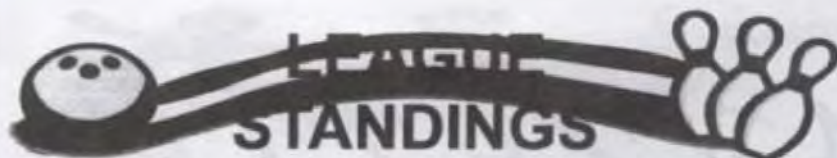

THE ROAD LESS TRAVELED

On at least one issue the voting results of 416 were pretty clear. There were some counties in Out State Nebraska that didn't cast one vote against the dreaded amendment. How awful, how hurtful, how disappointing. Why was this and what could we do about it?

This was the question poised to the Citizens for Equal Protection (CFEP) board of directors. The answer seemed clear, we had to go to these people and meet them and talk to them and let them get to know us and us them. Surely then some would open their minds and see how unfair this constitutional amendment and their bias towards gay people was. Surely. Thus "The Road Show" was born.

We are pleased to announce "On the Road to Fairness: Nebraska's Journey to End Anti-Gay Bias" is alive and kicking. CFEP has teamed up with Nebraskans for Peace, PFLAG and GLSEN and put the show on the road... The program includes a GLBT fact and information portion and a panel to answer questions. D Moritz and Donna Colley facilitated the first "Road Show" in Wayne on Tuesday, September 24. The program was attended by about 60 courageous Wayne folk and the panel consisted of a Gay Carpenter, a Gay Teacher, a Lesbian Mom and the Mom of a Lesbian. The idea being to let the people meet us and see us and hopefully realize we're just regular people- not too unlike themselves. It was a great start in our educational efforts.

"On the Road to Fairness" is scheduled in Hastings on October 22, and for Kearney on November 12. 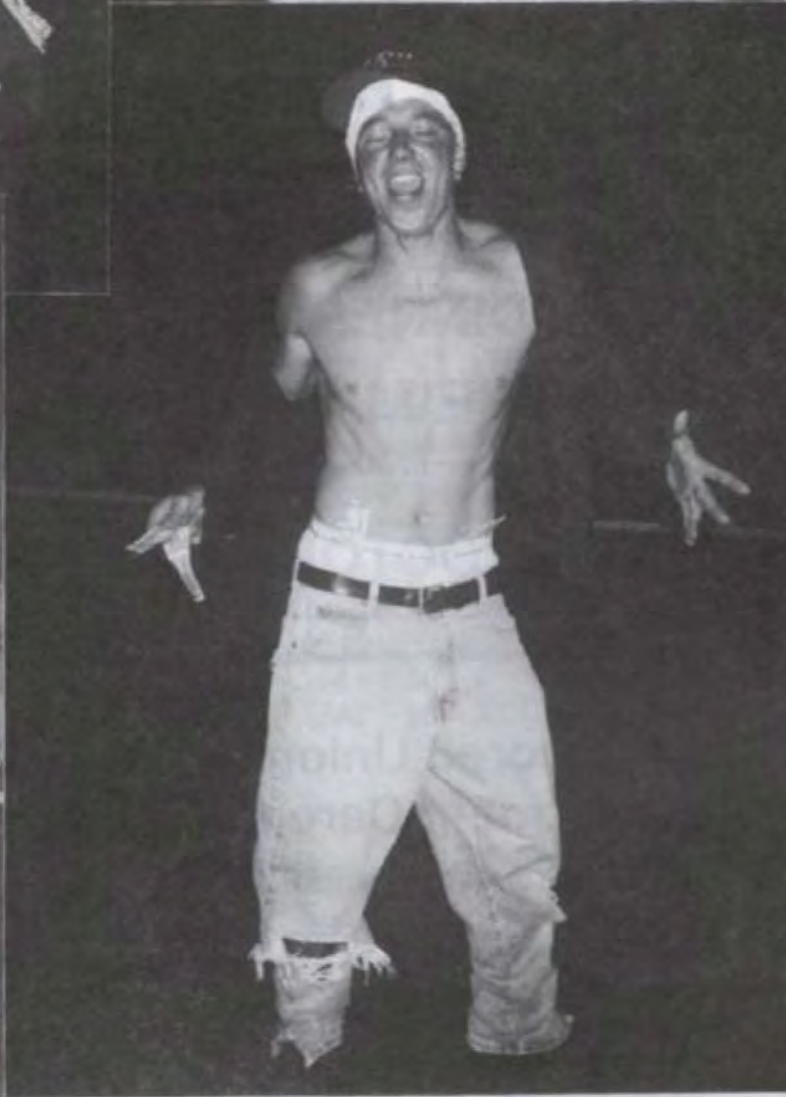
