MCC TORONTO "BANNS OF MARRIAGE" PROTESTED

Two protesters raised objections on December 17 as the "banns of marriage" were announced for the second of three times at Toronto's Metropolitan Community Church (MCC), a centuries-old tradition the church hopes will offer a legal loophole under Ontario law to create legal marriages for gay and lesbian couples.

A church can announce an impending marriage for three consecutive weeks and then hold a marriage ceremony and issue a license -- and the provincial Marriage Act does not specify that those marriages must be of heterosexual couples -- although Ontario's registrar has already said he will reject MCC's licenses. The main reason for the announcements is to allow objections to be raised before the marriage is performed, but the protesters' objections met none of the requirements of the Marriage Act for stopping the process.

When MCC's Reverend Brent Hawkes asked if anyone present was aware of a legal impediment to the marriages of Kevin Bourassa and Joe Varnell and of Anne and Elaine Vautour (both scheduled for January 14), anti-gay activist, evangelist and Dominion Freedom Party leader Ken Campbell was the first to rise.

"In the name of Christ and for his church, I have come today to register a protest over the lawless and Godless procedure which you are engaged in," Campbell said. "What you are doing is in violation of the law of God. For Kevin Bourassa and Joe Varnell, for Anne Vautour and Elaine Vautour, and for any other homosexual or lesbian couple, I object."

Then G. Cecil Brown stood to complain that the marriages violated both Christian teaching and Canadian law, which through common law views marriage as between one man and one woman.

Hawkes, who had anticipated protests when he announced the church's plans before the banns were first read there the previous week, reacted calmly.

He said, "After hearing the objections, I have determined that those objections are not lawful cause and we will continue the reading of the banns and the marriage ceremonies will proceed," and the predominantly gay and lesbian congregation cheered and clapped.

The law prescribes that the objections that can stop a marriage include a party to it being under legal age or married to someone else, or the couple being too closely related to each other by blood. Hawkes said from the pulpit, "I say to the congregation to welcome, to embrace, to love even those with whom we disagree," and invited the protesters to stay for the service, but Campbell and Brown quickly left the church. Hawkes said he had received similar objections by mail.

Campbell later complained to reporters that MCC's actions were destroying the meaning of marriage and blasphemously attempting to cloak in respectability something the Old Testament proscribed as an abomination.

The Vautours were not present, but Varnell and Bourassa found it unsettling to hear the objections in the church that has always been a safe space for them. The protesters in no way diminished their eagerness to marry, however, and the church is prepared to go to court if necessary so they can fulfill that dream.

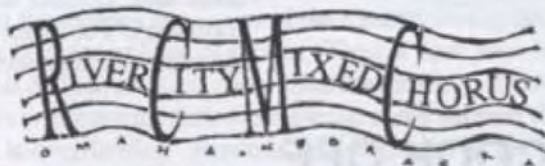
