A large community response is planned to James Dobson's Focus on the Family bringing the all-day "Love Won Out" Conference to Trinity Church in Omaha.

The Love Won Out conference travels from city to city with the message that "individuals don't have to be gay" and that "change is possible for those who experience same-sex attraction."

In response, several GLBT (Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender)/Ally groups have joined hands to plan two events and a letter-writing campaign. The sponsors include Citizens for Equal Protection; Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (Omaha and Lincoln chapters); River City Gender Alliance, and Metropolitan Community Church. Their response carries this theme: Got God? Got Love!

Michael Gordon, Executive Director of Citizens For Equal Protection said, "We consider this message harmful to our gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender loved ones, their families and friends. We believe that these individuals do not need 'fixing,' even if that were possible, and Dobson's message wrongly blames their parents."





gender rights group planned a protest Friday near a restaurant it said ejected four women because two of them kissed.

"It was a casual kiss," said Eva Sandoval, who said the women were approached after she briefly kissed her girlfriend, Blair Funk. "It was the sort of kiss I would give my grandfather."

But IHOP Corp, said the kissing was more extensive and that the manager only asked the women to tone things down.

Sandoval, 23, said the manager told them there had been complaints about public displays of affection at the women's table.

"He said, 'Don't look at me, stupid, like you don't know what I'm talking about. You know you were back there French-kissing at the table," Sandoval said, reading from a prepared statement at a news conference. "We didn't know what he was talking about because we hadn't been."

The women said they were told to leave and not come back.

They said they wanted a public apology and wanted the manager to be fired, although they later said sensitivity training would be an acceptable alternative.

The gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender rights group PROMO also planned a protest.

IHOP said the manager had undergone sensitivity training before the incident and said its restaurants do not treat people differently based on sexual orientation. There is no Missouri or U.S. law prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation by restaurants and other establishments.

"We're welcoming to all. That's how we built our business for 50 years," IHOP spokesman Patrick Lenow said. "What's not welcome at our restaurants are bold displays of affection, with open-mouth kissing and caressing. That's really not welcome at any restaurants."

Lenow said the women, who had been going to the restaurant for several years, had been asked before not to do such things as "exposing bare skin and lying down in booths with their heads resting on other guests' laps."

"What we're troubled by is that a guest-service issue has turned into seemingly so much more." Lenow said.

The three women who spoke at the news conference said the prior incidents Lenow mentioned never happened. They did say they had kissed numerous times and had not been confronted about it.



Former Offutt Protester/Author To Appear at The Reading Grounds

Former Omaha resident Mike Palecek, who served five jail and prison terms during the 1980s for protests at Offutt Air Force Base, will appear at The Reading Grounds (40th & Farnam St., Omaha) for a reading of his book The American Dream (CWG Press, Feb '07), Wed., April 4, 7pm.

Palacek crossed the line at the base on many occasions along with others to say no to the United States military and its surge toward global dominance. Palecek's incarceration included the county jails in Omaha, Papillion, Lincoln and Council Bluffs and also included the federal prisons in Chicago, Terre Haute and El Paso.

Palecek later went on to work for small-town newspapers in Nebraska, Minnesota and Iowa, In 1997 he left newspaper work to concentrate on writing novels. A native of Norfolk, Nebraska, Palecek now lives with his family in Sheldon, Iowa.

The book tour, covering the United States, is a modern-day ride of Paul Revere, carrying along the writings of Thomas Paine, warning the people of the coming of fascism by the perpetrators of 9/11 — the liars, the murderers, the charlatans of this current United States government.
