worda, and I simply iqnore it.

I Would say that it takes a lot of oourage to be a gay parent and to live your life as añ open gay person, but it may be that our thildren are the ones with the most courage in the long run. Take care and happy parenting.

There is one international organization for gay parents--it is the Gay Fathers Coalition International. It is not just for men, however, and recantly, the chaptera elected their first woman to the national board. They have in intornational conFerence once a year in the summer time.

## Parenting - An Interview

(The following interview was taken from a phone sonversation with a gay male parent who is 34 years old, has custody of hts 9 -year-old, and lives wich another gay parent. All mames have been changed.)

IN YOUR EXPERIENCE, WHAT WAS YOUR SEXUAL DIRECTION UNTIL YOUK MARRIAGE?
I can look back now and see the things that were chere that made me decide I was Indeed gay. There was no great change, it was a macter of understanding the definttion and importance. I didn't know the signifleance of all the litclo signs at the Eime, I assumed I vas faeling what everybody else was feeling.

50 YOU DIDN'T REALIZE THAT MARRLAGE WASN'T RIGHT FOR YOU, . . IT WASN+T A MATTER OF COVERINC UP ANYTHING?
RLght.

HOW LONG WERE YOU MARRIED? About six years.

WHEN HAS YOUR GIRL BORN?
Not qutte a year after we vert matried. That was Lmportant, we both wanted a kid.

HOW FAR WERE YOU INIO MARRIAGE WHEN YOU REALIZED THERE MIGHI BE A PTOBCEM?
It surfaced about our third year. It really happened when a lot more became avallabte, to Los Angeles. I'而 not Just talking about gay iffe but people were more "loose" there.

UNDER WHAT CIRCUMSTANCES DID YOU SPLTT AND WHAT SORT OF RELATIONSHIP DO YOU HAVE WITH YOUR WIFE NOW?
It. has run the gamut. At first, It was quite amicable. We did get along and we could still talk. The problem was I was more intarested in ending the relationship than she was. It has stnce then run atl ktnds of feelings. Right now, things aro pretty much ambiguous.
She's In Californla, and that

helps. We rarely talk, just about when Mary (their daughter) goes back to visite. I don't know whecher things will get hot again.
IN TERMS OF MARY AND THE DIVORCE EDUCATE ME ON HOW YOU GOT CUSTODY.
It was a fluke. At first we had joint custory. That's rather ambiguous. At chat eime Beth (his wifel was living in Omaha and ve vistted a-ioc. Then Bech moved, and we didn't change anything+ Mary stayed with her and visits were less frequent. Then Bech visited and asked me to keep Mary sc she could move to Callfornia. I had Mary about chree days and Bech came back, cook Mary with her, Ieft town with her. That's when there were sults and countersults, all the dirty stuff.

YOU SAID ALL THE DIRTY STUFF. DID HOMOSEXUALITY COME OUT? It never came aut in court. It am sure the opposition Lawyer mentloned it to the Judge because of the speed he acted on a couple of things. That's unethical at best. But we never came to a point in the actual court proceedings it was mentioned. It did come up in a deposition taking.

GO ON.
We had one hearing. Mary had heen awarded to me because Berh left the scate. Then we had another hearing which was a big flasco. We spent hours getting noching done. The whole proceeding ground to a halt. We settled out of court. By this time Beth was golng back to California. She would have cuscody, Mary would come back here for Christmas and summer. The pretty baste arrangement. By the time that was actually. arranged, ft was sumnertime, 30 Beth left Mary with me for the summer. Beth left, got remarried, got a job in Californla. One year ago, Mary went to Californfa for school. She declded she didn't want to live in callfornia with mom, she wanted to live in Nebraska with dad. Bech called up last Christmas and asked if I vant to change the arrangement. The lawyara
drafted the arrangement and basically flip-flopped 1 t . I ended up with custody. But the gay thing never really entered Into 15, except when fech got really angry.

SO YOU'VE NEVER REALL,Y SPENT THAT MUCH ENERGY, SAY IN COURT, FICHTING ABOUT THE GAY ISSUE?
No. In face, it would have been a good cest case because. frankly, I'm in a pretcy normal type situation. John and I have been together for awhtle and neither of us is weird. Besides, Beth earller agreed summers and long veekends were okay; It would have been hard for her to change that. But just from the deposition information, they were ready to use the gay issue.

## WHAT DOES MARY KNOW ABOUT YOUR SEXUALITY7

1 somet limes wouder. Any questions she asks gec answered. She knaws things are diffecent here. It dogen't take much for a kid to realize she's living with two sen instead of a man and yoman. He're very open about affection. She's accepted that. I don'r kniow if she's aware of any more. She knows it's more than two men who are Jist friends.
YOU DON'I THINK SHE'S UNCOMFORTABLE?
There doesn't seem so be a problem. 1 guess 1 'l1 have co hedge- . .the sleeps over at the neighbor's house but there's not the rectprocation. I do wonder why the nelghbor kid doesn't come over., +not as much as Mary goes over chere.
DO YOU THINK YOUR SITUATION IS SO MATTER OF EACT, EVERY DAY, THAT MARY MIGHT DISCUSS IT WITH OTHERS WITHOUT EVEN THINKING? I think she's gotten enough negactive information, espectally during the trial, that she's probably hesicant about usting a word Itke gay. Itm not sure exactly what the rest of the neighborhood thinks. They know we're here. But it's a three bedroom place and they probably think just about whatever they want to. As far as I've seen, nothing appears as

AS MARY GETS OLDER, DO YOU THINK MORE MIGHT DEVELOP: KIDS TEASING AND SO ON?
Sure, but that can happen For every reason Imaginable. I don't know exactly how to handle that. It w111 be honest. We'11 have to talk about how one can be discreet without being two-faced.

I THINK PEOPLE LIKE MARY WILL ULTIMATELY CHANGE THE WORLD BECAUSE OF HER UNIQUE SITUATION.

She's seen a number of gay people going out togecher.

WHAT DOES MARY THINK OF JOHN AS?
We've never given him a title. I don't know if she chinks of John as compared to her mother's second husband. But we 've never trted to put any name on chat.

IN TERMS OF RAISING MARY, HAS YOUR BEING GAY GHANGED ANYTHINGT TOR INSTANCE, WE TEND TO BE LESS BIGOTED ABOUT OTHER GROUPS BECAUSE OF THE WAY WE OURSELVES ARE SOMETIMES TREATED.
I'd say that's something I can appreciace. I thinik I can tolerace a bit better than other реорte.

DO YOU EVER THINK ABOUT THE FACT THAT YOU'RE BLESSD WITH SOMETHING MANY GAY PEOTLE WON'T EVER HAVE: A CHILD?
I'm very aware of that. I think a lot of our gay friends appreciate kids and relate. play and ralk to them. But among at least sone gay people there's a problem: a lot aren't comfortable with ktde. It does put us in a minority. It does put some restrictions on gay parents, but it would do that to anybody. Kids are a blessing if you want ther.

15 IT A PROBLEM THAT MARY IS GROWING UP WITHOUT A FEMALE ROLE MODEL?
She has an open enough relaclonship with her mother that a lot of these things can be taken care of chere. There are other people in my family. I chink it'll be someching I'll have to be awere of. I hope she" 11 develop ralacionships as she needs to with female relatives, teachers and so on.
*HAT HAPPY世H IF MAMY SOMEDAY WERE TO TELL YOU SHE IS GAY HERSELF?
I don't know what kind of difference LL. would make. I suppase we'd be a little more capable of handling the problem. Along with that thought, I would hope if something were to come up in school, If one of the kids or teachers were rumored to be gay, Mary would feel informed onough to speak Intelligently about it. i would hope she could shed some IIghe for ochers.

## ANY OTHER THOUCHTS?

Commundcation with other gay parents is important and probably will be more 50 as the kids get older. We did go to a national conference for gay fachers and it was enlightening-
The organtzation is called Gay
Fathers Coalition Internaclonal. I would like to see something happen IIn Omahal. It voutd be important for the kids, $t 00$. Gay parenting is an issue you can benefit from by discussion with other peaple. Just because people may not have custody or may even be denled visteation is not a reason to stay away from such ii group.

In love with a beauciful lady, with the certain knowledge in che depths of my soul that my sexual preferences were being denied. During that outward display of manhood, two sons were born, both of whom I love very much.
After six or so years of pleasing society, reality began to knock at my door. I knew that I had to give this charade up if I were ever going to be myself and totally happy. This knocking became a poundfing after almose eighe years. Sut, there was a price to pay: two very wonderful sons. It was with great reservation because of my sons that I finally ended the marrlage and began facing my being gay. Facing it was much less of a task than I had antlcipated, Losing my sons had to be the worst heartache that I had ever experienced. It took over six months before the crying in my sleep ceased. I finally began accepting thelr absence but never lost my love for them.
Some problems have occurred with thelr mother over the last seven years but I voved to stay on good terms with her In order to always see the boys. I have seen them every summer. They viste for at least a month each year and occastonally I
have them at Christmas. You see, they live almost seven hundred miles tway.

Out of that seven years has come a little sadness but also a litcle hope. My oldest son and his stepfacher had severe problems dealing with each other. He's almost fourteen and through a common agreement between him, his mother and me I nou have legal cistody of him for at least one year. It was to be his decision at the end of the year whether he would remain with me or return to Ilve with his mom. I have since learned that both sons were being physically abused and am now seeking full custody of bath my sons.

I have complete faith that with the help of God, my sons vill be with se permanently. I am sorry that my sons have had to experience the pain of abuse, but maybe I'11 have the opportun1ty co ease a little of that pain with thelr father's love. I know the next few months will be an uphill batcle in the courts but 1 know that with God on my side and the continuting aupport of my wonderful parcner of almose seven years I will vin.

Phone volanteers will be asked to make a 6 -month commitment to answering the phone in their home via a call-forwarding system, one evening every two weaks during the 6 months. Volunteers will have continuing access to AIDS Project organizers for new information and support.

Presently, 17 people are signed up to work on the phone line, and projected needs are for a total of $35-40$ people. People interested in helping staff the telephone line should call or write (ree phone number and addresa below), and plan to attend the training on Wov. 16, 17, 23, $=24$. Tralning sesisions are free and will include meals and training manuals. Volunteers are also neede for an AIDS "buddy system." Budays will assist persons with AIDS or AIDS-related diseases in everyday acpivities, such as shopping, medical appointments. and Just plain support. Buddys W111 also be asked to attend the november training sessions, along with additional training In areas nuch as enotional support and death and dying. $10-15$ people are needed in this area.

Aside from volunteer support, the Nebraska AIDS Project also needs financlal help from the community. Costs are quickly accumulating for training sess-

## Protection of Gays Debated by ASUN

Last spring the student senate at the University of Neb-raska-Lincoln passod a resolution which would have banned discrimination on several grounds by AsUN. This action was vetoed by Student Body President Gerard Keating because it included sexual orientation as a protected class, and alwo because of Some overbroad language in the statute itself.

A few weeks ago the student senate again took up the issue. After the vote was over, sexual brlentation wail still not included in the list of protected classes. though other minorities are now protected from discrimin-
ation by ASUN . The measure had again been approved narrowly by the studente but was vetoedby Student Body President Gerard Keating Following the vote I spoke with one of the senators, Jerry Roenser, who had been the origination sponsor of the bia to include sexual orientation and its primary supporter on the senate floor -

Roemer, a Junior Erom Hooper, Nebraska, and an agriculture major who hopes to go into agricultural law, told me that he was exposed to minorities when he worked at Camp Eanter Seal, a camp for handicapped children. He
sald that that expertence taught him that poople who are "different" are still people. He also said that many of hljs fellow senators initially expressed apprehension about including blacks, to a large degree because many of them have had no experience with blaoks. He belLeven that sexual orientation didn't pasa for the same reason--senators who have had no personal oontact with gay people have nothing to go on excopt stereotypes.

Roemer also sald that there was a difficulty convincing some peopla that diserimination does fa fact exist on UNL Campus. Prior to the passage of the bill last spring there was no provision against any sort of disorimination, and consequently nobody had any way of documenting whether minorities were being diacriminated againat or not.

There were no black senators at this time, and no openly gay senntors, though approximately one-third of the senate is female. Jerry Roemer sald that sexual orientation was deleted for emottonal reasons: "Thera war an emotional bandwagon, parttoularly about what the Colks back home would think." During the senate debate one female senator said that she had polled her classmates and only found one who opposed the addition of sexual orientation. Roemer, who chaired the coranitted that drafted the bill, said that
he was "shocked" to leara that there was no bill already in place to protect minorities. He also said that he was surprised at the number of senatora who originally voted to Include saxual orientation last spring but who changed their votes when it came to an overrida of the Keating veto.

Jerry Roemer aald that there were few senators on either side who were really confortable dealing with this issue. He again pointed out that few senators have had opportunity to deal with gay people as people and suggested that it was good that the bill was diacussed because if nothing olse it made people aware that this is an issue.

Durlng the discussion one opponent of the measure, Jim月ogers, told the benate that being qay was like having a taste for okra-it is an acguired taste and people who wish to disoriminate based on a liking for okra have the right to do so. Roemer found that argument "strange."

There has been discussion on possibly putting the issue on the ballot for the student body as a whole to dectde iander the co-sponstorship of the Gay/Lesbian Student Group, the Womens" Tlescurce Center and Young Damocrats. It press time Lt was not known if that route would be taken or not.

## Personal Profiles Vincent A. Percy

Many words desertbe Vincent $A$. Percy that include (Itusionist, entertainer, dancer, and star. Who is this charasmatic figure who has personified enthuslasm, creativity, and excitement? His show name is "Velvet" and
he recently won the prestigious title of MLss Gay Nebraska.

T recentiy interviewed Vince at The Max where he works as a bartender and at hls home where I viewed a large collection of show costumes, props, and accessories. I also previewed his atcire that was being put together for the Miss Gay America pageant. I wan quite fmpressed by his wide range of talents and personable nature.
HIs Involvements with female 11 Iusion started when he was a male dancer for his former lover "Satin". In 1981 he put on hil flrst female face as merely a joke, prompted by friends who wanted to try drag on people who never trled it before. His name evolved when he was introduced as "Satin's" sister at his Eirst stage appearance. His first serlous show was held at the Hollywood at the end of 1981 and the song, "You Should Hear How She Talks About You", by Mellssa Manchester was an instant hit. It wasn't long before Velvet vas doing more shows and he remembers putcing on benefic productions for the Metropolitan Community Church.

His first involvement with the Imperlal Court came when he was asked by Empress Toadfe to be Princess Royale. In 1984 he won the title of Empress IV and was very active in fundralsing and somminity involvements with the Imperial Court.

Vince describes himself as an entertainer who is able to valk off the stage and put his chardeter back ftr the eloset. "I want to be a man. Not a man who runs around in drag", exclaimed Vince.

He saas female fllusion as a true art as it takes a great deal of time and work. He sees innovation as very tmportant to keep the audfences attention and interest. Vince stressed the tmportance of nev songs, new ideas and new moves. He uses imagination and oreativity in his stage props, outfics, and dance productions. Such innovation was seen at the Miss Gay Nebraska pageant when. "Velvet" was carried on stage in a african fishing net secured by an 11 foot bamboo pole. Tvo men carrled him to the stage.

He performed to the song, "Beast it Me", by Bonnte Pointer. He is always looking for unusual items and Vince has searchnd in friunds houses, garage sales, and ant Lque shops. He sometimes draws ldeas down on paper and his friend beth can deslgn the outfit or come up with new Ideas: Vince describes Beth as remarkable and says she is a perfectionlst at whatever she does.

He was cotally shocked and surprised when he won the crown of MIss Gay Nebraska. He was especlally proud to be the first pertormer in Nebrasica state history to win two major titles in a row.

VInce stands $6^{\prime \prime} 1^{\prime \prime}$ call, has brown hatr and brown eyes and is 24 years old. He is very large and tall compared to ocher illusiontsts and this adds problems which he has co work around.

Vince has gone a long ways in a very short time. He sees new challenges in the future and may enter other contests fuch as Miss Gay Midwest.
