NEBRASKA SUPREME COURT OVERTURNS DECISION IN LESBIAN ADOPTION CASE

In the July 4 email distribution, PlanetOut (<http://www.planetout.com/pno/news/article.html?2002/07/03/1>) reported on a recent Nebraska Supreme Court decision that overturned a lower court decision that invalidated -- for the purposes of Nebraska law -- a lesbian mother's Pennsylvania adoption. They reported that Joan Bridgens adopted a child in 1996, and her partner, Serenna Russell, co-adopted the same child in 1997. After the two broke up, however, Bridgens challenged Russell's parental status, arguing that unsettled Pennsylvania law should not be honored in Nebraska. Although the trial court agreed with Bridgens, the high court did not, sending the case back to trial court in a June 28 opinion.

The case presents the simple question of whether a court judgment issued in one state must be honored in another. With very few exceptions, the Full Faith and Credit Clause of the U.S. Constitution insists that the answer is yes. But if a court lacks "subject matter jurisdiction" over the issue it decides, then other states are not bound to its opinion.

Since the legal status of second parent adoptions in Pennsylvania is presently under review by that state's Supreme Court, Bridgens convinced the trial judge that the procedure was irregular, and the Pennsylvania court lacked the authority to grant her former partner's adoption petition.

Although the high court reversed that decision last Friday, they did so on a technicality -- ruling that the burden of proof should have rested on Bridgens, who brought little or no evidence to support her argument. On remand, the justices ordered the trial court to hear evidence on both sides, and to take into account the eventual high court ruling out of Pennsylvania.

Two of the seven justices reached core issues in a concurrent opinion. Whether or not second parent adoptions survive the scrutiny of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court, they wrote, the court that issued the original decree had the jurisdiction to do so at the time. As such, the adoption is a settled matter of law, or res judicata, that cannot be challenged and that must be given full faith and credit.

Some of these ideas may well be revisited in the event that same-sex marriage is legalized in one of the 50 states, when the Full Faith and Credit Clause is expected to be raised as a challenge to one of the many states that outlaws recognition of a same-sex marriage from outside its borders.

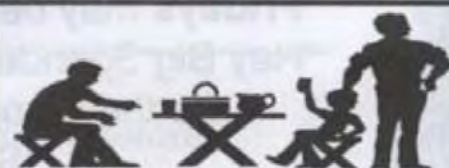

The Omaha Joint Electrical Apprenticeship & Training Committee accepts applications year around for the Electricians Apprenticeship program. Applications for Commercial and Industrial (Inside Electricians) can be filled out on all working Mondays, from 8:00 a.m. until 5:30 p.m.. Applications for Residential and Telecommunication can be filled out on all working Tuesday's, from 8:00 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. Applications are taken at the Apprenticeship Office, (8946 L Street, Omaha NE). There is a \$20.00 application fee.

week, nine months a year. The apprentice will be employed by a signatory contractor doing electrical construction work. The Residential and Telecommunication Programs are 3 years of apprenticeship. The Residential apprentice will perform work on houses and apartments and the Telecommunication apprentice will install computer networking, telephone systems, nurse call stations, fire alarm, and numerous low voltage installations.

\$11.25 an hour after the first 1000 hours, which is approximately six
