Ford Angers Gay Advocacy Groups

NEW YORK (CNNMoney.com) - Ford Motor Co. faced sharp criticism from gay and lesbian advocacy groups for agreeing to stop advertising in gay-themed publications in the face of a boycott by the conservative American Family Association, according to a report Tuesday.

The AFA launched a boycott of Ford (Research) in May to protest marketing aimed at gay and lesbian consumers, the Detroit News said. The automaker responded by promising that most of its brands, with the exception of Sweden-based Volvo, will no longer target gay consumers through advertising.

After Ford's concession, gay and lesbian organizations argued that the automaker caved in to pressure from the religious right, the paper said.

"We are deeply dismayed that Ford has entered into a confidential agreement with the extremist American Family Association that requires Ford to stop advertising in lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender media," a group of 17 gay and lesbian organizations said in a joint statement, according to the paper.

"If there is an agreement with AFA, we expect Ford to disavow it. We expect Ford to publicly reaffirm its historic support for our community. And, we expect Ford to meet with LGBT representatives this week to resolve these concerns."

Ford said that it could market its products in a manner that was just as effective without offending consumers, according to the report.

"We reserve the right to advertise our brands and products wherever we think it makes business sense," Ojakli and Leitch wrote in a letter Monday to Suzanne Wait, head of Ford's gay and lesbian employee group, according to the paper.

Ford said its nondiscrimination policies covering employees, regardless of race, religion, gender, sexual orientation and cultural and physical differences, will not change.

Many Omaha area gay and lesbian homeowners who have had trouble with credit cards and so on have found that there is *one* place in Omaha where they can be treated with respect.

No “better than you” attitude, no “b.s.,” no guilt just for being gay or lesbian.

At last, finding financial help doesn’t have to be like a “coming out” at Thanksgiving dinner with everyone pointing fingers, and finding fault.

Mindy Hahne, of Service First Home Mortgage in Omaha’s Midtown area works at a GLBT friendly outfit that *specializes* in helping Omaha area GLBT homeowners in need.

“These are good people with damaged credit reports and/or hard to prove income! Not through any fault of their own! I *specialize* in helping the gay and lesbian community get a *fair shake* from the financial industry!” Hahne says.

Hahne says she has a lot of connections to Wall Street money, “I have personal relationships with investors *nationwide*, even *internationally*! Fair-minded people who want to fund loans for people with past credit problems!” she says.

“Many of them have a social conscience! And they take pride in helping gay and lesbians in particular! Just like I do! They use my *proprietary* system as their own little bit of “*social activism*!” Hahne says.

Hahne says, “It’s my *personal mission* to change the mindsets! And to *liberate everyone* from the restraints!”

“I grew up in a house where we didn’t have much money! And my parents understood just how money *really* works even less! Nowadays, it’s a lot of fun for me to help people get control over their money and their lives!” Mindy says.

Miss Susan Advises Judge Vigilant

The following is an adaptation from Miss Susan's Etiquette Tips for the Socially Conscious Judge: A Guide to Honorable Conduct Toward Gays and Lesbians in the Courtroom, originally published in the St. Louis University Public Law Review in the Spring of 2005. Dear Miss Susan,

I have a single-parent lesbian adoption case coming up for final hearing next week. Although nothing in my state's law explicitly prevents a homosexual from adopting, I know in my heart of hearts that it can never be right for a child to grow up with a pervert for a mother. Anyway, I don't see why a lesbian would want children in the first place. Homosexuals are well-known for their promiscuous lifestyles, so she would never be able to provide a stable home for anything bigger than a pussy-cat. Why can't she just be happy with a house full of cats?

Dear Judge Vigilant,

I remember reading once about an aboriginal society where children are so precious that the word "child" also means "wealth." Cats are nice animals, but they don't enrich your life in quite the same way that a child does. (For one thing, children are much more affectionate than cats.) People who want to adopt recognize both the intrinsic value of a child and the difference they could make in the life of a child who is otherwise without parents. In that respect, I suspect that gays and lesbians are no different than any other prospective parents.

Naturally, you are not the first judge to consider an adoption by a gay or lesbian petitioner. In re Charles B. was an Ohio Supreme Court case dealing with this exact situation. In resolving the issue, the court decided to treat gay and lesbian adoptions just like any other adoption and looked to the best interests of the child. Although the petitioner was a gay man, nearly all of the evidence adduced at trial supported a conclusion that the petitioner would be a loving and supportive father. There was no evidence that his sexual orientation would be detrimental to the welfare of the child. Thus, the court overruled a lower appeals court ruling that homosexuals are per se ineligible to adopt in Ohio. In doing so, the Court stressed that "all relevant factors" must be considered in determining the best interests of the child, suggesting that the lower court erred in focusing on a single factor to the exclusion of all others.

This sort of single-minded focus may have been the crucial flaw for an Illinois judge in In re C.M.A. Despite clear precedent stating that sexual orientation is irrelevant in adoption cases, the lower court judge refused to grant two lesbian adoption petitions. In a bizarre twist, the lower court judge joined the unrelated adoption cases together and appointed the Family Research Council, a conservative think tank, as a "secondary guardian" to advocate the anti-gay point of view. Even after she was removed from the case for bias, she claimed that her

removal had been unwarranted and continued to issue orders in the case. The Appellate Court of Illinois found that the judge "obviously had a predetermined bias against lesbians" and affirmed the adoptions. In doing so, the court remarked that "no judge has the right or authority to ignore the rules governing our administration of justice."

Although I can see that you are uncomfortable with the petitioner's sexual orientation, I wonder if your objections to her "lesbian lifestyle" are based more on stereotypes than empirical data. Social science research suggests that children raised in gay and lesbian homes develop normally and lead healthy, happy lives. Perhaps you should look at this case again and ask yourself whether you are also focusing too much on the petitioner's sexual orientation and not enough on the best interests of the child.

also seen a high number of applicants --
including Kensington and Islington -- as
has Manchester and Glasgow.

However, less obvious locations are also
marking the introduction of the new laws.

In Croydon, the rainbow flag will fly
above the council buildings while regis-
trars in places as diverse as Scunthorpe and
Leicester will be welcoming couples in to
their offices to start the legal recognition
process.

The new laws have been broadly wel-
comed by gay activists, who say the chang-
es will transform the lives of many same-
sex couples.

However, many say this is only the start of
a ball rolling that will result in equality for
lesbian and gay people.

Writing in The Observer on Sunday,
Stonewall chief executive Ben Sumner-
skill said the new laws sent a strong mes-
sage to the government about how far it
can push social reform.

"Perhaps one happy outcome of Stone-
wall's campaign for civil partnership has
been the message it's given to a govern-
ment all too often over-anxious about so-
cial reform," he said. "The roof has not
fallen in, politically or socially. And it
won't fall in tomorrow morning either."

British Gay Couples Apply for Civil Unions

Lesbian and gay couples who braved
the cold winter weather across the
U.K. Monday morning have become
the first people to take advantage of
the Civil Partnership Act.

Hundreds of couples queued at regis-
ter offices to state their intention to
have a civil partnership, which gives
the same rights and responsibilities as
heterosexual marriage.

The new laws came into force at mid-
night and were celebrated by the ma-
jority of same-sex couples as one of
the most important legal changes af-
fecting lesbian and gay people.

The moment was marked by a large
projection of two grooms on the side
of the House of Parliament. The im-
age, sponsored by Gay.com, also fea-
tured the words "I Do."

After registering their partnerships,
couples must wait at least 15 days
before holding a ceremony. The first
ceremonies will take place in Brighton
and Hove at 8 a.m., the earliest time
the register office can open for use.

The city, which has a long reputation
as the country's official gay capital,
has seen the bulk of pre-registrations,
with nearly 500 couples planning to
have a ceremony in the near future.

Elton John and David Furnish to Wed

Veteran British rock star Elton John's civil partnership ceremony to long-term love David Furnish will take place in the same venue as the civil wedding of Britain's Prince Charles and Camilla.

The announcement - on the day new laws came into force in Britain allowing gay couples to pledge their troth and enjoy virtually the same legal rights as heterosexuals - follows mounting speculation about a venue.

Now pop royalty will not only follow the heir to the British throne by legally binding his relationship with the Canadian filmmaker at the Guildhall in Windsor, west of London, but have the same official to oversee events.

Clair Williams, the superintendent registrar of the Royal Borough of Windsor, will officiate at the private December 21 ceremony, alongside experienced fellow registrar Peter Edwards.

Williams, who performed the royal civil wedding at the Guildhall in April this year, said she was "delighted" the celebrity couple had chosen the historic 17th century venue.

"I and my colleague, Peter, will do out utmost to ensure that the ceremony is a very special and private occasion for them and their guests," she said.

Local authorities in Windsor - famous for its cobbled streets and fortified royal residence - are already liaising with police in anticipation of fans hoping to catch a glimpse of the couple, who have been together for 12 years.

Civil partnerships confers legal status on homosexual unions, allowing similar tax and inheritance benefits as heterosexual couples.

The first civil partnership ceremony is scheduled to take place on December 19 in Northern Ireland, followed by Scotland on December 20 and England and Wales the following day.

Couples have to first register their intent, wait a compulsory 15 days and then go to a register office or other authorised place.

There they sign an official civil partnership document in front of a registrar and two witnesses. The ceremony is much like a civil wedding. The marriage to Furnish will be John's second.

The singer had wed German music engineer Renate Blauel in

1984 but they divorced four years later.
