
Popular Christian Show Host Comes Out





Reflections With Pastor Tom

Courage

Courage is the inner power to move forward in spite of. There is so much out there to spite us, or so it would seem. I have found that people can far more readily identify what is keeping them from greatness than what is propelling them into prosperity.



The activity of being courageous is almost always something painful, uncomfortable or uneasy, but when the moment is past, we experience the payoff. We might say: "I can't believe I made it through that." or "Wow, I did it and I learned something," or maybe even, "that wasn't so bad after all." These statements and those like them are symptoms and signs of transformation and growth. Suddenly we are more than we were.

The key is to make courage a lifestyle, a way of being. Here is the test: When you or someone else has an idea, do you immediately identify all the reasons it won't work or do you identify all the reasons it could work? Sometimes, the difference between what we call "optimism" and "pessimism" is, in reality, the difference between courage being applied or not being applied.

A wise person once said that half of life is just showing up. This is totally true. Showing up takes courage. Think about it: we must show up to fix broken relationships, excel at our workplace, grow our friendships and intimate relationships, discover the power of God and community and live a healthy lifestyle. We also must show up by being accountable to our own selves. We all have "issues." The "issue" we are not working on today is tomorrow's disaster.

So, just show up. Its that simple. That's all the courage you need. Courage can be a charge into the battlefield, it can be risking your life to save another, it can be some monumental act, but 99.9% of the time . . . courage is just being present, courage is just showing up and engaging life.

Nebraska Pride 2008 Grand Marshal Announced

Rainbow Celebrations is proud to present Jan Ritterbush as Nebraska Pride 2008 Grand Marshal. There were three incredible nominees who were recognized for the mark they have made upon our world, not only for the GLBTQQS community, but in the advocacy for youth, education, and those affected by aids. They are examples we can all emulate but more than that, they give us hope for a better tomorrow.

An independent panel made up of teachers, artists, business managers, and students, scored the grand marshal candidates through the use of biographical information submitted and how the candidate best exemplified the nomination criteria of leadership, achievement, contribution for acceptance, equality, visibility, awareness and civil rights for the GLBTQQS community. They must also embody and exemplify Nebraska Pride's mission, vision and values. The scores were tabulated by an independent accountant and sealed until the announcement. 2008 Nebraska Pride Grand Marshal, Jan Ritterbush started her service career as a teenager assisting various organizations. Over the next 25 years she, her husband and their 4 biological children opened their home and hearts to 15 foster children. With a boundless energy, she served her community as a member of the chamber of commerce, the city council, and still had time to teach Sunday School. Finding out she was the mother of a gay son, she expanded her lifelong assistance to children to include all those in need. She began to volunteer at Nebraska Aids project as a receptionist, then answering the aids hotline, and finally assisting in preparing and serving meals for the clients. Involving herself with the Imperial Court of Nebraska, she began donating time and money to food 4 thought and toys 4 totz. In her efforts to serve through her work at Marriott, she received the Spirit to Serve award which is only given to 5 em-

ployees in the US. She is also a court appointed special advocate in speaking out on behalf of children who have been removed from their family. Jan is a woman of indomitable will, courage, and commitment to making her piece of the world a better place.

Nominee Don Randolph (Flowers) is Regent I, King Father. and one of the founders of the Imperial Court of Nebraska. He fostered the birth and growth of that organization as President for 9 years. Don has been on the board of directors of Human Rights for 6 years and on the board of directors for Nebraska Aids Project for 14 years. He lived through the pain and terror of the initial aids outbreak. This man saw the hatreds and fears of a world that hated Gay people and would kill them given the chance. He fought for our right to live bravely, and set an example of service to this community when others were too afraid. He was a member of the esteemed group of performers. the Omaha Meat Packers, and continues in his dedication to this community and to the Nebraska Aids Project.

Nominee Sally Presby has been involved in the GLBT community for over 20 years. She has supported many causes in this time such as Nebraska Aids Project, the Ribbon Foundation and the Iris Phoenix Scholarship fund. She has been a royal family member of the Imperial Court of Nebraska and an Executive Board Member as well. This lady has received a lifetime title from the Imperial court and numerous other awards from the Imperial Court of Nebraska over the years. Diagnosed with breast cancer in 2006, a number of shows were presented by her and for her. She has assisted in the raising of thousands of dollars for the GLBT community, and is exceedingly generous with her own personal funds always coming to the aid of the community's causes. A woman with a heart of gold, and an example of magnificent support, Sally is someone who personifies the truest sense of the word "friend."





Masturbation May Prevent Prostate Cancer

Frequent masturbation may help men cut their risk of contracting prostate cancer, Australian researchers have found. It is believed that carcinogens may build up in the prostate if men do not ejaculate regularly, BBC News reported on Wednesday. The researchers surveyed more than 1,000 men who had developed prostate cancer, and 1,250 men who had not. They found that men who had ejaculated the most between the ages of 20 and 50 were the least likely to get cancer. Men who ejaculated more than five times each week were a third less likely to develop prostate cancer.

Sexual intercourse may not have the same effect because of the higher risk of contracting a sexually transmitted disease, which could in turn raise the risk of cancer. "Had we been able to remove ejaculations associated with sexual intercourse, there should have been an even stronger protective effect of ejaculations," Graham Giles of the Cancer Council Victoria, who led the researchers, said in the article.

The prostate produces a fluid that is incorporated into ejaculation, which activates sperm and prevents them from sticking together. Studies on animals have shown that carcinogens like 3 -methylchloranthrene can be harbored in the prostate. Frequent ejaculation encourages the cancer-inducing fluids to "flush out." (The Advocate)

Sponsors of California Marriage Amendment Prepare to Submit Signatures

A coalition of religious groups that hope to add an anti-gay constitutional marriage amendment to California's November ballot say they have collected the requisite number of signatures to qualify the measure, according to the Associated Press.

The coalition, known as Protect Marriage, claims to have gathered more than 1.1 million signatures though it needed only 694,354 signatures in order to meet the threshold.

"We have gone against tremendous odds to do this, and now the voters in California will have the chance to protect marriage," Brian Brown, executive director of the California office of the

National Organization for Marriage, told the AP.

Protect Marriage plans to submit the signatures this week for verification by the California Secretary of State. The deadline is April 28.

Earlier this month, Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger told a gathering of Log Cabin Republicans that he thought the measure was unnecessary and that he would campaign against it should it make the ballot. The state legislature has twice passed a marriage equality bill and Gov. Schwarzenegger has vetoed it both times.

Though California's same-sex couples cannot legally wed, the state's Supreme Court is currently deliberating over a constitutional challenge to the ban on gay marriage.

New Jersey's National Organization for Marriage, Coloradobased Focus on the Family and the Knights of Columbus all contributed heavily to the Protect Marriage campaign. (The Advocate)

We live in a society where it is horrible to think that people die. You need to take advantage of this munificence of the masses.

Government agencies are always watching out for you. The FDA is monitoring what medications are safe for your consumption. CNN Reporter Faces Drug Charge

A CNN reporter was arrested Friday in Central Park with a small amount of methamphetamine in his pocket, but he avoided jail time by agreeing to undergo drug counseling and therapy.

Richard Quest, 46, was arrested around 3:40 a.m. on a count of possession of a controlled substance, a misdemeanor that usually refers to a personal use amount of a drug. He was also charged with loitering; the park officially closes at 1 a.m.

When police saw and detained Quest, he told them, "I've got some meth in my pocket," according to the complaint filed in court. The complaint said he had a plastic sandwich bag containing methamphetamine in a jacket pocket.

Quest was also found with a rope around his neck that was tied to his genitals and a sex toy in his boot, according to the New York Post.

Quest, who is British, is a correspondent for CNN International and is known for his reports on business travel. He hosts CNN Business Traveler and Quest.

At his arraignment in Manhattan's Criminal Court, Judge Anthony Ferrara told Quest that if he attends the counseling and therapy designated by prosecutors for the next six months, his case will dismissed.

The judge allowed Quest to leave court without posting bail. He warned that if Quest failed to comply with the counseling schedule, he could be back in court and on his way to jail.

Quest's lawyer, Alan M. Abramson, said his client "did not realize the park had a curfew. He was returning to his hotel with friends."

CNN had no immediate comment on Quest's arrest. (AP, with additional reporting by The Advocate)
