Arrests Made at Phelps Clan Funeral Demonstration

(Seaford Delaware) Five people face criminal charges after a weekend confrontation with members of a Kansas group that believes U.S. Military casualties are God's retribution for America's support of homosexuality, authorities said Monday. Members of Westboro Baptist Church in Topeka, Kan., gathered in Seaford on Sunday for a protest in conjunction with the funeral of Marine Cpl. Cory Palmer, who died earlier this month from injuries suffered in Iraq.

The Kansas group, carrying signs reading "God Hates Fags," "Fags Doom Nations" and "Vengeance is Mine, Sayeth the Lord," was met by a crowd of about 1,000 angry counter-demonstrators shouting "USA! USA!," as well as various taunts and obscenities.

Passing motorists honked their horns and hundreds of motorcycle riders revved their engines in an attempt to drown out the church members' shouts. Some counter-demonstrators hurled eggs, stones and water bottles.

State troopers and Seaford police officers were between the two factions, but authorities say a Bridgeville man broke through the police line and began assaulting two of the Westboro protesters shortly before the demonstration ended.

David Jones, 29, was charged with two counts of third-degree assault and one count of disorderly conduct. He was released on \$1,500 unsecured bond.

A 16-year-old Seaford boy was charged with criminal mischief and disorderly conduct after a tire on the Westboro group's rented van was slashed. He was being held at a detention center Monday in lieu of \$1,000 bond.

Christopher Daudt, 19, Stephen Carson, 19, and Allen Dunn, 56, all of Seaford, also were charged with criminal mischief and disorderly conduct after several counter-demonstrators threw rocks and bottles at a fire department vehicle carrying the Westboro protesters away from the scene, breaking several windows. Each was released on \$1,000 bond.

"Tempers got very high," said Stephanie Hansen, an attorney for the city. "The city provided plenty of police protection and did everything in its power to protect the members of Westboro

Baptist Church as they exercised their First Amendment rights."

Despite the violence, police department spokesman Capt. Gary Flood said he believed area residents showed "good restraint."

Judge Strikes Georgia Gay Marriage Ban

ATLANTA -- A judge has struck down Georgia's ban on samesex marriages, saying a measure overwhelmingly approved by voters in 2004 violated a provision of the state Constitution that limits ballot questions to a single subject.

The ruling by Fulton County Superior Court Judge Constance C. Russell had been eagerly awaited by gay rights supporters who filed the court challenge in November 2004, soon after the constitutional ban was approved.

Russell said the state's voters must first decide whether samesex relationships should have any legal status before they can be asked to decide if same-sex marriages should be banned.

"People who believe marriages between men and women should have a unique and privileged place in our society may also believe that same-sex relationships should have some place -- although not marriage," she wrote. "The single-subject rule protects the right of those people to hold both views and reflect both judgments by their vote."

Russell said "procedural safeguards such as the single-subject rule rarely enjoy public support."

"But ultimately it is those safeguards that preserve our liberties, because they ensure that the actions of government are constrained by the rule of law," the judge wrote.

Jack Senterfitt, who challenged the amendment on behalf of gay rights organization Lambda Legal, said the ruling "protects the right of voters to make independent decisions on each independent issue."

Gov. Sonny Perdue said the decision ran counter to the voice of Georgia voters in defining marriage as a union between a man and a woman.

"The people of Georgia knew exactly what they were doing when an overwhelming 76 percent voted in support of this constitutional amendment," he said. "It is sad that a single judge has chosen to reverse this decision."

Perdue said the state is considering appealing the decision to the Georgia Supreme Court.

We're All Going to Hell

With that said, let me begin. On Monday April 3, a group of radical "Christian" protestors gathered outside the student center to inform the UNO campus of everyone's one-way ticket to hell.

The protestors consisted of two men holding signs, and a group of men and women from Iowa wandering outside the student center carrying Bibles, singing hymns and passing out pamphlets.

I was walking to one of my classes when a little girl approached me

"Here," she said, "this is a good read." When I asked how old she was she replied by saying "I'm nine."

I took the pamphlet, and my heart instantly dropped. I recently wrote a column on Fred Phelps and his radical Westboro Baptist Church, and it hit me. I stood there confused.... Was this really happening?

Although this group had no affiliation with the Westboro Church, I instantly saw my previous column come to life. The signs these men held were nearly identical to the signs Phelps and his followers carried around. The large sign condemned "Gays and Lesboes," Muslims, Buddhists, Roman Catholics, Mormons, un-submissive wives, thieves, adulators, fornicators, baby killers, porn-addicts and racists. Many found the signs offensive, but more than anything, most considered them foolish. Was it the part that condemned racists to hell, but then later condemned Muslims, Buddhists and gays? Or maybe the section that condemned un-submissive wives in large font but then un-loving husbands in small?

Obviously this sign pissed me off. Not because they were pick-

eting against gays and lesbians, because let's face it, that is nothing new. I was furious at the whole concept. Muslims, Roman Catholics, gays, Mormons and Buddhists were all put on this sign right next to thieves, fornicators and porn-addicts. I know the Christian Bible says "All sins are equal in the eyes of God," but can this group be any more hypocritical? What about Matthew 7:1? "Do not judge, or you too will be judged?" Must have been a verse they overlooked.

The group visited our campus to bring shame and condemnation to others like myself; however, they failed miserably. If this protest did anything, it simply made me proud. Proud to be gay, and most importantly, proud of my fellow classmates and peers for sticking up for their beliefs and showing this group that Nebraska isn't as close-minded as they assume.

Students held signs reading, "God loves all sinners," "God is love," and even one poking fun at the protestors that read "Protesting makes me horny." I went a step further, and took a more physical approach. I grabbed one of my guy friends, made my way up to the protester holding the sign, and began kissing my friend in front of him. I honestly don't know what came over me, but what better statement to make? Applause quickly followed the kiss, and the man told me I was "sick and disgusting." I simply took a bow and walked away.

There is no denying the fact that these protestors had a right to be on our campus, but please, if you're going to protest something, must you offend absolutely everyone in the process? I'm only speaking for myself, but I fit four of the categories on that sign. I suppose my future is hopeless.

Perhaps the most touching moment of the protest was one that may have gone unnoticed by most; I'll never forget the song that played on the bell tower at around 3 p.m. I don't know if it was planned or just a coincidence: America the Beautiful rang throughout the campus, and all I could do was smile. America truly is beautiful, but not only in the physical aspect.

Look around. Everyone is different. Our campus is a portrait of color and diversity, something we often take for granted, and something these protestors obviously don't appreciate.

I often feel as if I repeat myself when I talk about religion and homosexuality, but I really don't think it can be said enough. Can you honestly imagine a heaven without gay people? Without Roman Catholics? Or Buddhists? I don't know who your God is, but my God would never turn his back on any of the above. If I've learned anything about the Christian religion, it's that the Christian God is "love." Whether you agree with homosexuality, Buddhism or abortion, it doesn't matter. Love is universal; it transcends all religions, genders and ethnic races. Perhaps if these protestors would have been more like their God, and brought some love to the UNO campus rather than uneducated hate, they would have been perceived better....then again, maybe not.
