

SO YOU WANT TO HELP WITH THE NEW VOICE.....

JUST WHAT DO THOSE PEOPLE DO, ANYWAY?

Needed: Treasurer & Advertising Manager

Up to this point we have talked about the direct service parts of putting together the magazine. But the most important positions with *The New Voice* are behind the scenes: the treasurer and advertising manager.

At present both of these positions are held by Mr. Dick Brown. Dick stepped in nearly 9 years ago after our first Omaha treasurer absconded with our entire treasury. And for 9 years Dick has presented us with meticulous treasurer's reports — to the extent of including a copy of our current bank statement so we can see that the actual balance in the bank is the same balance shown on his reports.

Thanks to his careful money management and attention to detail, *The New Voice* is financially solvent and current on all bills.

This is no easy task. Being treasurer requires an eye for detail and exact record keeping. Money comes in to the magazine in business checks, personal checks, money orders, and even in crumpled up \$1 bills, arriving at the P.O. Box or handed to one of us when we're out and about. Yet somehow Dick manages to get all the funds deposited promptly and his books balance every month.

One of the cross-over duties between Treasurer and Advertising Manager is that of billing. Despite our policy and our pleas, only part of the ads come in prepaid. Each month we send out 10-20 bills for display ads — and then we wait for our money. Most people are very prompt and we can expect a check by return mail. Others take a little

longer to pay. And still others will encounter financial difficulties and take a still longer time to pay. And then there are a few who don't seem to remember that they have to pay for advertising — these accounts take phone call after phone call until finally some payment is made. Two or three times in our history we have had to eventually write off a bill as uncollectable and have taken one bill to small claims court. This is the very frustrating part of the job, requiring the judicious use of patience, compassion, and good sound business sense.

The Advertising Manager is responsible for all advertising (except classifieds) and will negotiate contracts, provide rate sheets, and work out the exact size, format, and placement of all the display ads. Display ads also come in all sizes, shapes, and conditions. Some are slick, camera ready, half-tones; others are pasted together; and others are hand-written scrawls that we decipher and put into ad form. Probably the biggest headache with the advertising is to get people to respect our deadlines. We set the deadline for the 10th of the month so we have time to typeset and layout the magazine. But layout can't start until all of the ads are in and placed in the template so we know how much space we have for news and features. Unfortunately, too many people know that we work on the magazine for 1-2 weeks after deadline and so they don't get their ads to us until we are on the way to the printer (and then they wonder why we are frustrated). Getting the actual ads sometimes requires going to the busi-

ness, group, or individual several times to get the "camera ready" copy. Sometimes it is not ready when promised and so another trip is required, and another, and another.

So, as you may have guessed, the job of advertising manager is a tough one. And, of course, our advertising manager actually decides where each ad will be placed in the magazine, blocking out the space on the template and even typesetting some of the ads.

COMING OUT QUESTIONS

Dear Publishers,

Don't know if you are looking for new subject ideas or not, but have decided to send you some. I have enjoyed the few New Voices I have had the chance to read. And as a person who is just starting to explore my other self, have learned from it. Here are a collection of my questions, article topics, and scattered ideas.

1. Co-parenting agreements - is that a recognized fact in Iowa/Nebraska? (Editor's Note: Don't know the answer but maybe one of our readers will write in with some comments on the subject.)

2. Are the legislatures doing anything to recognize same-sex relationships: taxes, insurances, next of kin status, rights of survivorship? (Editor's Note: Nebraska Ernie Chambers keeps introducing a bill to legalize same-sex marriages, but it has never gotten out of committee. However, a Nebraska "Defense of Marriage Act," which would mean that Nebraska would never recognize same-sex marriages is moving through the unicameral and may well pass this session.)

3. Is it safe to walk in Omaha? If you wish to hold hands, is there a place where as women you would be safe from harassment? (Editor's Note: You would be quite safe at any of the 7 GLBT Bars, at MCC, at a River City Mixed Chorus Concert, at ICON Picnics, at Metro Club, or at any other GLBT event. In terms of public areas, I would say you would run some risk of harassment anywhere in Omaha, less in the Old Market than at the Crossroads, but anywhere open to the general public you have to recognize that homophobes may be present. I'd suggest you try some of the organizations and groups listed in the magazine.)

4. What about where do you meet people? Like I said, I am very new at this, where is there to go besides the bar? (Editor's Note: The same places I listed above. There is a Women's Support Group that meets on Saturday mornings at MCC-Omaha, there's Metro Club, there are wonderful events put on by WomenSpace - be sure to check out their article about their concert and Pridefest to be held in September, there are the ICON picnics, and I would also check out the Club James Dean - yes, it's a bar but it is a very comfortable bar with a clientele that's mainly women. I'll be hosting a women's dance contest there on May 2 and another dance contest at The MAX on June 7. Or you could try putting a personal ad in the classifieds. I know that can work, that's how Carla and I met and we've been together almost 9 years.)

5. What does the Resource Center Offer? (I should let them answer that for themselves, but so far they are primarily providing information to people who call or drop in. They aren't doing any programming but are making the facility available to groups that want to use it.)

6. It would be interesting to recognize the closet people like me. To tell them they are not alone even though they may feel very isolated. (Editor's Note: Sounds great! But finding closeted people isn't really easy. How about starting by sharing your story with our readers? You could be the one to reach out to other closeted people and let them know they are not alone.)

ELLEN'S OUT... NOW WHAT?

Now that she's come out of the closet, both in her show and publicly in real life, Ellen has a whole life ahead of her. Her show has struggled a bit in the ratings. Whether it survives, Ellen Degeneres will go down in history as being the first lead character in network television to come out of the closet.

The coming out episode was thought by some, certainly by the radical right, as a way to boost ratings. The radical right made it an issue bigger than it could ever handle. In the weeks leading to the historic episode, the radical right was trying to get ABC affiliates to refuse to air the program — and it tried to get advertisers to refuse to run spots during the program.

Interestingly, it also encouraged its followers to WATCH the program (supposedly so they could take note of advertisers).

At least one affiliate bit. WBMA-TV in Birmingham, Alabama refused to air the April 30 program. Jerry Heilman, the president and general manager of the station called it "inappropriate for family viewing". The local gay community protested — and organized a party to view the show with the rest of the country via its own satellite.

ABC found that you can't please everybody. The network rejected an Olivia Cruise advertisement based on its policy of not allowing advocacy ads of any kind. The ad would have featured two women embracing together on the deck of a cruise ship and kissing at the end — a theme seen every day by cruiselines frequented by a heterosexual clientele.

That did not, however, keep the Human Rights Campaign from buying advertising time on local affiliates. It had planned to air an ad entitled "Shoes" in at least 29 cities. (There was no immediate word on how many ended up airing.) The ad featured a woman who had just been fired from her job because of her sexual orientation. A conversation between her co-workers revealed that the firing was not against the law — a fact that one of her colleagues is shocked to learn.

Of course, the program had plenty of major advertisers. Gay and lesbian Americans are encouraged to contact the advertisers to show appreciation for not caving in to the radical right's demands. Among the advertisers and how to contact them: Chrysler 1-800-992-1997; General Motors 1-313-536-5000; and Johnson & Johnson 1-800-526-3967.

We're also encouraged to tell Disney that Ellen is a good thing for America. The phone number is 1-818-560-1000.



Many people today are afraid of homosexuals. Some are even afraid to shake hands with one if they know they are gay. Some are afraid to give a hug of greeting. Why?

Why does homophobia exist? Webster says "homophobia" is "hatred or fear of homosexuals or homosexuality". Why would anyone FEAR? Hatred may be understandable because we're taught to hate. But fear? This is an emotion. The reaction however could be the creation of hate masked in fear.

Isn't it 1997? Aren't we an educated nation of people? Yes, it is '97 and yes we are supposedly educated and fear is normally diminished through knowledge. We do sometimes forget however that politics exists and does create fears and hatreds which good people "fall for" in that game of power plays.

Normally FEAR of anything is caused because we don't know what's on the other side (this creates the fear of death), "don't know what might be lurking in the dark or under the bed" (boogies-men have been around for ages from this fear). "It could be contagious" (this fear of an unseen enemy created a paranoia so strong Howard Hughes washed his hands incessantly), "they do things so differently, I'm afraid of what they'll do next" (this fear keeps many Races and groups of people apart). It is easy to see what FEAR can do in a life when one might choose to remain ignorant instead of educated. What is worse also may be the extent of the damage FEAR does to the person fearing.

Fear of homosexuals may not be caused by ignorance as much as it is caused by simple denial — denial that the homosexual should even exist as a human being. As it might be indicated by the fact that most homophobes simply refuse to even discuss the topic or even be willing to converse with a homosexual. This denial of another's humanity eliminated anything even resembling intelligence and liberties of any civil nature should therefore also be denied in their estimation. Homosexuality is only a moral issue for so many homophobes and has nothing to do with knowledge or reality.

This position of "you are wrong and I am right" in religious belief systems over the centuries has resulted in the creation of far too many actual wars. Today, we who are the homosexuals are cast in the arena of wrong by those in the arenas of right.

History is filled with such arenas, all in the name of THEIR God, and groups of his followers who believe they have found the ONLY RIGHT even became willing to go to war or to persecute those who are not like themselves their RIGHT position.

Growing up in a Protestant evangelical belief system, I was taught and led to believe that all Catholics (they were also called Papists) would be excluded from OUR heaven. They were wrong and we were right. There was no room for their reality because of our theology. I was also

taught to believe "the dirty Japs" as we called them then, were at war with us because of the fact — according to our theology — that they were infidels and not Christians, as we believed "Christians" should be.

Remember the Crusades? Of course not. You're not old enough. But remember the battles of the last decades in Ireland? Catholics fighting Protestants and vice versa. Where is the moral high ground? They battle out of fear that one may become more powerful than the other and thus one belief system wins and the other would lose.

Maybe we as a homosexual community today are feared because the majority thinks our ranks will grow. I don't know, but I do know may folks do think people choose to be gay. I do know science and history show we have remained fairly constant 8 to 12 percent minority group over the ages and it's still the same today. I wonder if the "moral" segment of heterosexuality has a vision of thousands of "immoral" heterosexuals CHOOSING to become homosexuals! Increasing our so-called ranks as others might do through propagation is an impossibility. We can't breed homosexuals into existence and we can't make a straight person into a gay person. If you're straight, you're stuck with it for the rest of your life and if you're homosexual, better get used to it and out of denial because that's what you're stuck with.

The numbers in a gay population ONLY grow statistically when folks exit their closets and make themselves known publicly.

Maybe we're feared because of being UNSEEN, like Howard Hughes paranoia. I don't know. I do know the Black African American minority IS visible AND a growing minority AND FEARED by many in the White community. It is now 12%. That's 29,955,932 Blacks in America today. OFFICES OF TRIANGULO ROSA IN COSTA RICA ATTACKED

On December 16, 1996, following months of threatening phone calls, pranks, and other minor acts of vandalism, the members of Asociacion Triangulo Rosa discovered that all the windows in their offices had been broken by vandals. This attack is only the latest attempt to intimidate members of the Triangulo Rosa, a gay and lesbian organization in Costa Rica, and force the closure of their offices in the town of Alajuela. In the weeks leading to the most recent attack, vandals wrote obscenities on the walls and doors of the Triangulo Rosa offices. The group also received threatening phone calls demanding the group leave Alajuela.

Triangulo Rosa attempted to file a complaint with the local police authorities who refused to accept it, claiming the incident was not within their jurisdiction. The compliant was then presented to the Organismo de Investigacion Judicial (Institution for Judicial Investigation). Triangulo Rosa also approached the Defensoria de los Habitantes de la Republica (Defender of the Inhabitants of the Republic), which serves as an ombudsman on human rights cases, immediately following the attack requesting increased police protection and an immediate investigation. None of the agencies have responded.

Asociacion Triangulo Rosa has asked that international activists write letters stressing the following points: 1) Violence against minorities is deplorable and it is the responsibility of the Cost Rican government to investigate attacks against any and all minority groups including sexual minorities to ensure that perpetrators of these attacks are prosecuted for their crimes. 2) In situations where individuals or groups believe they may be in danger, it is the government's duty to provide adequate police protection. 3) The government of a country with Costa Rica's otherwise impressive human rights records needs to recognize that violations of the rights of sexual minorities are indeed human rights violations.

Now, the organization is naming the same networks as being the most sensitive and inclusive towards people of faith. The study, "Faith in A Box: Entertainment Television on Religion" notes that of entertainment programming on the six networks, ABC and CBS have the best records in 1996 of religious depictions.

Touched By An Angel, a 1997 Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation Media Award nominee, was also singled out in the report as "the best series of the year" for favorable treatment of religion.

OPENLY GAY MAN ELECTED SCHOOL BOARD PRESIDENT

An openly gay school board member in Redondo Beach, California, has been elected President of the school board.

Zeke Zeidler was first elected to the board in 1995 as a Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund-endorsed candidate. He became one of ten openly gay or lesbian school board members in the country.

"I am excited about this opportunity. We have many important issues on our plate, including class size reduction and domestic partnership benefits for employees," Zeidler said.

"As the only openly gay elected official in Redondo Beach, I have been able to provide a unique perspective while educating the board regarding gay and lesbian issues."

Since becoming a school board member, Zeidler has ensured that every new or revised school district policy and contract includes "sexual orientation" and "disability" in the anti-discrimination clause.

KIDS OF LESBIANS: THEY'RE HEALTHY

Three studies released last month found that children born to lesbian couples through donor insemination are just as emotionally healthy and well-adjusted as children born to straight parents.

The studies, conducted in the United States, Britain and the Netherlands found that, "When you look at children with standard psychological assessments, you can't tell who has a lesbian parent and who has a heterosexual parent," said Charlotte Patterson, a University of Virginia researcher.

In related news, the Illinois Supreme Court has let stand an appellate court decision to deny a father's appeal to take custody of his children from the mother because she is lesbian. "There have been over 70 studies that show a child of lesbian or gay parents is just as emotionally healthy and well-adjusted as children of heterosexual parents," said Shannon Mintoer, staff attorney for the National Center for Lesbian Rights.

MAN NEARLY DIES, NOW HE WANTS JOB BACK

John Mace of Seattle was told three years ago he had less than six months to live. Both lungs had collapsed and his doctor told him to get his affairs in order. But new drugs gave him hope. KING-TV reports doctors can find no trace of HIV in him now. Mace now has another fight on his hands. He wants his job back and wants his seniority status too. His employer of 10 years, Alaska Airlines, says he CAN have his job back — but only with the status of a new hire. Mace is taking the airline to court. The *Seattle Times* reports Mace argues that airlines forced him to quit his job instead of giving him extended leave, so he could get money from his 401(k), life insurance and pension plan. He argues that he could have taken a three-year medical leave which was provided by his union contract. His lawsuit contends that the airline violated discrimination laws that protected people under provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act. News reports quote airline spokesmen as saying Mace is being treated fairly — other employees had been forced to quit for health reasons (or family emergencies) and returned to work as new hires. The case could take two years.

"FATHERS" AND "SONS"

When I was a heterosexual, I lived with a woman for enough years to have fathered a baseball team. But it never crossed our minds to have kids. Even now, with the gay and lesbian babyboom in full swing, my hubperson and I chose merely to observe the procreative and child-rearing impulses of our friends. Perhaps I'm just one of those self-centered, luxury-seeking, responsibility-avoiding individualists at whom conservatives like to wag their fingers as they set up gays in general as their cultural symbol for decadent, self-indulgent, hollow existence. Yet, as the years roll by, I find scattered across the country a group of young men who look up to me sort of as a father. What the lions finessed, the lie of the mind has returned to me in altered form. I have a second generation of myself.

These young men are mostly graduate students. The contours of my relation to these fellows are not crisp. In one way, I am a parent figure in that I serve as an elder guide and adviser. Some, though, do not seek out guidance and counsel, but rather simply appreciate my life as a body of work that made a difference to their intellectual pursuits, their life experience and goals. Over those who seek my advice, I have no authority, so perhaps even for these men, I am more like an uncle than a parent; but then the relationship is a chosen one and so more like a mentoring relation than any blood relative. Yet these relations, even when conducted at a thousand miles removed, are personal and intimate in that they take their stamp from the individuality of those involved, and so they are more like friendships than mentoring relations. Even that's not quite right. For, unlike friends and lovers, we do not cut our adventures jointly. We do not seek out our experiences together, rather men seek me out because of my experience.

The earliest of these relations began when a young man engaged me at the first national confabulation of gay scholars. The year was 1987, the place Yale. This kid, cute as a button, saunters by, spies my tag, says, "Oh, so you're Richard Mohr; I really liked your AIDS article in Raritan," and walks on; he circles back a few minutes later and says, "Oh, I really liked your political piece in Christopher Street too." How could one not love someone like that and I still do.

Others I've lost. A cranky, grumpy, Old Testament sort of guy, I give advice heavily larded with tough love. Some can take the diet, even thrive, others are repulsed and scamper off feeling wounded and resentful. One stomped his way out shouting Oediapally: "You're not my father, you're not my psychiatrist, you're not my teacher."

Not that it's all been peaches for me. I enjoy nudging and helping my boys in completing tasks by which academics pay their dues — placing journal articles, securing book contracts, presenting conference papers. I arranged for them to be the speakers on a panel for which I chair. Well, both of them presented broadside attacks against an essay I'd written on outing. So there I am, sitting between them with a stiff smile firmly fronting clinched teeth as, by turns, they let loose salvos of "Mohr is mistaken... Mohr falsely holds... Mohr fails to..." Pow, pow, pow. The commentator and the audience were on their side too. My role as chair precluded my saying anything in response. Bruising as the experience was for my ego, my pride in my boys waxed large and confirmed my hope that I do not serve as a role model for anyone. I loathe the phrase "role model". I hope my dislike is not simply a knee-jerk reaction to conservatives' use of the phrase as a tool with which to bash lesbian and gay teachers, but an expression of the liberal's faith that one ought not to serve as the standard for another — that each should work out his own plan of life. The message of my work for my kids is not "here is the one true path; follow it," but rather "here is a largely uncharted valley, make use of its possibilities."

Not all will flourish long term in academe. Even if discrimination were not all play, there aren't enough university jobs to assure universal success. But like most people of their class and upbringing, they will land on their feet somewhere: law school, publishing, middle management — somewhere. In any case, since these are not my 'real' kids, I can wish them something finer than happiness. My hope is for dignity — that they will lead principled and honor-worthy lives even if it means they will not be as well off as otherwise. I do not have to fill a parent's role of teaching conformity as a condition for getting ahead. And I need not act like a downtrodden parent who teaches his child habits and attitudes by which she will grow up to become some happy slave or deferential housewife. But this wish for my men has me worried. All of them are nice guys — perhaps too nice. Making-nice and principled living are frequently at odds with each other — almost always in bureaucratic academe. I would not have accomplished my life work had I not the hostile, grating personality I have. Still, the great cultural shifts underway may mean that a gay person will soon be able to be principled and nice at the same time.

I have been a pessimist long enough that I cannot believe gays will reach the promised land in my lifetime. Yet I am optimistic enough to think some state approximating gays' justice might occur within the lifetime of my boys, and nothing would fulfill me more than if their good deeds should play a part in that realization.

AIDS "CZAR" NAMED

President Clinton's selection of Sandra L. Thurman to become the new White House "AIDS czar" is being met with support.

The Human Rights Campaign said of the selection, "She brings the right mix of leadership, political skills and commitment to the fight against HIV and AIDS."

Winnie Stachelberg, HRC's legislative director, said, "Thurman was intricately involved in the creation and enactment of the Ryan White CARE Act in 1990 and its reauthorization in 1995. She knows AIDS policy and politics from the inside — a critical combination of skills for this job."

Likewise, the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force commended her selection. NGLTF Executive Director Kerry Lobel added, "The Task Force calls upon Thurman and the administration to work with Congress to lift the ban on the use of federal funds for needle exchange programs, oppose H.R. 1062, the regressive legislation introduced by Rep. Coburn, R-Oklahoma, that would among other things, require states to adopt mandatory HIV testing laws."

Thurman becomes the third person to hold the position known informally as the national AIDS czar. She replaces Patsy Fleming who stepped down after President Clinton's re-election.

Most recently, she was a White House appointee to the U.S. Information Agency, responsible for cultural and professional exchange programs. Her AIDS-related activities include serving on the Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS; on the George State AIDS Task Force; the Fulton County HIV Planning Council; and the executive committee of Cities Advocating Emergency AIDS Relief.

Brian's Note: The opinions expressed on this page are mine at the time of this writing. At the time of this writing, I am in day number two of my birthday gift to myself (May 13th if you want to do something nice, like pay my rent.) I have quit smoking. Day number two is the day when the lizards start crawling on the walls, and the voices in your head grant you the demoniac power to hate and destroy all that would displease you. What a great time to work on my page!

The "Literate Poofster gets morning wood" department: Buy a copy of *Superman #123* (if you can still find it!) Not only do you get to see the premiere of the "new" last son of Krypton, your cover also glows in the dark!! And, as one of my friends so colloquially put it, "He's sporting quite a bulge now..."

The Terminal Cooties Department: May is also my anniversary-month of being diagnosed HIV positive (May 17th, if anyone wants to do anything nice like buy me a pony!) One year, someone asked me what I got for my birthday and I jumped up and down and screamed, "AZT! AZT!!!!" She didn't think it was funny.

Anyway, this will be my fourth year with the disease. So I guess I have been positive almost a third of the overall "AIDS crisis" years. I am not saying that I am an expert or anything like that; I am just trying to establish that I have put some time in the trenches. At some moments, you almost feel like you are in a twelve-step program with this virus. I know about the new drugs and treatments that are coming out almost every day, and for that I am thankful. I do worry that this may go the route of other plagues. Someone finds a vaccine, and society is left with all these "casualties" still out there, dependent on expensive drug therapies for life and dealing with side-effects that no one thought of five or so years later.

I also know that we live in a world filled to the proverbial brim with hypocrisy and discrimination. I then wonder if my community will still be there to support its "wounded" brothers and sisters once transmission of the virus can be stopped. Will it still be fashionable to have fund-raisers for those struck with HIV/AIDS (remember, scientists are starting to think that this will soon be like diabetes, etc. in having to take meds all your life) after no one has to worry about getting it themselves?

Omaha, Nebraska is one of the best places in the nation to be sick. We have The Nebraska AIDS Project (NAP) and The University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC), and both are fore-runners tops in the country in their own areas of helping with HIV/AIDS. Our cost of living in Omaha is lower on the average (remember, we do not pay sales tax on food items here); we have a very low unemployment rate with lots of part-time jobs available.

The Gay Lesbian Bisexual Transgendered community has always been generous in their fund-raising endeavors. Yet, as I have been known to say lately, "There is much more to helping those of us with HIV and AIDS than raising money, and patting yourself on the back!" I am talking about removing the stigma that we

still attach to the virus, and especially the stigma we attach to those who are known and/or rumored to be sick.

Please do not try to tell me there is no stigma. Rumors of a person's status can fly and spin around this town faster than Dorothy in the damn tornado, especially if said person is brave/stupid enough to approach someone who is healthy. How dare we overstep our boundaries, huh?

You know, I have a feeling that there are quite a few of those in the G/L/B/T community who love to host those "Pish-Posh" parties during the Night of a Thousand Stars, but would never get involved with a PLWA (and/or would never think to have one anywhere in sight during that evening in their home!) And for all those who feel the need to tell anyone that I talk to at a bar or event, "Did you know he is HIV positive/has AIDS?" I have a few things to say:

- 1.) I will tell him.
- 2.) I may have already told him.

3.) He may have known about it way before he met me.

4.) You look really stupid and pathetic, so please find something better to do with your time. Thank You.

There are times that I really regret being public about my status. You can "bet your hippy" that one of those times is when I am trying to meet someone. My favorite line is, "I really admire your honesty, but I can't get involved with someone like you." (there are many variants of this statement, just ask anyone at the clinic!)

Face it, people, if it can be rumored about and discriminated against, it can be classified as having a stigma! Yes, it is a scary thing. It's even scarier when people turn away from you because you have this disease.

You know, the G/L/B/T community screams at discrimination all the time. Maybe we should look inward once in a while and make sure that "our own house is in order."

The "Why I do the things I do" department: I was reading some of my poetry at the opening of the Resource Center (a big thanks goes out to all those who stopped by to listen, by the way), and Sharon asked me to explain how I put a poem together. I didn't think she was asking about the mechanics of poetry (nobody would ask that if they wanted to stay conscious!), I figured she was asking about the images I use. I tend to use a lot of images/metaphors from the Holocaust when I write an AIDS-related piece. In my mind, the parallels haunt me. When I read that we could have had a cure by now if the public (and those in charge) didn't waste dismiss the first five or so years by thinking of AIDS as a "gay disease," I think of the thousands that died in the camps. I think about the fact that most schools fail to mention those with the pink triangles when they teach about the Holocaust. 

As part of the Grand Opening of the GLBT Resource Center, candidates for local offices addressed the concerns of the community. The Christian Social Action Committee of Metropolitan Community Church of Omaha, Citizens for Equal Protection, and Rainbow PAC hosted a forum with local candidates.

Mayoral candidate Brenda Council spoke informally with the audience, reaffirming her commitment to end all forms of discrimination. She spoke passionately about her belief that there should be no discrimination in employment — that the only factor should be whether or not the person can do the job required.

Candidates Subby Anzaldo, Marc Kraft, and Mele Mason spoke to the audience about their support of the GLBT community. Anzaldo was only able to be at the Resource Center briefly, working his appearance in around other obligations, but spoke very positively, reminding the audience that he signed the local Proclamation for GLBT Pride when he was President of the City Council. Kraft spoke candidly of his support of the GLBT community through the years as did Mason. Both responded positively when asked for their comments regarding discrimination in employment. Both indicated they would support a city policy regarding benefits for domestic partners, but both also stated that they doubted that they could survive politically if either of them introduced the policy. Kraft did suggest that the community might consider petitioning the city to institute such a policy.

The position of Grand Czarina allowed me the opportunity to learn more about the workings of the Imperial Court system.



GAY RODEO EXPLAINED

This is the sixth in a series of articles to explain gay rodeo.

Heartland Regional Rodeo, sponsored by the Heartland Gay Rodeo Association, is scheduled for the weekend of June 27-29 in Fremont, NE. Ticket packages are now available from HGRA members for \$25 until May 31, and for \$30 after June 1. Each ticket package includes admission to the Friday night party, Saturday rodeo, Saturday night party, and Sunday rodeo. Individual tickets will also be available at the door gate.

There are a total of thirteen events in a gay rodeo, divided into four categories. Rough Stock events, Roping events, Horse events, and Camp events. The Camp events are unique to gay rodeo, and there are three: Steer Decorating, Goat Dressing, and the Wild Drag Race. The camp events are intended to be entry level and do not require previous rodeo experience. Anyone can compete. Men and women compete together in all Camp events. These are all timed events, and the fastest time wins.

Steer Decorating

This is a team event with two members per team. There is a steer in the chute with a rope around its horns. One team member stands 10 feet away holding the rope, the other team member stands forty feet away. When the gate opens, the second team member must run to the steer, team member must remove the rope from the steer's horns.

Goat Dressing

This is a team event with two members per team. There is a goat tethered to a stake in the arena. The team starts fifty feet from the goat. A whistle starts the event. The team must run to the goat, put a pair of underwear on the goat, and run back.

Wild Drag Race

This event is always a favorite in every gay rodeo. It is a team event with three members per team: one man, one woman, and one person (man or woman) in drag. The woman stands ten feet from the chute holding a rope that is tied to a steer in the chute. The man and the drag stand forty feet from the chute. Time starts when the chute opens. The drag must get on the steer's back and ride across a line that is seventy feet from the chute. The other two contestants assist in this maneuver. Part of the fun in watching this event is seeing what the drag costumes look like.



NAMIBIA'S NUJOMA ATTACKS HOMOSEXUALS

At the opening of the Swapo Women's Council Congress on December 6, 1996, President Nujoma of Namibia made a departure from his prepared speech to attack Namibia's homosexual citizens. With glaring similarity to Zimbabwe's President Mugabe in his disregard for the civil rights of lesbians and gay men, President Nujoma stated that "all necessary steps must be taken to combat influences that are influencing us and our children in a negative way. Homosexuals must be condemned and rejected in our society." *The Windhoek Advertiser* reported that this attack was immediately followed by a call from the Rainbow Project, a coalition of Namibian gays and lesbians, indicated that Prime Minister Hage Geingob had in 1990 assured Namibia's homosexual citizens of their rights under Article 10.2 of the Constitution.

Article 10.2 of the Namibian Constitution states that "no person may be discriminated against on the grounds of sex, race, colour, ethnic origin, religion, creed or social or economic status." The growing international trend is to interpret "other status" to include sexual orientation. Presumably, Prime Minister Hage Geingob supported that interpretation of the Namibia Constitution.

While President Nujoma has as yet made no public response to the outcry against his statements, he has issued no further attacks. Though this attack does not appear to have been precipitated by any high profile action on the part of Namibia's homosexual community, it is not unprecedented.

There was a similar outcry from Namibia's lesbian and gay citizens in October of 1995, when Ministers Helmut Angula and Nahas Angula, and Deputy Minister Hadino Hishongwa jointly denounced homosexuality as "an un-African social evil." Deputy Minister Hishongwa further declared homosexuality to be "pathological" and "curable through long-term treatment."

ARGENTINA VICTORY

On December 20, 1996, the Rosario town council adopted an anti-discrimination clause. The clause, based on the one adopted by Buenos Aires a few months ago and supported by various international human rights organizations, reads: "no discrimination [on the basis of] race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion, ideology, nationality, physical appearance, psychological, social, economic condition, or any other circumstance will be allowed... The city promotes the removal of any and every type of obstacle that actually restricts equality and freedom, [or] impedes a person's full development and her/his effective participation in the social, political, or economic community life."




