

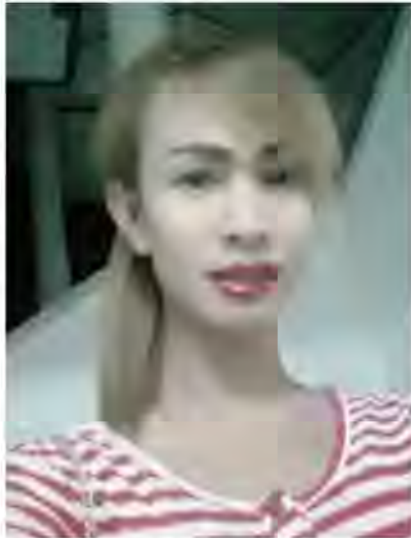


Body of Trans Woman Hidden in Hotel Bed Where Next Guests Were Sleeping

NOTE: Details in this story might be too graphic for some readers.

For four days and three nights, the body of a murdered transgender woman lay concealed in the bed frame of her Thailand hotel room. She remained unnoticed by cleaning staff until the next guests complained about the pungent odor.



The couple asked the hotel to deal with that smell and, according to PinkNews, that's when a hotel worker noticed the stench emanated from the bed, and that blood was leaking from the frame.

The decomposing body of Amphon Kongsong, 28, was discovered Saturday at the Soi Buakhao hotel in Pattaya, Thailand. She had checked in August 16.

Police say she had met a 17-year-old boy on Facebook and invited him and his 14-year-old friend to her room where they stayed for a few nights.

The boys confessed to killing Kongsong, claiming she made sexual advances that they found unwelcome.

Police chief Apichai Kropphet told reporters the 17-year-old admitted he strangled her, while the younger boy held her down.

Kropphet said police had arrested the pair and they faced charges of murder and concealing the body.

Vegas Cops Bust YouTuber Who Threatened to Kill 'Faggots and Lesbians'

Police in Las Vegas are holding a prolific alt-right vlogger who vowed in a YouTube video to murder "gays, faggots, lesbians and Satanists" and claimed to be a Christian warrior who was getting ready to kill soon, according to KTNV-TV.



The station reported police believe they stopped Bryce Cuellar (pictured at right) before he could potentially commit a mass shooting.

As Joe.My.God noted in sharing the TV station's reports, this was not just some crank with a webcam. Police say over the past three years his videos have grown more radical and aggressive and they have attracted a considerable following. Some 160,000 accounts are subscribed to the YouTube channel associated with Cuellar, and its videos have been viewed 73 million times.

Google, which owns YouTube, had taken down the video containing the threats even before detectives were notified by Interpol, back on July 2. Even so, the international police outfit was able to provide a link for them to view Cuellar's disturbing video, according to the station.

In that clip, Cuellar is wearing a military flak jacket and brandishing two rifles as well as night vision goggles, as he declares he is tired of the government trying to take away his First and Second Amendment rights. According to a police report on the video, Cuellar says that "he cannot wait to use his rifle in the manner in which the founding fathers intended."

Conservative Pastor: “Stoning Gays is the Mindset of God”

The New Civil Rights Movement reports that pastor Ben Bailey of the Central Church of Christ recorded a video in which he suggests “the mindset of God” is strongly in favor of stoning gay people to death.

According to Bailey, God has “a definite standard and it is not the liberal mindset that we see today.”

The speech was part of his weekly “The Gospel of Christ” evangelistic program, which, according to the website, “seeks to teach and preach THE WHOLE COUNSEL OF GOD.”

“God does not approve of homosexuality or gay marriage,” Bailey claims. “The scripture says... that is vile, unnatural and deserving of a penalty... It’s an abomination that under the Old Testament deserved stoning.”

“And so, is our God, the God of Bible, wanting us to go somewhere where it’s liberal, relaxed views and anything goes? No, that’s the effect of a very liberal society. And we need to make sure that such is not the idea or the mindset of God.”



Chicago Will Issue 10,000th Same-Sex Marriage License This Week

CHICAGO (AP) — Cook County officials say they expect to issue the 10,000th marriage license to a same-sex couple this week.

Cook County Clerk David Orr held a news conference Monday morning along with state lawmakers and civil right groups to mark the milestone. He says that as of Monday morning the clerk’s office has issued 9,990 marriage licenses to same-sex couples.



The Illinois Legislature approved a gay marriage law in late 2013, making Illinois the 16th state to allow same-sex marriages. The law took effect in June 2014.

State Rep. Greg Harris and state Sen. Heather Steans, who sponsored the Illinois legislation, were at Monday’s event in Chicago.

The U.S. Supreme Court legalized gay marriage in June 2015.

Federal Court Blocks North Carolina from Enforcing HB2 During Court Case

Plaintiff: 'The fight is not over'

A federal court granted a request on Friday (26 August) that will stop North Carolina's HB2 law from being enforced while it is



being challenged in court.

Passed earlier this year, HB2 diminishes workplace protections for LGBTI people including blocking local governments from passing anti-discrimination laws. In addition, it requires transgender citizens to use public restrooms according to their birth certificate gender.

The ruling came in a lawsuit filed by the American Civil Liberties Union, the ACLU of North Carolina, Lambda Legal, and the law firm of Jenner & Block on behalf of several LGBTI North Carolinians.

‘Today is a great day for me and hopefully this is the start to chipping away at the injustice of HB2 that is harming thousands of other transgender people who call North Carolina home,’ said Joaquín Carcaño, lead plaintiff in the case.

‘Today, the tightness that I have felt in my chest every day since HB2 passed has eased. But the fight is not over. We won't rest until this discriminatory law is defeated.

The lawsuit is scheduled to go to trial on 14 November. The groups filed the motion for preliminary injunction while the case proceeds through the court system.

Lambda Legal senior attorney Tara Borelli said the ruling stops some of the ‘grave harm’ the law imposes on her transgender clients.

‘This ruling is an important first step to make sure that thousands of LGBT people who call North Carolina home – particularly transgender people – get the privacy, respect, and protections afforded others in the state,’ Borelli stated.

The lawsuit maintains that through the law, North Carolina sends a purposeful message that LGBTI people are second-class citizens who are undeserving of the privacy, respect, and protections afforded others in the state.

North Carolina and the federal government are also facing each other in court over HB2.

Hillary's Mental Health Plan Could Help Make Sure It Gets Better

Hillary Clinton's campaign today released a comprehensive plan to improve access to mental health care in the United States, highlighting the economic and human cost of untreated depression, suicidal ideation, and numerous other conditions.



If it were put into place, Clinton's strategy could have a ripple effect for LGBT people, who are not only more likely to struggle with mental health than their straight, cisgender (non-trans) peers, but are also often unable to access competent health care to help them manage these issues.

Perhaps most importantly for LGBT people, Clinton's mental health platform calls for federal support for suicide prevention, including a national initiative to combat suicide led by the U.S. Surgeon General and the adoption of evidence-based suicide prevention and mental health programs in high schools, colleges, and universities. The platform directly mentions LGBT people in its pledge to work with schools and experts "to ensure that students of color and LGBT students are receiving adequate mental health coverage."

Promising that Clinton will convene a White House conference on mental health during her first year as president, the platform calls for the unification of mental and physical health care, intended to ensure "the next generation [grows] up knowing that mental health is a key component of overall health and there is no shame, stigma, or barriers to seeking out care."

That focus on reducing shame and stigma will sound familiar especially to LGBT Americans, who have been navigating the negative health consequences of dangerous political rhetoric and intersecting oppressions since long before the "homosexuality" was first listed as a mental illness in the early 19th century.

Study after study shows that LGBT Americans suffer from mental health disorders at rates far exceeding heterosexual, cisgender people — depression strikes gay men at six times the rate of straight men; nearly half of transgender people experience symptoms of anxiety and depression; lesbians and bisexual women also deal with higher rates of mental health problems than their straight sisters, with bisexual women faring even worse than lesbians. LGB youth are four times more likely, and questioning youth three times more likely, to attempt suicide as their straight peers; 41 percent of transgender people have attempted to end their lives.

The platform further discusses the importance of early diagnosis and intervention, calling for an increased public understanding that most mental health issues begin in childhood or adolescence. Improving the efficacy and availability of these evidence-based interventions, through information-sharing among experts, medical providers, and caretakers, will help strengthen the support networks already in place to help people with men-

tal disabilities, the platform contends.

In a nod to the ways that class privilege and socio-economic status contribute to the mental health of various communities, Clinton's plan also acknowledges that the nation must better enforce existing health care parity laws and provide more and better housing and job opportunities for people with mental health issues.

The platform also admits that the modern criminal justice system has become the nation's "'front line' of engagement with individuals with mental health problems." Instead of placing mentally unstable individuals in prison, Clinton's plan looks to prioritize treatment over punishment (especially for nonviolent first-time offenders) and promises to invest in specialized recovery and diversionary programs to keep such individuals out of state and federal prisons.

Noting that as many as one in 10 police encounters in America involve a person with some form of mental illness, Clinton's plan stresses that law enforcement must receive better training in de-escalating interactions with individuals who are in the midst of a mental health crisis. Although police officers routinely interact with people struggling with mental health issues, most receive minimal training on how to respond nonviolently in such a scenario. A March study from the Ruderman Family Foundation determined that "up to half of all people killed by police in the United States are disabled," including those who have some form of intellectual disability.

The dangerous outcome of these uninformed interactions between police and disabled Americans was put on shocking display last month in Florida, when a North Miami police officer shot Charles Kinsey, an unarmed black man and behavioral therapist who was lying on the ground with his hands up, explaining to officers that the young man sitting next to him was his autistic client carrying a toy truck, not a weapon of any kind. After the officer shot Kinsey, the therapist reportedly asked the officer why he fired his weapon, and the officer responded, "I don't know."

In February, a 24-year-old transgender man in Arizona was shot to death in his home by police who were responding to a request for a wellness check from a coworker who believed the young man might be suicidal. Kayden Clarke, who had Asperger syndrome and trauma surrounding what he said were years of physical, emotional, and sexual abuse, allegedly brandished a 12-inch kitchen knife when two officers appeared at his door. The responding officers reportedly felt so threatened that they fatally shot the young man. Clarke was remembered as a gifted animal trainer and compassionate volunteer who had made headlines a year earlier when a video of him working with his service dog, Samson, went viral.

Help! My Girlfriend Is Convinced I'm Gay After I Made This Request In Bed

A young man on Reddit claims that what was supposed to be an



innocent discussion with his girlfriend about their sexual fantasies went unexpectedly awry.

"The other morning, me and my apparently sane, rational girlfriend were fooling about in bed," the post begins. "All is well, we are naked and having fun, discussing things that we might like to try sexually together."

The topic of "prostate play" came up.

The man explains: "I have experimented before with prostate play, both solo and with partners, and we have even tried prostate massage together so I expressed an interest in pegging. I had to explain to her what that was... and she lost it."

The woman "burst into tears" before grabbing her things, getting dressed and running out of the apartment. She stopped answering her boyfriend's texts and calls and even went so far as to block him on Facebook.

Days later, he says, "I got an email."

The girlfriend wrote that she believed he was deeply closeted and said she wasn't interested in being the vehicle on his road to homosexuality.

"Apparently I 'revealed my latent urges' by asking to be pegged, and I will 'inevitably crave the real thing'," he writes. "She has expressed sorrow for running out on me, but apparently is leaving me for my own good so that I can 'follow my true self'."

But it gets worse, he says.

Days later, he writes, "I ... had literature put through my door on accepting yourself, how to come out, anti-homophobia stuff and PHONE CALLS FROM MY PARENTS. Apparently she rang my mother to let her know I came out to her (the ex) and would need some support."

"Seriously," he says, "WTF??"

Now the man claims mutual friends are reporting that she's telling everyone on Facebook that they've broken up because he's into "prostate play" because he's gay.

"What the hell do I do here," he wonders, "other than never speak to the crazy cow again?"

Man Sentenced to 9 Years for Biting Off Neighbor's Ear in Homophobic Attack

To hear the news that a British judge sentenced 21-year-old ex-con Ryan Kilgariff to nine years behind bars for violently attacking him, Colin Duncan had but one good ear, his left one. Kilgariff had bitten off his right ear.

In March, Kilgariff was fresh out of prison after serving an 80-day sentence for assaulting his mother, reported Kent Online. Duncan, 39, who was aware of his new next door neighbor's criminal past, but not knowing he was a homophobe, invited him to have a drink.

Prosecutors say they drank a bottle of vodka together before buying more bottles of lager. And when the clock struck midnight, Kilgariff launched what they described in court as "a sustained attack" on Duncan, in response to his statement that he was going to bed.

Duncan was kicked, punched and beaten with so many bottles, the prosecution revealed he "cannot remember how many blows were rained down on him as he protected himself with a blanket."

"Throughout the attack," prosecutor Matthew Hardyman told the Canterbury court, "Kilgariff referred to his victim as being 'queer' and gay."

Although the victim was not discovered until the next afternoon, and needed 20 stitches, Kent Online reported surgeons were able to re-attach part of his severed right ear.

"All I was trying to do was be kind and neighborly to a man who had just been released from prison," Duncan told police. "I thought I was going to be murdered."

Kilgariff was caught by police trying to escape through a window. He pleaded guilty to the hate crime and will be required to serve three years probation upon his release in nine years, according to KentOnline.



Pastor who said Pulse Victims Deserved to Die Busted for Child Abuse

Conservative Pastor Ken Adkins of St. Simons Island, Georgia, who has led a public campaign against the rights of LGBTQ Americans, is now an inmate at the jail of Glynn County,

charged with two counts of child molestation.

Adkins, who also goes by the title, Bishop, has been busy of late tweeting about the massacre in Orlando, Fla. His two accounts are protected from public viewing now but the Florida Times-Union reported this is what he tweeted Monday:



"Dear Gays, Go sit down somewhere. I know y'all want some special attention; y'all are sinners who need Jesus. This was an attack on America."

That was followed three hours later by another tweet, which refers in part to a controversial effort in nearby Jacksonville, Fla. to add protections for lesbians, gays, bisexuals and transgender people to an existing anti-discrimination ordinance. Adkins served as a panelist on one of the community forums convened last December to consider the expansion, which ultimately did not happen.

Jacksonville's mayor denounced the tweets Monday, saying, "We are on the heels of an attack on people, a terrorist attack, with people killed and maimed in our state. Suggesting that people should be victims is appalling."

According to the Florida Times-Union, Adkins emailed Curry Tuesday denying the tweet about getting "what they deserve" had anything to do with Orlando.

"My tweet was strictly meant for the Jacksonville group that has made my life a living hell since I served on the panel and opposed the HRO," Adkins wrote, referring to the human rights ordinance that was not expanded.

Adkins claimed it was he and his family who "are the victims here when you understand what I have had to endure for standing up for the Church during the discussions."

The pastor has also stood up in a very clear way for Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump by congratulating him for his nomination on his Twitter page.

The Georgia Bureau of Investigation issued a statement about Adkins' arrest Friday stating Ken Adkins arrested for alleged child molestation.

First Coast News in Jacksonville reports the investigation is ongoing. Adkins' website lists his church headquarters as Brunswick, Georgia, with other churches in Jacksonville and Atlanta. According to the Atlanta Journal Constitution, Adkins had opened a GoFundMe account in April with the banner headline, "My Firm is under Attack by the LGBT by Kenneth Adkins." The account has since closed.

Understanding Anita Bryant, the Woman Who Declared War on Gays

Robert Whirry — a writer of the upcoming play Anita Bryant's Playboy Interview — on why it's so important to know your enemies.

For those of us who've been around long enough to remember who Anita Bryant is and was — and a pat on the back if you do — then it's likely you also remember the devastating impact she and her words had on a generation of young gay men in the '70s who were struggling to come to terms with their sexuality in the days before AIDS struck our community like a sledgehammer. From being alternately amused and annoyed by the perennially grinning Florida Sunshine Tree girl hawking tubes of frozen concentrated orange juice (one container to two quarts of water, as I recall) we quickly went to feeling hurt, shocked, and angered when Anita took up the mantle of a latter-day Joan of Arc to do battle against the sworn enemies of God — the “homosexuals.”



Not only did Anita mobilize an army of haters to combat the great Satan of sodomy, but she laid the groundwork for the modern religious right that planted the seeds of intolerance on school boards, city councils, and local and state ballots across the country — and that led to pronouncements that AIDS was a judgment from God when the epidemic struck. You can trace a blood-red line directly from Anita to the likes of Jerry Falwell, the Moral Majority, and the Tea Party in our own day. Echoes of the movement even resound in Donald Trump's scapegoating of the menacing “other” in the form of immigrants and potential terrorists.

I can remember being 17 years old and nervously buying a copy of Playboy magazine at the newsstand because Anita had given a supposedly scandalous interview about gays and the people who hate them. At the time, the joke was that one read Playboy for the articles, but in my case, of course, the joke was true. I remember sitting on the floor with my supportive friends (all straight in those days) and laughing till we ached at the craziness of her mind-set — especially the confession that her personal turning point of revulsion had come when she found that gay men actually swallowed the semen of other men! I laughed — but at the bottom of the laughter, in the pit of my stomach, was a gaping wound and a confirmation of a deep self-hatred I was desperately trying to overcome and in some ways still am. It was akin to another punch in the gut I received a few years earlier when my mom brought home a copy of Everything You Always Wanted to Know About Sex* (*But Were Afraid to Ask) — the biggest best seller of its time and the first truly honest and open sex guide published in this country — to find that I was doomed to a life of blow jobs in bowling alleys with no hope for love or affection or dignity. Yet just as strongly, I was flummoxed and fascinated by the mind of such a person — how did these beliefs get started? What deep inner fears and hurts did they reveal? Could such a person ever be reached

and changed?

We've come a long way from the bad old days of 1978 and have much to be grateful for. In many ways, Anita reignited a gay rights movement that had gone stale and complacent, setting a torch to a bonfire of hatred around which the gay community could organize. Efforts to demonize people with AIDS backfired in the long run, and the dignity and solidarity with which the gay community addressed the epidemic became an inspiration that helped turn the tide of public opinion toward something like sympathy and even respect. Today, same-sex marriage is a done deal, the law of the land, something I couldn't have imagined a decade ago, although the battle for full equality is far from over. A Centers for Disease Control and Prevention survey published just two weeks ago found that nearly one in every five gay and bisexual students have been raped at some point in their lives, compared to one in 20 heterosexual students, while a shocking one in four have attempted suicide in the previous 12 months. And for all its potential to help cure the loneliness and isolation I felt as a kid growing up gay, social media has become a tool for bullying and shaming that is used against gay and lesbian youth more than any other subgroup.

Yet in the long run, it's still the strangeness and sickness of a mind that can hate that fascinates and haunts me. That mind still parades across my TV and computer screens each day as Trump bellows his random animus at a shooting gallery of nonwhite, non-Christian moving targets while red-capped idolaters shove protestors and call members of the news media traitors. In her Playboy interview, Anita Bryant gave us glimpses into how such a mind gets formed and what the key moments and issues are that can bring it into being. Her distant father, her unhappy mother, her conservative upbringing, the sense of unfairness she felt as an ambitious woman in a sexist society. And of course, probably most importantly, the inner donnybrook she (and most of us) must wage each day against the good old American demon of sexual repression.

What we ultimately hoped to bring about in presenting a literal staging of Anita's interview was a chance to not only laugh at the absurdity and pathos of it all but to contemplate how a hateful mind evolves, and what it might take to diminish that hatred. It's a cause that's just as important — perhaps even more important — than it was in 1978.

Don't Tell the Religious Right: Trump Embodies all Seven Deadly Sins

Here's one of the most enjoyable sights to watch during this election cycle: how religious right leaders willingly abandon

any sense of principle in order to justify their support for Donald Trump. There's a long and hilarious list of reasons, straight from the text, all of which ignores the simple fact that Trump is the least religious presidential candidate since, well, ever. The most religious candidate in this campaign is, of course, Hillary Clinton, a devout Methodist.

Obviously, capturing the presidency and the all-important fifth vote on the Supreme Court is far more important than practicing the values the religious right foists on the rest of us. The ends seem to, ahem, to trump the means, not matter how distasteful.

If anything, Trump is the antithesis of religious virtue. His life is a recap of the seven deadly sins writ large.

Here are some prime examples of how Trump illustrates the worst vices in the Christian tradition, mostly in his own words.

Pride

Like you have to ask, Trump is a walking seminar in narcissism; at least one psychologist is using tapes of him to teach about the personality disorder. By his own account, Trump is never wrong. "I think apologizing's a great thing, but you have to be wrong," he has said. "I will absolutely apologize, sometime in the hopefully distant future, if I'm ever wrong." What is "Love" Anyway?

I love working with couples: they come to me, wanting to improve their communications, work out problems between them and deepen their love. In couples' therapy, one of the most helpful things I do is to help a couple examine their definition of love. Specifically, we look at the difference between "Falling in Love" and what I call "Standing in Love".

Doesn't everyone want to "Fall in love"? It comes from all those old movies we've seen, where everything just comes together and – no matter what hell the two people have been through – in the end everything just falls into place as the two lovebirds kiss and fall into each other's arms.

Yeah, right. That's just how it happens, isn't it?

Illusions of how love works create a lot of suffering, whether we're single or partnered. "Falling in love" implies that we're passive and helpless. I don't think this paradigm works well for anyone. Over time, if we stay in this passive place, we usually get resentful and frustrated. And we wonder why our "love" doesn't feel good anymore. "What happened to our love"? I hear over-and-over again from unhappy couples.

I think we need a new way to conceptualize love. The idealized movie version of love isn't realistic, and it gives us crazy expectations that no man or woman could ever meet. This old idea about love sets our relationships up to fail.

Let's look at what I call "standing in love".

It takes guts, strength and a lot of impulse control to "stand in love". This concept of love emphasizes that we need to be active in sustaining love. It just doesn't "happen"; to make it work, we have to take a stand.

Ugh, I can hear you say. It sounds like a lot of work. Well, yeah, it does take work. But you don't need to be a martyr about it. Most relationships, initially, go along quite nicely. But almost everyone reaches a point that I call "when the glitter wears off".

This is the period when you begin to see your partner for who he or she really is. That façade of the first few months begins to wear away and you see this person as they really are: wonderful at times and pretty awful at other times. And, guess what? They begin to see you this way too.

Many people bail at this phase, and wonder why their relationships never last more than 2 or 3 months. They don't have the willingness to hang in past the "glitter" stage; they want everything all smooth and easy. Who doesn't? Unfortunately, this isn't real life...no matter how wonderful your partner is.

Some of my single clients are confused about the difference between romance and love. They date a lot, meet some great people, but soon discover that they don't really know what they want. They want romance but settle for sex and then they ask me, "why can't I find true love?"

I encourage you to spend some time thinking about the role you would like sex to play in your dating life. Rather than fall into bed with someone by default, why not think it out ahead of time? If you want "love" or "romance", it helps to get clear on what that means to you – and what role sex plays in the picture – before you go out and meet someone. A lot of hook-ups could have been more "romantic" and likely to lead to "love" if our libidos were not in total charge and our mind and heart were encouraged to participate more in the process of getting to know someone.

When you're in a relationship, don't give up and let your love collapse "when the glitter wears off", e.g., you discover that he has bad breath in the morning or that she snores and you can't sleep. This is when your "fall" into romance is over: you can "stand" in love and see your flaws, your lover's flaws and work them through together...or you can bail. The next time you're tempted to talk about "falling in love", consider "standing in love" instead. Take a pro-active role in creating love in your life by getting clear on what you want from a partner and not settling for less. You have nothing to lose but your passivity.

The Egyptian Police are Using Grindr to Entrap Gay Men

Reports from local media suggest the police are using features of the app, namely location and profile pictures, to identify them.

The men are then charged with 'inciting debauchery'. According to the Jerusalem Post, 11 men were sentenced for up to 12 years in prison for this charge, in April. Egypt is one of the few countries where homosexuality is de facto illegal. This means it's technically not banned, but police and the justice system use loopholes like 'inciting debauchery' to penalize men who sleep with men.

According to research from the Pew Research Center conducted in 2013, 95% of Egyptians think homosexuality should not be accepted by society.

A lifestyle magazine in the capital, CairoScene, said Grindr was 'jeopardizing the safety' of queer Egyptian men.

'It baffles me how easily people are willing to share such personal information in a country like Egypt – it is beyond stupid,' a source from the magazine told the Jerusalem Post.

'I would advise anyone to be careful when dating online,' they said.

40-Minutes Casserole

Ingredients

- 1 (8 oz.) package uncooked egg noodles
- 1 (10.75 oz.) can condensed tomato soup
- 1 (11 oz.) can Mexican-style corn
- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 1 (10.75 oz.) can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 16 slices American cheese

Methods/Steps

Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add the egg noodles and cook until tender, about 7 minutes. Drain, and set aside.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

In a large bowl, mix together the tomato soup, corn, onion, and cream of mushroom soup. Stir in the cooked noodles until well coated. Transfer to a 9x13-inch baking dish; place slices of cheese to cover the top.



Bake for 25 minutes in the preheated oven, or until cheese is melted and lightly browned.

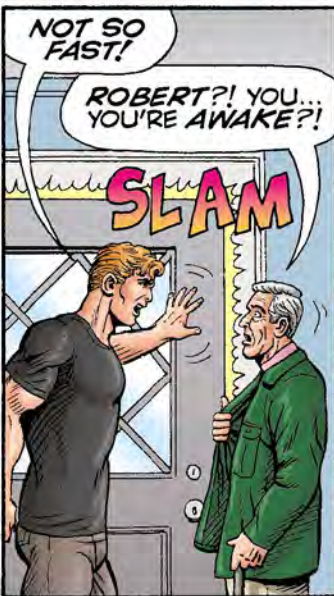

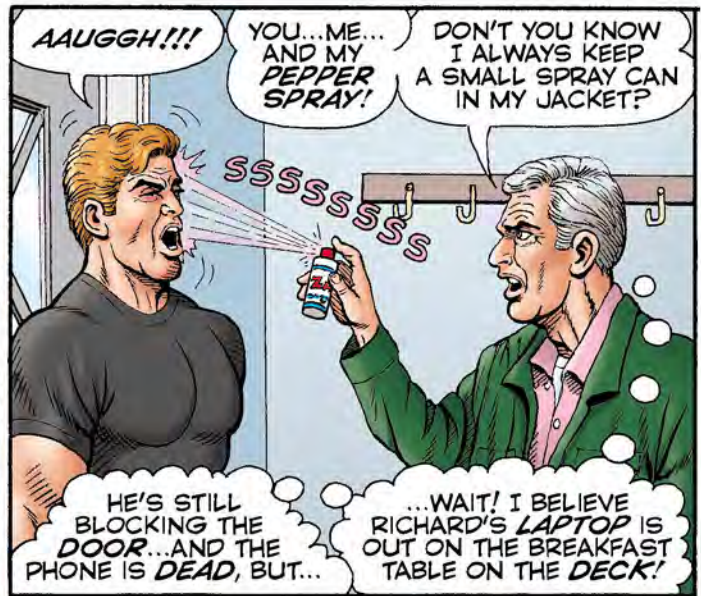

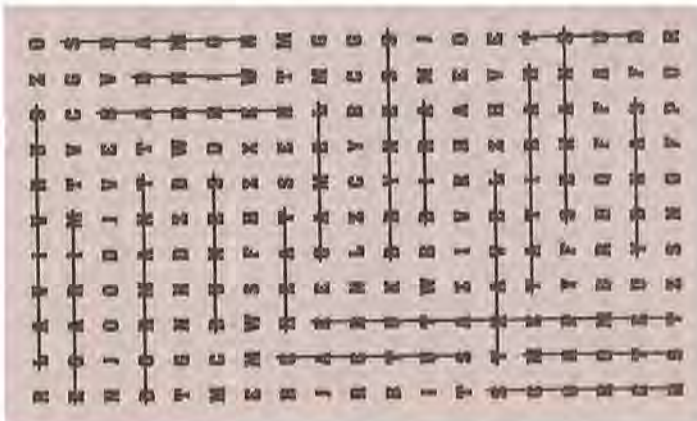
