President Barack Obama from repealing the Defense of Marriage Act, which would lead to interstate and federal recognition of same-sex marriages.

The four-page letter asks supporters to donate to the DOMA Defense Fund, so that "2% of the population" cannot "defeat 60% majorities" in states where marriage equality is constitutionally outlawed.

"We don't have tens of millions of dollars from a handful of gay billionaires funding our efforts," he wrote. "This time it's up to supporters."

Brown also wrote that the Democratic leadership in Washington have already pushed a radical agenda, sneaking in "far-reaching social policy changes as part of the economic stimulus package. If they think we're asleep at the wheel, they could try the same thing with marriage during the first few months of this new administration."

In order to stop the Administration and federal legislators from recognizing gay and lesbian marriages, the organization says it needs \$1 million to share its message in an advertising blitz. "Wavering politicians will take note when they begin to see well-funded, hard-hitting ads on TV and radio in their home districts."

The other purpose of the media campaign, Brown wrote, is to stop the media from portraying religious followers from looking like "hate-filled bigots."

#### Sweden Passes Same-Sex Marriage Law

(CNN) -- Sweden's parliament on Wednesday approved samesex marriage legislation, according to the parliament's Web site.

Previously, two people of the same sex could register their partnership, but with this vote, sex will no longer matter when two people want to get married.

The new "sex-neutral" law will take effect on May 1.

Couples who already had a registered partnership can now either stay in that union or transform it into a marriage if they wish, the Web site said.

The "yes" votes numbered 261, while 22 members of parliament voted "no" and 16 chose not to vote.

The Christian Democrats was the only party opposed to the new law.

"Unfortunately this is not an April Fool's Day joke, this is reality," Yvonne Andersson, member of the Swedish parliament for the Christian Democrats, wrote on the party's Web site following the vote.

The party had instead proposed a law that would remove the word "marriage" from Swedish law and replace it with a legally binding union between two persons, thus separating it from the Christian ceremony that the church conducts.

As Regner, secretary general of the Swedish Association for Sexuality Education, told CNN that Wednesday's vote meant a very important change in Swedish law.

"This was the last area where same sex couples were treated differently," she said.



#### Politician Fumes Over "Gay" Elephant in Zoo

WARSAW (Reuters) - A Polish politician has criticized his local zoo for acquiring a "gay" elephant named Ninio who prefers male companions and will probably not procreate, local

media reported Friday.

"We didn't pay 37 million zlotys (\$11 million) for the largest elephant house in Europe to have a gay elephant live there," Michal Grzes, a conservative councilor in the city of Poznan in western Poland, was quoted as saying.

"We were supposed to have a herd, but as Ninio prefers male friends over females how will he produce offspring?" said Grzes, who is from the right-wing opposition Law and Justice party.

The head of the Poznan zoo said 10-year-old Ninio may be too young to decide whether he prefers males or females as elephants only reach sexual maturity at 14.

#### **Reparations for Gay Americans**

As recently as a generation ago, marriage equality and full civil rights for gays and lesbians seemed like a remote and quixotic hope. Today, while setbacks such as California's Proposition 8 and the continued scourge of the Defense of Marriage Act serve as reminders that more struggle remains ahead, shifting attitudes—especially among younger Americans—make full homosexual citizenship look, increasingly, like an historical inevitability.

Victory may require five or maybe 20 years. Yet I have no doubt that "don't ask, don't tell" and same-sex adoption bans will be as unspeakable and inexplicable to my grandchildren as counting a slave as three-fifths of a human being.

What is not so clear to me is whether homosexuals will be adequately compensated for their mistreatment. So while I recognize that other battles remain, I think the time has arrived to place economic reparations for gay and lesbian Americans on the political agenda.

Reparations serve two distinct purposes. One is monetary restitution—such as the compensation that Bismarck exacted from France after the Franco-Prussian War or that the Allies demanded of Weimar Germany following World War I. Payments to Jewish Holocaust survivors and victims of the Japanese-American internment recognize the specific economic losses suffered by these individuals, but also the intangible harms done by uprooting and imprisoning innocent people.

Supporters of reparations for the descendants of African-American slaves often cite the labor rendered by their ancestors as justification for present-day compensation. While the financial losses suffered by gay and lesbian Americans as a result of state-sanctioned discrimination may prove challenging to quantify, they are real.

If you cannot serve in the military because of your sexual orientation, you also cannot qualify for the educational and economic benefits that such service guarantees. If you cannot marry your partner, you cannot take advantage of the numerous tax benefits that matrimony affords. Calculating the lost wages and benefits of workers terminated solely because of their sexual orientation may prove impossible, but countless men and women have suffered this fate without recourse. Placing a price tag on this hardship will be no easy feat. That is no excuse for not

# Diane's Story

"My partner and I had been together for 14 years when I received the worst phone call of my life. There had been a terrible accident, and she was being flown to the hospital by helicopter. attempting to do so.

A second purpose of reparations is to express moral opprobrium. Paying gays and lesbians a sum even far less than their economic losses might help atone for the dreams destroyed by criminal sodomy convictions and the suffering endured by those who lived in the shadows to stay clear of the penal code. A monthly check will never be enough to make up for the helplessness of being denied access to a partner's hospital bed. For couples separated by deportation orders--because only marriage conveys citizenship and federal law does not permit gays to marry--all the funds in the national treasury could not make full amends. Yet the admission of collective culpability behind such payments might offer a first step toward reconciliation.

The only danger in such a proposal is the possibility that a minority of unscrupulous straight people might claim homosexuality in an effort to defraud taxpayers. My instincts tell me that this fear is unfounded. In the first place, we are still at least half a social revolution away from the day when the sort of American who would cheat his gay and lesbian peers, possesses enough confidence in his own sexuality to impersonate a homosexual. Moreover, I am confident that the government could establish an effective system to screen for straight impostors. What an amusing turn of events it would be if the techniques our society once used to ferret out gays and lesbians were someday turned upon straight men and women pretending to be gays and lesbians. Some ironies are priceless.

I imagine that critics of reparations will dismiss this proposal as far-fetched. Maybe so. But equality for gays and lesbians also seemed far fetched 20 years ago. Of course, even I recognize that these payments should not last forever. When there are no gays and lesbians remaining who have known the insult of second-class citizenship, that will be the appropriate time to stop the checks.

#### **Tough & Classy Rolling Ladies**

The Omaha Roller Girls have taken quite a few hits and received some bruises on the track and they do their best to support others off of the track. These ladies show that they can do it all. Bobbi Grover of the Omaha Roller Girls gives us some insight to these ladies on how they play and participate in and with the community.

Bobbi gives us the league's history and how she got involved. "The ORG (Omaha Roller Girls) was established in January 2006. A few girls with big dreams recruited throughout the Omaha area, and laid the groundwork for what the league is today. I went to my first game as a spectator in August 2006. It was so much fun to watch, and it looked like it would be even more fun to play, so the very next week I showed up at practice, and have been there ever since." Now I notice your ORG shirts have the rainbow in the background, so is this an all lesbian group or what is the make-up of ORG? "The ORG rainbow shirts we had made especially for the 2008 Pride Parade. We are not an all lesbian group; we welcome all walks of life. However, there is a long standing joke that the difference between a lesbian and an Omaha Roller Girl, is two beers."

Grover explains how to be a recruit for ORG, the tryouts, and the physical condition to be an ORG. "We have a new recruit boot camp to get fresh meat. We just completed our first boot camp in December 2008, and are hoping to have another this summer. However, if someone is interested, and is at least 19, and can't wait for boot camp, they can always email our recruiter at org.recruiter@gmail.com. I joined the league not knowing how to skate very well. Bambi legs is what we call it. I also had no workout routine, and was quickly whipped into shape. Practicing 3 nights a week, 2 hours each night either makes you

or breaks you. We tell all potential newbies to go out to adult skate nights to practice general skating, and then do lunges and ankles exercises at home to strengthen the most abused derby

parts.

Bobbi shares the season information, division of ORG, and the two teams they have. "Our season lasts from January to October. We are in the North Central Division of the Women's Flat Track Derby Association (WFTDA). We currently have not played enough games to be a ranked team, but that time is quickly approaching. To mix it up and give our newer girls play time, we have two Intra-League teams, The Lowdown Lucys and Victoria's Secret Service. After a girl has passed all of her skills assessments, she is placed on a team. We normally have 2-3 VSS/Lucy games a year. In between our WFTDA sanctioned games. From the two Intra-league teams, our coaching committee picks the best of the best to form the ORG's Travel Team, which are the girls who play in the sanctioned games." Now the ORG don't have matches or games, they have bouts. What was the best and worst bout the ladies have had? "All of our bouts are awesome, so it's hard to pick the best and worst. but here goes.... During our 2007 season, one of our worst moments was from a Sioux Falls Roller Dollz bout. They brought busloads of drunk fans, and by the end of the bout the fans were getting a tad out of line. Needless to say the bout ended with about a 50 person brawl. It sucked, and was pretty scary, as we do have a lot of families that come out to our bouts with their children. That was the first and last time that ever happened. The bad blood stays on the track, and the league stands firm on their no fighting policy. There are still PLENTY of hard legal hits that send broads flying though. I think our best moment was our very first bout as a WFTDA league. We played against Lincoln, in Lincoln. Not only did we win our first WFTDA bout, but it was also the first time we had beat our big sister league, the No Coast Roller Girls. It was a great bout and a proud moment for the ORG."

Have the ORG brought home any trophies or such feats? "We played in our first tournament last November, in Sioux City. We did not win, but it really showed us what we are in for. Being a part of WFTDA, there are Regional and National tournaments. Our dream is to make it to Regionals, kick ass, and make it to Nationals. There are a lot of BIG teams that make it

there, so we still have some work to do."

Now each lady has a personality about her, sort of like a drag queen. How did some of these ladies' names come about? Bobbi lets this answer come from a fellow teammate, Jessica Palimenio, aka Daisy Mayhem. "I originally tried to use the drag queen name formula of first pets name and the first street you lived on, but Buffy Meadows just didn't seem to strike fear into people like I had hoped." Each girl can pick her own name, but it must be approved and registered on a national derby roster. The Omaha Roller Girls have been out there doing voluntary community functions as Bobbi explains. "We want to be a positive force in the community. Unfortunately roller derby has a bad stigma that follows us around. The only way to change that is to show that we care, and we are not just a bunch of beer swillin' bar brawlers. We have participated and donated to the Relay for Life, we were a bronze level team last year donating over \$1500. We have also donated to the March of Dimes, Turn Purple, The Omaha Food Bank, the Phoenix House, the YWCA, Omaha Polar Bear Plunge, and most recently Operation BBQ For Our Troops."

I notice you do different types of things with your skates on, for example, one night it was musical chairs, what was that about? "Full Contact musical chairs is something we have been doing annually, to raise money for our league. We pay to play, and usually have 2-3 fundraisers a year to make sure we can pay our



monthly rent at Skatedaze, and the many other expenses that come with running a sports team."

Bobbi leaves the interview with this. "The only things fixed in this league are the garter belts and pins curls. Each and every girl gives 110% every time they are on that track. We practice hard so that we can play hard. This really is a sisterhood, and you will not find a more diverse group of girls that all get along so well."



#### Jerry Falwell's Legacy of Hate Lives On

The Liberty Alliance, the fundamentalist Baptist group formerly run by Jerry Falwell, and now his son Jerry Falwell Jr., has issued an action alert urging followers to rail against the hatecrimes bill that would add sexual orientation, gender identity, and disability to the existing federal hate-crimes law.

H.R. 1913, the "Local Law Enforcement Hate Crimes Prevention Act of 2009," will likely be brought before the full House of Representatives on Wednesday. Liberty's urgent alert reads. "It is critical that you contact your congressional representative immediately to let him or her know of your opposition to this dangerous legislation, which may form a legal basis to criminalize even a sermon or Bible reading as 'hate speech,' resulting in potential fines or even imprisonment of pastors, Sunday school teachers, youth leaders, Christian counselors, and religious broadcasters.

"The word 'intimidation' in H.R. 1913 is so broadly defined that no Christian is safe from this threat. Pastors could even be convicted for 'conspiracy to commit a hate crime.' Please forward this e-mail to all your friends. If you are a pastor, please tell your congregation of this threat to their constitutional freedoms. There is no legal restriction to prohibit you from talking about this dangerous legislation from your pulpit. Call the capitol switchboard immediately at (202) 224-3121."

#### **Newsom Makes Bid for** Calif. Governor Official


