Russian Parliament to Take Up Anti-LGBT Bill

Russia's parliament is scheduled to take up a bill on January 22 that will ban gays and lesbians from showing any form of public affection. The bill was proposed in October by two members of the



Communist Party, and has made its way to the Duma's lower house.

In an interview, Ivan Nikitchuk, Russian lawmaker and a sponsor of the bill, said that the proposal will stop "sick and crazy people" from "displaying their demonic desires which the West has forced on us."

If the bill is passed, "the public expression of nontraditional sexual relations, manifested in a public demonstration of personal perverted sexual preferences in public places" will be criminalized. Anyone caught breaking the law will be fined an equivalent of \$65 and face up to 15 days in jail. The law is so vague that any action or behavior that is non-gender-conforming will also be punishable.

The current gay propaganda law in Russia already prohibits the "promotion of non-traditional sexual relationships to minors." If the proposed bill passes, members of the LGBT community in Russia will face further discrimination.

Ricky Martin 'Open' to Sex With Women, But Doesn't Call Himself Bi

Ricky Martin, who came out as gay in 2010, now says he's "open to having sex with a woman," but that doesn't mean he identifies as bisexual.

"I know that I like both men and women, I'm against sexual labels, we are simply human beings with emotional and sexual needs," Martin told Mexican magazine Fama!, according to an English translation by the Latin Post.

"I am gay, men fascinate me, but I like to enjoy sex in total freedom, so I'm open to having sex with a woman if I feel desire," added the singer-actor. He said he wouldn't be interested in an ongoing relationship with a woman, though. "Men are my thing," he explained.

Martin, the father of twin sons, broke up with stockbroker Carlos González

Abella in January 2014 after a three-year relationship. It's lately been rumored that Martin is dating Spanish singer Pablo Alborán, but neither man has confirmed or denied the relationship, the Latin Post reports.



PrEP as Safe as Aspirin, Claims New Study

A study recently published in the Oxford Journal's Open Forum Infectious Diseases concluded that taking pre-exposure propyhlaxis for the prevention of HIV was as safe as aspirin.

Researchers from the University of California, Los Angeles compared five major studies on PrEP for HIV infection and two major studies on aspirin safety.

According to the study, catchily titled, "Is Emtricitabine-Tenofovir Disoproxil Fumarate Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis for the Prevention of HIV Infection Safer than Aspirin?":

Mexico's Marriage Equality Momentum Picks Up

Nayarit is the latest state to legalize same-sex marriage.

Following places like Chihuahua and Mexico City, the western Mexican state of Nayarit has legalized same-sex marriage. The state's congress passed an amendment to the state civil code this week, which should be formalized shortly, The Yucatan Times reports.

Nayarit's legalization follows a decision by the nation's Supreme Court that opened the door for such changes. That June ruling stated that limiting marriages to opposite-sex couples was unconstitutional,



though it didn't order states to begin issuing marriage licenses to all. Instead, the high court was offering "jurisprudential thesis" to the states, and opening the door for lower-court judges to follow their lead should local marriage bans be challenged.

Some jurisdictions enacted marriage equality earlier, with Mexico City doing so almost six years ago.

The liberal-minded Mexican Supreme Court in August also struck down bans on adoption of children by same-sex couples.

More Americans Are Drinking Themselves to Death — Are You?

New stats show alcohol-related deaths are on the rise, and people with HIV may be at greater risk.

Nearly 30,700 Americans died last year because of alcohol — and those deaths



had nothing to do with drunk driving, homicides, or alcoholrelated accidents, according to new statistics from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The Washington Post reports that including those deaths would raise the total of all deaths related to alcohol to 90,000 last year.

And those numbers are on the rise: 2014 saw the first increase in 35 years to the number of deaths caused by alcohol poisoning or cirrhosis. Those 2014 numbers also represent a 37 percent increase over 2002 deaths. In addition to the increase in alcohol deaths, the CDC also reported an increase in other


deaths related to substance abuse, particularly painkiller and heroin abuse.

The number of people who use alcohol increased slightly between 2002 and 2014, particularly among women, the Washington Post reports. Alcohol-related problems are more typically associated with established heavy drinkers and those who are older and more suseptible to other health issues. The majority of people who drink consume less than problem drinkers and the health effects are less pronounced. Washington Post also notes that the line between regular consumption to get a buzz and overdosing on alcohol is a lot thinner than with other controlled substances.

Alcohol is the most abused substance in the United States, and the National Institutes of Health reports that drinking is a greater problem among those with HIV versus the general population, putting HIV-positive people at greater risk for alcohol-related deaths. According to the NIH, 8 percent of people with HIV are classified as heavy drinkers versus 4.5 percent in the general population.

A heavy drinker is defined as a person who consumed five or more drinks at a single occasion on each of five or more days within the past 30 days. The same study also reported that 67 percent of heavy drinkers had been told by a health care provider that they were drinking too much.

While a 2013 study suggested that alcohol has no impact on HIV treatments overall, it did find that heavy drinkers were much more likely to interupt their antiretroviral therapy. Treatment interuption has a demonstrated, potentially long-term





impact on people living with HIV, so it pays to keep your drinking in check.

Good Morning, Baltimore! Hairspray to Be NBC's Next Live Musical

Sanders Campaign Slams HRC's Clinton Endorsement

The Human Rights
Campaign, the nation's
largest and most influential LGBT advocacy
group, formally endorsed Hillary Clinton
for president Tuesday
morning, and it didn't
take long for her Democratic rival — Vermont Sen. Bernie
Sanders — to weigh in
on the news.

"It's understandable and consistent with the establishment organizations voting for the establishment candidate, but it's an endorsement that cannot possibly be based on the facts and the record," Sanders cam-



paign spokesman Michael Briggs told the Washington Blade.

Briggs reiterated Sanders's LGBT rights cred, which includes voting against "don't ask, don't tell" and the Defense of Marriage Act in the 1990s as well as supporting civil unions in Vermont in 2000. Sanders supports marriage equality, but advised against it in 2006.

While Clinton currently rivals Sanders in support for LGBT equality, her record is more spotty, with support for DOMA in her 2000 Senate run and partial support for its repeal in her unsuccessful 2008 White House bid. Clinton's support for marriage equality wasn't cemented until last year. Clinton now supports a vast array of LGBT rights measures, including a national Equality Act, which would ban anti- LGBT discrimination in housing and employment, open transgender military service, and a ban on conversion therapy; Sanders supports all these things as well.

"So who knows what prompted the Human Rights Campaign to do what it does — I have trouble myself figuring why they do some of the things they do over the years — but I think the gay men and lesbians all over the country will know who has been their champion for a long, long time and will consider that as they make up their mind on support for his campaign," Briggs told the Blade.

The HRC says its endorsement of Clinton was a unanimous decision among its 32 "community leaders" that stemmed from a questionairre sent to all 2016 candidates (no Republican responded to the questionnaire).

Bette Midler to Return to Broadway in Hello, Dolly!

British Parliament Debates Banning 'Bonkers' Republican Candidate, **Donald Trump**

Yesterday, the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland debated an unusual-and quite sensational—topic: Donald Trump. In response to the inflammatory language the business mogul has employed against veterans, Muslims, Hispanics, the disabled, and women (to name a few) in his bid for the Republican party's presidential nomination, a petition was launched in the United Kingdom to ban him from entering the country on the grounds of hate speech. After more than half a million people signed the motion, the government was compelled to respond, and Members of Parliament (MPs) certainly did not pull punches.

The debate lasted for nearly three hours, much to the chagrin of Trump, who has invested hundreds of millions of dollars in the



Scottish economy in the form a real estate and a luxury golf course near Aberdeen. Throughout the session, MPs took turns accusing Trump of being everything from "bonkers" to a "demagogue," "buffoon," "racist, homophobic, [and] misogynistic," and "a poisonous, corrosive man." Tim Cook Get Intimate on 60 Minutes

The CBS television show, 60 Minutes, devoted much of its episode to an interview with Tim Cook, the CEO of Apple and the most powerful gay man in the world.

While much of the discussion focused on Apple's business practices — including its use of encryption, its hiring of workers in China, and accusations that it seeks tax shelters in foreign countries — Charlie Rose did bring up Cook's relatively recent coming out.



Cook described why he sees being gay as a benefit:

"When you're in a minority group, it gives you a sense of empathy of what it's like to be in the minority, and you begin to look at things from different point of views, and I think it was a gift for me."

Since he came out, the Apple CEO has become an outspoken advocate for LGBT equality. When Indiana passed a bill earlier this year that would have allowed businesses to discriminate against gay people, Cook blasted Gov. Mike Pence in a Washington Post op-ed. Cook also unsuccessfully urged Alabama to

enact LGBT protections, and made a large donation to the Human Rights Campaign.

Rose also asked why Cook didn't come out sooner. The executive said he valued his privacy but eventually realized his impact as an out gay leader would be too great to pass up.

"But it became increasingly clear to me that if I said something that it could help other people. And I'm glad, because I think that some kid somewhere, some kid in Alabama, I think if they just for a moment stop and say, 'If it didn't limit him, it may not limit me.' Or this kid that's getting bullied. Or worse, I've gotten notes from people contemplating suicide. And so if I could touch just one of those, it's worth it. And I couldn't look myself in the mirror without doing it."

Op-Ed: The After-Meth of Sex

Recovery gave Blair Fell his life back, but getting off was never the same.

I did Tina, gay slang for crystal meth, for eight years. Not every day, though every day I wanted it so badly that I did other drugs to hold off the cravings. And when I did do it, once or twice a month,



I'd be lost to the drug for usually three days at a time. Why? What's so great about doing meth? Why are so many people — especially urban gay men — still risking their lives as I did?

Imagine a magic powder that transforms every potential lover into the person of your dreams. Now suppose every touch of that person feels like full-body orgasms for hours, and your hunger for them never ceases as long as you are under the spell. This powder also gives you the supernatural ability to block out every interfering thought about your job, or taking Billy to soccer practice, or paying rent. No more obsessing about your mortality or your lover's, or about how your ac-

It's not only the best sex you've ever had, it's better than the best. It's dark and kinky, and reveals your deepest, most secret fantasies. Fantasies you didn't even know you had. It's huge. It's wet. It's voracious. It's Godzilla-fucks-Gamera sex! Now imagine all that and then multiply it by 100 and stretch it over three days.

That's meth sex.

OK, sure, meth sex had a few drawbacks. Like when a sex partner (also on meth) hid under the bed because of the FBI camera he hallucinated was hiding in the TV set. Or the frequent instances where neither I nor my hyper-horny partner could get hard. (Thanks, Tina!) Or when the drug started to wind down, and, for the 100th time, I was surprised to discover I was no longer attracted to the aforementioned god-like partner whom I swore I was in love with five minutes before. And then, as I prayed that this now lizard-human-Antichrist would leave, he instead kept pulling incessantly on his flaccid little buddy, stammering, "Just five more minutes and I can come! Just give me five more minutes!" for five hours.

But still, meth sex, at least when I first started having it, was the best sex ever.

So, despite the suicidal depression that always followed, despite the job losses, the inability to maintain any kind of relationship, the questions by dentists about my teeth-grinding, and the fact that, to be honest, it never was quite as good as that first time, I kept chasing that initial experience of the most-amazing-sex-I-ever-had. But then, toward the end of my using, the space between the first bump of the night and the suicidal depression grew dramatically shorter. Even when I was high I was low. Something had to change. The best-sex-I-ever-had thing became just a label on the packaging — its promise as truthful as a Sea-Monkeys advertisement in the back of a comic book.

So in 2002, with the help of a lot of friends out in Los Angeles, I got sober and things definitely got better. I was finally able to form real friendships. My boss loved me at work. I was engaged with real life. One day during my first months of sobriety I had an epiphany while hiking up in Runyon Canyon. I realized that what was supposed to be my tragic life story suddenly had an additional, potentially happy chapter stapled onto the ending. My old ending was supposed to be death or insanity. But now there was this hopeful uncertainty. As long as I stayed sober there was the possibility my life would turn out OK.

There was only one not-so-little problem: Sex without crystal meth just wasn't working.

In my first year sober I went about six months without sex. Not a big deal for some, but for a hyper-sexed gay man like me such a long dry spell just didn't happen. When I did manage to hang out with someone it not only lacked the herculean aspect of meth sex; without the drug I could barely feel anything. The wiring between my genitals and my brain was wrong. It was as though when I pressed play on the TV remote I was getting ice cubes from the freezer. Also, I started to look at people as complete human beings rather than flesh tools. Casual sex became so awkward. It was as though everyone I went home with became this non-sexual buddy with whom I needed to have a heartfelt talk. My libido had been

replaced with an obsessive sense of humanity.

It was a nightmare.

I would invent excuses for the jamming of my equipment: "Sorry, I just broke up with someone." Or, "Sorry, I already came three times today." Or, closer to the truth (but still a lie): "I just got sober and I'm not supposed to have sex."

So I spent a lot of time masturbating. A lot. But in my masturbatory fantasies I was still getting high. That's right, even though I was sober, I needed to imagine doing meth so I could stop my mind from spinning and get off. I knew this could be dangerous to my sobriety, but it was the only way I could climax. I kept it a secret for a long time.

Then one night, just shy of a year sober, I stumbled across two insanely hot, breathtakingly bearish Long Beach lumberjacks. Before I could shift into my sexless social worker mode, the younger member of the couple invited me to have a three-way with them. Considering this might be a sign from the Great Horndog in the sky, I felt I would be remiss not to give this polyamorous playdate a try. Besides, in my drug-using days an intimacy-free three-way could inspire me to feats of sexual acrobatics that could humble a Cirque du Soleil contortionist.

"Sure. What the hell," I said, trying to approximate what I vaguely remembered was a dirty smile.

Suddenly their flannel dropped to the floor in a small mountain range of plaid. And there they stood, stark naked — 450 pounds of muscle, hairy chests, and dicks to infinity. There were only two things missing: meth and me. As the sex began I felt like I was floating three feet above the scene, observing it. Every attempt at something sexual seemed just a little bit silly. I was an alien visiting the Planet of Gay for the first time: "Penises? What does one do with these things called penises?"

The awkward three-way came to a close, and when it came time for the money shot I was unable to make change. Womp womp. Bears: 2 Me: 0.

I had resigned myself to the belief that my dirty sex life was over, and that someday I'd meet another sexually dysfunctional person and we'd settle down on some gay Amish farm and have a pleasant, passionless relationship while enjoying the benefits of two Social Security checks.

Hmm, I thought. Hurray for sobriety?

But I stayed sober, hoping time would heal things. And it did. Periodically sex would happen, and while it hadn't returned to its meth-y (and messy) glory days, it also wasn't getting worse. Month by month the sense memory of meth sex became diluted in the stream of sober life. I no longer needed to think about meth to masturbate. Then about two years after I got clean something shifted. I met a guy on a dating Web site on a trip back East. He was covered in tattoos, a sex god personified. I knew it was only going to be a weekend fling, but after our sexual encounter I suddenly realized I had just fully enjoyed sexy, dirty, casual sex again. Cue the choir of raunchy angels. Of course, this human-sized sex only lasted a fraction as long as my old meth sex. But, go figure, humans aren't supposed to have sex for three days non-stop.

I was finally OK with that.

The Double Testosterone Marriage

gay married coupleI am pleased to report that I have recently signed a contract to publish my new book "The Double Testosterone Marriage: Monogamy or Open Relationship?" with Rowman & Little-



field Publishers. I will turn in the manuscript in June and the book should be published later in the year.

About six months' ago, when I wrote the proposal for the book, a submissions editor at another major publisher asked me, "Why do you want to write this book?" This column is – in essence – the answer to that question.

As a psychotherapist to many LGBT couples, I have noticed that gay couples, in particular, often find themselves in a challenging situation: because of the double testosterone factor (for male-male couples), sex is often more important than it is for male-female and female-female couples. In my counseling experience, two married men often have a stronger desire for sex – wanting more of it and with a wider variety of partners – than married opposite-sex or lesbian couples. How does this work within the structure of a monogamous marriage?

Or does it?

When I was playing in a rock band in my 20's, I thought that marriage was obsolete. In my 30's, I found myself wanting more commitment and depth in my romantic relationships. As I approached my late 40's, I wasn't sure that monogamy was the best way for two men to be together.

In my 50's, I discovered that many long-term gay couples gave lip service to monogamy – and appeared to be monogamous – but, upon closer inspection, were not.

As a psychotherapist, now in my early 60's, I've discovered that many successful gay marriages are – by choice – not strictly monogamous.

Legal gay marriage is still a relatively new phenomenon. This book – that I'm in the process of writing – will offer married gay couples (and gay couples considering marriage) an easy-to-follow, practical framework that you can use to help create, adjust and structure your marriages.

Assuming that gay marriages will emulate heterosexual marriages is neither a valid nor a helpful assumption. But, as gay men, where does that leave us? There are currently no "rule

books" for how a "double testosterone" marriage could or should work. While there are lots of books about how to plan your gay wedding, there are virtually none that address what to do after the honeymoon is over (literally and figuratively).

This book will fill that void.

In the book we'll follow two married couples: Tomas and Larry, representing a harmonious open marriage, and Ethan and Jake, representing a fulfilling monogamous marriage. They're an amalgam of dozens of real couples I've worked with over the past 15 years. Each couple will experience the joys and difficulties of their double testosterone marriage, giving the reader a wide range of options and possibilities for his own marriage.

This book will be frank, engaging, and filled with an abundance of practical advice for newly-married couples and single men/couples considering marriage. For example, we'll look at how aging and illness can affect our sex lives, and what we can do about incompatible sex drives.

It is to be expected that some readers (and reviewers) may find my posing the question of "monogamy or open relationship?" – in regards to gay marriage – to be controversial. The book may even be disliked. The Double Testosterone Marriage dares to ask the question: is monogamy or an open relationship (or a combination of both) the best way to structure your marriage?

Same-sex marriage has been a long time coming – a few thousand years or so – and now that it's finally here, many gay, bisexual and transgender men may think that it's a bad idea to "rock the boat" by discussing some of the ideas in this book. I disagree. I believe that now is the perfect time to question what gay marriage can, should and will be, while it is still relatively new, fresh and malleable.

Please wish me luck, and let me know if you have any ideas you'd like to see included (or addressed) in the book.

The Hungry Homo

Savory Pancakes

Ingredients:

8 slices bacon

1/3 cup finely chopped yellow onion

2 Tbsp chopped fresh chives

1/8 tsp ground black pepper

1 cup frozen corn, thawed

1/2 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese

2 cups Krusteaz buttermilk pancake mix (it says just add water on the front of the box)

1 1/3 cup water

vegetable oil, for cooking the griddle cakes maple syrup, for serving

Instructions:

- 1. Cook the bacon in a large skillet over medium heat until brown and crisp. Remove from the pan with a slotted spoon and drain on a paper-towel-lined plate. Crumble the cooked bacon when cool enough to handle. Reserve 1 Tbsp of the bacon for garnishing. Drain all of the bacon fat except for one Tbsp from the pan, then add in the chopped vellow onion and sauté until tender, about five minutes. Remove from the heat.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the pancake mix and water. Add the bacon, sautéed onion, chives, cayenne, corn and cheese and stir just until combined.
- 3. Heat a large frying pan over medium heat. Add a Tbsp of vegetable oil. When it sizzles, ladle 1/3 cup of the corn cake batter into the pan and cook until golden brown on the bottom. about 3-4 minutes. Flip over and brown the second side, another 3-4 minutes. Repeat with the remaining batter, adding a little vegetable oil to the pan as needed.
- 4. Serve with maple syrup over top, then garnish with the reserved bacon pieces. Makes about 8 large (5-6 inch) pancakes

Whenever we fell victim to such heartless comments, we would be told by harried adults. "Just remember, sticks and stones may break your bones, but words will never hurt you." This



little poem worked once. And only once. After that, the more imaginative bullies learned to go for the throat. That's when we learned that the real poem went like this: "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words can make me cry in the corner for hours." It's a lesson we learned the hard way, and we ourselves learned to utilize to full effect. Every last one of us learned how to use words with certain folks to essentially drive a stake through their heart and to twist any knife we dug into them.

I have a complicated relationship with words. I understand how words can be microaggressions — and that says a lot, since I'm not the biggest fan of critical studies. I also know that words come with multiple meanings and are reliant on context, which is why the reaction to Quentin Tarantino's drunken use of the word "ghetto" at the Golden Globes perplexed me. I also know how important word choice can be. Hence the reason I always use quantifiers like "some," "many," and "most" as accurately as possible to reflect the number of people I'm talking about. Word choice also matters when you're trying to communicate how you feel and what you think on a particular subject.

When Barry Humphries, famous for his Dame Edna character, said in an interview with the Daily Telegraph that Caitlyn Jenner and other trans women were "mutilated men," it gave one pause, especially after Humphries called Jenner "an attention-seeking ratbag." In Australian slang, "ratbag" is a stupid, eccentric, or disagreeable person, which is a really interesting phrase coming from a man who made a career playing a rather outlandish drag character, something many would call eccentric. However, the word that is most striking is the choice of "mutilated." In the Merriam-Webster dictionary, "mutilate" means "to cut up or alter radically so as to make imperfect." This word is interesting in that most psychologists would tell you that trans people feel that their bodies are already imperfect, so already a level of ignorance is in evidence.

Secondly, the definition implies a level of malevolence; that the speaker is implying that something they already were happy with is now damaged and ruined. It implies that people like Humphries as well as Germaine Greer, who he was agreeing with in the article, feel that trans women are damaging and rendering imperfect something they already found whole and perfect — in this case, their idea of gender and sexuality.

What Greer and Humphries are saying is that trans women are destroying their view of human gender expression. I know this sounds Freudian, but there is a psychology to words. In the case of Greer and Humphries and anyone else who feel that trans women (it's never trans men, it seems) are mutilating themselves, they are implying that their view of gender and sexuality is reliant on anatomy — that anatomy defines who we are and nothing else. It's especially telling in Humphries's case as he has made no small amount of money and fame on playing fast and loose with gender presentation. What it shows is a very narrow, very backward understanding of the human mind. It honestly is the definition of ignorance.



My doctors had been encouraging me to get out and start engaging with people in the world again so that I would not continue to perseverate on the trauma I experienced.

For my big, ambitious goal I made the decision that I wanted to get on to The Late Show with Stephen Colbert as a guest. And tell my story but much more importantly let everyone know that there is indeed hope and happiness on the other side of PTSD. I love this show and thought this will be a great way to have fun too and give me a goal and something to look forward to each day.

I also made the decision that I would go out all over the Phoenix, Arizona area each day and ask people to sign words of support on giant petition boards (foam poster boards that are 30 inches by 40 inches). These will help me get the attention of The Late Show in New York and demonstrate all the people that want me on the show. This satisfied my second objective of getting out and meeting a lot of new people.

As of January 10th I have met 3,750 new people that I've approached that have signed in 10 cities and three states in 60 days. (I took my journey back to the Chicago area for Christmas to visit family and friends). I have taken 770 pictures with many of these people I've met and I post them on Instagram.

People have signed their words of support in 30 languages on 49 of my giant petition boards. They have also put artwork, poetry, and inspiring stories on these boards and have used a variety of 12 Sharpie markers that I have given them. It's become a happy, amazing project that is getting me healthy again.


