#### N.Y. Court Strikes Down Ban on Same-Sex Marriage

NEW YORK -- A judge declared Friday that a law banning same-sex marriage violates the state constitution, a first-of-its-kind ruling in New York that would clear the way for gay couples to wed if it survives on appeal.

Gay rights activists hailed the ruling as a historic victory that "delivers the state Constitution's promise of equality to all New Yorkers."

"The court recognized that unless gay people can marry, they are not being treated equally under the law," said Susan Sommer, a Lambda Legal Defense Fund lawyer who presented the case for five couples who brought the lawsuit. "Same-sex couples need the protections and security marriage provides, and this ruling says they're entitled to get them the same way straight couples do."

State Supreme Court Justice Doris Ling-Cohan ruled that the New York City clerk could not deny a license to any couple solely on the ground that the two are of the same sex.

The city Law Department issued a statement saying only, "We are reviewing the decision thoroughly and considering our options."

Mary Jo Kennedy and Jo-Ann Shain, one of the couples in the case, said they were thrilled by the ruling and believed it would offer their family increased legal protection. They have been together 23 years and have a 15-year-old daughter.

"We're just overjoyed," said Shain. "We didn't think it would ever happen.

Kennedy said she wants to marry Shain as soon as possible. "I can't wait," she said. "We went to buy a (marriage) license in March 2004 and couldn't get it. That's what started this whole thing."

#### Daughter of Conservative Republican Calls Herself Liberal Queer

ANNAPOLIS, Maryland (AP) -- The daughter of conservative Republican Alan Keyes referred to herself Monday as a "liberal queer" and urged support for gay and lesbian young people who have been deserted by their families.

Maya Marcel-Keves, 19, addressed a rally sponsored by the gay-rights group Equality Maryland, saying she was motivated to speak out because of her rocky relationship with her parents and the recent death of a friend who had fallen ill after being thrown out of the house by his family.



Marcel-Keyes told several hundred supporters that her sexuality had created a rift in her relationship with her parents.

"Things just came to a head. Liberal queer plus conservative Republican just doesn't mesh well," she said. "That was making my life a little bit turbulent."

Later, Marcel-Keyes told CNN her parents "were not too pleased" when they learned she was a lesbian, but she said she loves them "very much, and they love me. They can't support my activities."

The judge noted that one plaintiff, Curtis Woolbright, is the son of an interracial couple who moved to California in 1966 to marry. She said California then was the only state whose courts had ruled that interracial marriage prohibitions were unconstitutional.

Her father, the Republican candidate for the U.S. Senate in Illinois last year, created a stir in August when he said during an interview that homosexuality was "selfish hedonism" and that Vice President Dick Cheney's lesbian daughter was a sinner.

In a statement issued Monday night, Keyes said: "My daughter is an adult, and she is responsible for her own actions. What she chooses to do has nothing to do with my work or political activities."

Marcel-Keyes said she received an outpouring of support when disclosing her sexual orientation, but her friend did not.

"Like me, he grew up queer in a conservative household," she said. But where she got hundreds of e-mails, offers of a place to stay and a college scholarship, "he'd been out there two years and had gotten nothing."

"And the worst part is, he isn't the only one," Marcel-Keyes said.








#### 'Ex-gay' Billboards in Texas Stir Anger

The LGBT community in Houston and Galveston is reacting angrily after 15 billboards appeared with the message "I questioned homosexuality. Change is possible. Discover how.

The billboards feature either a man or a woman and promote Focus on the Family's "Love Won Out" conference set for Feb. 19 in Houston. The conference bills itself as "a dynamic oneday conference addressing, understanding and preventing homosexuality."

Galveston resident B. Joe Cline of Lighthouse Freedom Ministry raised money from various Christian organizations to put up the billboards. Cline says he was inspired by his son, who Cline claims was able to change his sexual orientation.

Community activist Ray Hill says the billboards are a sign of desperation. "Focus on the Family charges big bucks for this seminar. And Grace Community Church, which is hosting the thing, is worried it will take a bath. So the billboards have been put up so the church won't suffer."

The conference costs \$50 for advance registration. Walk-in registration costs \$60.

"I don't know if they're going to get enough suckers in to make it profitable, but they're trying," Hill added. "This is all about money."

Sue Null, an advocacy chair for the Houston chapter of the Parents, Family and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (PFLAG) told the Houston Chronicle that her organization is considering an appropriate response to the billboards.

"For an organization to spend their time and money promoting untruth and lies against gays, lesbians, bisexuals and transgenders is a deplorable situation," she said.

John Paulk, the author of the book "Love Won Out," which is the inspiration behind these conferences, made the cover of Newsweek for claiming people could change their sexual orientation. He would later leave Focus on the Family after being photographed by a Human Rights Campaign staffer at a gay bar in Washington, D.C.

According to the American Psychiatric Association's Web site, "There is no published scientific evidence supporting the efficacy of 'reparative therapy' as a treatment to change one's sexual orientation. It is not described in the scientific literature, nor is it mentioned in the APA's latest comprehensive Task Force Report, "Treatments of Psychiatric Disorders." (1989)

"There is no evidence that any treatment can change a homosexual person's deep-seated sexual feelings for others of the same sex," the APA says.

The Web site concludes, "Clinical experience suggests that any person who seeks conversion therapy may be doing so because of social bias that has resulted in internalized homophobia, and that gay men and lesbians who have accepted their sexual orientation positively are better adjusted than those who have not done so."

#### GLAAD CONDEMNS EDUCATION SECRETARY'S ATTEMPT TO PROMOTE IGNORANCE OF SAME-SEX FAMILIES

NEW YORK, WEDNESDAY, JAN. 26, 2004 -- The Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation (GLAAD) today condemned Bush Administration Education Secretary Margaret Spellings' attacks on PBS and an upcoming "Postcards from Buster" episode where the lead character, Buster, visits with children who have lesbian parents.

Although PBS has said that its decision (reported by the Associated Press) not to distribute the "Sugartime!" episode of "Postcards from Buster" had nothing to do with Spellings' objection to its representation of gay people, Spellings' letter to PBS contains language suggesting that she intends to use the Department of Education's Ready-to-Learn Television grants program as a means of preventing participating media projects from presenting inclusive images of same-sex families.

"For the Department of Education to try to prevent television programs from depicting gays and lesbians should raise serious concerns for all Americans," said GLAAD Executive Director Joan M. Garry. "Secretary Spellings' attempt to create and enforce a policy of invisibility for gay and lesbian families is a profoundly offensive display of intolerance, one that imposes on our children an agenda of ignorance under the guise of 'education."

WGBH, the Boston public television station that produces "Postcards from Buster," has said that it intends to air the "Sugartime!" episode and will make it available to other stations.

The Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation (GLAAD) is dedicated to promoting and ensuring fair, accurate and inclusive representation of people and events in the media as a means of eliminating homophobia and discrimination based on gender identity and sexual orientation.

## Gay 'Survivor' Winner Arraigned Over Taxes

PROVIDENCE, R.I. -"Survivor" winner Richard Hatch was arraigned
Tuesday in federal court
on charges that he never
paid taxes on the \$1
million he won on the
hit CBS reality show.

Hatch did not enter a plea, but told U.S. Magistrate Judge Lincoln Almond that he understood the charges, and



waived his right to a grand jury. Almond released Hatch on a \$50,000 bond, which the reality TV star posted immediately following the hearing.

A plea hearing will be scheduled at a later date with U.S. District Judge Ernest Torres. Prosecutors said they expected Hatch to eventually plead guilty as part of an agreement in which they would recommend leniency when Hatch is sentenced.

Hatch, dressed in green khakis and a baggy plaid flannel shirt, would not comment outside the courtroom, and slipped past reporters as he exited the building.

Federal prosecutors charged that Hatch. 43, filed false 2000 and 2001 tax returns, omitting his income from the CBS show, as well as another \$321,000 he was paid by a Boston radio station.

Hatch, who lives in Newport, faces a maximum five years in federal prison and a \$250,000 fine for each charge.

In deciding to release Hatch, Almond found that he was not a flight risk, given his strong ties to the state. Almond ordered Hatch, who has been traveling as a motivational speaker and has made numerous television appearances since his 2000 Survivor win, to surrender his passport. He prohibited Hatch from leaving Rhode Island without the court's permission.

Hatch was also ordered to submit to periodic drug and alcohol tests.

As part of the plea agreement, Hatch said he would pay the taxes he owes, which the government said are between \$200,000 and \$400,000. The agreement does not shield him from any penalties the Internal Revenue Service might impose.

According to the U.S. Attorney's Office, Survivor Entertainment Group paid Hatch \$10,000 in August 2000 for appearing on the final episode of the reality show and \$1 million for being declared the show's winner. Prosecutors allege that in November 2002, Hatch filed a false personal income tax return for the 2000 tax year by failing to report the \$1.01 million.

Prosecutors also said that Hatch failed to report income he earned working as on-air co-host and on-air personality for "The Wilde Show" on WQSX-FM in Boston between January and December 2001.

On "Survivor," Hatch stood out because of his penchant for nudity and as the only openly gay contestant. Dave Letterman dubbed him the "fat naked guy."

Since the television show, Hatch has weathered a series of legal battles.

He was arrested in April 2000 on a charge of abusing his then 9 -year-old son. That charge was later dropped.

In 2002, in a ruling that overturned a conviction from several months earlier, Hatch was found innocent of assaulting his exboyfriend.

#### 'Ex-gay' Therapist Cited For Ethics Breeches

Richard Cohen, an influential figure in the "ex-gay" movement, has been permanently expelled from the American Counseling Association (ACA) because of ethics violations, according to an ACA document.

Cohen, billed as an "expert in sexual reorientation therapy," is the board president of Parents and Friends of Ex-Gays (PFOX) and author of "Coming Out Straight: Understanding and Healing Homosexuality." He claims that he was not gay; he had "same-sex attraction disorder" and has since been healed.

The ACA announcement was obtained by Wayne Besen, author of "Anything But Straight: Unmasking the Scandals and Lies Behind the Ex-Gay Myth," and posted on his Web site on Tuesday.

The ACA said Cohen was expelled for violations of six ethical codes and that he "has not elected to appeal the decision taken by the ACA Ethics Committee." Details about the violations were not specified, but they corresponded to ACA codes of conduct toward clients, such as avoiding dual relationships or fostering dependent counseling ties.

The case was closed on May 28, 2002, according to Larry Freeman, the ACA's manager of ethics and professional standards.

Ex-Gay Therapist Cited, Continues......

"It is no surprise that Richard Cohen violated the ACA ethics,

because reparative therapy itself lacks integrity and attempts to meet their agenda's need, not the needs of clients," said Joe Kort, psychotherapist and author of "10 Smart Things Gay Men Can Do to Improve Their Lives."

"Of particular note is that Cohen's violations are self-serving, as he is accused of violating standard ethics of protecting his client from dual relationships, marketing purposes and testimonials," Kort added.

Considered a success story for the "ex-gay" movement, Cohen is an adviser to conservative radio host Dr. Laura Schlessinger, and he has advocated his therapeutic theories on "The O'Reilly Factor," "20/20" and other shows.

One man who considered himself "ex-gay" for 17 years said Cohen's book, "Coming Out Straight," ultimately discouraged him from keeping up the struggle to change his orientation. Rick from Fredonia, N.Y., (who asked that his last name be withheld), said Cohen relies on a common reparative therapy theory: A child who doesn't form a healthy bond with his or her same-sex parent develops an "unhealthy" sexuality.

"Cohen's approach is to utilize 'holding therapy' as a way of repairing the bond and help a person transition from homosexuality to their 'inherent' heterosexuality," Rick told the PlanetOut Network.

"I found this basic concept to be very damaging to me," he said.
"I was always 'sick' or 'broken' or in some other way inadequate as a human being. Because therapy always focused on my father and his supposed absence and bad parenting, my relationship with him suffered."

Rick added, "I decided to stop being 'ex-gay' after a long process in which I determined being gay was not a sickness to be healed or a sin to be repented of."

The American Psychiatric Association has repudiated "reparative therapy" for homosexuality. "There is no evidence that any treatment can change a homosexual person's deep-seated sexual feelings for others of the same sex," the group claims on its Web site.

#### San Francisco Mayor Urges Gays to Use Clout

Politicians who want to ban same-sex marriage shouldn't expect money from gays and lesbians, says Mayor Gavin Newsom.

SAN FRANCISCO — Marking the anniversary of his decision to sanction same-sex marriages, Mayor Gavin Newsom on

Saturday urged gay couples to back politicians who support gay marriage, saying it is time "to hold our elected officials accountable"

"It is no longer acceptable for politicians to come to you every election cycle and ask for money and then say, `It's too much, too soon," Newsom told about 3,000 gay and lesbian supporters during a ceremony to remember last year's "Winter of Love," the four-week period when his administration granted marriage licenses to same-sex couples.

The licenses were later voided by the California Supreme Court, which ruled that Newsom had overstepped his authority.

A ruling is expected any day on a pair of lawsuits filed by the city and same-sex couples that seek to overturn California's marriage laws.

"He is a hero, especially to be a straight man and to stand up for our rights when he doesn't have to;' said Beth McLaughlin, 40, who married her partner last year.

The couple was about to leave on an anniversary cruise to Mexico, but McLaughlin said they didn't hesitate to drive nearly 100 miles to hear the mayor speak at City Hall.

"For him to back us has been awesome, and he has stuck his head out on the chopping block quite a few times," she said.

The 37-year-old Democrat is blamed for feeding a rush to the polls in November, when 11 states passed amendments banning gay marriage. Gay marriage opponents have taken steps to do the same in another 17 states, according to the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force.

Newsom's "too much, too soon" remarks appeared aimed at Sen. Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.), who has said Newsom's decision to let gay couples marry played a role in President Bush's reelection.

## **New Backer of Gay Marriage**

**BOSTON**-The Massachusetts attorney general, who played a key role in state efforts to fight the legalization of gay marriage a year ago, now says he favors same-sex marriage and will oppose any efforts to ban it.

Thomas Reilly, an unannounced Democratic candidate for governor, said he would vote against a constitutional amendment to ban gay marriage if it reaches the 2006 state ballot.

"Once rights are given, they should not be taken away," Reilly told The Boston Globe for Saturday's editions.

Reilly fought gay marriage supporters in the case that led the Supreme Judicial Court to rule that it was unconstitutional to bar same-sex couples from marrying.

On May 17 2004, Massachusetts became the first state to recognize same-sex weddings.

Reilly said he concluded "no one has been hurt" by the samesex marriages that have taken place.

Tim O'Brien, leader of the state GOP, said Reilly has "completely flip-flopped" because he needs to answer to a special-interest group.


