1. We have volunteer opportunities for phone banking on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings (calling from friendly lists to generate what else - more volunteers!). This is also how we line up folks to do voter canvassing on Saturday and Sunday. Call the office and talk to Scott Winkler to volunteer.

2. Voter canvassing is really great! You get a chance to talk to the general public, one-on-one, and educate them on what the ballot language really means. The response to this education has been fabulous, with many people who are undecided making up their minds to vote AGAINST! Call Scott Winkler to volunteer for voter canvassing.

3. We also need volunteers to help staff the office during the daytime and in the evening, answering phones, running errands, stapling, collating, stuffing envelopes - well, you get the idea! Call Michael Jones at the office to volunteer as office staff. Even just a few hours would help!

4. We are setting up house parties (you know, invite your closest and most intimate 20 to 30 people over for dinner) as a fund-raiser. After the house parties, we will all meet at one central location for the party to beat all parties! Call Beth Rigatuso at the office to volunteer to have a house party.

C is for Contributions, contributions, contributions! Because we are a grass roots committee, we rely on money raised from fair-minded Nebraskans like yourself to run the campaign. All of the money we raise goes for just one thing - a massive campaign to educate the public to vote AGAINST the ballot measure.

D is for dedicated - which is what we all are, dedicated to ensuring your rights are protected by the Constitution, not inhibited by it.

E is for education. A lot of this is being done through our voter canvassing and through the extensive work of our Media Director, M. J. McBride. We also have a wonderful Speakers' Bureau headed up by Hollis Glaser.

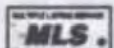

# FIRST UNITARIAN HOSTS SERIES OF G/L FILMS

First Unitarian Church of Omaha announces a Gay and Lesbian Film Festival will run for four weeks, Sunday, September 17 & 14 and October 1 & 8. The films will be shown at 6pm in the Common Room downstairs at First Unitarian Church, 3114 Harney, in Omaha. There is a \$2.00 charge per night for food and incidentals (no registration is required for this film series) The films to be shown are:

## SEPTEMBER 17: "THE CHILDREN'S HOUR"

A child's lie has life shattering repercussions in this daring 1961 film based on a Broadway play many believed too bold for the screen. The story begins at an exclusive girls school run by Karen Wright (Audrey Hepburn) and Martha Dobie (Shirley MacLaine). When they discipline a vindictive little girl, the child twists an overheard comment into slander. She accuses her teachers of lesbianism...and her gullible grandmother spreads the gossip. Outraged, Karen and Martha fight back in court. But a child's lie is hard to disprove. Co-starring James Garner, Miriam Hopkins and Fay Bainter, this powerful film was one of the first movies approved by the liberalized Production Code.

## SEPTEMBER 24: "A VERY NATURAL THING"

One of the first commercial films to openly deal with the gay experience, "A Very Natural Thing" (1971) is the story of Jason, a former seminary student and David, an advertising executive. Together they discover passion and romance while learning to love and respect each other. "The first feature film made in this country to deal honestly with a relationship between two men." -Vito Russo

## OCTOBER 1: "THE HANGING GARDEN"

Having fled years earlier, a once inept William returns home now a confident, together, gay young man. Still old demons must be met, and new wonders explored. "The Hanging Garden" presents the most modern, lyrical and humorous approach to family reunions.

## OCTOBER 8: "WHEN NIGHT IS FALLING"

Successful in her teaching job at a conservative religious college, Camille looked forward to marrying her adoring, minister boyfriend and settling down to the conventions of family and career. But a chance encounter with a beautiful, irresistibly sensuous young female circus performer named Petra is about to transform Camille's predictable life into an electrifying erotic adventure. Captivated by Petra's impulsive sexuality and passionately free spirit, Camille is drawn into a world whose existence she never dared imagine. A world of hypnotic sensuality, rapturous self-discovery and exquisite erotic pleasure. Now, walking an emotional high-wire between the familiar past and the forbidden future, Camille must choose between the love she can't forget...and the desire she can't resist.

# NAMES Project of the Heartland

Do you remember someone who has died of AIDS? This December, Unity Church of Omaha is participating in an ongoing effort to keep the NAMES alive of those family members and friends who have left us because of this terrible disease.

Starting December 1st, we will host a display of 9 of the 12' x 12' panels of the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt. Volunteers will be needed to hang them for display, to remove them after December 18th, and to answer questions about the panels, about AIDS, and about what we can do to stop the spread of this disease. There may be new 6' x 3' panels submitted at that time in December, also.

The display will be assisted by The NAMES Project of the Heartland/Omaha Chapter. The local chapter is currently quite small and in need of more volunteers and board members. Unity Church of Omaha has helped in the past by hosting general meetings and Panel-Making Workshops. Every six months, the local chapter has a different set of panels on loan from the national office in San Francisco. Currently, Unity Church of Omaha is acting as the repository for the panels on loan, which is a tremendous help for the local chapter. Eight panels, each 3' x 6', make up a block, which can weigh from 20 to 40 pounds.

Some history: In April of 1997, a small group of people who had helped at the AIDS Quilt Display at Iowa Western Community College got together and decided that a local chapter of the NAMES Project was needed here in Nebraska. Approval as a local chapter was granted in October of 1997, and it has since then become a nonprofit 501C3. The main expenses of the committee include dues to the national organization, postage for the return of the panels to San Francisco, and various mailings.

Since forming in October of 1997, the local chapter has sponsored a number of panel displays, at Creighton, UNO, UNL, Peru State, and various other area schools here in Nebraska and in Kansas, and at several businesses.

For those who are interested in making a panel to memorialize a loved one who has died of AIDS, panel-making workshops are held periodically to provide ideas, techniques, and support. Unity Church of Omaha has been very gracious in providing space for these workshops. Each panel is 3' x 6', designed either vertically or horizontally, and there are some guidelines as to construction. They are sometimes displayed outdoors, and are moved and sent all over the country, so they must be durable.

PFLAG will present a wonderful panel on how it feels to come out, how to do it, what it's like to be the family and friends of a person coming out, and good tips from them on when is a good time, and how best to present this sometimes startling news to your loved ones. Other workshops that are being formed are: a youth speak out, a people of color coffee talk, who the 'T' in GLBT is, and what all those trans words mean, and polyamory - an alternative for many. Hopefully, you'll find information that you've been looking for.

We will also be offering two projection movie viewings, courtesy of Lynn Rogers, complete with fresh popcorn and other concessions.

Don't forget! This will be a jam packed GLBT weekend. Onyx Images is hosting their annual ball Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. The Heartland Gay Rodeo Association & Front Runners have their annual barn dance Saturday evening. MCC's annual softball tournament will be on Sunday. All in all, it looks to be an affirming and happening 3 days. As a part of the wonderful Nebraska Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender communities, please join us to celebrate our lives, and our families.

## She's BAAACK!!!! Suzanne Westenhoeffer

WomenSpace is pleased to announce that Suzanne Westenhoeffer will be returning to Omaha this fall. Suzanne has recently released a third comedy CD "I'm Not Cindy Brady" and continues to pack theatres across the country with her own unique brand of hilarity.

In 1990, while working as a bartender in north New Jersey, Suzanne was encouraged to enter a comedy contest at Kelly's Piano Bar in New York City and though she had never done stand-up before, she won. She quickly became known as the gay girl in straight clubs.

It was a year later when Suzanne performed at The Duplex in New York that the gay audience found her and she began getting work emceeding drag shows, AIDS benefits and gay pride events.

While performing in a comedy club in 1991, Suzanne was approached by the Sally Jessy Raphael talk show asking her to appear. The theme was "Breaking the Lesbian Stereotype: Lesbians Who Don't Look Like Lesbians". She went on and publicly came out on national television.

As a lesbian comedian, Suzanne became a pioneer on the stand-up circuit, performing in the conservative and straight Improvs in Dallas and Addison, Texas and the University of Wyoming in Laramie. Without changing her material to accommodate the straight audiences, she won them over not only by being funny but by revealing the similarities among people rather than their differences. Suzanne has also taken her unique way of educating into the

classroom where she has an open dialogue with teenagers about being gay.

In 1994, Suzanne became the first lesbian comedian to be given her own HBO Comedy special, which went on to be nominated for a Cable ACE Award. She was also the first gay person to appear on Comedy Central and to be on A&E's *Evening at the Improv*, *Caroline's Comedy Hour*, and *Politically Incorrect*. She was also on *Out There* on Comedy Central. Suzanne was featured in the first gay and lesbian sketch comedy pilot produced by Andy Nulman of Montreal's *Just For Laughs Festival* for Showtime and the CBC and has appeared on such talk shows as *Geraldo*, *Joan Rivers*, *Ricki Lake*, *Arsenio*, and *Roseanne*.

With all her successes, it was the GLAMA Award (Gay and Lesbian American Music Awards) for her first comedy CD, *Nothing in My Closet But My Clothes*, on the Uproar Entertainment label, that Suzanne especially cherishes. Not that she's sitting around waiting but as she says, "when your own community tells you what you're doing is a good thing, that means a great deal, that means more than anything else."

Today, Suzanne can be seen at comedy clubs across the country, from Caroline's in New York to the Improv in Orange County, California. She can also be found headlining at New York's The Bottom Line, Los Angeles' Highways Performance Space, Chicago's Park West and San Francisco's The Great American Music Hall, as well as women's music festivals and college campuses.

Suzanne's career goals are to have her own sitcom and to be the next David Letterman.

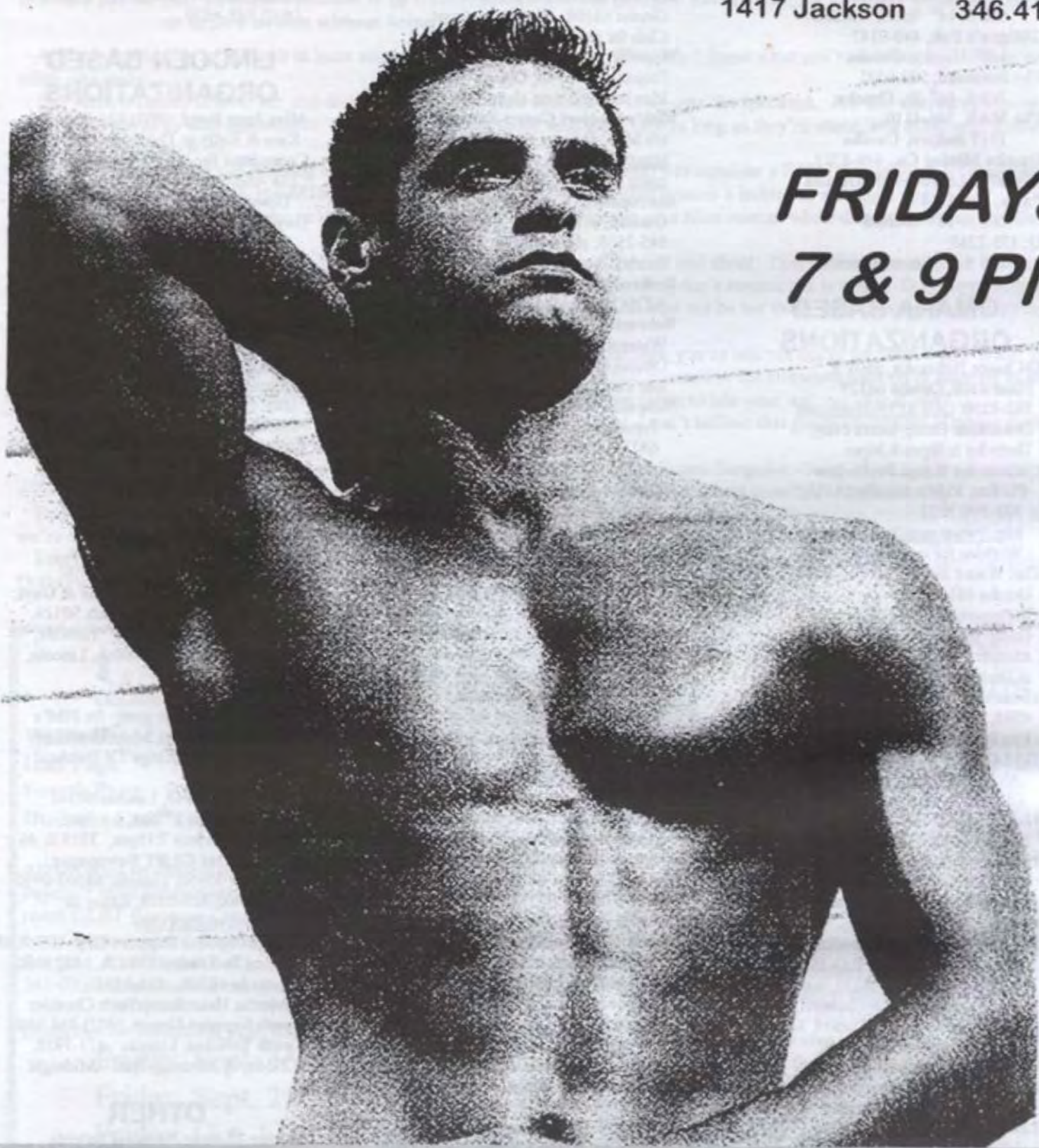
