RESOURCE CENTER CONTINUES TO STRUGGLE BUT REAFFIRMS COMMITMENT TO COMMUNITY

A meeting of the Board of Directors was held Saturday, June 10 and the decision was made by those present to continue to work to keep the Rainbow Outreach GLBT Resource Center open. The Resource Center continues to struggle to survive. Income from the Gayzette advertising and from donations and memberships have kept the bills current, but each month brings new challenges.

Several new volunteers have stepped forward to help with the day to day operations of the Center and the Center is currently staffed with reliable volunteers Monday – Friday, 6-9pm. A training session for several new volunteers will be held Tuesday, June 20 at 7pm. Walk-in volunteers are welcome at this session.

OPEN BOARD MEETINGS PLANNED

We continue to be in need of persons willing to serve on the Board of Directors. We welcome interested parties to attend one of four meetings planned over the next two months. These meetings will serve as orientation meetings for prospective board members, as town hall meetings soliciting input from the community, and as planning meetings to determine the future of the Resource Center. RODEO JUNE 24, 25 IN SPRINGFIELD, NEBRASKA

The Heartland Regional Rodeo takes place June 24 and 25 at the Cass County Fairgrounds in Springfield, Nebraska. This event will draw hundreds of rodeo fans from across the country as cowboys and cowgirls compete in both rough stock and camp events. While this is serious rodeo, including the toughest challenges to face rodeo competitors, it also includes some events just for fun. You will see the fastest horses and riders compete against the clock in the barrel and flag races. There will be the battle of muscle and leverage against brute strength in chute dogging. Calf roping will test the skill of rope handlers while balance, strength, and timing will determine who is the best in the rough stock events of steer riding, bronco riding, and bull riding. But if you think it's all serious rodeo, remember to stick around for the goat dressing and wild drag races. Yes, there's something for everyone at the Heartland Regional Rodeo.

Be sure to arrive early enough for the Grand Entrance held at noon Saturday and Sunday. The Grand Entrance features not only the dignitaries of the rodeo but also the highly moving posting of the colors and the walk of the riderless horse in memory of all the fallen riders. The saddle blanket of the riderless horse will bear special "memory badges" purchased by area supporters in honor of friends and family no longer with us.

There will also be lots of country barbecue at the chuck wagon and entertainment on the rodeo stage along with

displays by area vendors and organizations.

When the cowboys and cowgirls aren't rodeoing, they will be taking part in a host of events including a Twisted Poker Crawl on Thursday, a Show-Down with Grub on Friday, a Boot-Scootin' Dance on Saturday, and the Rodeo Awards on Sunday. Check the calendar for details.

REV. SLOAT LEADS FINAL SERVICE

Rev. Sharon Sloat of Metropolitan Community Church of Omaha will lead her final service as senior pastor there on Sunday, June 25, at 10:20 AM. The Board of Directors and congregation of MCC-Omaha invites the community to attend this special service.

Rev. Sloat came to Omaha from Des Moines in the fall of 1996 to serve as interim pastor, while MCC-O conducted a pastoral search. Rev. Sloat had previously served as interim pastor in Des Moines, following her student clergy training in 1993-4 under Rev. Matthew Howard.

In the spring of 1997, the members of MCC-O voted to call Rev. Sloat as Senior Pastor. She accepted that call and has served as senior pastor since that time. As senior pastor she has often spoke with radio and television interviewers, as well as on college campuses, on behalf of GLBT people. As the only MCC church in Nebraska, Rev. Sloat has been pastor to a congregation spread from one end of the state to the other.

A reception in Rev. Sloat's honor will be held Sunday, June 25, following the 10:20 service. The community is invited to attend.

The pastoral search process has begun to find Rev. Sloat's replacement. In the meantime, MCC-O will be offering all the same ministries to the community that it has in the past, thanks to the help of local clergy and MCC-O lay leaders.

OMAHA PRIDE PARADE ATTRACTS HUNDREDS

Hundreds of people came together in downtown Omaha on June 11 to celebrate Pride 2000 with a parade and festival. After a brief delay waiting for the police escort to arrive, the parade took marchers from 14th and Jones through the heart of the Old Market to the Heartland of America Park where vendors and organizations had set up tables under large white tents with columns of balloons as guideposts. The parade was led by mounted HGRA members Bryn Geerdes and her partner Tamara Marks whose high stepping horses caught the attention of the crowds of College World Series Fans. The parade included the highest representation of youth yet seen in a Pride parade with Gay/Straight Alliances from Omaha and Lincoln High Schools joining with members of the Proud Horizons Youth Group and supporters from the Gay, Lesbian, Straight Education Network (GLSEN). GLSEN had rented a school bus for the parade but the high spirited youth preferred to walk the route arm and arm or carrying signs proclaiming their pride. New to the parade this year was a women's drumming group. Returning for the 16th Year were the Imperial Court of Nebraska and Metropolitan Community Church of Omaha.
