As Hillary's Lead Grows, Jill Stein Raises Money for Recount

As of Thursday, Green Party presidential candidate Jill Stein has raised over \$3,500,000 for election recounts in three key states that cost Hillary Clinton the presidency: Michigan, Wisconsin, and Pennsylvania.

"After a divisive and painful presidential race, reported hacks into voter and party databases and individual email accounts are causing many American to wonder if our election results are reliable," Stein said in a statement released Wednesday.



"These concerns need to be investigated before the 2016 presidential election is certified. We deserve elections we can trust."

Stein met a \$2.5 million deadline on Wednesday and is looking for \$4.5 million by Friday at 4 p.m. Central, the deadline to challenge Wisconsin's election results (Michigan and Pennsylvania deadlines come a few days later). Stein argues there are irregularities with machine-counted vote tallies and mentions in her statement that voting machines used in Wisconsin had been banned in California because they were susceptible to hacking. The Democratic National Committee's emails were hacked earlier this year — allegedly by people affiliated with the Russian government — as well as those of Clinton campaign chair John Podesta.

Academics have also said a recount is necessary, though out pollster Nate Silver disputes that there were any discrepancies in the three aforementioned states.

The Clinton campaign has remained mum about any potential recount or election audit; Hillary Clinton herself urged unity after the surprising results of two weeks ago. But since Clinton made her concession speech November 9, her lead in the popular vote has ballooned; she's now ahead of Donald Trump by over 2 million votes. Trump won the election by doing well in the Electoral College, sweeping the South and notching shocking wins in the three states Stein wants recounted.

Raymond Buys was starved and tortured and even forced to eat his own feces. Severely malnourished, dehydrated, with burns and wounds all over his body, he lay in intensive care for four weeks until he died.




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He was just 15.

Just 10 weeks before, the teen's parents signed him up in 2011 for the Echo Wild Game Rangers course in South Africa in perfect health with the intention of 'making him a man'.

We do not know how he identified sexually, but for being 'effeminate' he was chained to his bed every night and was repeatedly tortured.

In one witness testimony, a fellow victim said the course 'General' tied Buys to a chair naked with his head covered in a pillowcase, would beat him with planks and hosepipes, and would electrocute him with a stun gun.

This is an extreme, but very real, instance of 'conversion therapy'.

Every single time I have to write about this 'therapy' in a news article I remind people that 'gay cures' have been condemned by every mainstream health and psychological group in the world. They do not work. They are dangerous to a person's mental and physical health. And they should not be attempted by anyone.

With the election of Donald Trump and Mike Pence, I get people want to joke. I get people want to get back to a shred of normalcy. It's a natural reaction.

The Truth About Sexuality in Ancient Greece and Rome

Sexuality is a topic often whitewashed out of our history books, and we rarely see the place of LGBT people in the ancient world mentioned in television documentaries.

Most of us know that the ancient pagan world was more tolerant of homosexuality than the one god religions that would follow. But how tolerant were the ancient Greeks and Romans? It turns out they weren't nearly as tolerant as you might like to think.

Neither the Greeks or the Romans had a concept of homosexuality or heterosexuality.

Men were assumed to be attracted to both males and females. and to express a preference for just one sex was considered eccentric.

But as both societies were intensely patriarchal what was important in sexual relationships was the status of who did the penetrating and their age.

In this world the notion of sex between two grown men was deeply taboo as it was seen to reduce the passive partner to the level of a woman.

Indeed if the Greeks and Romans did not outlaw it, it was because the shame of the act was punishment enough - though the weight of shame fell mostly on the penetrated.

Of greater taboo still was for an older man to allow himself to be penetrated by a younger man - the modern word 'pathetic' derives from the Latin for such a man.

The only act considered more taboo was cunnilingus - to the Ancient's minds as dangerously close to a man being penetrated by a woman as was possible.

Contrary to popular belief, anal sex for the Greeks and Romans was primarily a heterosexual act. There was no taboo on it occurring between men and women and it was the most reliable form of contraception available so would have been a regular part of the sex lives of any married couple.

Where sex between males was deemed acceptable to occur was between men and youths, and in theory it was only supposed to be inter-crucial (where one partner grips the other's penis between his thighs) though from the writings the Greeks and Romans have left to us, it was often not.

In both societies youths were considered to be able to consent to sex from around their mid teens, which was similar to the age that girls were considered ready for marriage, and it was acceptable for youths to be in same-sex relationships until they could grow a full beard - and for this reason, there were all manner of depilatory products on sale in order to help you keep your boyfriend respectable!

After this age in Greece, the young man was expected to find a wife and go about starting a family, having been mentored by his older partner, with the two men staying friends.



In practice, however, many of these relationships probably would have carried on behind closed doors.

In Greece such relationships occurred between free born males - though there were also male prostitutes.

Many of the most famous names to come down to us in history from the Greek world have been same-sex attracted - from bisexual Alexander the Great whose father Phillip destroyed the all-gay Sacred Band of Thebes to the philosophers Plato and Socrates.

Few lesbian voices come to us from the ancient world but the lyric poet Sappho is a notable exception and her love poems for other women speak down to us through the ages. And of course, the island of her birth, Lesbos, gives us the word 'lesbian' that we still use today.

Sex between women wasn't illegal, but, like the Victorians, the Greeks and Romans simply refused to believe it happened.

In comparison, sex between men in the Roman world was a mostly more sinister affair.

Having sex with a free born Roman male could see you up on charges for ruining the youth's future reputation. But slaves and foreigners were all fair game.

Male and female prostitutes openly plied their trade on the streets of Rome. But in truth any slave was a sex slave if their master so desired, and it was primarily through master-slave relationships that sex between males occurred in Ancient Rome.

Thus when the emperor Hadrian took a male lover in the form of a Bythinian youth named Antinous, as a foreigner it was perfectly acceptable for Antinous to appear in public next to the emperor and his wife Vibia Sabina as his lover.

Hadrian and Antinous were lovers for five years until Antinous fell from a boat in the Nile and drowned. Some have suggested he killed himself to avoid shaming the emperor as he grew older.

Heartbroken, Hadrian had Antinous declared a god, built temples to him all over the empire, named a star after him and built a city in Egypt, Antinopolis, in his honor.

When the Roman Empire became Christian the temples of the

cult of Antinous were destroyed – though many of the statues ended up in the Vatican art collections where they were seen by the artist Raphael, who used his likeness when painting angels as his model of male perfection.

Both the Greeks and Romans could appeal to religion in their belief that their behavior was moral, though we might have a different view on what is proper today.

For the Greeks, Zeus had his male lover Ganymede, and Plato rated this love as higher than that found in marriage.

The Romans had the same gods by different names so Zeus became Jupiter and Ganymede became Catamitus.

Homosexual characters were often mocked as figures of fun in bawdy Roman comedies, but at the same time same-sex couples, cross dressers and male prostitutes would have been common sights on the streets.

And some couples did buck the discrimination that was thrown at them by publicly celebrating their commitment through same -sex marriage.

These include two emperors - Nero and Elagabalus, but we know of many others.

Such marriages were not legally recognized but by 342AD the dual Christian emperors Constantius and Constans had them banned on threat of death, and homosexuality in the Roman Empire was silenced for centuries to come.

So what is the verdict on how the Greek and Roman civilizations treated their LGBT citizens? Certainly there was a lot of discrimination and extreme social stigma for any relationship between men that fell outside of a very tight set of parameters.

However compared to what was to follow into much of the 20th Century, they were centuries ahead of their time.

Dear Gay Men: Your Friend is HIV-Positive

It doesn't matter who you are or from where you hail, if you are a man who kisses other men, someone you know is HIVpositive.

Before I sprouted out of the closet as a little gay sapling, my mother had never met a single homosexual person in her life. And in the suffocating southern Christian confines of Texas, her limited perception was open to the most horrific creative interpretation. The nightmares of evil drag queens and insidious perverts quickly faded away, however, once her son told her that he liked boys.

The majority of gay men know how it feels to secretly live in the presence of someone who is blindly afraid of you, yet that is exactly what we do to HIV-positive men.



It is because of this that I write an open letter to gay men of young and old.

Your friend is living with HIV.

It doesn't matter who you are or where you hail from, if you are a man who kisses other men, someone you know is HIV-positive. Hopefully, this is already yesterday's news because you live in a collective space where your friends are not afraid to discuss their love and sex lives, regardless of status. But if you care to argue that this is a false narrative, then you may be creating barriers for your HIV-positive friends without even knowing it. This isn't just a hindrance to their mental health, it is also a risk to your own HIV-negative status. If you don't acknowledge the reality that your friends may be living with HIV, you probably think that you've never slept with an HIV-positive person either.

In the first six months after my diagnosis, I was petrified to tell my best friend about my status. As much as I knew he wouldn't judge me or toss our friendship aside, something he previously said kept ringing in my ears.

"I would never date someone with HIV. I just don't think I could get over it."

A world where my best buddy would reject someone just like me was a world I could live without. Yet I tucked it inside and hid something from my friend to avoid any stigma from someone I loved.

When I did tell him my status and the reason for my hesitation, he was immediately overcome with unquestionable support and complete remorse. And just like anyone who made a judgment before getting to know someone, his benign HIV stigma has become undetectable.

Although most days I do feel like a rainbow unicorn, my story and my status is nothing unique. If you are a gay man, or any other person who knows more than a handful of gays, then you know a person with HIV. Instead of trying to figure out who it could be, think about how you would feel if one of your closest friends was judged, rejected, and ridiculed for status.

Or worse... How do you feel if one of your friends is remaining silent because he feels you might judge and reject him as well. HIV isn't exclusive to the LGBT community, but it is the backbone of its legacy of tragedy and strength. Today, HIV doesn't have to rob a person of anything in their life, but only if they are surrounded by an educated and loving community that understand a disease is not a characteristic or a flaw. It's just another thing to overcome, and the LGBT community overcomes our struggles together.

Be a part of that community. Be a friend, a lover, and an ally to people with HIV.

Pope Francis: Priests Can Forgive Abortion

But it's still a sin, according to the Roman Catholic Church's leader.

In a letter released Monday, Pope Francis stated priests could continue to forgive women for having abortions, extending a special dispensation that began last year for "the Year of Mercy," which ended Sunday.

According to the letter, abortion would still be considered "a grave sin since it puts an end to an innocent life," but "there is no sin that God's mercy cannot reach and wipe away when it

finds a repentant heart seeking to be reconciled with the Father."

While the Pope's extension of forgiveness to women who have had abortions falls short of total acceptance, it does allow for communication between Roman Catholics and their leaders on the issue. Women who had sought abortions do not need to feel exiled from the church and can share their stories with religious leaders.

"The practical effect of Francis' announcement remains unclear," CNN reports, but "it draws attention to the prevailing theme of his papacy: That the doors of the Church must remain open, just as God's forgiveness and mercy extend to all those who repent from sin."

However, despite public perception of Pope Francis as among the more liberal pontiffs, he has appointed leaders who speak out against transgender rights, divorce, and homosexuality.

It's Over: Duck Dynasty to End Bigoted Run

It's all over but the quacking: Duck Dynasty, the A&E reality show that followed the lives of the homophobic and transphobic Robertson family and their duck call business, will end its run next year.



The family made the announcement in a video that accompanied the season premiere Wednesday, The New York Times reports. "We've decided as a family for this to be the final chapter of the Duck Dynasty series," said Jase Robertson, one of patriarch Phil's sons. The final season, the 11th, will run in two parts: the first with episodes airing weekly now through January 18, the second running from March 1 through April 12. The family hinted that they might appear in some specials.

The series about the West Monroe, La., family began airing in 2012, and Phil Robertson was briefly suspended in December 2013 after the publication of a GQ interview in which he called homosexuality a sin on par with bestiality and terrorism, and said he never saw blacks being mistreated in the South before the civil rights movement.

"Start with homosexual behavior and just morph out from there," he said. "Bestiality, sleeping around with this woman and that woman and that woman and those men. ... Don't be deceived. Neither the adulterers, the idolaters, the male prostitutes, the homosexual offenders, the greedy, the drunkards, the slanderers, the swindlers — they won't inherit the kingdom of God. Don't deceive yourself. It's not right." But Jesus can save gays, drunks, and terrorists, he said — of course, only if they change their behavior.

He was soon back on the show, though, and he and other members of the family continued to spew anti-LGBT venom. Early in 2014, son Willie Robertson told a CNN interviewer he believes in a literal reading of the Bible, so therefore being gay is a sin and unrepentant gays will spend eternity in hell. Willie Robertson appeared at the Republican National Convention this year in support of Donald Trump's presidential

candidacy, and Fox News has hired him as a contributor.

His father supported Ted Cruz in the Republican presidential primaries but came over to Trump after the latter won the nomination. Phil Robertson appeared at a Cruz rally in January, calling marriage equality "evil." Then over the summer, speaking at a right-wing conference, he blamed the Supreme Court's marriage equality ruling and recent advances in transgender rights for the thousands of murders in the United States and the deaths of American soldiers overseas. He also delivered a transphobic video rant on behalf of the conservative organization Citizens United, urging support for legislation that would restrict transgender people's restroom access.

Duck Dynasty's ratings peaked in 2013 and dropped off severely the following year, the Los Angeles Times reports, Rumors of the show's cancellation began circulating early in 2015. The Robertsons will undoubtedly continue to spout anti-LGBT rhetoric — but at least now they're losing one prominent platform.

12 Steps for the Rest of Us

While I am not a member of a 12 step program, I find the 12 steps are useful for anyone struggling with an addiction. In reality, most of us have some kind of addictive or compulsive behavior that interferes with our happiness.



In his book "Spirituality and the Twelve Steps", Richard Rohr writes "There are shared and agreed-upon addictions in every culture and institution. They may not look like addictions because we have all agreed to be compulsive about the same things. There is the American addiction to oil, war and power, the white person's addiction to superiority; the wealthy person's addiction to entitlement".

No matter who we are, we are all addicted to something, and the 12 steps can be useful for us all. Here is my interpretation of the first six of the 12 steps:.

Step 1: Powerlessness. We cannot control our lives, no matter how much we try. Whether you believe in a Higher Power or not, this step is about realizing that it's not all about you, and never will be. This is wonderful news for perfectionists. As long as you cling tightly to YOUR way as the RIGHT way, you are doomed to unhappiness. Since so much of life won't go your way: can you be at peace with this or will you fight it every inch of the way?

Step 2: Your Mind Cannot Take You There. The Buddhists talk about "monkey mind": your mind is a thought-generating machine and won't ever take you to a place of peace. Your mind will tell you anything. For example, your mind says, "I'm a good-looking, kind person". Then, a few minutes later, it tells you, "I'm an ugly, mean person." This is left brain stuff. If you want peace, focus on right-brain activities like music, art, dancing, nature, being with animals, loving relationships and life-affirming sexuality.

Step 3: Accepting What Is. We have an endless capacity for self-loathing. Instead of accepting our flawed selves, we fight the truth, get aggressive with ourselves and others, try to power through our day and wonder why we're too exhausted after work to have any fun. Surrender has become a dirty word, associated with failure and losers. Ironically, it's actually the path to peace.

Step 4: Take A Good Look at Yourself. Knowledge can come from reading a book, but wisdom comes from looking at yourself. We all have a shadow self that we don't want to see, but that others see quite clearly. I like the saying, "The truth will set you free" and would add;, "but first it's gonna piss you off." See yourself clearly and notice what you're doing that brings you unhappiness. (Gradually) stop doing it. This is what psychotherapy is about: you stop blaming other people and see that YOU are the problem.

Step 5: Tell The Truth. In a world that encourages addictions to shopping, food, unrealistic body images, workaholism and emotionless sex, it's hard to know the truth about who you really are. A 12-stepper told me: "You're only as sick as your secrets." Shame comes from hiding things. You think you're so bad or messed up, that no one else is like you. Telling the truth is freeing; keeping secrets is bad for your mental health; plus, it takes a lot of energy to remember who you told what lie to.

Step 6: Am I Willing to Change? We all have defects of character, but

are we willing to change? Change is scary. As one of my clients told me, "Who am I going to be when I come out of this?" We don't know. We are leaping into the unknown. And yet, without being willing, change rarely happens. In my experience, we don't need to know HOW to change, we need only be WILLING. And that willingness is enough; the Universe/God/whomever can work with that and send us just what we need to get the change process going.

Step 7: Asking for help. Why can't we fix ourselves? Why can't we use our willpower and push through our obstacles? Unfortunately, none of us can do it all on our own. The original 12 steps invoke the help of a Higher Power, but if that doesn't work for you, why not use other forms of assistance like good friends, wise elders, psychotherapy, insightful books, workshops or all of the above? This step is about admitting that we need help to change and, for some of us, that ain't so easy.

Step 8: Who have you harmed? This step makes sense to almost everyone, here's the original wording: "Made a list of all persons we had
harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all." I doubt that
any of us get through life without harming a shitload of people. We get
scared, act badly, want revenge, and enjoy feeling superior because it
hides our inferiority. We manipulate people because we're afraid to
confront them directly. It's EASY to harm people, but not so easy to
own up to it.

Step 9: Making amends. This is the action part of step 8. Once you realize who you've messed with, lied to, hurt or deceived, now you get to own it and apologize. For most of us, this is really hard. It is incredibly humbling...and yet, incredibly freeing to make amends. You are wiping the slate clean. This doesn't mean that the person you're apologizing to is going to forgive you, or even want to speak with you. A happy ending is optional. The joy comes from your internal freedom at cleaning up your old messes.

Step 10: Continue to take a personal inventory and admit when you are wrong. If the world operated on this level of self-awareness and honesty, it would be quite a wonderful place. To me, a personal inventory means being self-aware: watching myself, questioning my motivation for doing things, being cognizant of my thoughts, choosing to create peace over war, and consciously choosing to forgive when it's much easier to judge and punish myself and others.

Step 11: Thinking differently. Wouldn't it be great to be able to go out and buy a new mind or update it like you do your smartphone? In a way, you can. This step is about updating your cognitive "software" through a spiritual revolution. The original step focuses on prayer to God and meditation, but even atheists can be quiet, listen to their intuitive self and meditate. It's about being still and listening, not talking or taking action. It's about quiet time, time spent in nature or around animals, reading something that makes you think, and allowing other people to inspire you.

Step 12: Giving back. When you learn something new, don't you want to share it with people you love? As a farm boy in Ohio, I remember one of my grandma's friends saying, "You can't get to heaven on your own; you got to take someone with you." As a community, we grow and move together. We're all connected: when you prosper, it paves the way for me to do the same. When you have a wonderful relationship, it shows the rest of us that we can have one too.

The 12 steps have, historically, been helpful to millions of 12-step members all over the globe. Many people have gotten hung up on the "Higher Power" part.

Don't be.

Take the essence of the steps and put them to use in your own life. The steps offer a simple and effective system of personal growth and change.

And don't feel you need to have some big dramatic "addiction" for them to be useful. Whether you notice unhelpful behavior relating to sex or shopping, eating too much or spending too many hours at your job, give the steps a try and see what happens.

The Hungry Homo

Chicken & Chips Casserole

Ingredients

4 cups chopped roasted skinless, boneless chicken breast (about 4 breasts)

1/4 cup chopped green onions

1/4 cup chopped red bell pepper

2 tbsp. finely chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley

1 (8 oz.) can sliced water chestnuts, drained and chopped

1/2 cup low-fat mayonnaise

1/4 cup reduced-fat sour cream

2 tbsp. fresh lemon juice

2 tsp. Dijon mustard

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. freshly ground black pepper

Cooking spray

3/4 cup (3 oz.) shredded Swiss cheese

3/4 cup crushed baked potato chips

Steps

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Combine chicken and next 4 ingredients (through water chestnuts) in a large bowl; stir well. Combine low-fat mayonnaise and next 5 ingredients (through black pepper) in a small bowl, stirring with a whisk. Add mayonnaise mixture to chicken mixture; stir well to combine.

Spoon chicken mixture into an 11 x 7-inch baking dish coated with cooking spray, and sprinkle with cheese; top cheese evenly with chips. Bake at 400 degrees for 13 minutes or until filling is bubbly and chips are golden.

10 eggs

1/3 cup milk

1/2 tsp. salt

4 dashes hot pepper sauce

1/2 lb. bacon - cooked, and chopped into bite-size pieces

1 (4 oz.) can black olives, drained

2 Roma (plum) tomatoes, chopped

1/4 cup green onions, chopped

1/3 cup mushrooms, sliced

3/4 cup Colby-Monterey Jack cheese, shredded

More Than 400 Hate Incidents Reported Since Trump's Election

There have been 437 reported acts of verbal and physical harassment recorded by the Southern Poverty Law Center since voters elected Donald Trump president of the United States.

Appointments such as Steve Bannon to Trump's administration and a failure to seriously address the hateful Trump campaign rhetoric, the social justice watchdog organization says there's no telling how high that number will grow.


"I think there is the idea that these ideas or this behavior is sort of relegated to rural areas or "flyover country... that's not the case at all." Rvan Lenz from Southern Poverty Law Center tells The Advocate. "It's happening everywhere. It's happening in cities, in small towns, it's happening on the coast and in the heartland, it's all over the place."

The center began tracking incidents the day after Trump was elected, just like in 2008 when then President-elect Obama was voted into office. The SPLC recorded incidents back in 2008, but the difference now is with Trump, it's becoming an ongoing issue. Though Lenz says what is different this time around is that even though some might debate the effects of rhetoric to cause violence, SPLC says history shows differently. And recent appointments such as Steve Bannon as Chief Strategist

don't support Trump's message of unity, which he delivered on 60 Minutes last Sun-

"The days to come are like critically important in terms of the political tenor of this country over the next four years, and it doesn't seem like the rhetoric is going away." savs Lenz.

The reports of violence certainly haven't. Though SPLC



Schools have seen many incidents, too. A New School dorm resident in New York City posted an image of a swastika drawn on the door where three jewish women live. And a social media post reported by Dallas Morning News about a veteran who was kicked out of a Chili's restaurant on Veteran's day because a white Trump supporter reportedly claimed the man, who is black, wasn't a veteran and that his service dog wasn't a real service dog.

Social media is filled with reports, many real, but some false, about hateful incidents. And new data indicates the hate might not just stop at incidents but result in criminal acts. This week. the FBI released it's official report on hate crimes, indicating a six percent increase since last year driven by a 65 percent increase in hate crimes against Muslims. Though as Vox points out, the many barriers to collecting and reporting accurate hate crime data are plentiful, and numbers are hard to rely on.

Hate crimes are the legal charges reported by law enforcement agencies of crimes fitting statutory hate crimes definitions. In comparison. SPLC reports are mainly self-initiated and don't directly track crimes. But no matter the source, the timing of the increase seems more than coincidental.

"It comes at the end of a campaign in which President-elect Donald Trump blew a whistle to a number of far-right extremist ideologies, from anti-black to to anti-immigrant to anti-LGBT," says Lenz. "What is surprising is just how rapidly it started after the election. It was almost as if with the election of Donald Trump that his followers, the adherents of far-right ideology had seen a green light to conduct themselves and purport themselves with complete disregard for humanity and politeness."

And, SPLC and others think with the appointment of Stephen Bannon, the former Breitbart executive and Trump campaign CEO who they say has clear ties to white nationalism, as Chief Strategist is the sound of the whistle ringing louder and clear-

SPLC has urged the President-elect to take a much stronger stance against the violence and hate rhetoric, even taking out a



full page ad in The Wall Street Journal denouncing the deplorable position of putting anyone connected with white nationalism in the White House.

And other initiatives are working to track the incidents of violence post-election, such as the Kenyan technology company Ushahidi, New York Daily News journalist Shaun King and professors at Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Harvard University.


But, as the number grows each day, everyone is left wondering just how big the surge of more visible and emboldened hate will become.

Minnesota Mother Sues Daughter for Transitioning

A 17-year-old trans teen is being sued by her mother over the daughter's transition. In her lawsuit, Anmarie Calgaro (pictured) lists her child as a defendant, along with two health care providers who provided transition-related services to her.

The teenager has been legally emancipated and living independently from Calgaro since June 2015, according to





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Buzzfeed. After striking out on her own, the teen began receiving hormone replacement therapy — Minnesota allows emancipated minors to manage their own health care without parental approval.



The law allowing minors to make their own decisions is at the heart of the lawsuit by Calgaro, who's being represented by a notorious anti-abortion law firm. Still, Calgaro has made no bones about her opposition to her daughter's transition; she uses male pronouns for her daughter in the lawsuit and stated she's trying to stop her child from "doing something [she] might regret."

The odd thing about this case is that the daughter will likely be a legal adult by the time it goes to court. Responding to that point, Calgaro reportedly said, "I'm filing this on behalf of other parents."

IBM Named Most LGBT-Friendly Employer in the World

For the third year in a row, tech giant IBM has been named the world's most LGBT-inclusive employer by Amsterdam-based Workplace Pride Foundation.

The 2015 Global Benchmark looked at 21 companies, but this grew to 30 organizations for the 2016 survey.

Between them, the companies account for some 3 million employees in over 100 countries.

The top ten companies, and their respective benchmark scores, were as follows:

IBM: (US) 89.11% Dow: (US) 86.00% Shell: (NL) 84.89%

Accenture (US) – 83.78% KPN: (NL) 80.44%

BNP Paribas: (FR) 79.78% Cisco: (US) 73.33%

ING: (NL) 70.0% Post NL: (NL) 69.44% Sodexo: (FR) 66.44%

The highest scoring new entrant on the 2016 benchmark was Accenture, with its score of 83.78%.

In September, Accenture took the number one position, and IBM the seventh, in a top ten ranking of LGBT-inclusive employers in Ireland.

IBM scored the top mark of 100 in the most recent HRC Corporate Equality Index in the US – where it was a vocal opponent of the anti-LGBT HB 2 legislation in North Carolina.
