NEBRASKA ADVOCATES FOR JUSTICE & EQUALITY WORK TO DEFEAT DEFENSE OF MARRIAGE AMENDMENT

Approximately 400 volunteers attended rallies held by Nebraska Advocates for Justice & Equality on July 20, with standing room only at First United Methodist Church in Omaha and Unitarian Church in Lincoln.

In Omaha, Nebraska Advocates President, Linda Richenberg, let volunteers know they would be instrumental in defeating the Constitutional amendment ballot measure and that two most important words between now and November 7th are "Vote No." The Reverend Mark Kernling led a prayer asking that they be guided in their efforts for this worthy cause. Mike McClellan, attorney and friend of Nebraska Advocates, spoke about legal repercussions of the ballot measure. Not only would the GLBT community be affected, but businesses that offer domestic partner benefits could suffer, leading to a drain as educated people sought employment in states that recognize such partners. The language has not changed significantly from the petition, and the amendment would be attached to the Bill of Right section of the state Constitution, so the very section which guarantees rights would have an amendment which negatively impacted rights. How wrong that is. Tim Butts of Nebraska ACLU, stressed should the ballot measure pass, at least 15 Nebraska laws would need to be changed; domestic partnerships are in danger as they would no longer be legally recognized. The Board of Nebraska ACLU pledged support and time, and "put our money where our mouth is" to aid in defeating the ballot measure. M. J. McBride of the Nebraska Advocates Board, led an exercise of "Hear, speak and acknowledge," telling volunteers if they truly spoke from their hearts they would forever change the future. M. J. listed 5 points Nebraska Advocates volunteers would stress in the weeks leading to the election: 1. Vote No on antigay legislation. 2. This amendment would ban all legal recognition of same sex couples. 3. They say they're just trying to ban gay marriage. They are banning more than marriage. 4. If marriage is good enough for committed heterosexual couples, why isn't it be good enough for homosexual couples? 5. It's just wrong to treat gay people or any people as second-class couples. The Omaha volunteer coordinators, Deb Keeney, Scott Winkler and

Beth Rigatuso spoke. Then a special treat when Ann Boyle spoke, telling volunteers "Hate is not the enemy, ignorance is the enemy." Ms. Boyle went on "People should have a decent life and the rights given to us by the Constitution...life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." Ms. Boyle believes, like Eleanor Roosevelt, in the "Party of hope." She pledged her willingness to help fight against the ballot measure any way she can.

In Lincoln, Dave Gilsdorf of the Nebraska Advocates Board, spoke of the widespread belief that since most Nebraskans are Christians, the amendment will pass easily. Not true, he said, "Many will vote 'no' if we share our personal experiences." After a prayer by Pastor Jay Vetter of Christ United Methodist Church, John

Taylor, attorney and member of the Nebraska Advocates Board, explained potential legal implications should the ballot measure pass. Ms. Cheryl Applegate addressed the volunteers, stating "This is a civil rights issue," and told of being beaten almost to death in Maryland in the 1960s when she was the first black student to attend a segregated high school. "It is one group saying that another group does not deserve civil rights, because we are not like them." Mike Donlan, chair of the Lancaster County Democrats, issued a statement of support for the fight against the ballot measure. Ms. Deanna Zaffke, Lincoln Volunteer Coordinator, let volunteers know how important their contributions are. Ms. Amy Young gave information on how to write letters to the editor so they get published.

SEMINARY GRADUATION FEATURES MCC MEMBER

On Saturday, June 3, Chicago Theological Seminary held its graduation ceremony before a standing-room-only audience of over 2,000. Among the graduates was The Rev. Jesse Jackson Sr., who had left CTS a short time before receiving his degree to join Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in Atlanta in 1966, and Jo A. Bell. Jo is a member of Holy Covenant MCC and chose to attend CTS because of its close relationship with UFMCC. As Jo's friends and family members gathered to watch her receive her Master of Divinity Degree, they were also experiencing a great sense of pride. Jo had been chosen by her peers to give the Response to the Charge delivered by the Dean of CTS, Dr. Dow Edgerton. This may be the first time in history that such an honor had been bestowed on an open lesbian seminarian. The charge by Dr. Edgerton told the graduates that they, "would know God's house not by who is kept out, but by the multitude invited in..."

Jo responded by telling the graduating class of 2000 that, "...the house of God they had grown up in has changed, and it has changed by God's design. It is now an eclectic gathering! Eunuchs and foreigners - those who have been legally shut out - are now invited in; and all they must do is 'love God.'

Jo continued by saying, "We are not called into a soft and gentle ministry - we are called into a transformative ministry in the 'real' world - and today, in the 'real' world there is no such house of prayer that truly welcomes all people. We are called into a violent time, a time of upheaval - much of it stemming from societal norms that don't allow us to grasp that God has created us all so very different...to be beautiful and fabulous and challenging - to one another, and to God."

Jo's speech was interrupted by applause on several occasions, and by the end the audience was on their feet giving a standing ovation. Jo has signed on as the Pastoral Intern of Holy Covenant MCC in Hinsdale, Illinois as she continues her journey toward ordination in UFMCC. 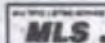
