#### Bareback Sex Lands Soldier in Brig

Military and civilian authorities have charged an HIV-positive soldier with assault with a deadly weapon, accusing him of having unprotected sex with a partner he didn't tell about the infection.

Military and civilian prosecutors haven't decided who will prosecute the case against Pfc. Johnny Lamar Dalton, said Maj. Tom Earnhardt, a spokesman for the 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, N.C.

Dalton, 25, was arrested last week and was being held Tuesday in the Cumberland County jail on a \$50,000 bond, said sheriff's department spokeswoman Debbi Tanna. She said inmates weren't allowed to give interviews, and a jailer said the soldier hadn't been appointed an attorney.

Along with the assault count, Dalton faces civilian charges of committing a crime against nature and misdemeanor assault inflicting serious injury. Earnhardt said he faces the same charges in the military's criminal justice system.

An arrest warrant filed by county officials accuses Dalton of not telling his male partner, an 18-year-old civilian, that he has HIV, the virus that causes AIDS. The teen's mother alcrted authorities to the relationship after her son fell ill and told her about it; he has tested positive for HIV. Tanna said she did not know whether Dalton was the source of the teen's infection.

Dalton is assigned to the 22nd Aviation Support Battalion, which is part of the 82nd Airborne, Earnhardt said. He was ordered by his commander in November not to have unprotected sex after it was discovered he was HIV-positive. State law also prohibits a person infected with HIV from having sex unless condoms are used and requires that sexual partners be notified.

"All the command knew was that he had been diagnosed with HIV," said Earnhardt, who added that HIV infection is one of several medical conditions, including pregnancy, heart disease and cancer, that would prevent a soldier from deploying. "What a service member does when they're off duty, we have to depend on their honor and integrity."



Earnhardt said Army prosecutors aren't focusing on the soldier's sexual orientation. The military's "don't ask, don't tell" policy allows gays and lesbians to serve if they keep their sexual orientation private and do not engage in homosexual acts. The law prohibits commanders from asking about a person's sex life and requires discharge of those who openly acknowledge they are gay.

"Our real focus is here we are with two families who are having to cope with the tragedy of this disease," Earnhardt said. (Estes Thompson, AP)

#### Top Hong Kong Court Rejects Sodomy Ban

Hong Kong's top court Tuesday rejected a ban on public gay sodomy, another victory for the Chinese territory's gay rights movement.

The case stemmed from the prosecution of two men who acknowledged committing sodomy in a car parked on an isolated road at night, the ruling said. Public gay sex was a crime with a maximum penalty of five years in prison.

After the two men challenged the charges, lower courts ruled in their favor, but the government appealed to Hong Kong's Court of Final Appeal.

A panel of five top judges unanimously dismissed the government's appeal.

Chief Justice Andrew Li said in the ruling that the law targets homosexuals and "does not criminalize heterosexuals for the same or comparable conduct."


The case was the first prosecution of the 1991 law.

Earlier, a 20-year-old Hong Kong gay man successfully challenged another law that punished men under 21 who engaged in gay sodomy by up to life imprisonment. The consensual age for heterosexual intercourse in Hong Kong was 16.

A local judge ruled in 2005 that the law infringed on the rights of gay men. The Hong Kong government also unsuccessfully appealed that ruling.

Now that the ban of public gay sodomy and the higher consensual age for gay sex have been struck down in court, such restrictions are unenforceable, but lawmakers still need to repeal

#### **Fitness Corner**

You want to lose weight. You want to look good. You want to train to run that marathon. That's all great. Now don't forget to see your neighborhood doctor for all your

to see your neighborhood doctor for all your regular checkups. It's not as difficult as studying for collegiate midterms or final exams but these can definitely save your life. These preventative measures include your eye exam, dental exam, annual physical, prostate exam, and the colorectal exam.

The annual physical will likely include blood work, a urinalysis, and a palpatory head to toe analysis of your mainframe. The good doc might order additional tests if there are any abnormalities detected. The blood work will reveal cholesterol levels and any signs of infection among other items of interest. This is also the time to ask plenty of questions. Any concerns or uncertainties about your health should be addressed. Your physician might not know to look if you don't head him or her in the right direction. It is a team effort.

Your eyes need to have attention once a year. This exam can detect problems that include high blood pressure and elevated cholesterol in addition to eye matters such as glaucoma. Furthermore, diabetes can create adverse conditions for the eyes and can be spotted by inspecting the retina and the optical blood vessels. Dental exams are requested by the teeth experts every six months. Your dentist will look for signs of oral cancer and look for any early signs of tooth decay. He or she can inform you of any deficiencies in brushing, flossing, and rinsing. Hopefully you are brushing, flossing, or rinsing. Be prepared for some poking, prodding, scraping, and spitting. Don't procrastinate on these examinations. Problems in your mouth can lead to other health difficulties and your dental expert will be all too happy to discuss these with you. Put a picture of that hilljack's smile from the movie Deliverance on your calendar as a gentle reminder of why you need to keep these appointments.
