A Sincere Apology

Leaders of ex-gay programs apologized to LGBT people in a press conference and called on other leaders to do the same

As the director of an ex-gay ministry in Hayward, Calif., Darlene Bogle appeared on shows like Sally Jesse Raphael, Jerry Springer, and 48 Hours to tell people that being gay is "curable." She wrote several articles and two books—Long Road to Love and Strangers in a Christian Land—about being an ex-gay and held workshops on the subject.

In 1990, Bogle met Des, who was attending one of her ex-gay workshops, and sensed instantly that God bought them together. Within weeks Bogle was asked to step down from her leadership position at the Foursquare Church and she was removed from the Exodus ministry.

Bogle, joined by former ex-gay ministers Jeremy Marks and Michael Bussee, held a press conference on June 27 at the Los Angeles Gay and Lesbian Center with Soulforce and Beyond Ex-Gay to apologize for exposing LGBT Christians to such indoctrination.

The press conference and apology precedes the Ex-Gay Survivor's Conference in Irvine, Calif., this weekend. Beyond Ex-Gay and Soulforce partnered with the University of California, Irvine's LGBT Resource Center to sponsor the conference with workshops, speeches, and entertainment.

"Although we acted in good faith, we have since witnessed the isolation, shame, fear, and loss of faith that this message creates," Bussee said, speaking for the group. "We apologize for our part in the message of broken truth we spoke on behalf of Exodus and other organizations."

Bussee, the cofounder of Exodus International, said that he was a devout evangelical who started the ex-gay movement in the 1970s out of his own self-hate. Eventually he and another cofounder, Gary Cooper, left the group and their wives to be together and happy. He has been critical of Exodus ever since.

In 1986, Marks became a member of a ministry in the United Kingdom where he met other gay Christians mired in the same struggle to be straight. He headed several ex-gay programs, including Courage U.K., and later became president of Exodus International Europe. By 2000, Marks abandoned the ex-gay theories and transformed Courage U.K. into a gay-affirming evangelical ministry.

Ex-gay survivor Eric Leocadio was on hand to witness the official apology in Los Angeles. As a high school freshman Leocadio ingested two fistfuls of pills, hoping to kill himself so that he would not have to struggle with his sexual orientation.

"When I survived," said Leocadio, now 31, "I realized that God





wasn't done with me. There was so much more that God had
planned for me."

But his journey of self-acceptance was arduous. After his suicide attempt Leocadio became a devoted Christian and used his spirituality to stifle his same-sex attractions. At 26 he ended up at the Desert Stream Ministries in Anaheim, Calif., where he underwent an intensive ex-gay program to heal his "brokenness" (along with masturbators, prostitutes, and fellow gays), yearning to live a straight and "normal" life.

"I received a lot of mixed signals from the church," he said.

"Everyone gets unconditional love from God but only conditional love from the church, based on the concept of 'wholeness.'"

Leocadio left Desert Stream in 2004 when he realized the promise of an ex-gay life devoid of same-sex attraction wasn't true. It became clear to him that one could not just shed sexuality and that he would have to devote the rest of his life to praying against his sexual urges. The following year Leoncadio started his TwoWorldCollision blog to document the conflict between being gay and being Christian; his posts have been known to move people to tears and inspire e-mail responses from around the world.


"I wanted to get to the point where I owned my belief," he said.
"What I knew about Christianity was the only thing I was
taught. I decided to take a step back and learn more. I met other
gay Christians who had a genuine faith and love for God.
Through meeting them, I have been able to truly learn the love
of God and own it for myself."







Terror Threat Can't Keep Pride Down

Despite lashing rain and last week's attempted terrorist attacks, London Pride blazed ahead, attracting tens of thousand revelers for the annual festivities.

The march began at Baker Street and made its way as planned through the West End, through Oxford Street and Regent Street, confronting a hostile, yet small group of conservative Christians and National Front protesters at the bottom of Haymarket before spilling into Trafalgar Square for a rally and pop performances.

Pride organizers met with police Friday and determined there was no need to cancel the festivities. Police deployed more than 350 officers to secure the event, supporting their LGBT comrades, who marched in the parade in uniform, as did members of the Royal Navy.

On Friday, London Mayor Ken Livingstone insisted he would be attending the Gay Pride march, saying, "I think people are completely safe to walk about the streets of London today and tomorrow.

"I have promised my family all week that we are all going on the Gay Pride march. We will all be there," Livingstone told BBC radio. "I suspect virtually everybody who intended to go on that march will be there."

Livingstone joined actor John Barrowman and comedian Amy Lam on Pride's lead float before speaking in Trafalgar Square with his two young children. He was joined by Labor and Liberal Democrat members of Parliament.

Commenting on the gay community's defiant response to the terror threats, a proud Livingstone recalled London's similar response to the July 7, 2005 terrorist bomb plot aboard London's transit system. (Gay.com U.K.)

Enzyme Seen to Scrub HIV from Cells

Scientists in Germany have discovered a way to remove the HIV virus from infected cells, the Associated Press reported. The study, published in Science magazine, involved a newly engineered enzyme that attacks the DNA of the virus and cuts it from infected cells.

"A customized enzyme that effectively excises integrated HIV-1 from infected cells in vitro might one day help to eradicate (the) virus from AIDS patients," Alan Engelman, of Harvard University's Dana-Farber Cancer Institude, wrote in an article accompanying the study, AP reported.

The study's authors say the the enzyme, called Tre, won't be available as a treatment any time in the near future, but say it's a step forward in the fight 40 million infected people face worldwide.

The enzyme's method of finding the HIV virus' DNA might be the key to solving what the article calls a substantial obstacle the virus' ability to go undetected for several months or years because of its occasional dormancy within infected cells. Still, barriers remain before the enzyme can be made publicly available.

"The most important, and likely most difficult, among these is that the enzyme would need efficient and safe means of delivery and would have to be able to function without adverse side effects," wrote Indrani Sarkar of the Max Planck Institute for Molecular Cell Biology and Genetics in Dresden, the lead author of the Science article.

"Nevertheless, the results we present offer an early proof of principal for this type of approach, which we speculate might form a useful basis for the development of future HIV therapies," Sarkar wrote. (The Advocate)

Consider Yourself Lucky

How Typical

It was reported last week that 26 men were arrested for what police in the United Arab Emirates called a "gay wedding."

All of the men were charged with homosexuality, a crime under Sharia (Islamic) law, and have been sentenced each to five years in prison.

This case has received nationwide attention recently after the Iranian government suggested giving the men male hormone treatment to "direct the men away from homosexual behavior."

According to the exiled Iranian gay rights group, Homan, the Iranian government has executed at least 4,000 homosexuals since 1979.

I found this information quite shocking after watching the HBO documentary Middle Sexes: Redefining He and She. A large portion of the film was centered on Middle Eastern sexual identity.

I am no expert in the laws of the Middle East, but I was shocked to hear a few interpretations of what the term "gay" and "homosexual" meant to some in the Arab world.

First of all "gay sex" and "gay sexual attachment" are two totally different things. Having sex with a man is acceptable. It's simply a form of sexual release, and does not mean you are gay (unless you are in a marriage, then it is considered adultery). However, if you start developing feelings and any form of attachment, you are considered a homosexual, and ultimately an outcast. Which is why the 26 men getting married were arrested.

I recently read an interesting article on the topic of Arab homosexuality and was quite surprised by its contents. The story was called Equivocal Lifestyles by Nur Sati. The article is about a European male who studied abroad in Jordan. He talks about how common it is to find Arabic men holding hands, or hugging each other on the streets without a female in sight. He also states how easy it is to approach someone for sexual intercourse. Marcus, the European male, says he feels comfortable approaching a man in Jordan with frankness about his desires. Even though the man may not be gay, there is some sort of "understanding" about what is going on, and little or no offense would be taken.

These behaviors are something those in the West would consider "homosexual behavior," but same sex desires/couples aren't a topic of discussion in the Arab world.

The 2004 movie, Touch of Pink, does a humorous and factual representation of this culture. The film follows a young Arabic male who moves to England to pursue his career. While in England he falls in love with another man, and is afraid to tell his family. Long story short, his family is devastated/outraged, but

later comes around in the end. It paints a good picture of how some of his family members accepted "male-male sexual activity," but condemned homosexuality.

I guess the reason I am discussing this issue is because I think as a society, including myself, we so often complain about things we should ultimately appreciate. I know that if I want to buy a house with the man of my dreams, I can do so without the fear of being exiled, killed, or injected with male hormones. Sure I might have to deal with a few stares or remarks, but I would consider that a small price to pay.

It's still hard to believe that certain cultures still treat homosexuals and women in such a discouraging fashion, especially when our American soldiers (including thousands of homosexuals) are over there defending their freedom and their beliefs.

The new Iraqi constitution fails to provide protection to homosexuals, but, it does state that "each person has the right to personal privacy as long as it does not violate the rights of others or general morality." In a part of the world where most find homosexuality immoral, I don't see this as being hopeful.

I guess it's stories like these that make me realize how different our world is. To think that an 18-hour flight to the Middle East could be a difference in life and death for me is mind-boggling. I truly consider myself lucky.
