Ohio Man Sentenced to 2 ½ Years for Trying to Beat the Gay out of Disabled Brother

Ohio man Lawrence Featheroff has been sentenced to 30 months in prison over the beating and threatening of his younger disabled brother in an effort to turn him straight.

Featheroff, 38, had been entrusted with looking after his 26-year-old brother Jason Meyers who suffers from a developmental disorder after he had been abused in a group home despite having prior convictions for domestic violence.



Police were contacted by a concerned sibling who was worried Meyers was being physically assaulted and when they arrived to check in on him on 15 January they found him suffering a concussion and a sprained ankle with bruises all over his face.

Meyers later told police that Featheroff, his girlfriend Jamie Smith and a family friend, Brent Disbennet, had punched him repeatedly, allowed him to eat only once a day and made him run up and down a hill while carrying a heavy railroad tie.

Featheroff also threatened his brother with a butchers knife, telling him that he would cut off his genitals if he was gay.

Featheroff told police that he had become angry after his brother confided to him that he was attracted to other males.

Detective Brian Lowe told Fairfield County Common Pleas Court that Featheroff had told him he had 'wanted to toughen him up to push the gay out of him and make him a normal person.'

Meyers and Featheroff are two of eight siblings by different fathers that were removed from their mother's home due to abuse or neglect but the siblings have reunited as adults to form a family.

Meyers is now living in adult foster care. Smith and Disbennet have both pleaded not guilty to the charges against them and their cases are still pending.

Boy Scouts of America Bans Gay Scoutmaster

The Boy Scouts of America has kicked out a scoutmaster for being gay.

The youth organization revoked the membership of Geoff McGrath, the 49-year-old leader of a Seattle-area troop, after BSA officials learned of his sexual orientation. NBC re-



ports that he may be the first gay leader to be expelled since the BSA lifted its ban on gay youth, but not gay leaders, January 1.

"It's extremely disappointing to not be fully supported and defended in my membership," McGrath said. "They are complaining that the problem [his sexuality] is a distraction to Scouting, and they don't seem to understand that the distraction is self-inflicted."

A BSA spokesman confirmed that the membership of McGrath, a married Eagle Scout, had been "revoked."

"Our policy is that we do not ask people about their sexual orientation, and it's not an issue until they deliberately inject it into Scouting in an inappropriate fashion," Deron Smith, a BSA representative, told NBC.

McGrath had served as leader of Troop 98, which is based in the Rainier Beach neighborhood of Seattle. The members of the group, which was described as "fully inclusive" on the BSA website, were informed of its leader's sexual orientation before joining, and there had been no reported issues. The troop had even grown to incorporate a Cub Scout pack last fall.

"Anyone who is willing to step forward and provide an opportunity for our youth should be supported, and Geoff has done an excellent job," said Denise Mimura, the mother of a Troop 98 scout. "If anyone has an issue with this, then where are they?"

Rev. Monica Corsaro of the Rainier Beach United Methodist Church, a partner of Troop 98, had recruited the 49-year-old

software engineer for the position last year shortly after BSA leadership had voted to allow gay youth. Corsaro said many gay couples live in the neighborhood, and the decision reflects this demographic.

"I wouldn't have a Boy Scout troop unless we did it this way,"

Corsaro said. "This is who we are."

Zach Wahls, cofounder of Scouting for Equality, condemned the actions of the BSA, which he sees as further proof that its ban on gay leaders is "out of whack."

"It hurts to watch this happen," he said. "This troop and this Cub Scout pack would not exist without Geoffrey McGrath, and the fact that they would remove somebody who is growing Scouting just shows how out of whack this policy is."

Mom Of Michael Morones, 11-Year-Old Bullied Over 'My Little Pony,' Speaks Out On Son's Suicide Attempt

Tiffany Morones-Suttle faced every mother's nightmare in February when her 11-year-old son Michael Morones attempted suicide after classmates bullied him for loving the cartoon "My Little Pony."



Morones-Suttle joined HuffPost Live's Ahmed Shihab-Eldin to share her story on April 14, hours before Broadway Battles Bullying, a star-studded concert in Morones' honor featuring Ian McKellen, Patrick Stewart, Mary-Louise Parker and more.

Morones' mother said the terrifying experience has taught her the importance of fighting for her child.

"Sometimes our kids think they're strong and they're tough and they can handle everything, but as a parent it's our job to say, 'You know what, this is something I get to handle for you,'" she said. "It's not fighting their battles for them, but it's showing them how to do it when they get older and they're equipped better to do that."

Morones is still struggling with the effects of his suicide attempt. Morones-Suttle said she recently met with a neurologist, who said her son may have "locked-in syndrome," which is preventing him from communicating.

Morones-Suttle got visibly emotional and she described the idea of having to plan her son's funeral, but now that the darkest moment has passed, she's focused on sharing what she's learned with other parents.

"I'd seen things in the news and read things, and I was like, 'Wow, how does a kid ever feel like that? And where are their parents, where are the teachers?' Then you're kind of thrust into the situation, [and you say], 'Oh, wait, I was there,'" she said. "You have to step back and realize that it's everybody together trying to make that change."

Anglican Priest Defies Church, Marries Partner

An Anglican priest married his partner last week, defying his church's ban on same-sex marriages for clergy members and prompting some Church of England officials to warn of a looming "crisis," reports London's Independent.



Rev. Jeremy Pemberton married Laurence Cunnington, ignoring directives from the Church of England that also prohibit Anglican clergy from blessing same-sex unions.

When same-sex marriage became legal in England and Wales earlier this year, Archbishop Justin Welby, speaking on behalf of the Church of England's House of Bishops, released a statement saying, "We are all in agreement that the Christian understanding and doctrine of marriage as a lifelong union between one man and one woman remains unchanged."

Pemberton, however, told The Mail on Sunday that he simply loved his partner and wanted to marry.


"I love this man and I want to be married to him. That's what I want. It is the same as anyone who wants to get married," he said.

According to the Independent, the couple received public support from several pro-LGBT groups and some clergy members as well. Drew Mac, vicar of Sedbergh, wrote on Twitter, "Congratulations and best wishes — and may God bless you too!"

But Rev. Rod Thomas, a conservative member of the General Synod, told The Telegraph that without consequences for Pemberton, the Church of England could face a "crisis."

"If there is not clear discipline then it is the equiva-






Mozilla CEO Resigns, Opposition to Gay Marriage Drew Fire

(Reuters) - Mozilla Chief Executive Brendan Eich has stepped down, the company said on Thursday, after an online dating service urged a boycott of the company's web browser because of a donation Eich made to opponents of gay marriage.

The software company came under fire for appointing Eich as CEO last month. In 2008, he gave money to oppose the legalization of



"We didn't act like you'd expect Mozilla to act," wrote Mozilla Executive Chairwoman Mitchell Baker in a blog post. "We didn't move fast enough to engage with people once the controversy started. We're sorry."

The next step for Mozilla's leadership "is still being discussed," she added, with more information to come next week.

While gay activists applauded the move, many in the technology community lamented the departure of Eich, who invented the programming language Javascript and co-founded Mozilla

"Brendan Eich is a good friend of 20 years, and has made a profound contribution to the Web and to the entire world," venture capitalist Marc Andreessen tweeted.

Eich donated \$1,000 in 2008 in support of California's Proposition 8, which banned gay marriage in the state until it was struck down by the Supreme Court in June.

His resignation came days after OkCupid.com, the popular online dating site, called for a boycott of Mozilla Firefox to protest the world's No. 2 Web browser naming a gay marriage

opponent as chief executive.

On Monday, OkCupid sent a message to visitors who accessed the website through Firefox, suggesting they use browsers such as Microsoft Corp's Internet Explorer or Google Inc's Chrome.

"Mozilla's new CEO, Brendan Eich, is an opponent of equal rights for gay couples," the message said. "We would therefore prefer that our users not use Mozilla software to access OkCupid."

Federal Judge Officially Strikes Down Ohio's Gay Marriage Ban in Out of State Marriage Case

A federal judge in Ohio officially issued a ruling today declaring Ohio's ban on gay marriage unconstitutional.

Judge Timothy Black gave advance notice last week of his intentions in order to give the state time to prepare its appeal. He also placed a stay on his ruling pending appeals meaning same-sex marriages cannot yet begin in the state.

Still, it marks the 10th consecutive ruling invalidating such a ban since the US Supreme Court gutted key provisions of the Defense of Marriage Act last June.



His ruling comes in a case that has four married same-sex couples seeking an order that would require the state to place the names of both parents on the birth certificates of their children.

Black found Ohio's ban on recognizing out-of-state marriages of same-sex couples to unconstitutional and that the state has no justification for such discrimination.

'When a state effectively terminates the marriage of a same-sex couple married in another jurisdiction by refusing to recognize the marriage, that state unlawfully intrudes into the realm of





private marital, family, and intimate relations specifically protected by the Supreme Court,' he writes in the opinion.

Black also wrote: 'Ohio's refusal to recognize same-sex marriages performed in other jurisdictions violates the substantive due process rights of the parties to those marriages because it deprives them of their rights to marry, to remain married, and to effectively parent their children, absent a sufficient articulated state interest for doing so.'

The judge also found that the state is in violation of the Constitution by denying recognition to out-of-state adoption decrees and by refusing to amend the birth certificates of Ohio-born children.

He wrote: 'The inability to obtain an accurate birth certificate saddles the child with the life-long disability of a government identity document that does not reflect the child's parentage and burdens the ability of the child's parents to exercise their parental rights and responsibilities.'

The ruling comes in a case involving three are lesbian couples who are expecting children to be born in Ohio and a married same-sex couple living in New York City but whose adopted lence, they should also have a right to speak out about it.

son was born in Ohio.

The Ohio Department of Health, the agency charged with issuing birth certificates in the state, will not issue or amend birth certificates to name both parents.

'This is a great day for fairness and respect for Ohio families,' Susan Sommer, director of constitutional litigation for Lambda Legal said in a statement.

'This powerful opinion affirms what we have been arguing all along: These couples' marriages were disrespected by Ohio's discriminatory laws, and created not only a second-class of families by nullifying legal marriages from other states, but also a second-class of parents, where one could be listed on a birth certificate and one could not.'

Oregon Students Protest Day Of Silence With 'Gay Not OK' Shirts

Four students at a high school in Oregon City, Ore. caused controversy after wearing shirts in protest of the National Day Of Silence, an event meant to draw attention to the bullying of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) individuals.

The shirts read "Gay Is Not Ok" and "Gay Day Is Not OK." Two of the students reportedly stated that if the school is sponsoring the National Day Of Si-



would not be allowing the "Gay Day Is Not Ok" shirts on campus, and that the students would be required to turn the shirts inside out or take them off.

This certainly isn't the first time that students in public schools have attempted to make an anti-gay statement through their choice of clothing. Last October two students donned confederate flags at their Washington high school in response to another student wearing a rainbow flag on campus for two weeks.

Life Beyond Therapy

SELF ESTEEM

A lot of new clients tell me that they have lousy self-esteem...when someone gives them a compliment, they can't let it in. I think most of us have troubles with self-esteem (myself included), so let's look at what it is and how we can cultivate it.



Self-esteem is how we "esteem" ourselves: what we think about ourselves. No one thinks they're fabulous 24/7, but, how do you feel about yourself most of the time? Do you usually think you're okay, sometimes really good, other times, not so great? If so, you're normal. Most people have frequent fluctuations in their self-esteem.

If your self-esteem is messed up, it's hard for your brain to al-

low positive, kind and loving experiences to sink in. Here are my top three symptoms of poor self-esteem:

- (1) you don't believe that anything positive about you is true (denial)
- (2) you don't trust what people say to you (mistrust/ invalidation)
- (3) you think everyone wants something from you (paranoia)

These are useful things to know about yourself. Try not to judge yourself, just observe what you do. And please don't beat yourself up for doing this (that always slows down the change process): just notice what you do to sabotage your self-esteem. Observe it as neutrally as possible.

Once you see what you do, you can begin to change it with some introspection. Ask yourself questions like: Have I always been this way? Was I ever able to trust people? Did I used to allow myself to receive praise from others? Do a little detective work: go back in your life and see where any cognitive distortions may have originated. Who said what to you and when? Who hurt you/betrayed you/disappointed you/used you? Do you want to continue through life not trusting people? (Sorry, rhetorical question).

Part of freeing yourself from past conditioning is to see where all this crap started. It helps to identify how the innocent, trusting child you started out as (yes, even you hyper-cynical folks) somehow got turned around. For many of my clients, this is their "aha" moment: they see that something (or a series of events) happened that really changed who they were. They gave up being trusting and open; and replaced it with defenses to prevent ever being hurt again. This is what is known as the "adaptive self": it's what we did to survive, to get through tough times. However, as adults, it doesn't serve us to continue this way.

I'm not encouraging anyone to be stupid and gullible. It's good to have a healthy dose of skepticism, but it's not helpful to be so over defended that you don't let anyone into your heart. This is often why low self-esteem is correlated with feelings of isolation and loneliness. Are you willing to let people get to know you? Or do you give off a "leave me alone" vibe that would intimidate even Brad or Angelina?

While poor self-esteem isn't necessarily linked to emotional, physical or sexual abuse, some studies show that when adults don't remember large chunks of their childhood, there is usually a good reason. Often, our mind "protects" us against remembering something unpleasant or painful. While this doesn't mean you were abused, it's likely that something bad happened (you were made fun of by someone, your parents were divorcing, you had a crush on some same-sex hottie at school and felt miserable because you couldn't express it) and perhaps it's too painful to remember.

If your self-esteem isn't where you'd like it to be, I encourage you to do some introspective detective work to see why. Then you can begin to address any cognitive distortions (inaccurate ways you talk/think about yourself) so you can begin the change process. Self-esteem isn't fixed, it's malleable. Admittedly, it takes time and energy to shift it...but it's an awfully good investment in yourself.
