

New Harlem Church Sign: Jesus 'Brim-stoned' Gays

The ATLAH World Missionary Church in New York City's Harlem neighborhood, notorious for homophobic messages on its signage and from Pastor James David Manning's pulpit, has a new and unbiblical hate statement on its marquee.



"When the homos bullied the poor and needy in Sodom like they do in Harlem, Jesus fire and brim-stoned them," reads the sign, photos of which have been posted by The New Civil Rights Movement, JoeMyGod, and Real Stories Gallery on Twitter.

Of course, according to the Bible, Jesus hadn't yet been born at the time God destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah, which is recounted in the Old Testament. Also, many modern scholars have interpreted the Sodom and Gomorrah story as being about inhospitality and rape, not consensual gay sex.

The church is the same one that earlier this year posted a sign reading "Jesus would stone homos," which led some LGBT protesters to show up there and challenge Pastor Manning to stone them. Then this summer, it put up the message that "All churches and members that support homes cursed be thou with cancer HIV syphilis stroke madness itch then hell." These, like the most recent message, were accompanied by chapter-and-verse citations from the Bible, imply-

ing that they are quotes from those passages, which they are not.

Among Manning's outrageous statements, as previously reported, are that President Obama has unleashed "homo demons," that gay white men "are going to take the black woman's man," and that the Roman Catholic Church has "the homosexual spirit." The New Civil Rights Movement has posted a few more of the minister's choice comments, such as that NASA's Voyager space probe proves the "entire universe rebukes sodomy," that Michael Sam intends to marry a 9-year-old boy, and that both Obama and Russian president Vladimir Putin are gay, with Putin expected to out Obama within 100 days.

But the police report paints a slightly different picture. Twenty-six-year-old Doug Adams, of Woodside, was "masturbating in flight and later tried to open an exit door," according to the Omaha Police Department report acquired by NBC Bay Area on Tuesday.

The U.S. Attorney's Office told reporters in Nebraska that Adams was taken to the hospital for observation.

Sam Slater, an LA film producer who videotaped police officers boarding the plane in Omaha and taking a man away in handcuffs, said the passenger was wearing a hospital bracelet and sat behind him on the plane.

Slater's business partner, Paul Bernon, said the man returned from the bathroom and began arguing with a woman sitting next to him and tried to tell an attendant that he wanted her to move.

"He at that point was fidgeting and began to remove the plastic covering from the emergency exit door and tried to pull to open the door," Slater said. "Fortunately there were a couple of Boston police officers on the flight that were there at that point to help as well."

Gay Bathhouses Face Steady Decline

The internet and social acceptance of LGBT community members is forcing owners of gay bathhouses to get creative — or risk going bankrupt.

"The acceptance of gays has changed the whole world," Dennis Holding, an owner of a Miami-based bathhouse, told Associated Press. "It's taken away the need to sneak into back-alley places."

Los Angeles experienced the sharpest decline of bathhouses recently, with two establishments shuttering this year. The Hollywood Spa closed in April and Flex Spa in Silver Lake closed temporarily for the summer due to permitting issues. Cities from San Antonio to San Diego have also seen bathhouses shut down.

Urban bathhouses — which typically include pools, saunas, and steam rooms — have existed since the early 1900s, initially created as hygienic places for low-income people to bathe and shower. That changed in the middle-20th century, when the bathhouses became a place for gay men to meet up, relax, and explore their sexuality. In the late 1970s, there were almost 200 gay bathhouses in the U.S. — New York's Continental Baths, with performances by Bette Midler, being the most famous. By 1990, though, the number had dwindled to about 90, following years of raid and crackdowns amid the AIDS epidemic. The bathhouses were further decimated in the late '90s, when the Internet facilitated easy hook-ups and bathhouses and bars became less of a necessity for meeting fellow gay men.

"[Now] the younger generation's main fear is that it's some dark, seedy place," T.J. Nibbio, the executive director for the North American Bathhouse Association, said.

Some owners realize that gay bathhouses need to up the ante and provide something that can't be found online. "Bathhouses at some level will go extinct if you don't offer something more than a towel," Todd Saporito, of Flex Spas, told Pink News. "If we don't, we feed the haters and we hand the bigots who remain a vocal minority ammunition with which to attack us."

Bathhouse chain Steamworks recently worked to rebrand themselves by refreshing their logo and website.

Find Out How This Ex-Marine Reacted When His Son Came Out As Gay

Twenty-two years ago, Jack Freedman sat down to write the most difficult letter of his life: He was coming out to his father, a tough former Marine.

"What I need to tell you is that I'm gay. I think you may have already guessed a long time ago," Freedman wrote. "There are tears running down my face as I write, ... I'm so worried that this will change the way you see me."



It's obvious Freedman poured his heart into the lengthy letter, detailing his struggle to come to a place where he accepted and loved the gay man he is. He stressed that his attraction to men was no different than his father's attraction to women, and asked his father to try to forget the stereotypes and rumors he may have heard about gay men. "Most of it is bullshit," he wrote.

"Being gay doesn't mean that I'm any different from who you've always known me to be," Freedman finished. After

signing the letter, he sealed it, handed it to his father, and then left the house for an hour.

When he returned, the then 21-year-old encountered his father standing in the exact same place in Freedman's childhood home, letter dangling from one hand.

"His eyes were wet. No tears, but just barely," Freedman recalls of the moment that's since remained lodged in his memory. "And in a tone of voice tinged with 'what did I do wrong that you don't already know this,' he said, 'Jack. You're my son. I love you no matter what.""

Freedman posted the letter to his Facebook wall on September 11, noting that the year marked the point in his life where he has been out as gay longer than he had been closeted. In his post explaining the letter, Freedman framed it as a memorial to the father who loved him unconditionally, and said he hoped that it might provide inspiration to those who worry about coming out to their parents.

Bible-Quoting Man Shoots Couple With BB Gun Outside Minneapolis Gay Bar

A same-sex couple visiting Minneapolis from out of town were greeted Thursday with more than they could have expected when a bar patron shot both men in the legs with a BB gun.





Last Thursday night, 43-year-old Wayne Steven Odegard arrived at The Saloon, a popular Minneapolis gay bar. Soon after, he began harassing customers and making homophobic comments aimed at a nearby gay couple holding hands, according to Minneapolis news station KMSP-TV.

The situation escalated, and Odegard produced a CO2-powered BB gun, aiming it at customers. Odegard fired the BB gun at another couple, striking the men in their legs, before attempting to run from the scene. Saloon security guard Tyler Erick-

son took chase, grabbing Odegard only a few yards away from the door, where he called police.

"He told me multiple times that I'm going to go to hell and he's going to bring me with him," Erickson told KMSP. "He recited a biblical passage — I think it's a Deuteronomy passage," adding that the victims were from Broolyn and Philadelphia. "They both joked that they came to progressive Minneapolis and got shot for being gay."

In 2011, the U.S. Department of Justice's Community Relations Service met with Minnesota LGBT advocacy organizations to discuss what needed to be done in the wake of the stabbing death of Chrissie Bates, a 45-year-old transgender woman who was stabbed to death in her Minneapolis apartment. Later that year, trans woman CeCe McDonald was attacked outside of a Minneapolis tavern. In conjunction with local law enforcement, the DOJ worked to develop city-wide LGBT outreach programs. While such efforts were aimed at improving the relationship between police and LGBT individuals, anti-LGBT violence remains a sad reality nationwide.

KMSP reports that if found guilty, Odegard could face seconddegree assault and gun possession charges, punishable by up to seven years in prison and a fine of up to \$14,000.

STUDY: Number of Married Same-Sex Couples Up by 50 Percent in Three Years

By the end of 2013, there were an estimated 130,000 married same-sex couples in the U.S., a 50 percent increase from three years earlier, says a new Williams Institute study.

As more and more states offer same-sex couples the right to marry, couples are taking advantage of this right — the number of same-sex mar-



ried couples in the U.S. increased by 50 percent between 2010 and 2013, according to a new study from the Williams Institute.

At the end of 2013, there were approximately 690,000 samesex couples in the U.S., of which at least 124,000 and perhaps as many as 130,000 were married, says the institute's report, based on its analysis of the National Health Interview Survey for 2013, the first time the survey included a sexual orientation question. Comparing these numbers with data from other demographic studies, the Institute estimates the number of married same-sex couples increased by 50 percent over three years.

Three Gay-Bashing Suspects Released on Bail Less Than 24 Hours After Arrest

The three suspects arrested in the Philadelphia gay bashing that left two men hospitalized have been released on bail after spending less than 24 hours in jail.

Phillip Williams, 24, and Kevin Harrigan, 26, were each released on \$75,000 bail. Kathryn Knott, 24, was released on \$50,000 bail. All three, who were part of a larger group of as many as 15 people, have been charged with aggravated assault, simple assault, reckless endangerment, and criminal conspiracy in connection with the attack on a gay couple in Philly's Center City neighborhood earlier this month.

Knott, the daughter of nearby Chalfont Borough police chief Karl Knott, has also been suspended from her job at Lansdale Hospital, where she worked as an emergency room technician, according to the Bucks County Courier Times. Abington Health, the hospital's parent company, is also investigating Knott for photos of patient X-rays she posted to her Twitter

"Abington Health takes patient privacy and confidentiality very seriously and is fully investigating this matter," company officials said in a statement.

In addition, Fran McGlinn has not been formally listed as a suspect in the assault, with police instead calling him a person of interest, but the Roman Catholic Archidiocese of Philadelphia nonetheless released McGlinn from his position as assistant coach at Archbishop Wood High School this month.

In light of the attack, the Philadelphia LGBT activists are calling for changes to Pennsylvania's hate-crime statute, which does not cover attacks motivated by the victim's sexual orientation or gender identity. A petition on Change.org aimed state lawmakers and created by Caryn Kunkle says the absence of such provisions is a "gross failure to protect and serve people like my friend who were savagely attacked primarily for their sexual orientation."

"My friends are traumatized but not defeated," writes Kunkle.
"They never want this to happen to anyone again. And I won't

standby so I am demanding that the Pennsylvania state legislators act now to pass a law for a hate crime to include sexual orientation in its definition."

Out state representative Brian Sims has stood behind the couple to support inclusion of sexual orientation in the hate-crime law. Sims will host a rally today in Philadelphia's Love Park, with multiple speakers expected to appear. Sims will also host a public hearing of the House Democratic Policy Committee October 2 at the Kimmel Center in Philly to discuss LGBT hate-crime issues, according to the Pennsylvania House of Representatives.

Op-ed: Finding Sympathy for the Most Hated Woman in America

Nazi. Bitch. Scum. Kathryn Knott is all of those, according to non-anonymous Facebook commenters, reacting to the 24-year -old's alleged involvement in the bashing of a gay couple in Philadelphia that sent one of the victims to the hospital and left him with 24 stitches in his face. Knott wasn't alone in the beating; there were two men arrested, like her, for their participa-

tion, and they were part of a larger mob of as many as 15 people. But you almost wouldn't know that from the media, especially the gay blogosphere, which is focusing its gaze on this modern-day Anita Bryant.

Knott certainly has all the credentials needed for her new position as most hated woman in gay America — her title until Michele Bachmann verbally vomits again — with her vile Twitter ac-



count. She expresses awful sentiments not worth repeating, but take my word that they're vulgar, xenophobic, racist, and, yes, homophobic. It's also her relationship to her father, a police chief in Bucks County, Pa., that feeds the scorn. On that same dreadful Twitter feed, Knott brags how her powerful daddy punishes her enemies and treats her like the princess of her suburban kingdom. She comes off entitled, privileged, and none too bright (speaking of less-than-smart moves, the emergency room tech was just fired after tweeting out patients' private medical history).

All of that is enough to make her an anti-star on Towleroad and JoeMyGod, but there's more at play. The unspoken feeling

that Knott has betrayed us, gay men, is evident. Her actions feel more egregious than those of her two hateful, privileged male friends, since most of us expect that, if we're heckled or bashed, it will be by straight men (or men who pretend to be straight), not women. For the most part, women didn't push us into lockers. They didn't tie Matthew Shepard to a fence. Women may not always be gay men's allies, but they're rarely our enemies. It's sexist to think that women are nurturing, not nihilistic, but we still do tend to believe that. Unfairly or not, she's being held to a higher standard.

Knott's repellent behavior stings because women are supposed to know what it's like to be oppressed. Women typically face an uphill battle in a misogynistic world that demands clearly defined gender roles. She comes off like a traitor, siding with the patriarchal society that says gay men are disgusting and deserving of violence. Most gay men love the women in our lives; how dare she not love us back?

This is a reminder that people in other oppressed groups (in this case, women) who hate other social minorities (gay men) don't necessarily comprehend or care that we're all fighting similar battles — or that we're even in one. Knott's actions and messages make it clear that she doesn't understand the deficits she faces as a woman.

Even if she is pretty, young, blond, and the daughter of a police chief, those assets and connections may have helped her in the past, but they're doing her no favors now. There's nothing the public likes more than to bring a perceived spoiled brat — someone seemingly handed everything her whole life — down to earth. Seeing the mighty fall is a blood sport enjoyed by everyone, regardless of orientation.

But back to that cop dad. While his daughter loses her job, her reputation, and, perhaps, her freedom, Karl Knott gets off mostly scot-free. Let's remember that hate is learned, not inherited. It's pretty clear that Kathryn Knott was raised to think she's better than people who speak Spanish, have dark skin, or fall in love with someone of the same sex. If Karl Knott raises a bigot for a daughter, what are the policies he enforces in Chalfont Borough, Pa.? Karl Knott is the kind of person who makes you realize why so many minorities have no faith in the police to protect and serve fairly.

When Kathryn Knott's Twitter feed was discovered to still be live (face-palm), I had the urge to send her a message. I would never call her the names others have, but I wanted her to understand that the way she's going through life, as evidenced in her feed, is wrong. Before I could articulate a missive, I stopped and realized how dumb and hubris-filled it was to think that this 24-year-old was going to do a 180, and suddenly devote herself to LGBT equality, subscribe to Ms., or volunteer at the ACLU simply because I told her to.

Knott is probably too far gone at this point, and if not, too angry, scared, and confused to think clearly. But I do hope she can grow from this and understand why the world is so livid with her. Don't get me wrong, I'm still fuming at her actions and entitlement. But she's a victim too; of bad parenting, segregation, misinformation, and misogyny. After this public lashing, maybe that will finally sink in.

Russia's Highest Court Upholds So-Called LGBT Propaganda Law

Russia's highest court upheld the country's ban on socalled LGBT propaganda last week, claiming it was necessary to prevent children from being recruited into nonheterosexual society.

Evtushenko, and Dmitry Isakov filed the complaint with the Constitutional Court of Russia, claiming it violated their constitutional right to freedom of speech, while also discriminating against them, RT reports.

The court, however, said the law was aimed at protecting minors from information that could "push [them] to nonconventional sexual relationships, which in their turn prevent from building a family, as it is traditionally understood in Russia." The court also said the law was not an outright ban or censure of homosexuality.

Constitutional Court judge Nikolay Bondar said the law also contends that minors must not be allowed in pro-LGBT events like rallies or discussions, nor can the information promoted be aimed at young people.

"The practices of some European countries, which are connected with the deformation of traditional values of family and marriage, can't be an example for us," Bondar said.

Each of the activists who filed the complaint were fined for protesting the law, which was enacted last year. Private citizens may be fined anywhere between 4,000-5,000 rubles (\$100-\$130), which is how the three activists were charged. Civil servants may be charged anywhere between 40,000 and 50,000 rubles (or \$1,000-\$1,300), while messages from the media or Internet by legal entities could lead to fines as high as 1 million rubles, or \$26,000.

We closed the Center as of December 2nd, 2013.

The Gayzette will continue to be published and our hotline and web site will be continued.

We appreciate the past support for the Center but it became clear that it was time to close and become a virtual Center. We feel we can accomplish much more for the GLBT community in this way.

- •1 lb. cream cheese, softened and cut into small pieces

- •1/3 cup granulated sugar

·Mocha Sauce:

- ·1 cup semisweet chocolate pieces
- •1/3 cup Kahlua
- •1/3 cup light corn syrup

Cheesecake:

Heat oven to 325 degrees. Slowly heat chocolate, butter and Kahlua in a small saucepan, stirring until chocolate melts and mixture is smooth. Set aside and cool slightly. 
