Wyoming Couple Challenges Marriage Law

A gay couple on Cheyenne, Wyo., who were refused a marriage license have filed a federal lawsuit to challenge the state's law that defines marriage as a union between a man and woman, reports Associated Press. Ryan W. Dupree and David Shupe-Roderick filed the lawsuit



earlier this month and will act as their own attorneys in the case, which is assigned to U.S. district judge Alan B. Johnson of Cheyenne. They have asked Johnson to block the state from enforcing the law that denies gay and lesbian couples access to civil marriage.

California Senate Reverses Gay "Cure" Law

Roy Ashburn The California state senate passed measures Monday to reverse an archaic law that requires the state mental health agency to research "cures" for homosexuality, and to call on President Barack Obama and Congress to repeal the Defense of Marriage Act.

According to the Associated Press, Sen. Roy Ashburn, who came out this year after a drunk driving incident involving a gay bar, carried the bill to reverse the gay

"cure" law, which the assembly already approved. It passed on a 36-0 vote with no debate.

"The law passed in 1950 classifies gays as sexual deviants," reported the AP. "It requires the Department of Mental Health to research the causes and potential cures for homosexuality."

The senate also approved a resolution already passed in the assembly calling on the president and federal lawmakers to

repeal the discriminatory DOMA. The vote was 22-12, according to the AP.

LGBT Community is a Protected Class in Iowa

"Our Liberties We Prize and Our Rights We Will Maintain."
This is the motto of the state of Iowa. It's been true since the state was founded by abolitionists in 1838, and it is still true today for LGBT folks. Iowa's LGBT citizens not only enjoy full marriage equality and adoption rights, but they also enjoy other equal rights that are not currently available in many other states, including Nebraska.

For example, in 2007 Iowa became the fifth state in the nation to legally protect children from bullying due to sexual orientation and gender identity. Also in 2007, Iowa became the seventh state to ban discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity. That elevated Iowa's GLBT citizens to the level of protected class status.

Protected class status means that a person cannot be discriminated against in housing, employment, education, public accommodation and credit. So, in Iowa a landlord can't refuse to rent an apartment to you because you're a lesbian couple or a restaurant can't refuse to serve you because you held your gay partner's hand at the table.

If a GLBT person in Iowa is discriminated against in any of the five protected class categories, he or she can take their case to either the Iowa Civil Rights Commission in Des Moines or their local Civil Rights Commission.

All cities in Iowa with a population greater than 23,000 are required by law to have a civil rights commission, and Council Bluffs has a civil rights commission. So it is fitting that in 2008 the Council Bluffs city council added sexual orientation and gender identity to its list of protected classes.

So when you're considering a place to live, consider living in a state that treats all of its citizens equally; consider living in a state that protects its LGBT citizens; consider living in Iowa.

The Three Year Itch



"The excitement's gone".

"She's so predictable; I know exactly what she'll do."


Sound familiar? These statements are typical of how some of my clients describe their long-term relationships. Those of you who have



In couple's counseling, it's typical to believe that heterosexual couples start to unravel after about seven years. There's even a movie about this: "The Seven Year Itch", starring Marilyn Monroe. In the movie, the (straight) married man gets bored with his wife after seven years and looks to the divine Marilyn for a new lease on life. For us LGBT folks, a more appropriate title to describe our challenges with relationship boredom may be: The three year itch". As a therapist for LGBT couples, I've noticed that after about three years' together, many gay couples hit a wall called "boredom". It often manifests in the following ways:

- You become bored with yourself, your life, your job;
- You let your social life (with your partner and on your own) fade away;
- Your sex life with your partner becomes almost nonexistent (the popular concept of "lesbian bed death" fits in here);
- You let yourself go (gaining weight, not exercising, eating poorly); and
- You take your partner for granted.

This is a time when LGBT couples may start to consider "open" relationships or begin to develop fantasy lives that involve other people. Why? The glitter has worn off. You know too much about your partner to harbor any illusions. You've seen each other at your worst and probably had three years of ups and downs, stony silences and angry arguments. While this is the cement of real intimacy, it is death to illusions of romantic love. Falling in love is easy; this is the Hollywood movie aspect of new love: the mystery of your new lover is enticing; everything's new and sex is a great adventure. A few years later, all your illusions are gone, and you're left with a relationship with a real person, warts and all.



Boredom is fear in disguise. What are we afraid of? That our lives aren't enough, that we aren't enough and neither is our partner. Boredom says, "You made a mistake, dump this loser, get someone better and you'll be a lot happier." It's an interesting idea: this continual search for someone better (some people call it "the search for my soul mate"). How will we know when we find this perfect person? Will we ever meet him/her?

We can't meet him/her because this person doesn't exist, and neither does a boredom-free relationship. Every new lover eventually becomes familiar. Newness masks fear. It's like when you buy something new to cheer yourself up. And it works, right? For about five minutes. Relationships are the same. A new lover may make you happy for a while, but every man/woman will inevitably fall off their pedestal when the glitter wears off and their burps, farts and heavy baggage appear.

Don't scratch the Three Year Itch! Instead, see it for what it is the fear beneath the boredom – and focus not only on your partner but also on yourself. When YOU are happy, fulfilled and excited about your life, you bring that to your relationship.

people to shop at either store and believes that consumers should make their own decisions after careful consideration of all of the information available to them.

"Because we understand the impact of leaving Target and Best Buy on the various products associated with the buyer's guide, both companies will soon be removed from it," Sainz added

The decision comes after mounting criticism of the HRC Corporate Equality Index (from which the buyer's guide is derived) and whether it accurately reflects a company's record on LGBT equality.

Speaking on Michelangelo Signorile's satellite radio show Thursday, Sainz said HRC would remain neutral in a MoveOn.org-organized boycott of Target. But HRC announced last week that it would donate \$150,000 to "help elect a pro-equality governor and legislature in Minnesota" after Target

HRC Drops Target and Best Buy

In a story broken on Advocate.com, the Human Rights Campaign will drop both Target Corp. and Best Buy, two companies embattled over donations that aided an antigay politician's campaign, from its annual Buying for Equality Guide.

In a Friday statement, HRC vice president of communications Fred Sainz said the national organization "will not encourage declined a request from the group to do so. "We believe that it is impossible to avoid turning any further actions into a political issue and will use the benefit of time to make thoughtful, careful decisions on how best to move forward," Target spokeswoman Jessica Carlson said.

Sainz told Signorile that HRC is grappling with a sea change in the realm of corporate political donations, resulting from the January U.S. Supreme Court decision in Citizens United v. Fed-

eral Election Commission, which struck down limits on corporate spending in elections.

"Already complicated, the Citizens United decision has made campaign finance issues even more complex," Sainz said in the statement. "HRC is



thoughtfully studying the many ramifications of political giving by companies in this new reality."

The court's decision allowed for an influx in campaign spending, and Target, which donated \$150,000 to an organization supporting Minnesota state representative Tom Emmer's campaign for governor, has become a cautionary tale in corporate America. The retailer's pro-LGBT reputation has quickly eroded in recent weeks, fueled by boycotts, viral protest videos, and demonstrations at Target locations around the nation.

Emmer, who won the Republican gubernatorial primary election earlier this month, has consistently opposed marriage rights for same-sex couples and authored a 2007 state constitutional

amendment prohibiting gay marriage.

The HRC Corporate Equality Index has primarily focused on how a company treats its gay employees — using criteria such as partner benefits, diversity training, and nondiscrimination policies — but the latest report evaluates whether an employer "exhibits responsible behavior towards the LGBT community" and "does not engage in action that would undermine LGBT equality."

Both Target and Best Buy received 100% ratings on HRC's 2010 index, completed before the controversial donations were made. HRC has delayed the release of its 2011 Corporate Equality Index as it considers the methodology used to compile the report.

Target executives did not address the growing backlash in its second-quarter earnings call Wednesday. Though the company reported a 14.3% increase in net income compared to the yearago period, it's yet to be seen what impact the fallout resulting from Target's political donations will have on future earnings. News of the donation broke just days before the end of the company's second quarter on July 31.

The initiative, Tel Aviv Gay Vibe will cost about \$87,000 and will be enacted over the next sixth months. "The gay market, they have money to spend and they love very much the stylized life of Tel Aviv. They like the good life," says chief executive of the association Etti Gargir in Pink News.

GayIsrael.org, the official website of Gay Vibe, paints a luxurious picture of the city: "This dashing piece of gay heaven holds within the perfect combination for a perfect



realized the greater need for development workers throughout the country's less populous regions. He stated, "Despite recent progress for LGBT people in Ireland, a significant number still find it difficult to be 'out' and remain living in their local communities. Much of this is the result of a lack of recognition that all communities are made up of people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender."

The initiative aims to function by uniting and strengthening LGBT organizations throughout the country to better address the needs of each region. The group was developed out of collaboration between 11 Irish LGBT organizations and will receive funding from the Atlantic Philanthropies, a grant group that gives billions of dollars to various aid programs each year.

Pat Carey, minister of community, equality, and Gaeltacht affairs, launched the program. He told Irish Times, "Irish society has not always been as supportive of gay people as it should have been, particularly in rural Ireland." He continued by sympathizing with the LGBT plight, stating that it is "a cause of sadness and a terrible waste of potential when a young person is lost to a rural community because of their sexual orientation or gender identity."

The events in April followed student protests in January, in which more than 100 students and faculty

members marched on the campus to urge administrators to add sexual orientation to the school's antidiscrimination policy as well as acknowledge the campus's LGBT alliance. The protest came after the student newspaper published an antigay cartoon, resulting in the resignation of the paper's assistant managing editor.

Famed Bathhouse Goes Doggy Style

Club Turk Baths, one of San Francisco's first gay bathhouses as well as one of its last, is set to become a canine day-care facility, reports the San Francisco Examiner. The bathhouse, located in the city's Tenderloin district, has

Marine Chief Pushes Separate Bunks

The head of the Marine Corps, Gen. James Conway, reiterated his position Tuesday that straight Marines might be allowed to

elect separate living quarters from gays if "don't ask, don't tell" is repealed.

According to an MSNBC report of the briefing at the Pentagon, "Conway said the Marines may make



such housing arrangements 'voluntary' to accommodate any 'moral concerns.' He said many Marines are 'very religious' and because of their moral concerns 'don't want to room' with homosexuals."

But Conway also said the Marines would move quickly to implement repeal if the law was lifted. "We cannot be seen as dragging our feet. We've got two wars to fight. We'll implement it and move on," he said.


