Iowa Passes Civil Rights Bill

Without debate, the Iowa House late Wednesday April 25, 2007, voted 59-37 to extend civil rights protections based on sexual orientation and gender identity. The Iowa Senate two hours later approved House changes in the bill, sending it to the governor's desk by a 34-16 vote. Both votes were bipartisan.

The bill forbids discrimination based on someone's real or perceived sexual orientation or gender identity when it comes to employment, education, credit, housing, and public accommodations.

Governor Chet Culver promises to sign the bill into law. Culver calls it "historic civil rights legislation" and in a written statement said "we must create an Iowa in which we do not discriminate against anyone, anywhere, at anytime."

Ask Your Life Coach

Dear Life Coach,

I am a high-powered lawyer who fits all the stereotypes. I'm talking big fat Lexus, 80-hour workweeks and very nice suits. About six months ago, I fell hard for a guy that is bad news. He is unemployed, smokes pot on a daily basis, and has absolutely no ambition. He also seems to be overly interested in letting me pay for everything. To make matters worse, I think he may be cheating on me. I know it sounds bad, but I'm crazy about him. Is there a way we can overcome our differences, especially since they do not bother him?

Annette: I have a prediction: this will not end well. There is a better man for you out there. Go and find him.

Jeremy: Of course he is not bothered. For someone smart enough to be a successful lawyer, you sure are acting out of character. You're like a toddler who knows the oven is hot, but touches it anyway, because "it seems like fun". Get out now, or pay the (possibly severe) consequences later.

Dear Life coach.

Ever since I came out to my middle-aged mother (about three years ago), she has turned into a monster. She was always a Christian, but recently things have turned very sour. Some of her friends at her church have been talking to her about the fact that I am probably going to hell, and she is buying into their negativity hook, line, and sinker.

Now I find brochures about all kinds of organizations that can supposedly "cure" me. They even held a collection at her church to send me to "Gay-rehab". I've asked her to stop, I've told her it's no use, I've even tried to break off all contact. No luck...I still come home on a daily basis to find those stinking brochures jammed in my mailbox. Please advise...I'm so irritated, I'm contemplating going to her church in drag to teach them all a lesson (some friends have already volunteered to go with me).

Annette: That would probably not help, although if you do decide to do it, please have someone bring a video camera. I understand your dilemma; your mother is your mother. Are you willing to put in all the work that is needed to salvage this relationship? Because you WILL be doing all the work; it doesn't sound like she will snap out of it on her own. I suggest you meet her on her own turf. There are churches that offer a different perspective. Find a minister that is more open and not judgmental; ask him to go with you and talk to her. That way, you have someone knowledgeable in your corner, someone who speaks her language, but can soften her opinion.

Jeremy: When you came out, your mother was most likely at a loss as to how to react; it is obvious that she looked for and found guidance from the wrong people. Causing a rift between a mother and her child is not religiously inspired; it is spiteful. Find a mediator, like a family member she is close to. A friend she has outside of this church, or maybe a member of the clergy. Expose her to people that will remind her that her relationship with you is valuable, and should not be lost. She needs the right kind of guidance, and she needs to be educated. Call PFLAGG immediately.





Zubro's nincteen mysteries rank him among the most prolific of openly gay authors.







what GLBTQ individuals deal with in their search for religion and spirituality," says Andy Melichar, creator of the *Uncovering Spirituality* project. "I've had people tell me that I am going to hell, that I will burn for all eternity because of who I am – people would be appalled at the things that are said and done in the name of religion. This project will capture and convey the mixed messages, the confusion, the angst, and also the joy and love that GLBTQ people find while searching for their religious and spiritual community."

"I left the Catholic church because I was no longer accepted or welcomed. Everything I had been told by the church seemed like a lie. When I reconciled my sexuality with myself, the religious leaders I looked up to and admired throughout my life suddenly had a different opinion of me, which contradicted everything they had taught me," explains Beth Rigatuso, who is partnering in the project with Melichar, "I spent years searching for a religious community that accepted me for who I am. When I found a church that accepted me and my sexuality. I found my home, my extended family, and a new connection with the God that I always knew loved me just the way he made me."

"We started this project to bring together a community of people who have struggled to find their place not only in the world, but also within their own definition of spirituality. This documentary will expose the true nature of religion within the GLBTQ community and show people who are struggling not only with their sexuality, but also with their religion, there are options; there are people and communities in this world who are accepting and welcoming" says Melichar.


