## Aleta Fenceroy

12/27/1948 - 9/23/2006

From her spouse Jean Mayberry

As most, if not all of you know, Aleta has been battling cancer since she was diagnosed on June 15th of this year. I was blessed to be with Aleta at the end of her life. She died at home, in a hospital bed that I had set up in the dining room next to a big window so that she could look out at the garden. She lived just over 3



months after she was diagnosed with cancer, but she had many good days. Aleta died peacefully in the company of friends and family who loved her.

She had wonderful visits with her two children, Michelle and J.J., who flew in from Phoenix and Africa respectively. She was able to read to her granddaughters, Chloe and Ella, and hold the newest addition, little Teaghan.

And even though this was a terrible situation, we were able to take so many good things from it. The incredible support and love we felt from friends close by and far away really sustained us. We grew closer to each other and to our families. We found humor and learned lessons of courage and compassion from fellow cancer patients and their families. We learned to enjoy the little moments that make our days and our lives so precious.

Aleta raised two children on her own, a single mom on welfare, working part-time and going to college to earn a Master of Music Degree. She graduated from Morningside College in Sioux City, 1A and received her Masters at the University Of Minnisota, in Minneapolis. She was a church organist for 30 years, 4 of which were spent in Norway. She worked for the State of Iowa Department of Corrections for over 15 years before going back to school to earn an Associates Degree in computer programming in 1998. She then took a job in Omaha, Nebraska with First Data Resources as an analyst/programmer and software writer. She LOVED her job. She loved solving puzzles, following trails and picking up clues and that was her favorite part of being a programmer.

She was dogged in her pursuit of answers at work and that is how she was in most aspects of her life. When she sunk her teeth into something, she didn't let go. Hence, 8 years of "Fenceberry Articles." Hour upon hour and day upon day were spent on the home computer. Aleta was determined to hunt down the story; to get the news out; to defend her community; and to right the wrongs to the best of her ability. And she did it with love, wit, dignity and charm. That is the way she lived her life and that is the way she died.

She will be terribly missed. She is terribly missed.

A memorial celebration of her life has been planned and arrangements will be finalized when her son knows on which dates he will be in Omaha. There will be no funeral. Aleta requested there be no flowers. Anyone wishing to make a donation should write a check to the American Civil Liberties Union.

Many Omaha area gay and lesbian homeowners who have had trouble with credit cards and so on have found that there is *one* place in Omaha where they can be treated with respect.

No "better than you" attitude, no "b.s.", no guilt just for being gay or lesbian

At last, finding financial help doesn't have to be like a "coming out" at Thanksgiving dinner with everyone pointing fingers, and finding fault.

Mindy Hahne, of Service First Solutions in Omaha's Midtown area works at a GLBT friendly outfit that *specializes* in helping Omaha area GLBT homeowners in need.

Hahne says she takes great pride in being gay and lesbian friendly. And treating the folks she helps like family.

"A lot of people in the GLBT community don't realize that even without gay marriage, or civil unions, there are already several equal protections in place for gay and lesbians as real property owners! Maybe because no one else wants to tell you about them!" Mindy says.

"Being gay or lesbian doesn't have to be a barrier to equal treatment anymore!' Hahne says.

Hahne has helped many gays and lesbians over the years, many personal friends.

"I am the one person in town that specializes in helping gay and lesbian folks with debt consolidation, cash out, credit repair and so on!" Hahne says.

"These are good people with damaged credit reports and/or hard to prove income! Not through any fault of their own! I specialize in helping the gay and lesbian community get a fair shake from the financial industry!" Hahne

Hahne says she has a lot of connections to Wall Street money, "I have personal relationships with investors nationwide, even internationally! Fair-minded people who want to fund loans for people with past credit problems!" she says.

"Many of them have a social conscience! And they take pride in helping gay and lesbians in particular! Just like I do! They use my proprietary system as their own little bit of "social activism!" Hahne says.

These investors are people who buy 'pools' of mortgages of 50 million dollars at a whack! 50 million bucks! It's taken me 5 long years and it's been really hard to find these 'fat cats!' People who are 'like-minded' about what I do for the Omaha gay and lesbian community!' Mindy says.

"Not only is it *illegal* to discriminate against the GLBT community, it's just plain wrong!" Hahne says. "The self-limiting perceptions held by some in the community are just as much of a problem as the crooked people who perpetrate the discriminatory practices themselves!" she says.

Hahne says, "It's my personal mission to change the mindsets! And to liberate everyone from the restraints!"

"I grew up in a house where we didn't have much money! And my parents understood just how money really works even less! Nowadays, it's a lot of fun for me to help people get control over their money and their lives!" Mindy says.

# The Fitness Corner

Running reminds me of Chariots of Fire, Oprah's marathon adventure, "Run, Forrest, Run!", and those 10 laps around the gym to start freshman P. E. class. I love to run and I know there are ten million weirdos like me

out there. And for those of you contemplating joining this Priory of Dyin' secret society, I am going to help you find your perfect "sole" mate. That is the perfect pair of running shoes.

There are some basics you need to know before selecting that sui generis pair of shoes. It has nothing to do with haute couture, color, and Versace. Leave all that to the fashion cognoscentes on 7th Avenue in New York. What you need to concern yourself with will have a direct impact on your body's well-being.

Let's start with an explanation of pronation. Conjunction junction, what's your function. Pronation is the rotation of the foot downward and inward when you land on the ground. Pronation is something we all do and it is quite normal. It simply helps the foot absorb the shock of impact from running. Some runners overpronate. Their feet roll too far inward. Some runners underpronate or supinate. Their feet don't roll inward enough. Both of these conditions can cause injuries over time.


You can determine which category you fall into by checking you arch heights. Your arch decides how your legs and feet will operate when you run. Fifty percent of runners have normal arches while twenty-five percent have low arches and twenty-five percent have high arches. The best method for analysis is by means of the "wet test".

Wet the bottom of your bare foot and then stand on a flat, dry surface. A good recommendation is to stand firmly on a white piece of paper. If the resulting footprint is really full and wide and has no arch then you are flat-footed or an overpronator. If the footprint is slight and curved and you can only see the ball and heel of your foot then you are high-arched or a supinator.

Flat-footers like myself need motion-control shoes. Higharched runners or supinators need cushioned shoes. Runners with normal arches can celebrate their status by getting any shoe they want. Normalites can get stability shoes if they so desire a category or label.

With those basics, you can go shopping. I recommend going to a running specialty store. The good folks at these stores can further assist you in getting that most special pair of ruby red slippers. The store associates will probably gather some additional information from you by asking such questions as: How long have you been running? How many miles do you run? What terrain do you run on? How much do you weigh? Boxers or briefs?!!?

It is wise to shop later in the day. Your feet expand during the day and will be most comparable to your expanded feet when



If you drink well water, have a septic tank, and get up at 5AM to milk the cows, then the odds are good that you don't have a running specialty store nearby. In that case, call the good people at Road Runner Sports in San Diego. They are the running specialty store for you. They are so darn helpful and they have a liberal return policy if the shoes don't fit when you finally try them on.

Now for some final advice. Get new shoes every 400 to 500 miles. Only use your running shoes for running. Don't mow the lawn in them. Don't go dancing in them. Just running. Keep your shoes dry if at all possible, You denizens of Seattle know that's not gonna happen! If they do get wet, then just let them air-dry. Do not put them in the dryer or use a blow dryer on them. Big mistake. Just air-dry. A fan or some newspaper inside them can help. Find a good brand and model and stick with it as long as the company keeps making them. Don't mess with success.

You now have your pair of running shoes and know how to take care of them. Time to go grab a burger and beer and discuss what other former boy-band member is gay.


