# N.J. Church Group Sues Over Gay Ceremony

A church group sued New Jersey on Monday over the state's investigation of a complaint that the group refused to allow a lesbian couple to hold a civil union ceremony at a beachfront pavilion it owns.

The Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association, a Methodist group, alleges that by finding enough reason to investigate the complaint, the state's Division on Civil Rights is threatening to prosecute the group in order to force it to allow such ceremonies to take place.

The investigation is the first of its kind for New Jersey, which began allowing same-sex couples to enter into civil unions in February.

Harriet Bernstein and Luisa Paster of Ocean Grove filed the complaint after the association rejected their application to use the pavilion and returned their \$75 deposit. The group said it

# The Real Eyes of Tammy Faye: A legacy beyond the mascara

Tammy Faye had barely taken her final breath before columnists, bloggers, critics and fans alike were typing away. "Legacy of Greed" read one headline. Emotive. Extravagent. Some went as far as saying she wouldn't even make it to the pearly gates, much less get a free pass in.

For me, however, it's taken a few weeks to figure out how I'd like to remember her. After all, I'd had a long, scrappy history with the lady many knew only by her cumbersome eyelashes.

Maybe, just maybe, Tammy Faye was The Real Thing.

Jim and Tammy were regulars on the television set in our house. We vacationed at their theme park. Belonged to the same Protestant denomination. And my parents still talk about the newlywed evangelist couple who, driving a black Cadillac, came to their country church in Wanchese, North Carolina. Many there today will tell you that Jim and Tammy are responsible for their born-again experience. This was, of course, years before their ascent to fame and the collapse that would ensue.


I was just ten-years-old when the scandal broke as front-page news, and as would most, I too ended up dismissing the Bakkers as frauds - the wolves in sheep's clothing I'd been warned about.

It wasn't until I came out as a gay man that I'd learn that Tammy Faye was much more than an overly made-up, loony, pop culture caricature.


Like the Bakkers, I tried my hand at full-time ministry. I became a youth pastor and served as a regional youth representative for North Carolina District Council of the Assemblies of God. But at the forefront of my good intentions was the ever-

looming reality that I am gay, there is nothing I can do to change that, and the denomination in which I was baptized and now served, would never allow an openly-gay man to operate in any position.

Disillusioned by this reality, I left ministry and dismissed organized religion altogether. The very thought of it made me nauseous, nervous. Even going to church with mom on Mother's Day was unthinkable.

Then, I saw The Eyes of Tammy Faye, the documentary about Tammy's life. I had read that drag queen superstar, Rupaul, was the narrator so I took a deep breath and watched it. So much of what I'd assumed was true. Tammy Faye did come across as an emotional wreck. Trivial things made her cry. She was at times outlandish and her make-up was god-awful.

But behind the clunky mascara was something unquestionably authentic. And, without overstating it, christlike. Although she would have been justified in doing so, she harbored no malice. Not towards Jim Bakker and not toward other celebrity ministers like Jerry Falwell who had said and done horrible things to her.

And, her love for even the gravest "sinner" - including people like me -- was something the staunchest atheist could not write off.

I continued to follow her life via the internet and television appearances. I monitored her battle with cancer through notes she'd post on her webpage. "It's little old me. Just wanted to give you an update," began one. Her stardom never went to her head. I laughed at her refusal to visit a nudist colony with her cohorts on The Surreal Life. And, when her bestseller, I Will Survive ... And You Will Too, was released, I couldn't put it down.

Unaware of what was happening; Tammy Faye was gradually changing my opinion of the church and its so-called Christians. After all, like me she was an outsider, often criticized by her evangelical counterparts. Her unconditional acceptance of all people was too much for many.

The night before she died, Tammy gave her final interview to Larry King. When asked what she'd like to be remembered for, without missing a beat, "Well, my eyelashes," she said. From Jan Hooks famous parody on Saturday Night Live to the documentary about her life, the clunky mascara, often smudged from her easily-triggered tears, likely resulted in many dismissing the televangelist as nothing more than a kook.

But for those of us who cared to take a closer look, our memory will be of an individual who helped us take the first step toward something we'd once walked away from.

rejected the application because the church does not recognize same-sex unions.

"In an apparent distortion of the First Amendment, they are claiming that they have the right to discriminate against people who do not share their religious tenets," Bernstein said.

The organization said if the group were to allow civil union ceremonies for same-sex couples to take place, it would constitute approval of such unions. The lawsuit also says the state's investigation has forced the association to limit use of the pavilion for weddings out of fear of prosecution.

"The government can't force a private Christian organization to use its property in a way that would violate its own religious beliefs," said Brian Raum, a lawyer for the Alliance Defense Fund, which is representing the association.

In a statement, Lee Moore, a spokesman for the state's attorney general, described the lawsuit as "premature," saying the division hasn't come to any conclusion about the case.


"To date, the Division on Civil Rights has asserted nothing beyond its right to initiate an investigation to determine whether there has been a violation of the law against discrimination," Moore said.

Moore said it was the first investigation to deal with the issue of where a civil union ceremony could be performed since the civil-unions legislation became law. He said the state had previously received two complaints having to do with receiving job benefits.

The association said it uses the pavilion for a variety of programs, such as a Sunday-morning worship service and a Bible school class, and has rented the pavilion for wedding ceremonies.

Bernstein said that in the past, the pavilion has been used for civil wedding ceremonies as well as for people of all faiths to get married. She said it's also used for concerts and impromptu gatherings. (Rebecca Santana, AP)







# LEAVE GAY MARRIAGE OUT OF THE CONVERSATION

At Least Until Next November

As a gay American with a lot at stake next November, I watched closely last Thursday's Presidential debate, the first-ever focused exclusively on our rights. The panelist's concerns ranged from abolishing "Don't Ask, Don't Tell," to employment non-discrimination laws, to how ours compares to the civil rights struggle of African Americans. Answers were mostly predictable, safe, and showed candidates do scrutinize polls.

All but two Democratic hopefuls showed up for the two-hour event. Republicans, though invited, knew better. After all, the small number of potential gay voters isn't worth alienating their non-gay constituency – especially those more conservative.

Driving the dialogue was whether or not these politicians endorse gay marriage. This clearly weighted most heavily on the minds of the panelists and "civil unions" was not an acceptable answer. The unwavering emphasis on this issue, not whether or not the candidates called it marriage or civil union, frightened me.

Barack Obama, citing the more than eleven hundred federal rights available to opposite-sex couples, said that he would "fight hard" to make sure those same rights are available to us. He was careful, however, to refer to this as a step toward "civil unions," not marriage. Edwards, while sympathizing with gay people, stated that his political viewpoints have not changed. He didn't mince words and made clear his opposition to same-sex marriage.

Hillary Clinton, the frontrunner, was asked why she opposed gay marriage. "I prefer to think of it as being very positive about civil unions," she said.

I've considered passionate and persuasive arguments from both sides of the debate. These range from "Adam and Eve, not Adam and Steve" to child rearing to economic. And I've seen what happens when some politicos try to press the issue.

In 2004, Mayor Gavin Newsome ruffled feathers when he let gay couples marry on the steps of San Francisco City Hall. This was shortly after "activist judges" made Massachusetts the first state to allow legally-recognized gay marriages. While some saw these as steps in the right direction, others like me attributed this to why voters in eleven states passed constitutional amendments banning gay marriage that year. We felt it was too far, too fast and – even worse — believed these noble gestures may have been directly related to the reelection of George W. Bush. A CNN exit poll showed that "moral issues" topped the list of why voters came out for the 2004 election - above jobs and slightly above the Iraq war.

Three years later, most Americans are still not ready to grant marriage rights to same-sex couples.

Last August, a survey released by The Pew Research Center found that fifty four percent favor civil unions. Call it marriage, and that figure drops to thirty five. Even those who support gay marriage are on the fence about whether or not now is the time to be pushing for it. Only fifty one percent of supporters believe we should.

This doesn't mean we should drop the issue altogether. But might we at least consider letting it rest until next November? Not doing so may result in our losing not only another election, but even more federal rights. After all, the same candidates who said they were not comfortable with the word "marriage" last Thursday also confirmed their support for things like our right to adopt, overturning "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" and most spoke in favor of civil unions.

In spite of setbacks, gay Americans have made noteworthy political and social progress in recent years. Some forget that just ten years ago Ellen DeGeneres caused a national frenzy when she "came out" on her sitcom. Ratings plummeted. Advertisers yanked their spots. And the show was soon canned.

Today, Ellen's daytime talk show has won Emmy's and is one of television's most viewed. Gay characters also have a strong presence on cable and broadcast networks, including a gay couple who will move to Wisteria Lane (Desperate Housewives) this fall.

In Massachusetts, gay couples can marry and in four other states, our civil unions are legally recognized. Earlier this year a poll from Harris Interactive showed that fifty five percent of Americans believe we should be allowed to serve our military without hiding our sexual identity. And support for gay adoption rights has grown steadily during the past decade.

My fear is that if this divisive issue continues to define our current civil rights struggle, especially during this already volatile election year, the end result will again be a "moral values" President, one conservatives trust to uphold their ideals. And if "gay marriage now" means repeating what happened in 2004, this gay American will take civil unions any day. After all, if we aren't careful we might end up with someone like Mitt Romney, just as conservative as our current President, but – quite possibly – a whole lot smarter.
