CREECH TRIAL

The Rev. Jimmy Creech was tried on charges of disobeying the United Methodist Church of discipline by performing a Holy Union of Larry Ellis and James Raymer from North Carolina. Rev. Creech was tried in Hastings 20 months ago for marrying a lesbian couple here in Omaha at the First United Methodist Church. He was acquitted on by a narrow margin.

The trial took place at the Trinity United Methodist Church in Grand Island. This time the vote was unanimous

13-0. The jury then handed Rev. Creech the "death" penalty by stripping of his pastoral credentials.

Tuesday afternoon and evening prior to the trial we attended a Soulforce training led by the Rev. Mel White, a former "ghost writer" for Jerry Falwell. He came out fifteen years ago and has been working for religious justice since then. There was also a reenactment of the Holy Union of Larry and James. Many couples, including Carla and Sharon, plus many straight couples reaffirmed their commitment vows.

Wednesday, 74 members of the Soulforce team were arrested for blocking the entrance of the church as a symbolic gesture of blocking the trial. Dexter Jenks, 8, and Victoria Peterson, 72, were the youngest and oldest arrestees. I am

proud to include both as good friends of mine.

The trial of Rev. Creech was only a step backwards. I mat many other kind and caring folks from around the Country who will continue to move forward to right a sad situation. Do not forget what a noble and righteous act the Rev. Creech performed. He will go down in history as a great man.



ADVOCATE REPORTS GAYS COULD BE TARGET OF MILLENIUM VIOLENCE

The largest gay publication, The Advocate, included in its website a report from The Washington Post that the FBI is warning local police chiefs that gay men and lesbians are among the potential targets of extremists groups preparing for violence at the dawn of the new millennium. In a 34-page report prpared by the agency's domestic terrorism unit. the FBI says that several racist groups and militias are looking for targets as the New Year approaches. Among the groups identified in the report is the Christian Identity movement, to which two brothers accused in the murder of a gay couple in Northern California have ties. The report said that police need to monitor the groups to determine if they are planning attacks for January 1. Neil Gallagher, head of the FBI's national security division, told the Post that the public needs to be "aware but not scared" of threats.

On December 11, 1999 Learning to Exchange Power will host its third annual fund-raiser for Toyz 4 Totz, an annual benefit of the Imperial Court of Nebraska which provides toys for over 100 children affected by HIV/AIDS across the state of Nebraska and Southwest Iowa.

Learning to Exchange Power will begin this event with workshops on various aspects of the Leather Lifestyle. From 1-4 p.m. participants will learn about Waxing taught by Beth and Dusty and about Whips taught by LordWolf and Susan. There will be a dinner break from 4-7 when many of those attending the event will meet for dinner at the Old Country buffet.
