Actor, Jason Stuart has just been inked to co-star in the independent feature film The Fluffer. He also completed a cameo in the indie comedy Get Your Stuff and was

recently seen in the David Spade film Lost & Found from Warner Bros. & Alcon Entertainment. He has also been seen in recent guest shots on the WB's Charmed and The Drew Carey Show.

was originally known as the First
Church of Nebraska. Later the
name was changed to the
Metropolitan Community Church of
Omaha. The UFMCC was founded
by the Rev. Troy Perry in 1969 in
Los Angeles, Ca., after a friend of
Rev. Perry's was jailed and lost his
job and announced tp Rev. Perry
that nobody lied queers, not even
God. The Rev. Perry knew better
and knew that he needed to answer
his calling to share the Good News
that Jesus loves everyone to the
GBLT community.**




